






Westminster Voting Intention: January 2024

How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?











If there were elections to the Scottish Parliament tomorrow, how would you use your constituency vote?











If there were elections to the Scottish Parliament tomorrow, how would you use your regional list vote?









How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?



How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?












Trust in parties, by issue


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
Support for Scottish independence: January 2024

All likely to vote and expressing a voting intention



Technical note

lpsos interviewed a representative sample of 1,005 adults aged 16+ across Scotland. Interviews were conducted by telephone: 25 – 31 January 2024. Data are weighted by age, sex, region, social grade, tenure, working status, work sector, education and country of birth to match the profile of the population.

Where percentages do not sum to 100 this may be due to computer rounding, the exclusion of "don't know" categories, or multiple answers. An asterisk (*) denotes any value of less than half a per cent.
