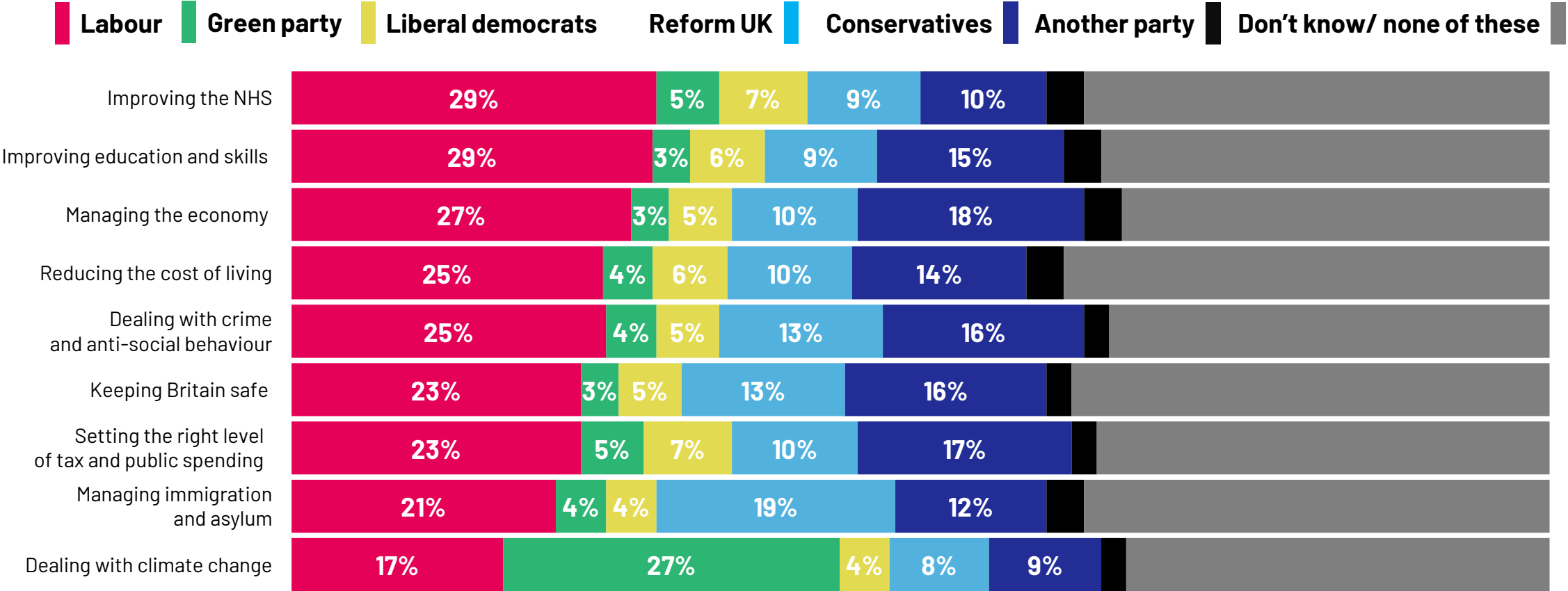

Labour are seen as party with the best policies for most key issues – however a considerable proportion say they either don't know or none of these parties

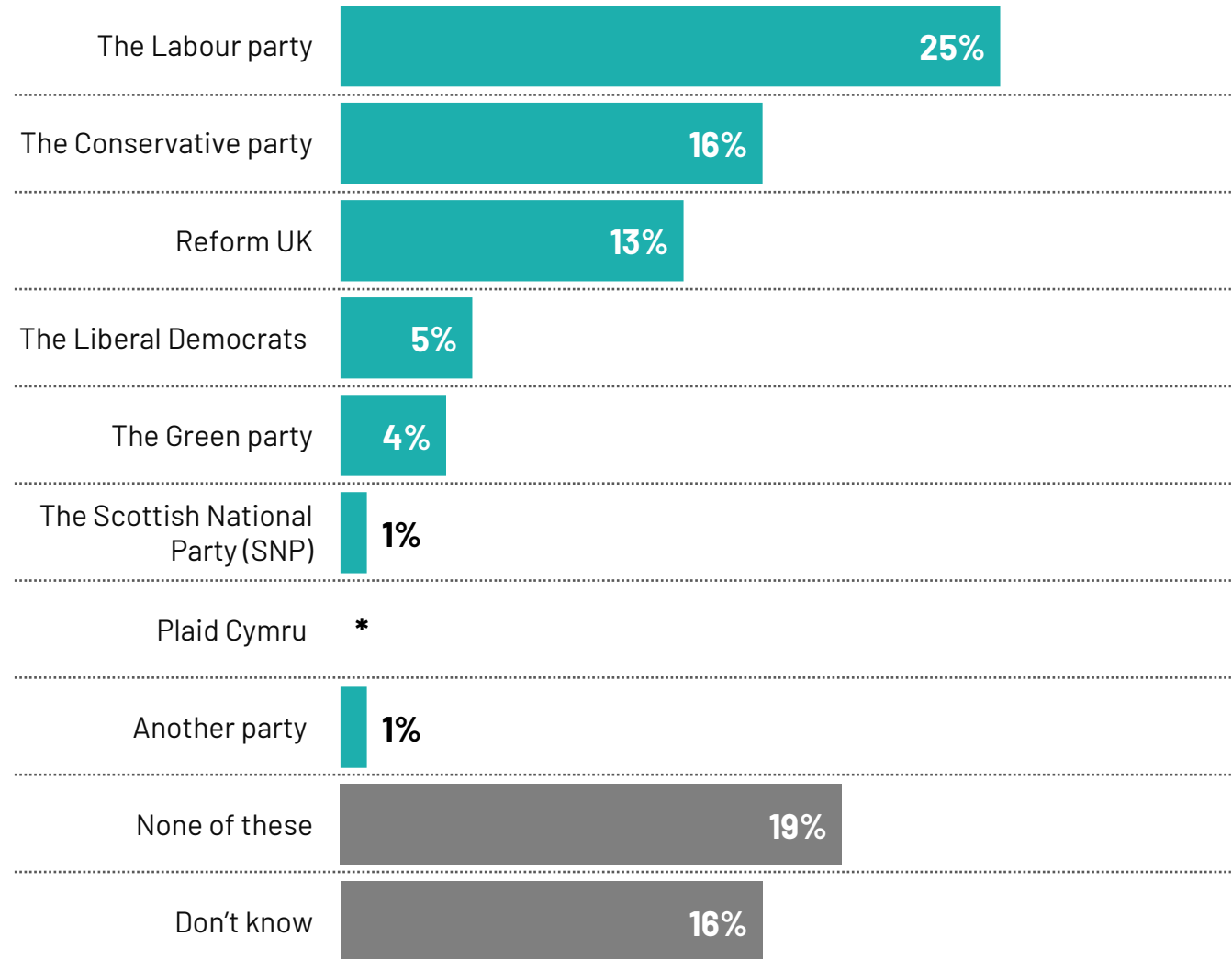
Thinking about the following issues, which party, if any, do you think has the best policies to address them?

A quarter think Labour has the best policies for dealing with Crime and anti-social behaviour

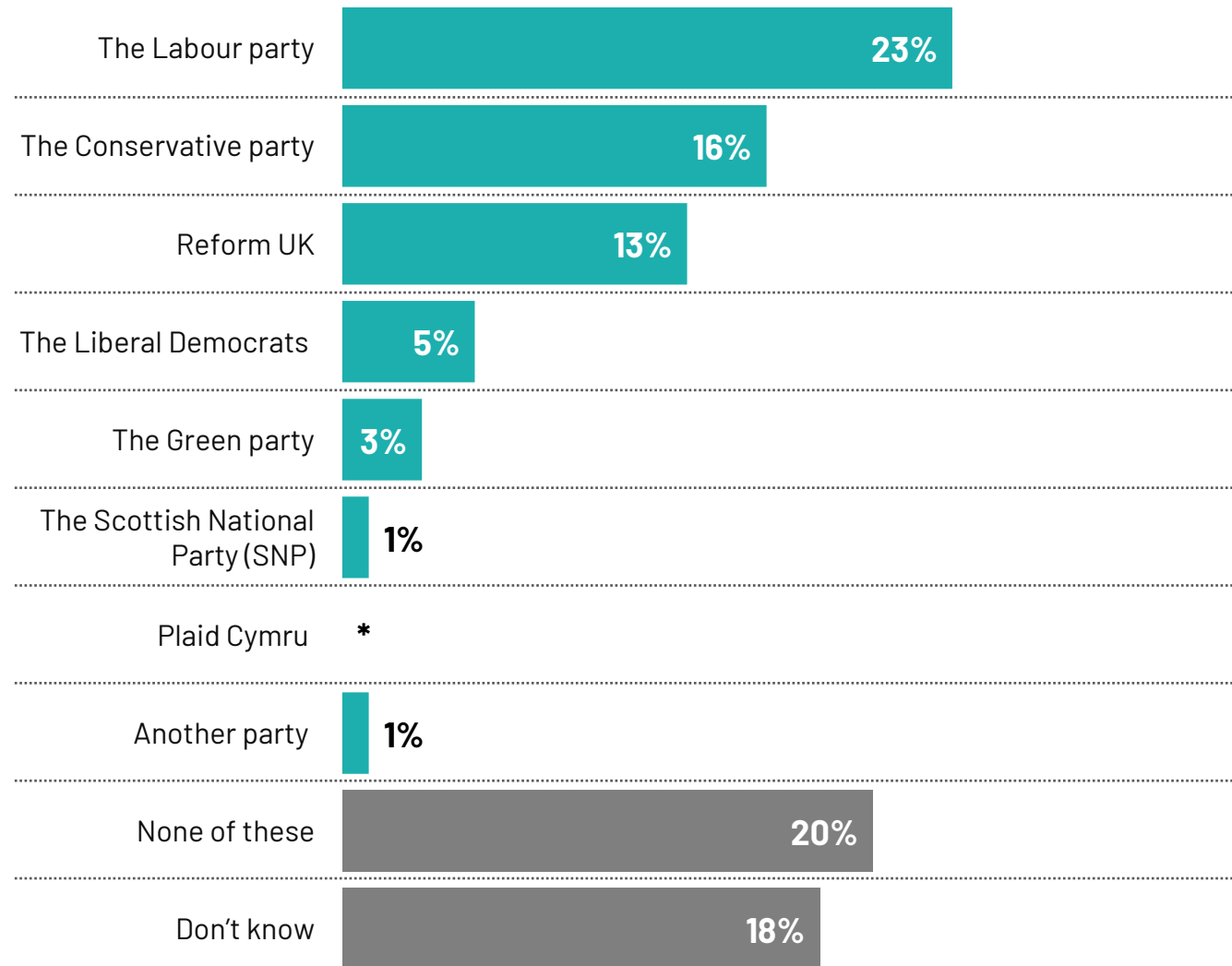
Thinking about the following issues, which party, if either, do you think has the best policies to address them?

Under a quarter think Labour has the best policies for keeping Britain safe

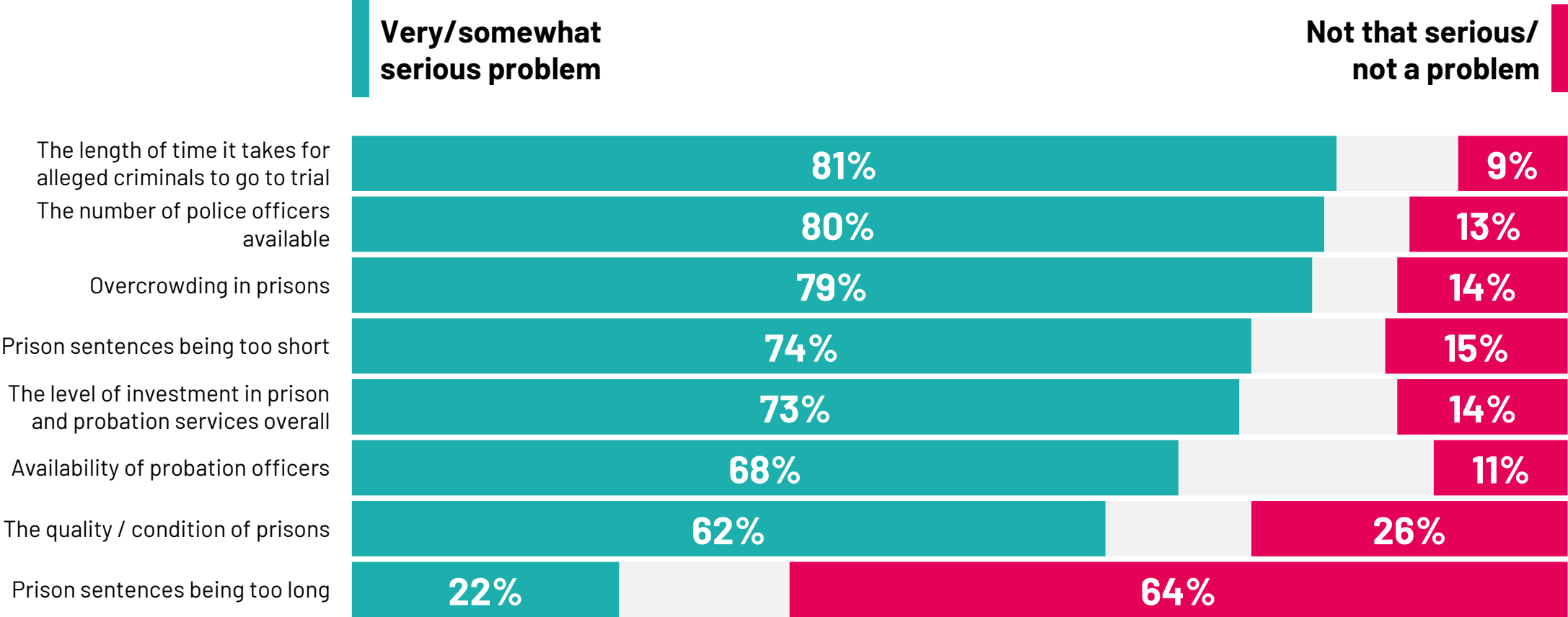
Thinking about the following issues, which party, if either, do you think has the best policies to address them?

To what extent, if at all, do you think each of the below are a serious or not serious problem with respect to criminal justice in Britain?



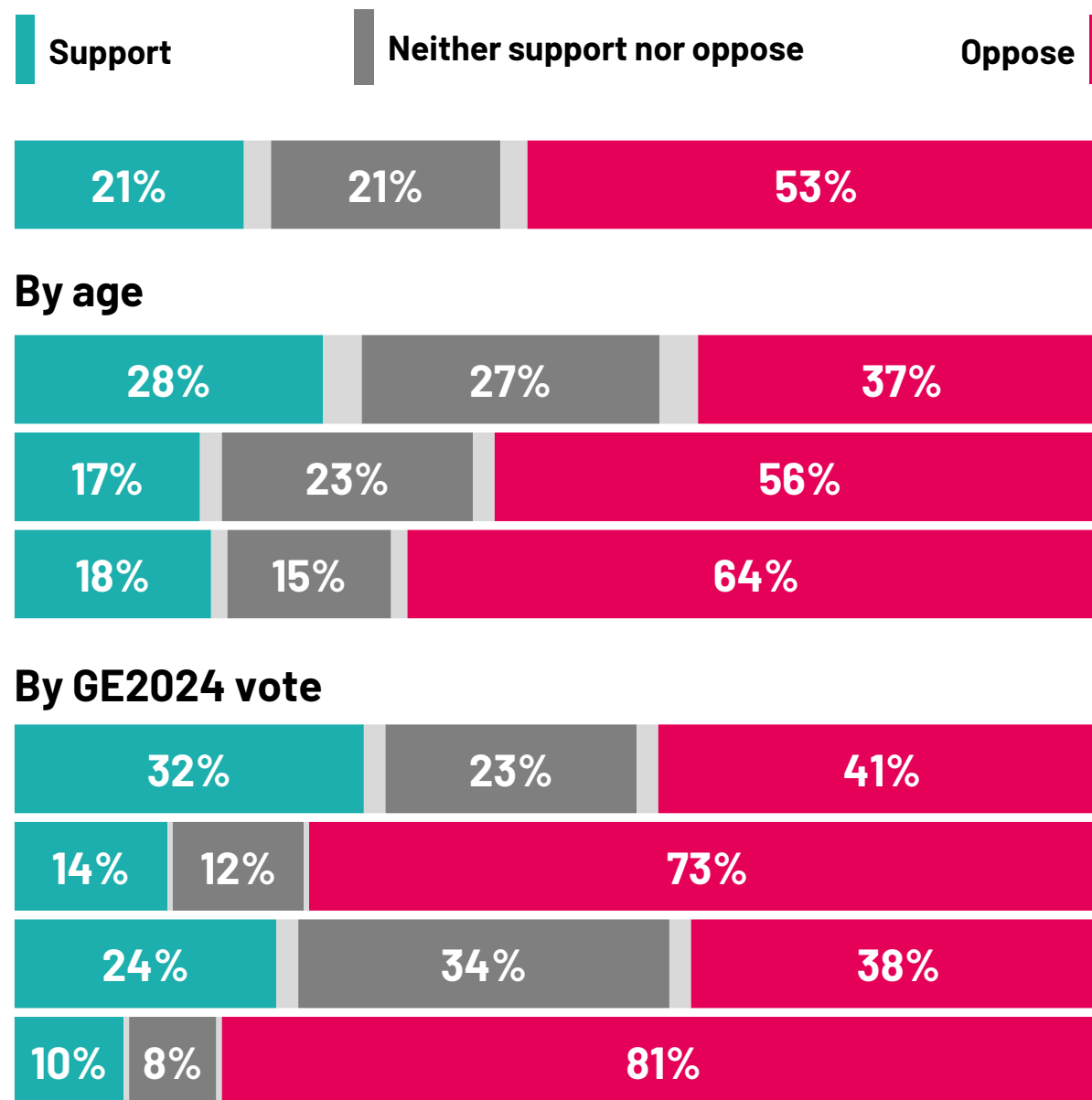

As you may know, this summer, Labour announced a plan to release certain prisoners early as a response to overcrowding in prisons.

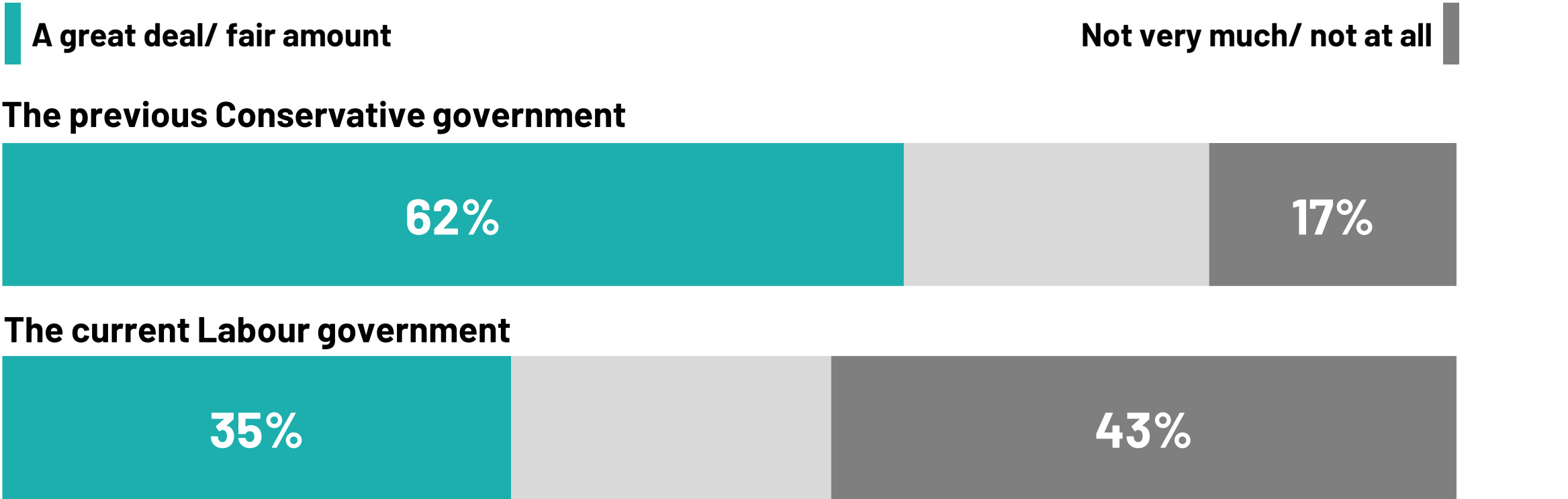
To what extent do you support or oppose this initiative?

The public are more likely to think the previous Conservative government is responsible for the current overcrowding in prisons

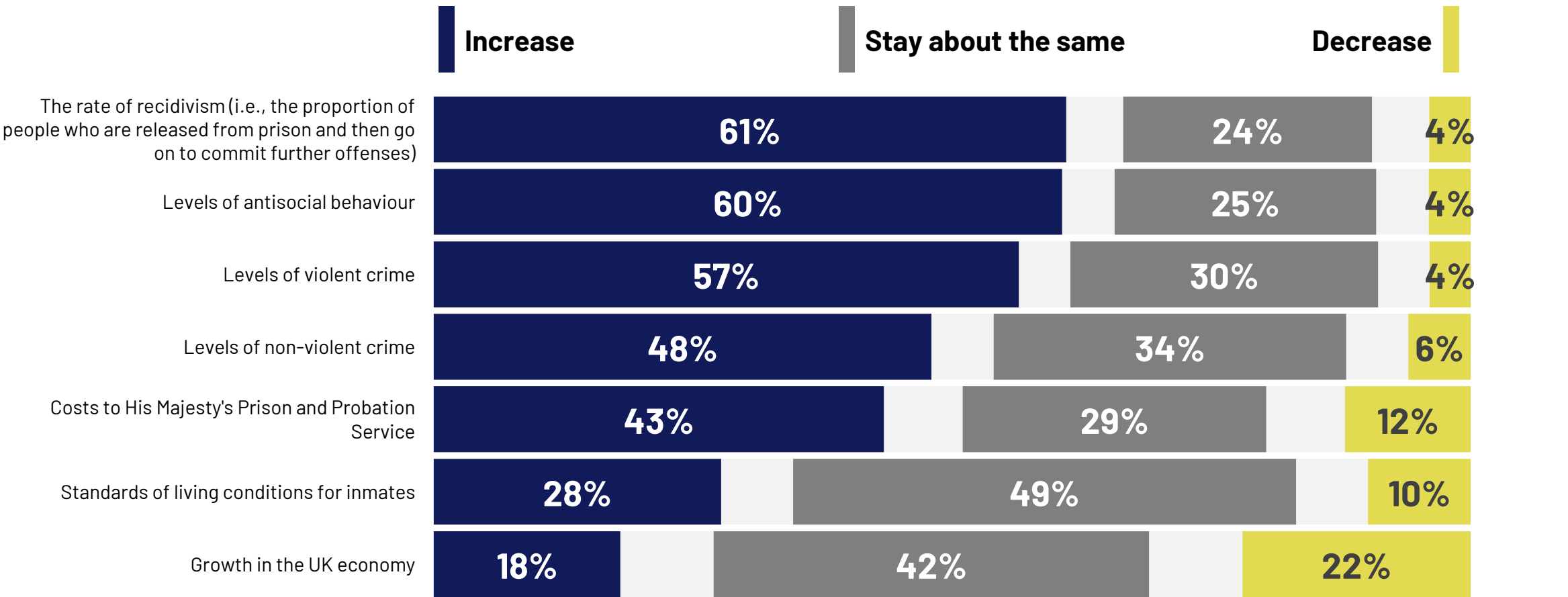
To what extent, if at all, do you think each of the following is responsible for the current overcrowding in prisons within England and Wales?
