































Political parties: Net favourability

























Keir Starmer continues to lead Kemi Badenoch when the public are asked to consider who would make a better Prime Minister


Which of the following, if either, do you think would make a better Prime Minister?





Keir Starmer continues to lead Nigel Farage when the public are asked who would make the better Prime Minister




Which party, if any, do you trust most to deliver on each of the following issues?
