This ABC News/Ipsos poll was conducted among 2,808 respondents, October 18-22, 2024, via the probability-based Ipsos KnowledgePanel®. Results have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 2 percentage points for the full sample, including design effects due to weighting. Error margins are larger for subgroups. For registered voters, the sample size is 2,392 and the error margin is 2 points. For likely voters, the sample size is 1,913 and the error margin is 2.5 points. Sampling error is not the only cause of differences in polls.

Survey design, management and analysis were provided by Langer Research Associates. Sampling, fieldwork and data processing were provided by Ipsos Public Affairs.

Where noted, trend comparisons are to random-digit-dialed telephone surveys ("CATI mode") by ABC News and The Washington Post or others. Questions were reformatted as of January 2024 given the change to a self-administered online questionnaire. Differences from previous results may reflect mode effects.
