





What percentage of your country's population do you think immigrants (i.e., people born in another country) represent?










The most irrational beliefs remain a largely minority view – but they still attract more than a quarter of the population

Do you personally believe in (i) witchcraft, (ii) ghosts, (iii) clairvoyance?






On a more serious note, almost half of the population say they do not trust scientists






The individual actions most likely to combat climate change remain relatively unknown

From the following list, which three actions do you think would most significantly reduce a person's greenhouse gas emissions?


The steps that are easiest to implement and closest to everyday life are perceived as having the greatest impact

Trust in electoral democracy remains a majority view – but not by a wide margin






What comes close to your view of the 2020 presidential election? It was...




Misperception Index— by topic (10 = widest gap between actual data and respondents' perception)
