

MDVIP/Ipsos Primary Care Physicians Survey 2024

These are some of the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted between October 9-25th, 2024, on behalf of MDVIP. For this survey, a sample of roughly 401 primary care physicians age 35+ were interviewed online in English in the United States.

In questions that permit multiple responses, columns may total substantially more than 100%, depending on the number of different responses offered by each respondent.
