Key findings



Disinformation worry high

Just over 3 in 4 (76% on average across 30 countries) say some person, organization, or country deliberately spreading disinformation to influence public opinion is a real threat in the world today. The threat was added to the poll this year as it has emerged as a hot topic during one of the biggest global election years in history.



Canada retains top spot

Almost 8 in 10 (79%) say Canada is the country/organization most likely to have a positive influence on world affairs over the next decade, once again topping our list. Meanwhile, Iran remains in the bottom spot, with 25% saying it will have a positive influence.



World War III fear drops

Fear about a world conflict involving superpowers similar to World Wars I and II over the next 25 years has dropped in 29 out of 30 countries year-over-year. As the full-scale invasion of Ukraine nears the three-year mark and with the Hamas-Israel conflict in its second year, 63% (-seven percentage points versus 2023) expect a worldwide conflict between now and 2074.



Hacking concern remains

Being hacked for fraudulent or espionage purposes ties disinformation as the No. 1 threat in 2024, with 76% also saying hacking is a real concern. Hacking has consistently been seen as a leading threat over the past decade and fear about hacking rose in 19 out of 30 countries this year.



Sweating natural disasters

Over the past decade, on average across 20 countries*, concern about one issue has grown the most: natural disasters. Fires, floods and heatwaves have become the norm and thus it's no surprise the proportion of people who think a major natural disaster in their country is a threat now sits at 69% in 2024 versus 58% in 2015.



Hope amid pessimism

The proportion of people who think more things are getting better than worse these days is down nine points, on average across 20 countries*, since we first started asking this question in 2017. On the other hand, a new question shows there's some hope with a majority in all 30 countries saying democracy, human rights and the rule of law are universal values that all nations deserve and can aspire to.








Attitudes about the state of the world over time*














Confidence in Government Response: Terrorist Attack








Confidence in Government Response: Personal Safety














Willingness to Engage in World Affairs (Global Average)




Willingness to Engage in World Affairs Over Time*






World Influencers: My Country






World Influencers: The International Monetary Fund (IMF)






World Influencers: United States




U.S. President Role in World Security












Role of the U.S. as democratic leader

METHODOLOGY

These are the results of a 30-country survey conducted by Ipsos on its Global Advisor online platform and, in India, on its IndiaBus platform, between Friday, September 20 and Friday, October 4, 2024. For this survey, Ipsos interviewed a total of 22,989 adults aged 18 years and older in India, 18-74 in Canada, Malaysia, South Africa, Türkiye, and the United States, 20-74 in Thailand, 21-74 in Indonesia and Singapore, and 16-74 in all other countries.

The sample consists of approximately 1,000 individuals each in Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Spain, and the U.S., and 500 individuals each in Argentina, Belgium, Chile, Colombia, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Israel, Malaysia, Mexico, the Netherlands, Peru, Poland, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Thailand, and Türkiye. The sample in India consists of approximately 2,000 individuals, of whom approximately 1,800 were interviewed face-to-face and 200 were interviewed online.

Samples in Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Hungary, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Poland, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, and the U.S. can be considered representative of their general adult populations under the age of 75.

Samples in Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Indonesia, Israel, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Singapore, South Africa, Thailand, and Türkiye are more urban, more educated, and/or more affluent than the general population. The survey results for these countries should be viewed as reflecting the views of the more "connected" segment of their population.

India's sample represents a large subset of its urban population — social economic classes A, B and C in metros and tier 1-3 town classes across all four zones.

The data is weighted so that the composition of each country's sample best reflects the demographic profile of the adult population according to the most recent census data. "The 30-country average" reflects the average result for all the countries and markets in

which the survey was conducted. It has not been adjusted to the population size of each country or market and is not intended to suggest a total result.

When percentages do not sum up to 100 or the 'difference' appears to be +/-1 percentage point more/less than the actual result, this may be due to rounding, multiple responses, or the exclusion of "don't know" or not stated responses.

The precision of Ipsos online polls is calculated using a credibility interval with a poll where N=1,000 being accurate to +/- 3.5 percentage points and of where N=500 being accurate to +/- 5.0 percentage points.
