



### By 2019 General Election vote








How likely or unlikely, if either, do you think it is that the General Election on July 4<sup>th</sup> will result in each of the following?

And still thinking about the different possible outcomes of the next General Election, do you think each of the following would be good or bad outcomes for the country, if either?






## Size of a Labour majority?

Over the past few decades, Prime Ministers have formed governments with different size majorities depending on how many seats they won at an election. For example, David Cameron had a majority of around 15 in 2015, Boris Johnson around 80 seats in 2019, and Tony Blair around 180 seats in 1997.


How likely or unlikely, if either, do you think it is that the General Election on July 4<sup>th</sup> will result in each of the following?





# Labour majority: A good or bad outcome?


And still thinking about the different possible outcomes of the next General Election, do you think each of the following would be good or bad outcomes for the country, if either?
