Nearly 4 in 5 Britons are concerned about the possibility of having to wait on a trolley in a corridor at A&E


How concerned, if at all, are you about each of the following?

2 in 5 of those concerned about capacity at their local A&E say they are less likely to seek emergency care if they needed it, with an equal share saying their concern about A&E capacity has no impact on whether or not they would seek such care

You mentioned you were concerned about capacity at your local A&E. Does this concern make you more or less likely to seek emergency care if you needed it, or does it have no impact?




