


Building more affordable homes is selected most often as the highest housing priority.

This list shows a selection of issues associated with housing in Britain. Which one of these, if any, do you think should be the highest priority for the next Government to deal with?





Here is the same list again. Which others, if any, do you think should be priorities for the next Government to deal with?






Conservative and Labour voters have broadly similar priorities.








Two in five people support the Government borrowing money to fund the building of more affordable housing – yet a similar proportion oppose an increase in taxes for the same purpose.


To what extent do you support or oppose the following...

An increase in taxes to fund the building of more affordable housing for people to buy or rent?








Over half of 2019 Labour voters support the Government borrowing money and increasing taxes, to fund the building of more affordable homes.




Almost half of renters support the Government borrowing money to fund the building of more affordable housing.




The different generations have more in common attitudinally than not with Baby Boomers relatively less likely to think housing has been harder for them than their parents' generation.
