



## A majority of Britons say they feel worse off than in 2019

Do you think you are better or worse off, if either, than when Boris Johnson's Conservative government was re-elected in December 2019?








# Twice as many 2019 Conservatives say they are worse off than better off since the last election

### Would you be better off under the Conservatives or Labour?








#### ... If Rishi Sunak's Conservatives win the next General Election?




# Almost half of Britons feel more concerned about Britain's public services following the Autumn Statement
