


### Britons are more positive about the quality of education in Britain at all levels of the education system, compared to May 2023


In general, to what extent, would say the quality of each of the following in Britain is good or bad?




# The public remain divided towards undergraduate tuition fees – Gen Z are increasingly favourable towards making university free

#### Among all living in England



When thinking about the amount of young people who go to university, in your opinion, is it too many young people, not enough young people, or about the right amount?










An overwhelming majority think that Medicine, Dentistry, Law, Science, and Engineering are worth studying at university
