


Both the public and those that have a child in the household, think 11-12 years old is the most acceptable age for a child to be given a smartphone






A quarter say they have given a smartphone to their child(ren) aged 11-12 years old, however a similar proportion have never given their child a smartphone

What's the youngest age you personally have given a smartphone to your child(ren) for their own personal use?








# 7 in 10 support asking students to deposit their phones into a basket during class

To what extent would you support or oppose schools implementing each of the following smartphone related policies?









## Most of those with a child in their household have not considered doing any of the below measures regarding their own child(ren)

Which of the following things have you done or would you consider doing regarding your child(ren) bringing smartphones to school?








55 per cent of those with a child in their household report that their child(ren)'s schools have not implemented a smartphone ban
