


Almost half of the public think Keir Starmer has been doing a bad job as Prime Minister


To what extent, would you say Keir Starmer has been doing a good job or bad job as Prime Minister, or neither?





Almost half of Britons think the current Labour Government is doing badly at running the country. This figure is up considerably from when Labour assumed office and is comparable to Boris Johnson's Government


Would you say that the current Labour Government, led by Prime Minister Keir Starmer, is doing well or badly at running the country, or do you not have an opinion?

To what extent, if either, are you pleased or disappointed by what the Labour party have done in Government so far?






Older age groups are more likely to say they are disappointed by what Labour have done in Government, compared to younger Brits

Two in five think that the Labour Government will change Britain for the worse – only 27% think for the better

Do you think that the Labour Government will change Britain for the better, for the worse, or not make any difference?






On balance, younger Brits are slightly more likely to say Labour will change Britain for the better than worse.

However, half of 55-75s think Labour will change Britain for the worse

To what extent, if at all, do you think Rachel Reeves has been doing a good job or a bad job, in her role as Chancellor of the Exchequer?






