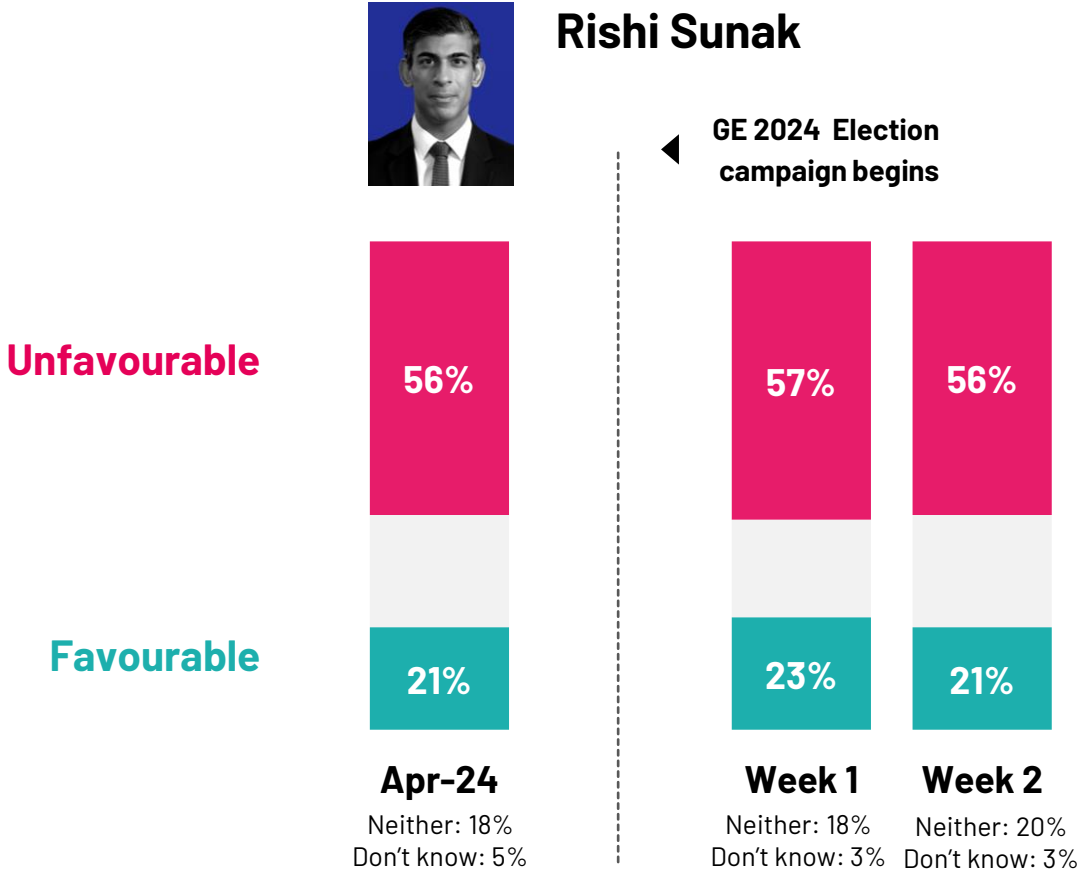

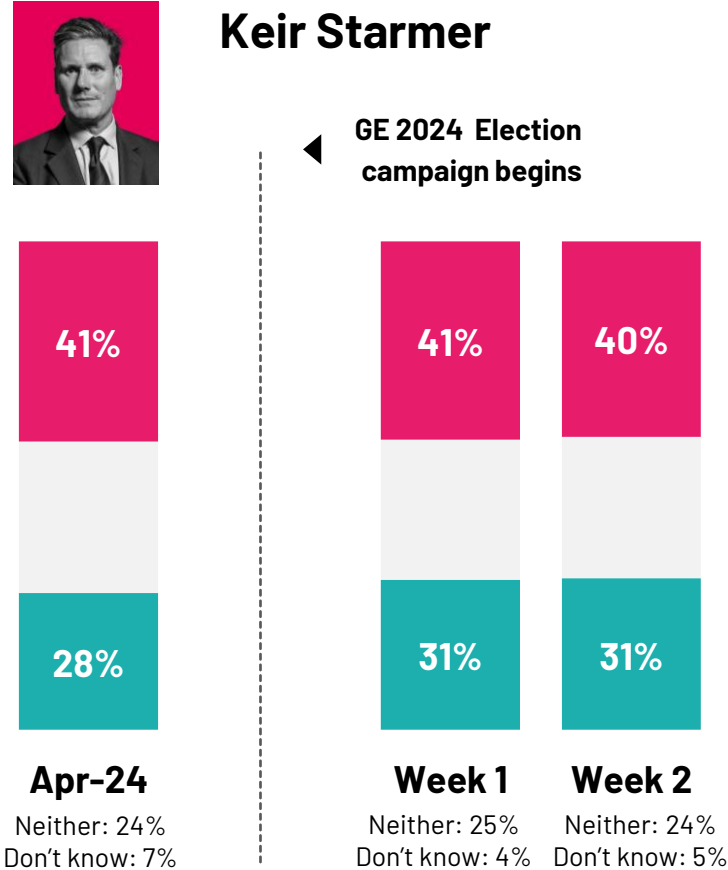

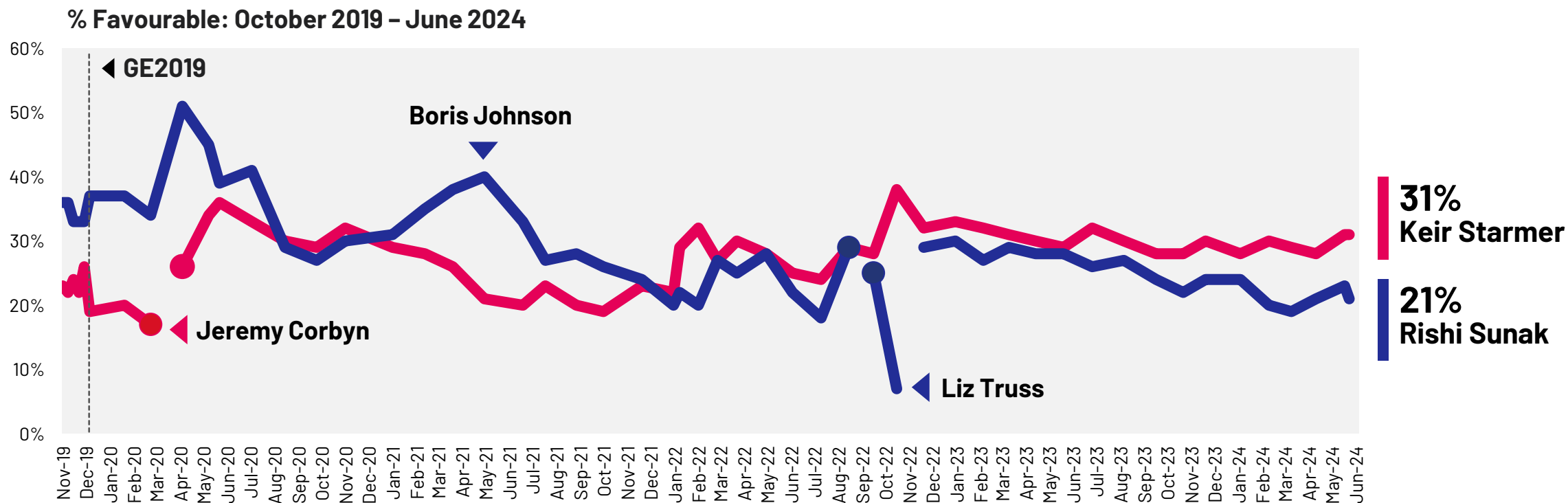

Favourability: Conservative leader vs Labour leader

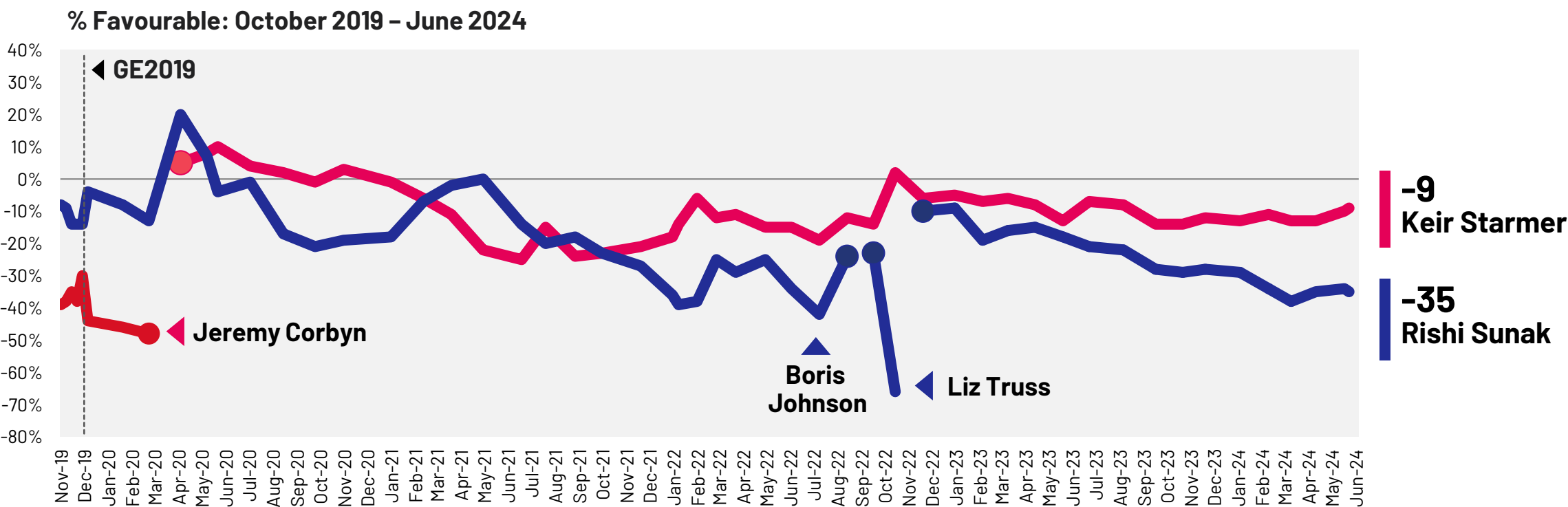
To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians and political parties?

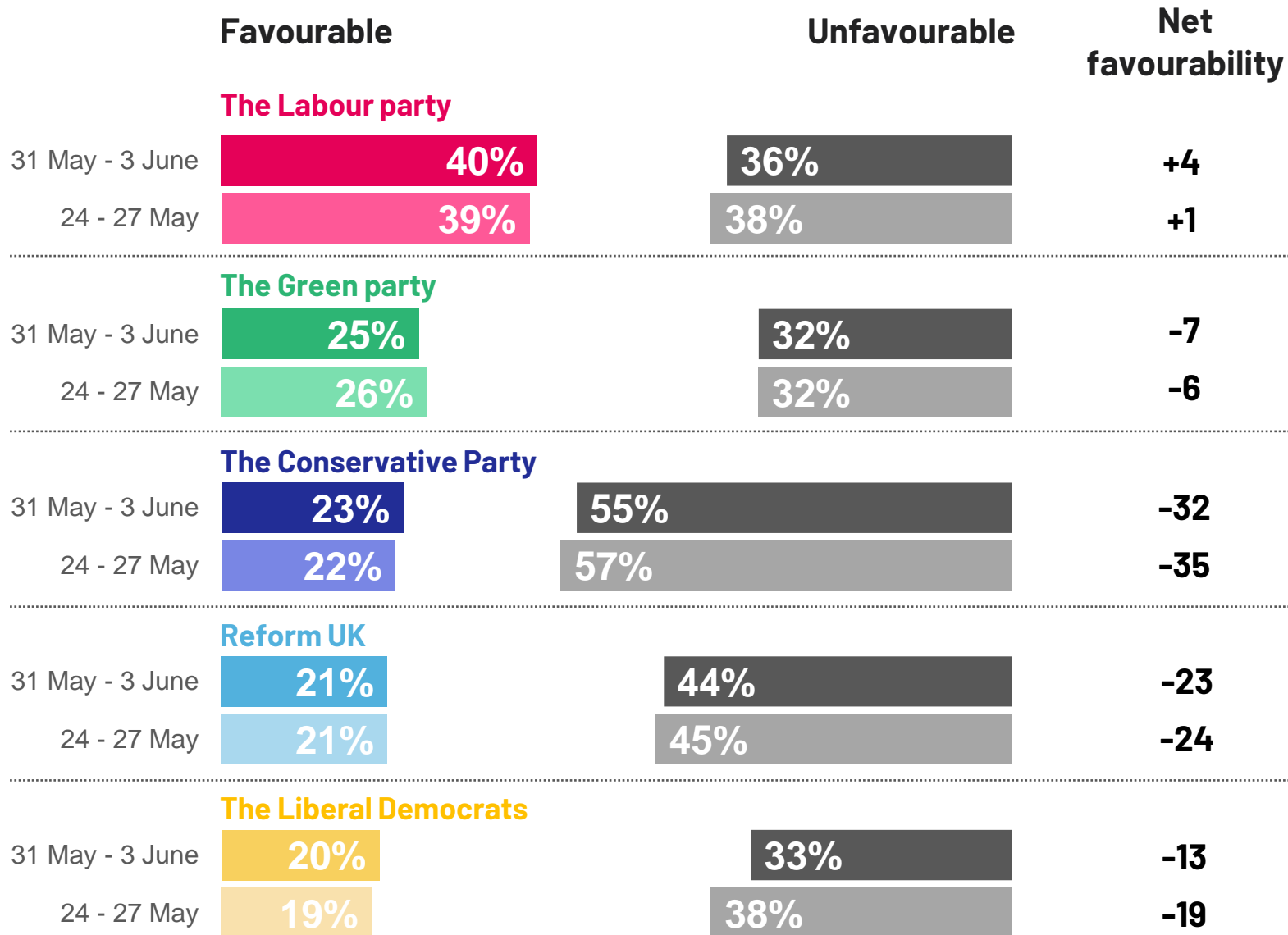

Favourability towards political parties

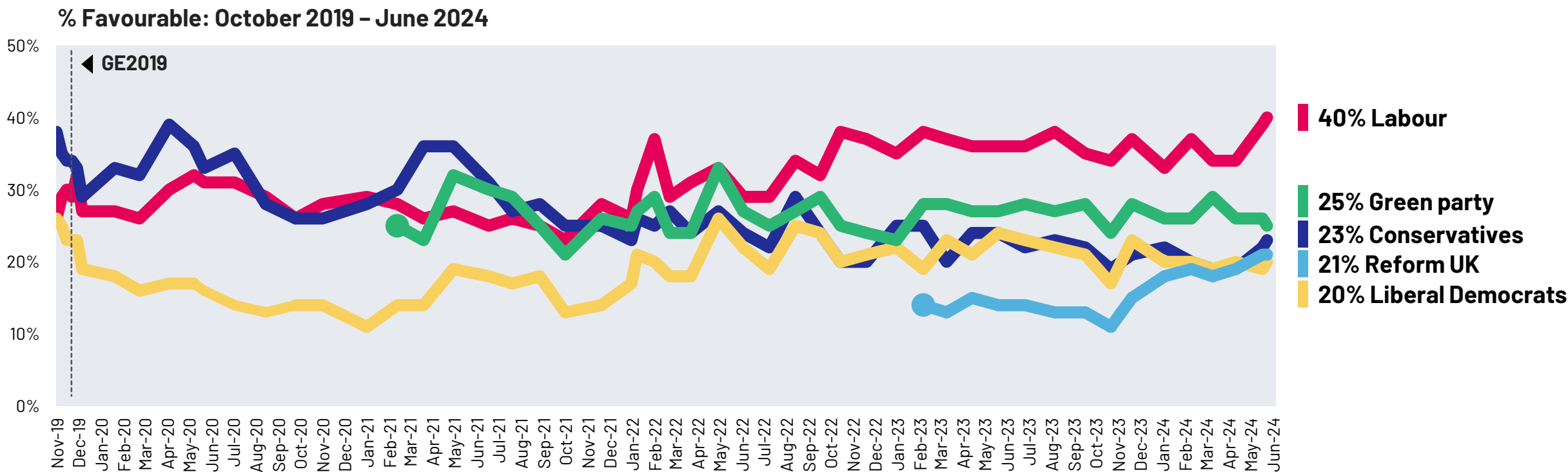

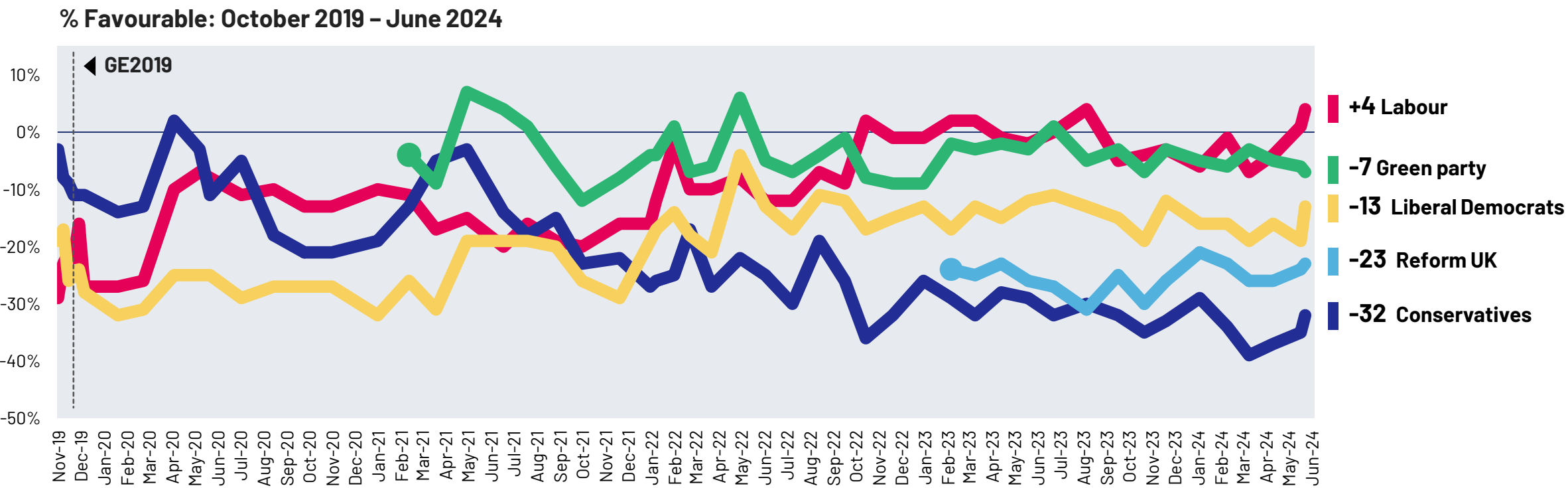

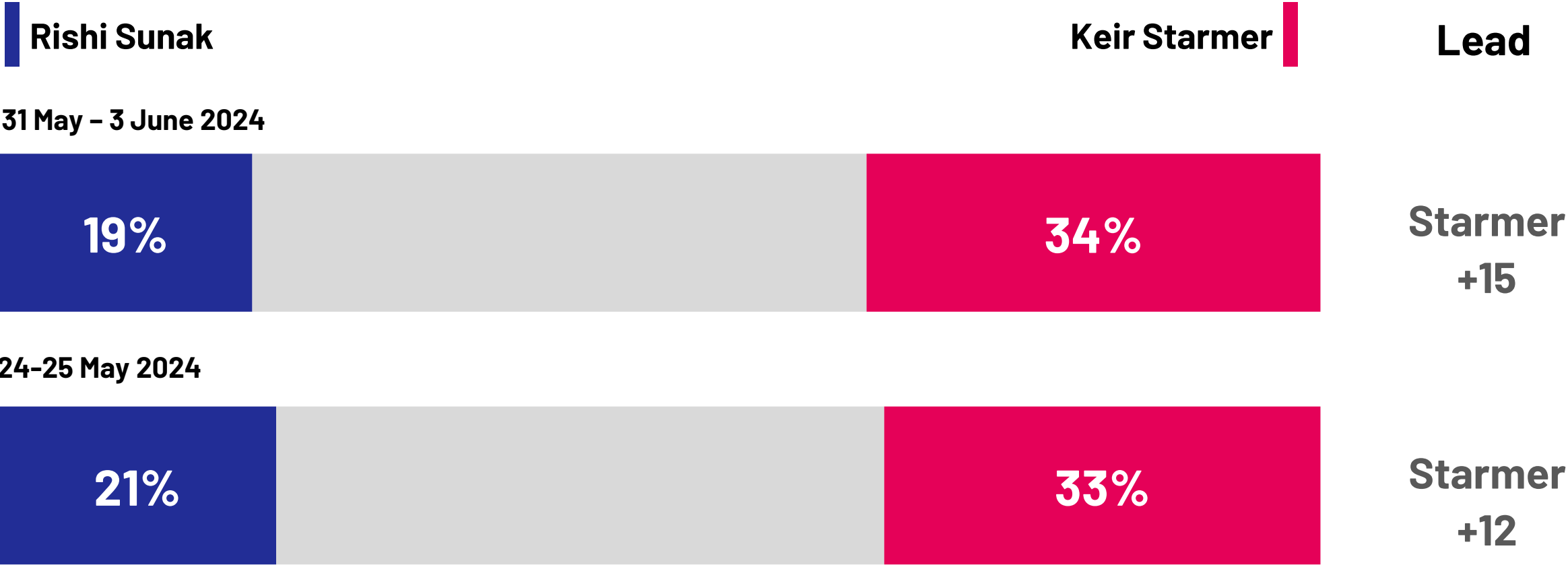

Which of the following, if either, do you think would make a better Prime Minister?

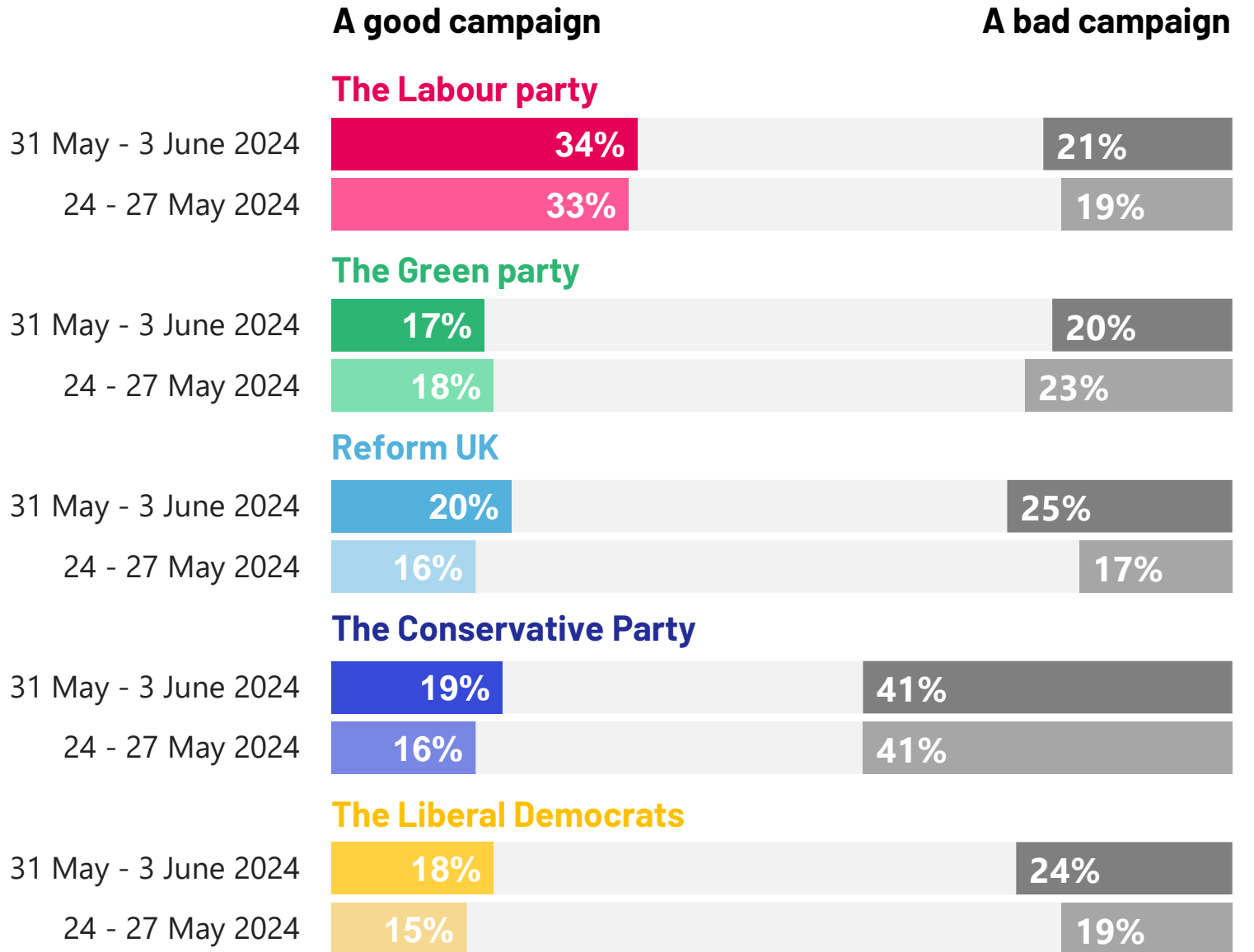

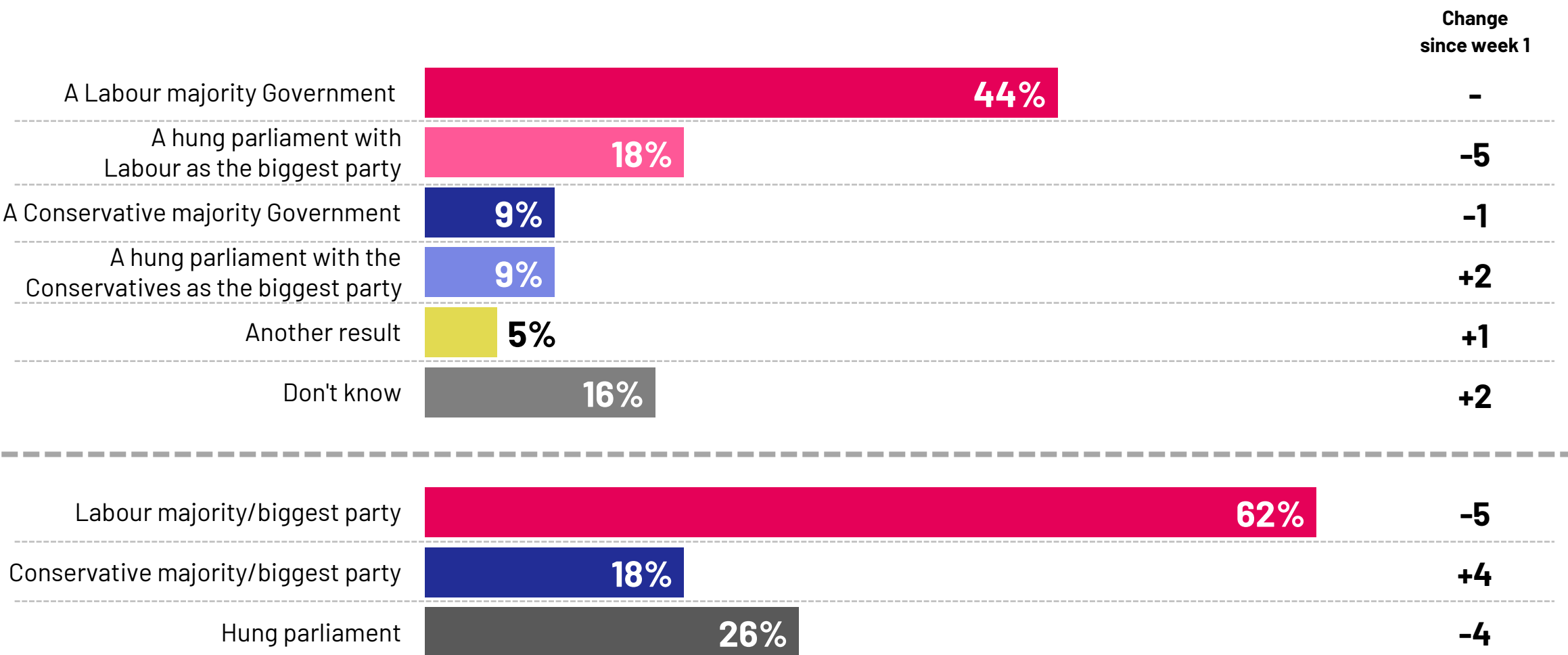

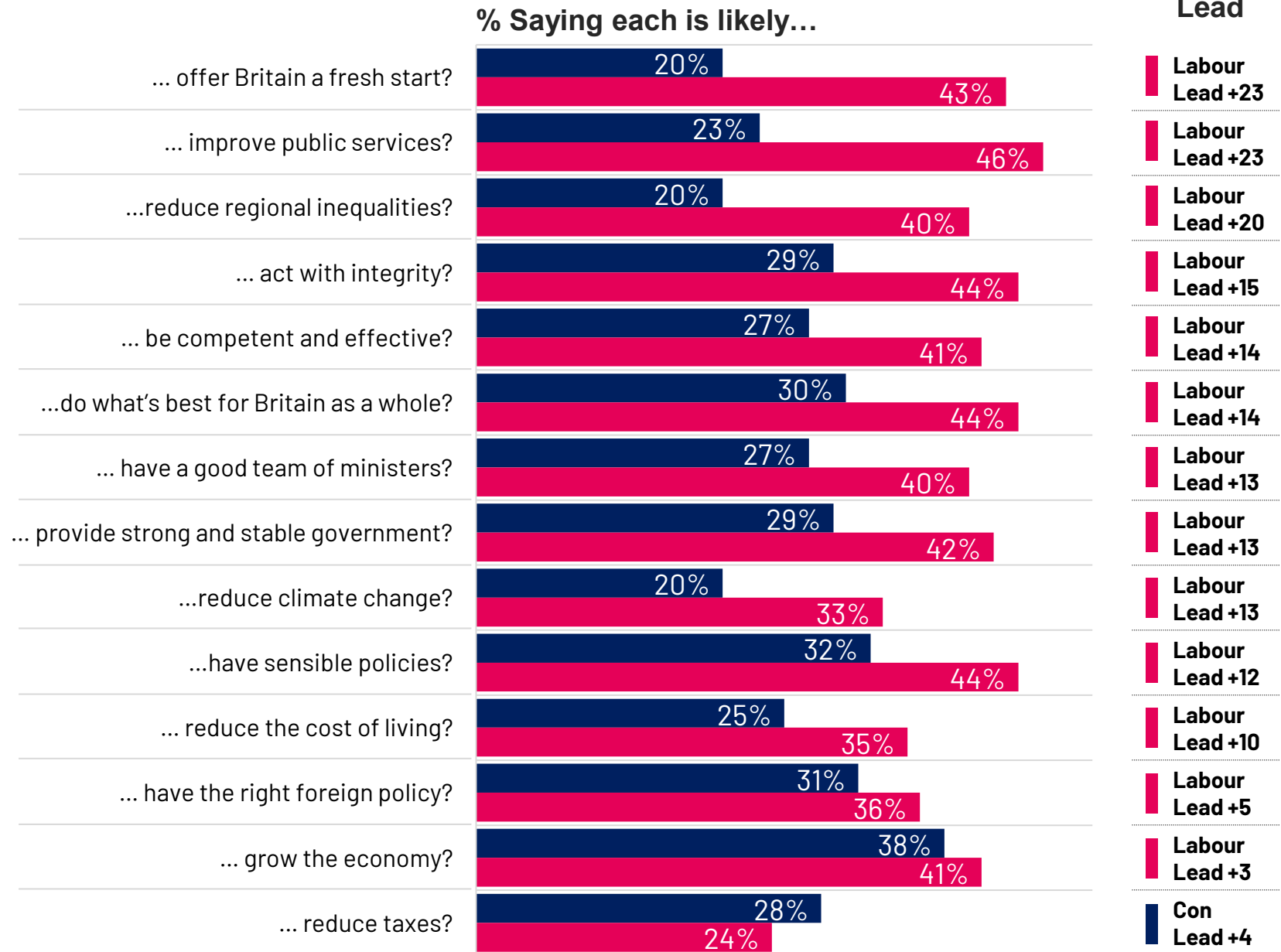

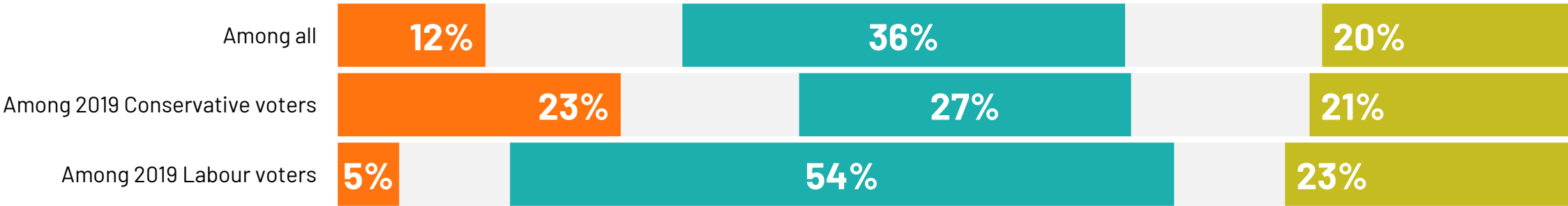

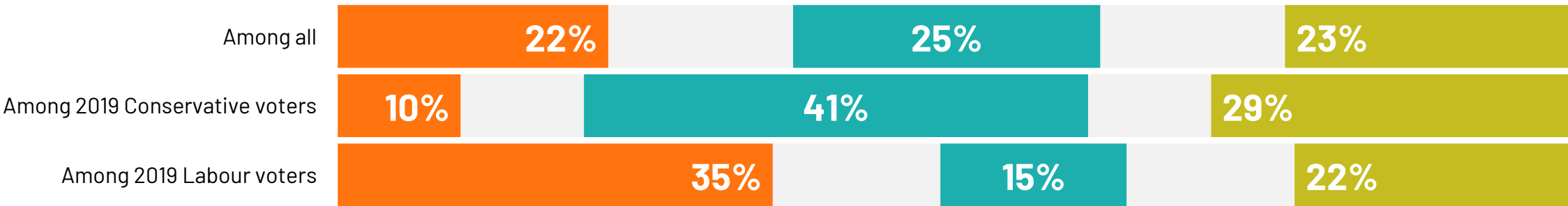
Based on what you know, do you think that the Labour Party's / Conservative Party's plans for Britain if they win the upcoming General Election are too radical, not radical enough or about right?

The Conservative Party's plans

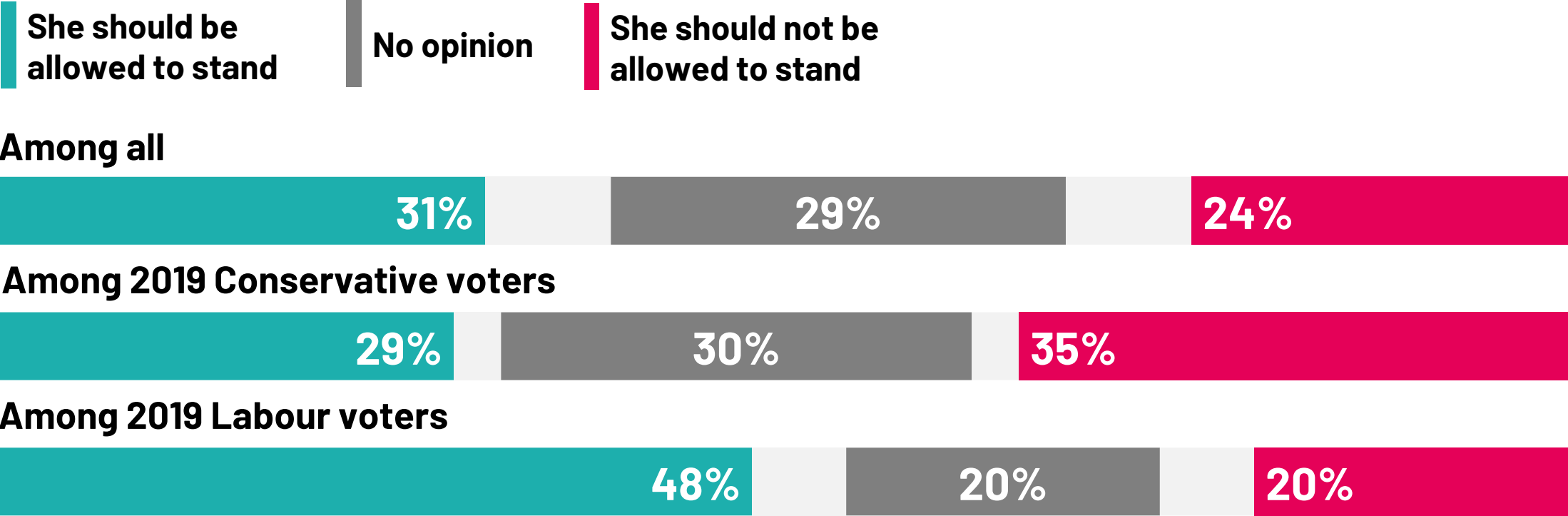

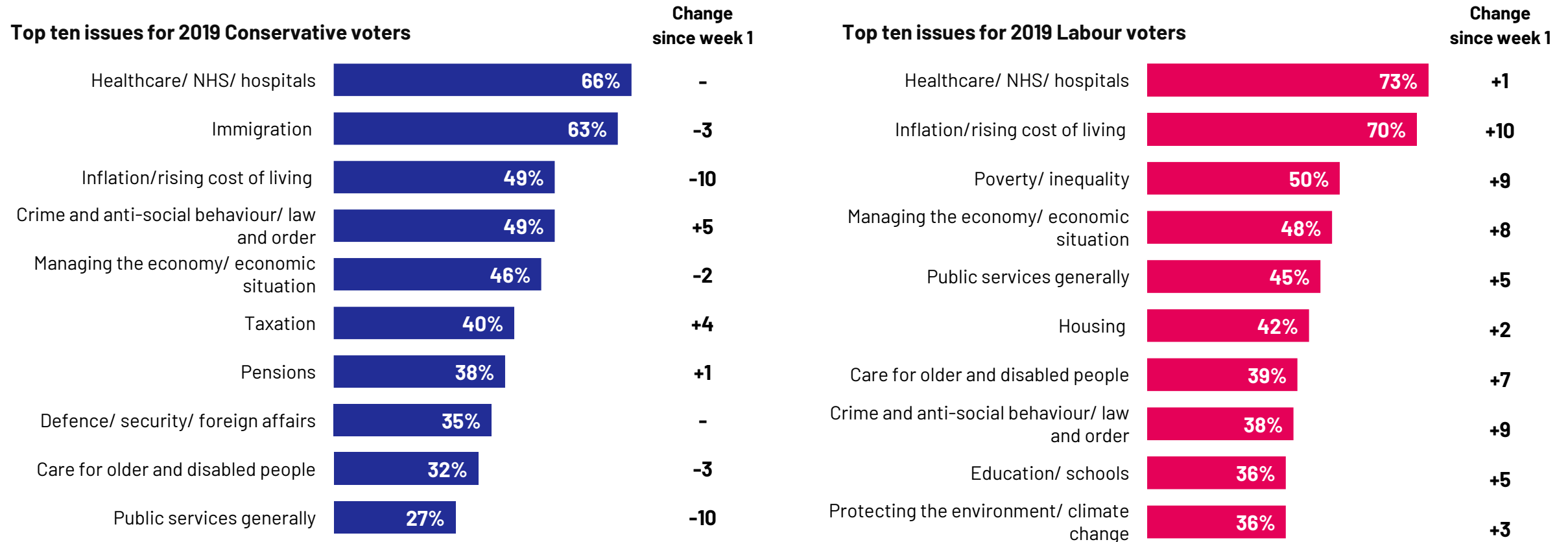

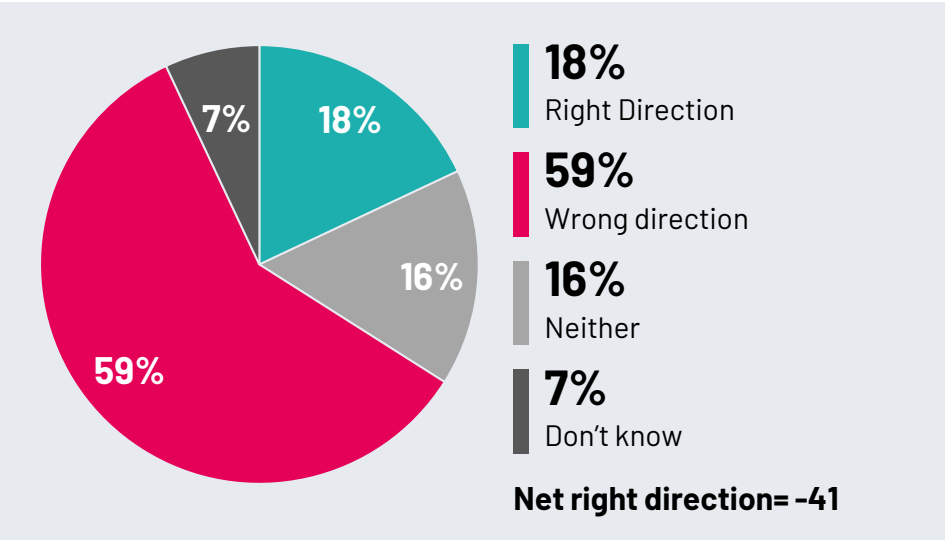

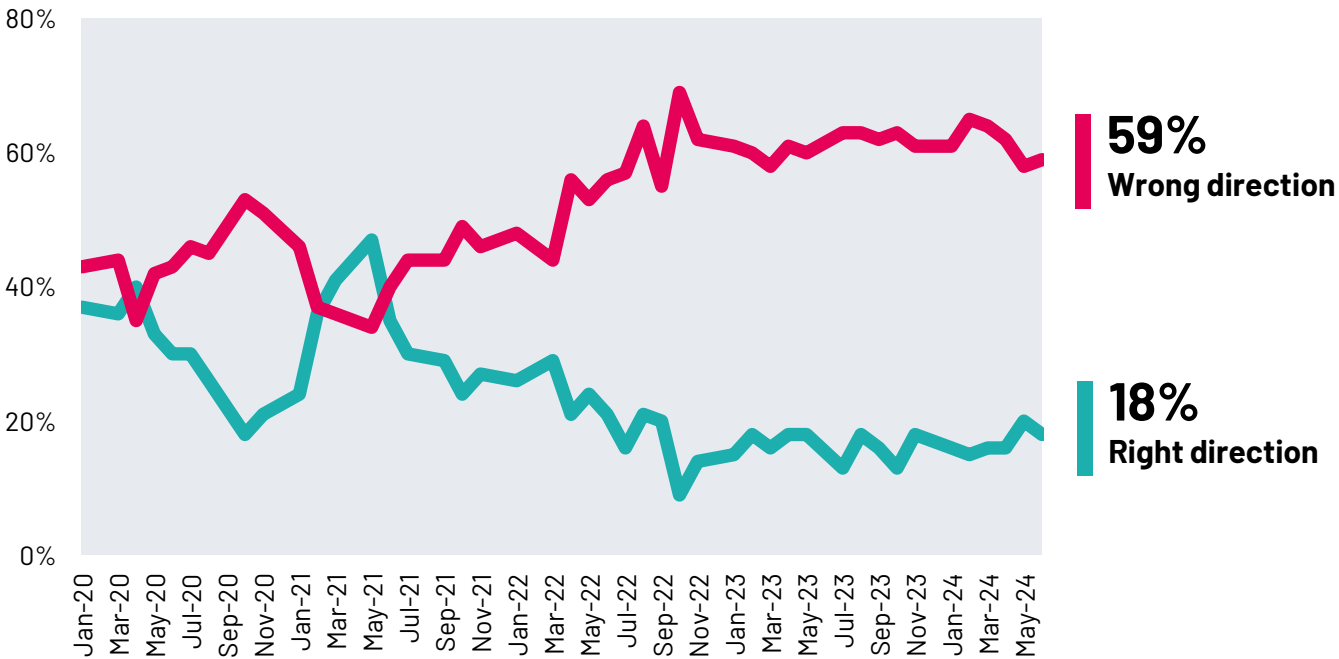

January 2020 – June 2024

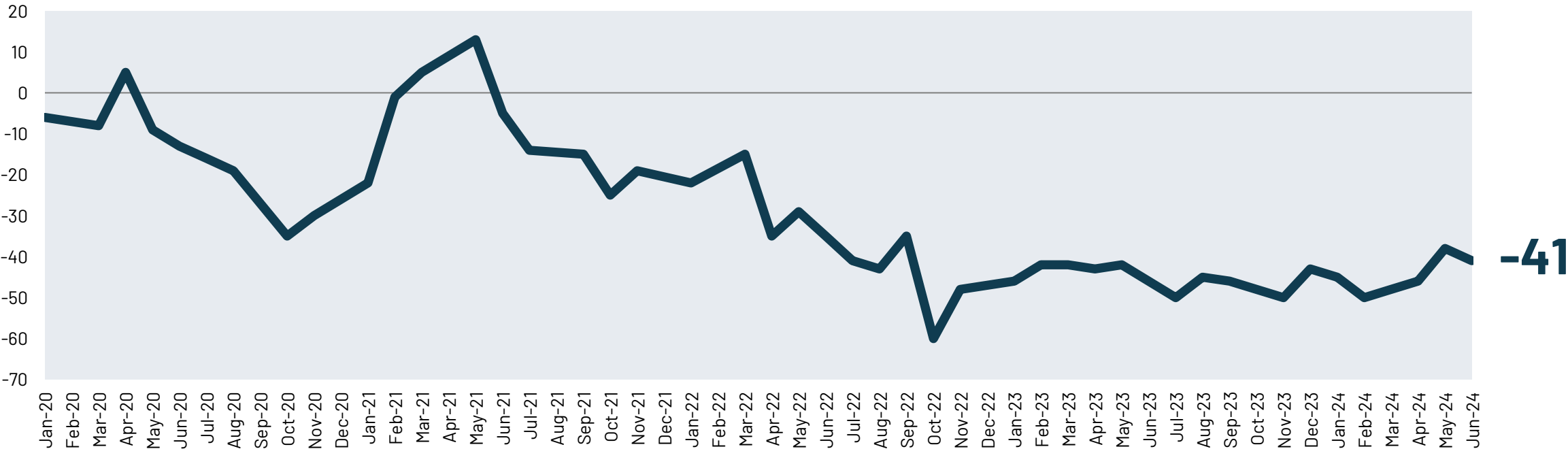
