

How do you intend to vote in the General Election? Will you vote ...?






Base: 1,003 British adults 18+, 17-23 January 2024; Headline Voting Intention: all 9/10 certain to vote, always/usually/it depends vote in General Elections = 617. Margin of error is displayed at +/- 4% All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that they lie within 2 points. This is especially important to keep in mind when calculating party lead figures.

How would you vote if there were an election tomorrow?

















Rishi Sunak: Satisfaction amongst Conservative supporters



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his/her job as Prime Minister?





How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way the government is running the country?





How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his/her job as Prime Minister?



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his/her job as Prime Minister?






Keir Starmer: Satisfaction







Keir Starmer: Satisfaction amongst Labour supporters










Do you think that the general economic condition of the country will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?


















