Three in ten think that Keir Starmer is doing a good job as Prime Minister – up slightly from last month

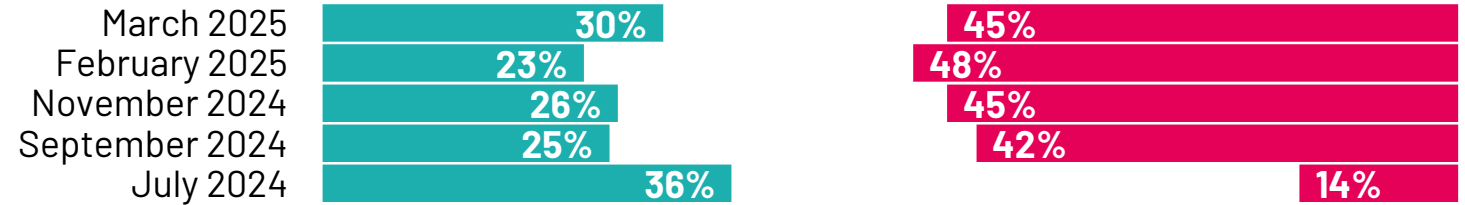
To what extent, would you say Keir Starmer has been doing a good job or bad job as Prime Minister, or neither?

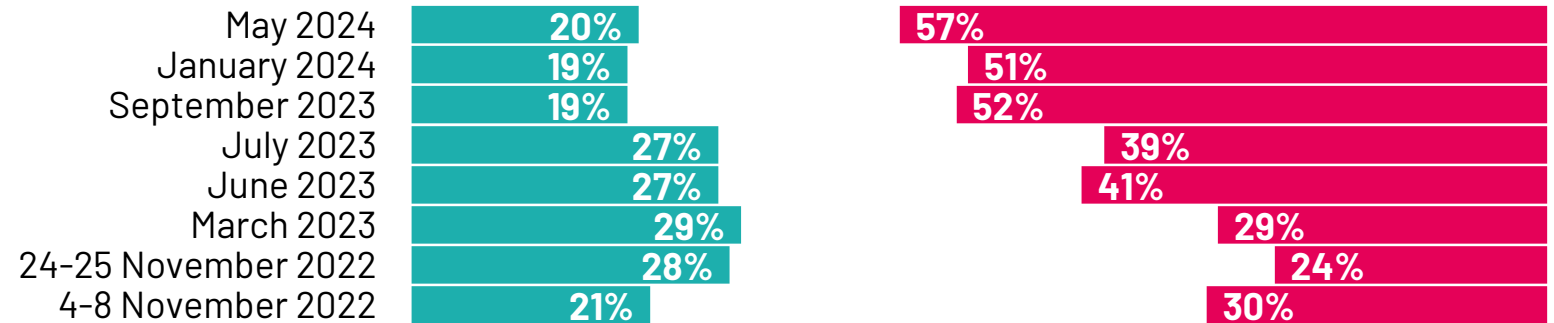

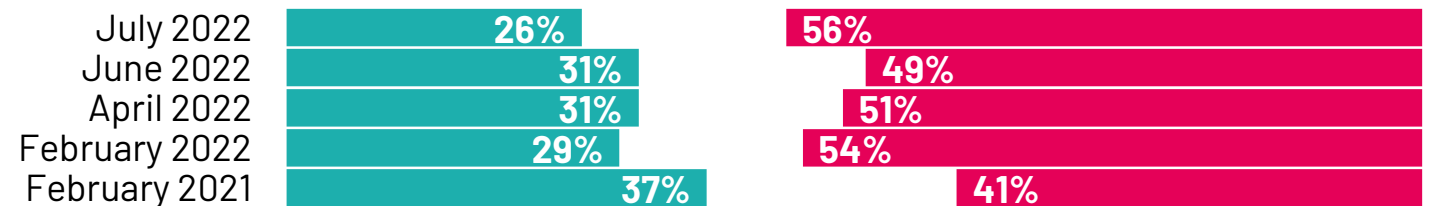

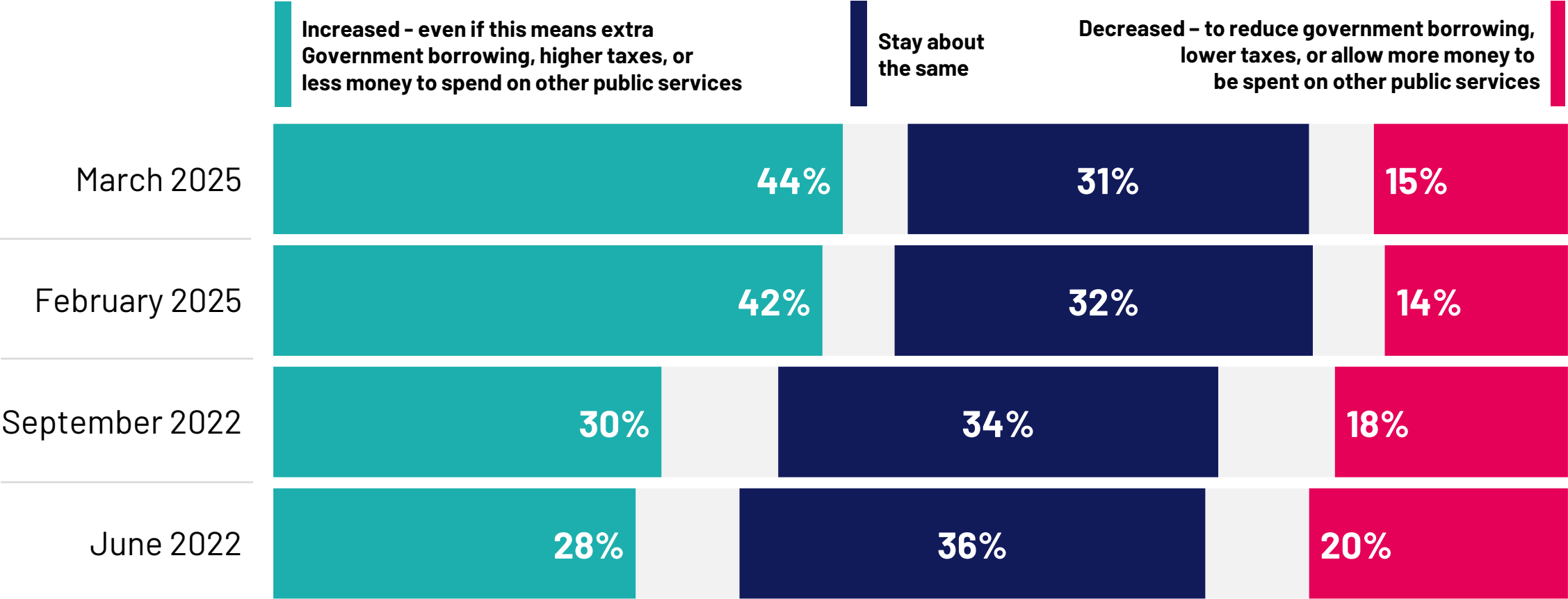

Over two in five Britons continue to think government spending on defence and the Armed Forces should be increased – even if it means extra borrowing, higher taxes, or less money for public services

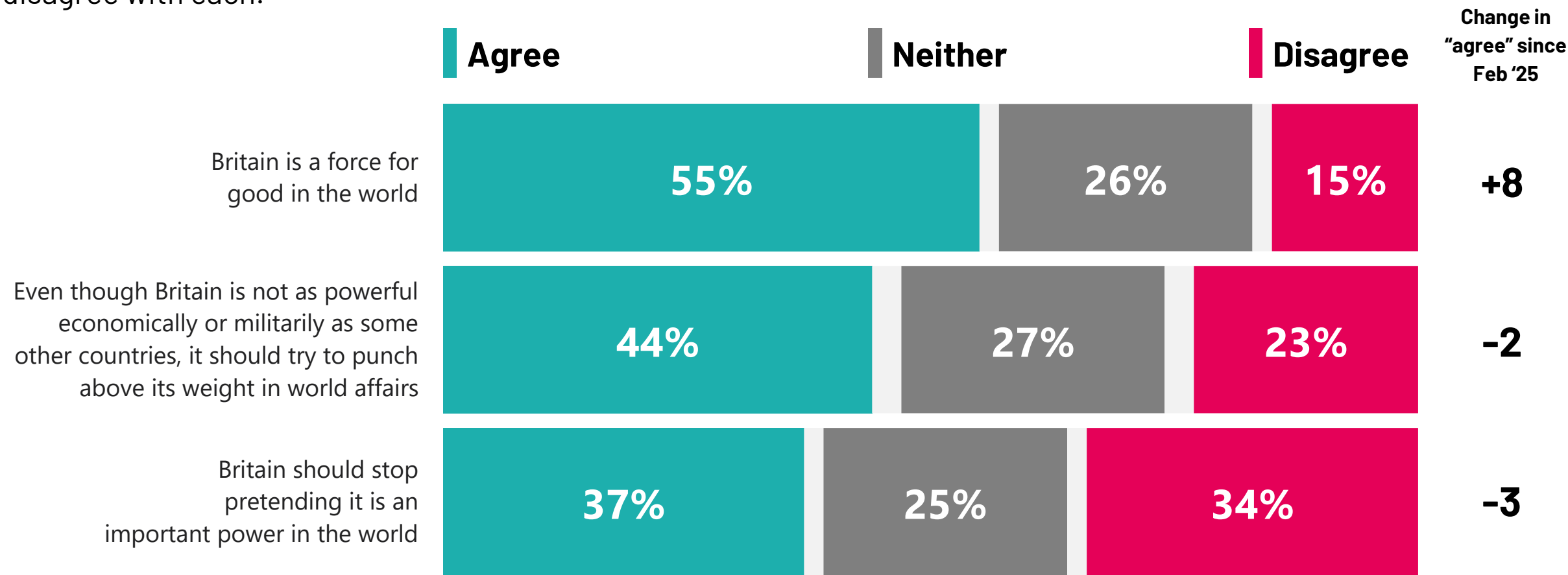
Do you think government spending on defence and the Armed Forces in the UK should be...?

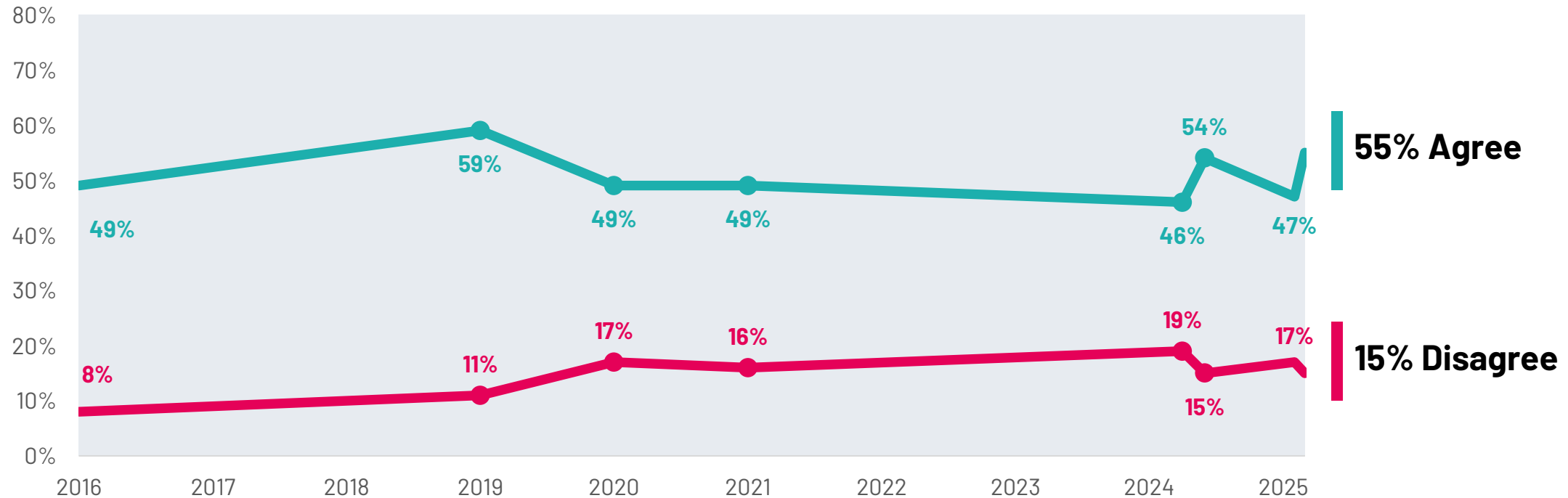

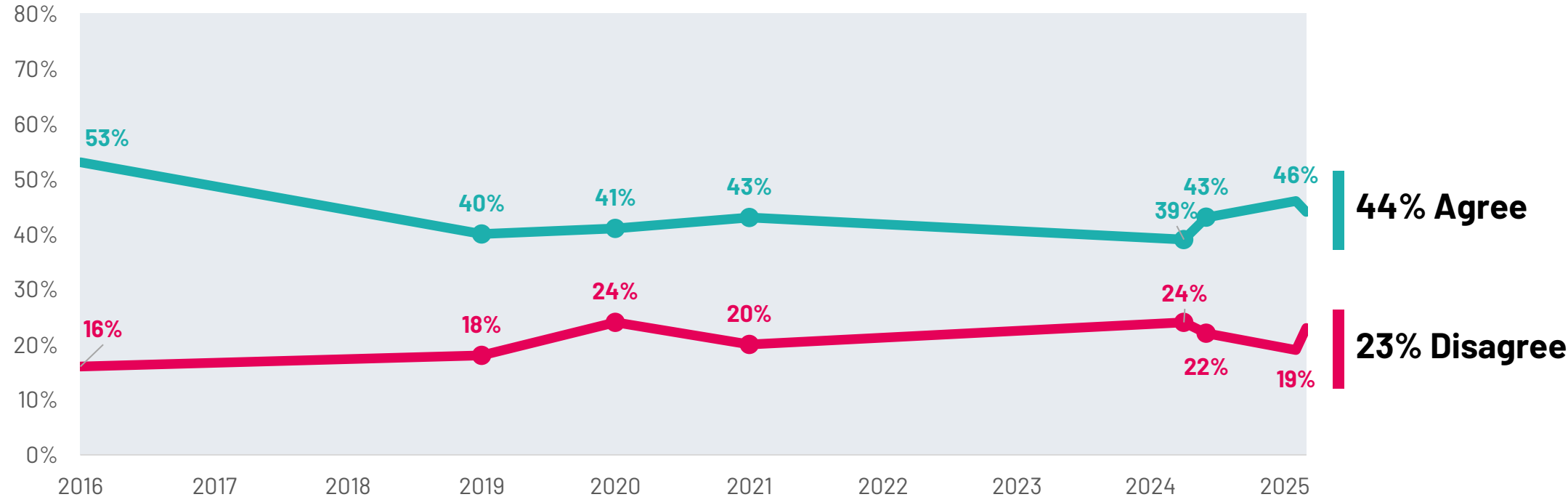

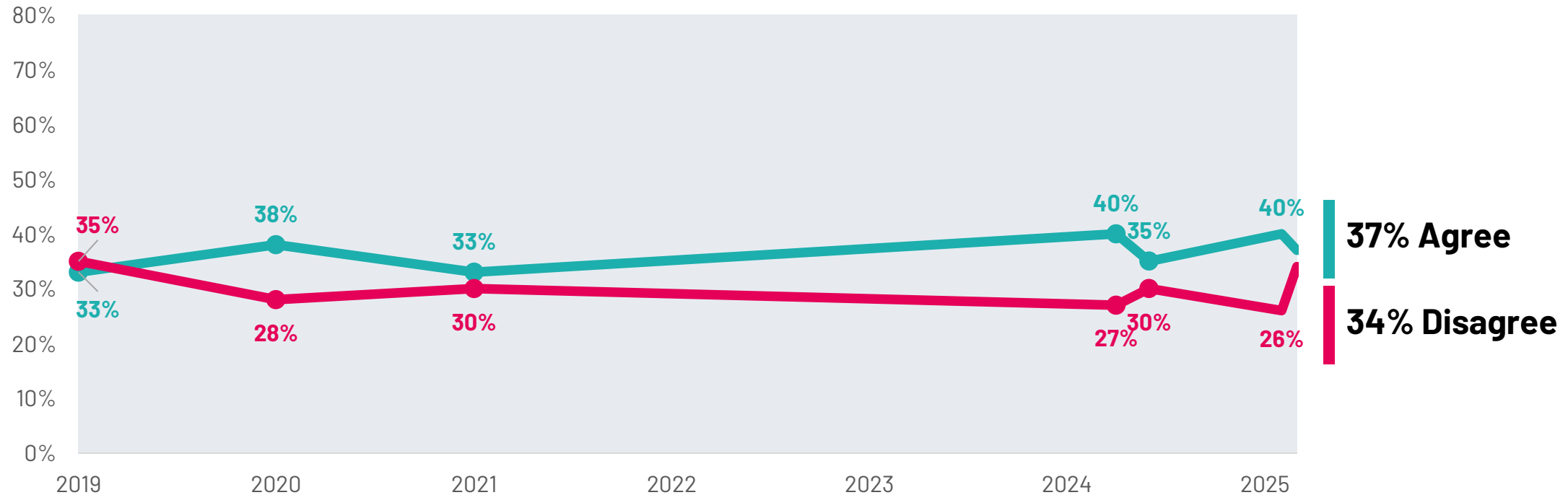

Just over half of Britons think that other countries take the UK seriously on the world stage

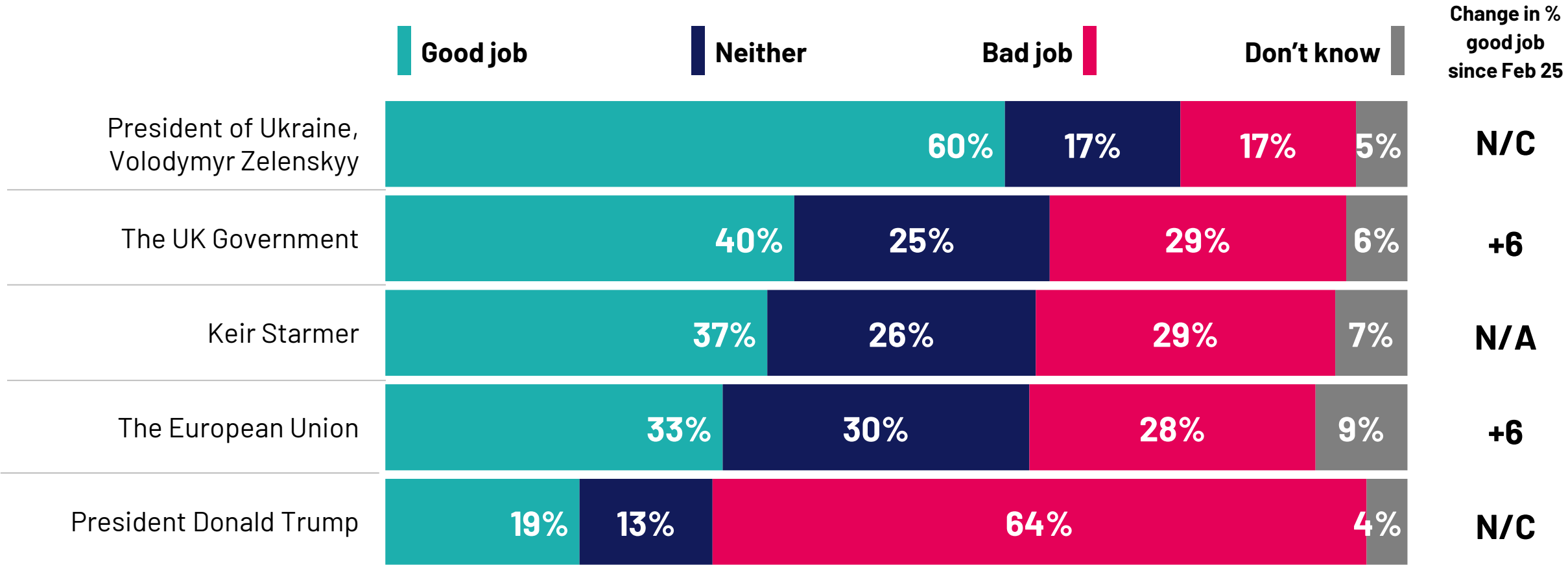
Generally speaking, how seriously, if at all, do you think other countries take what the UK has to say on the world stage?

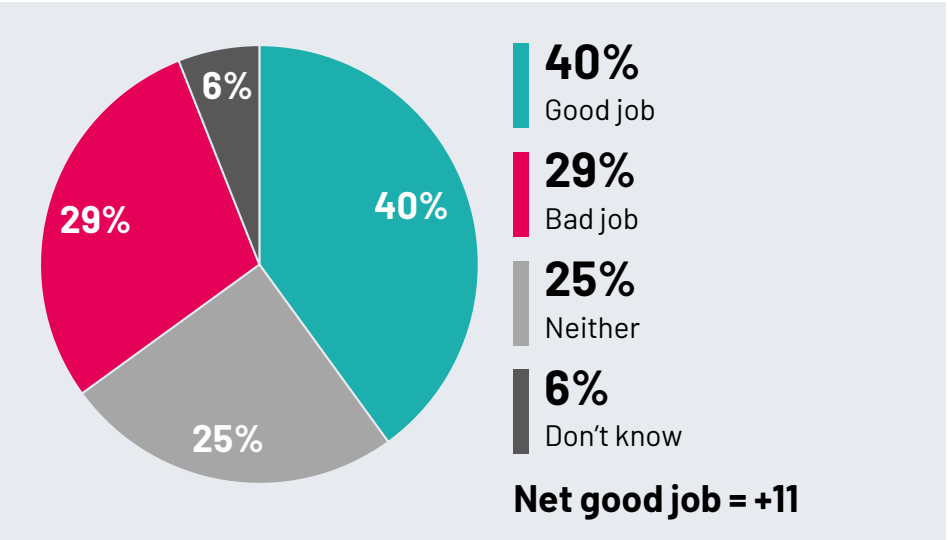

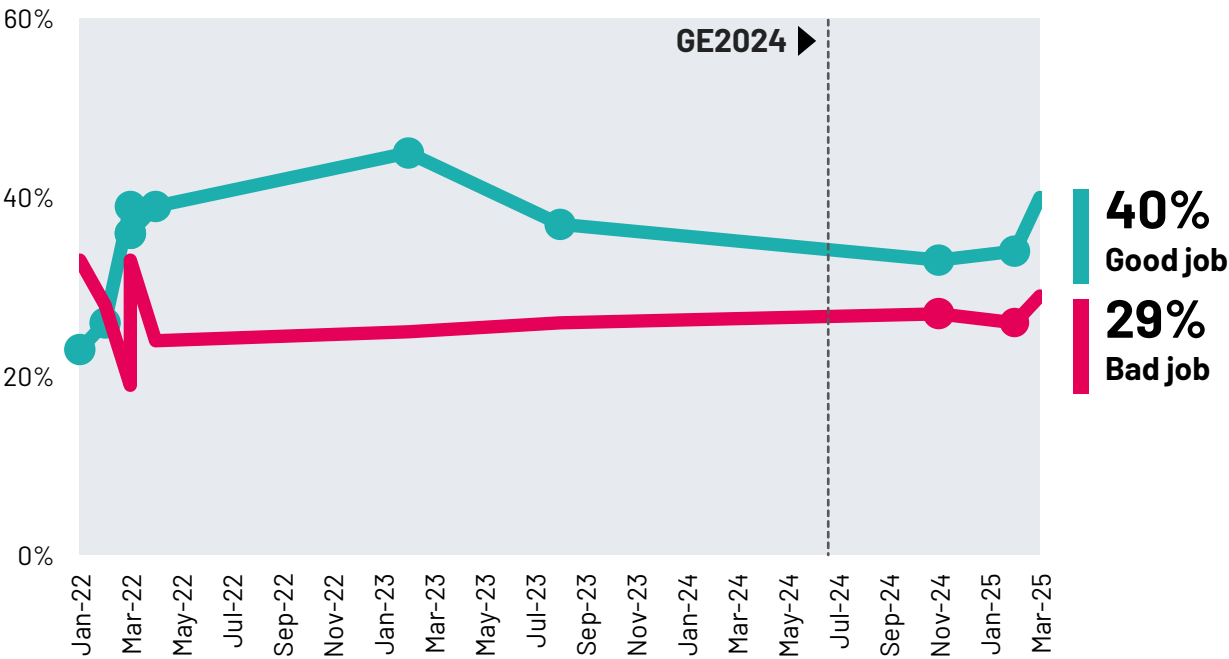

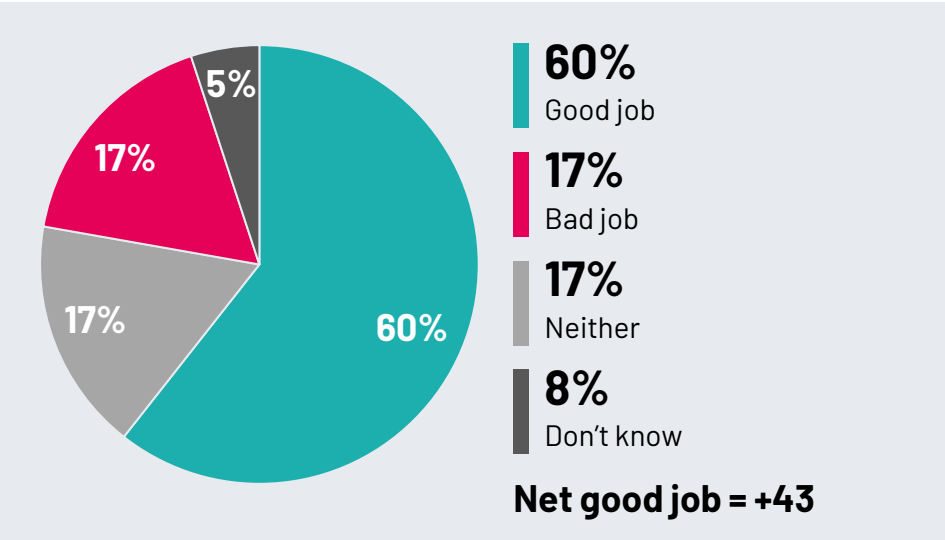

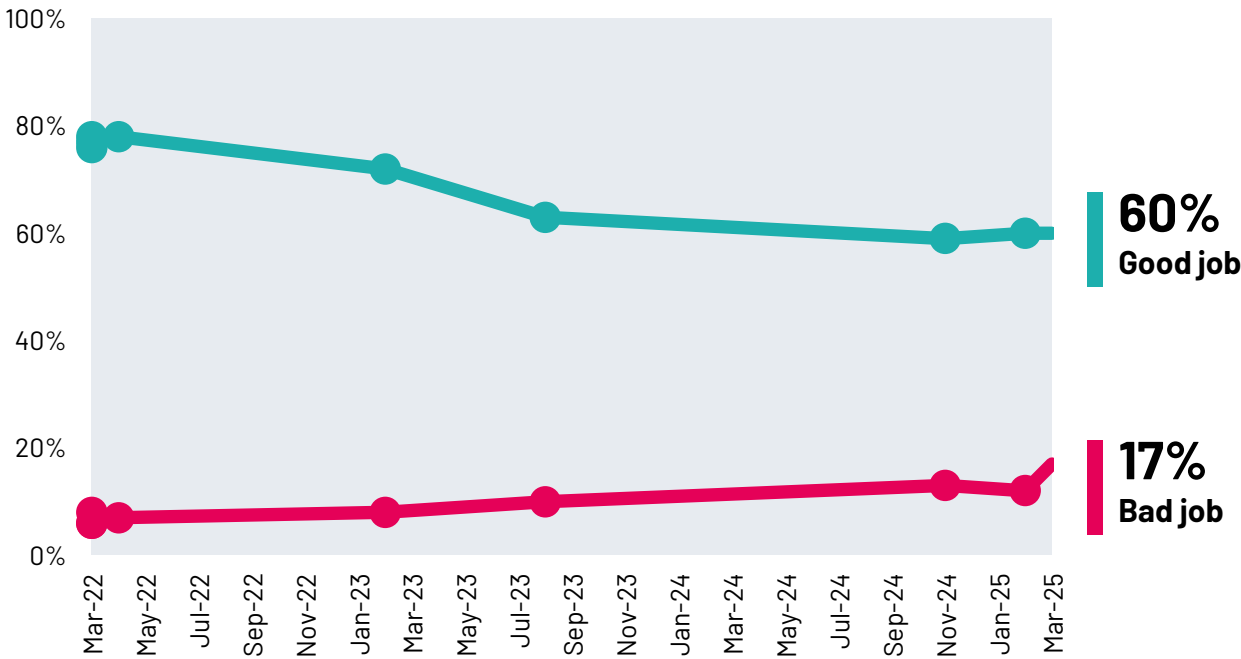

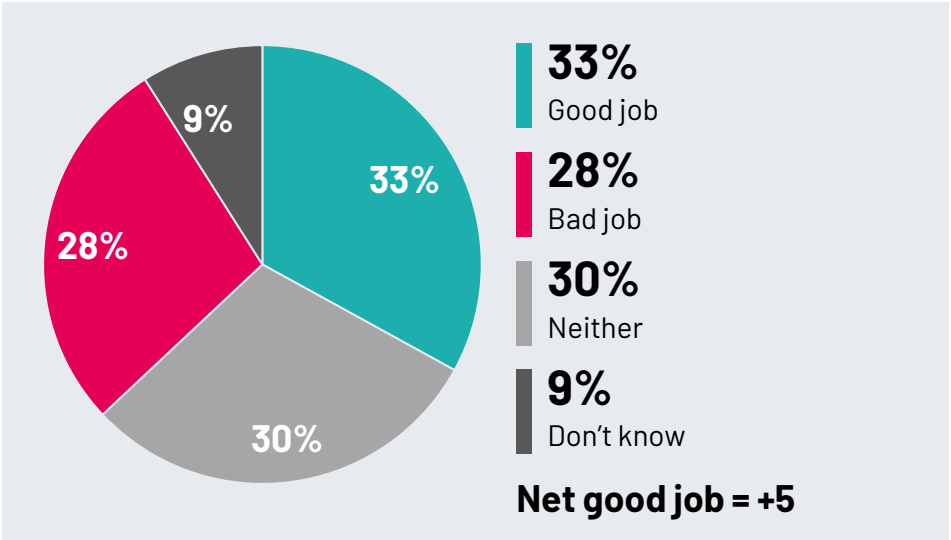

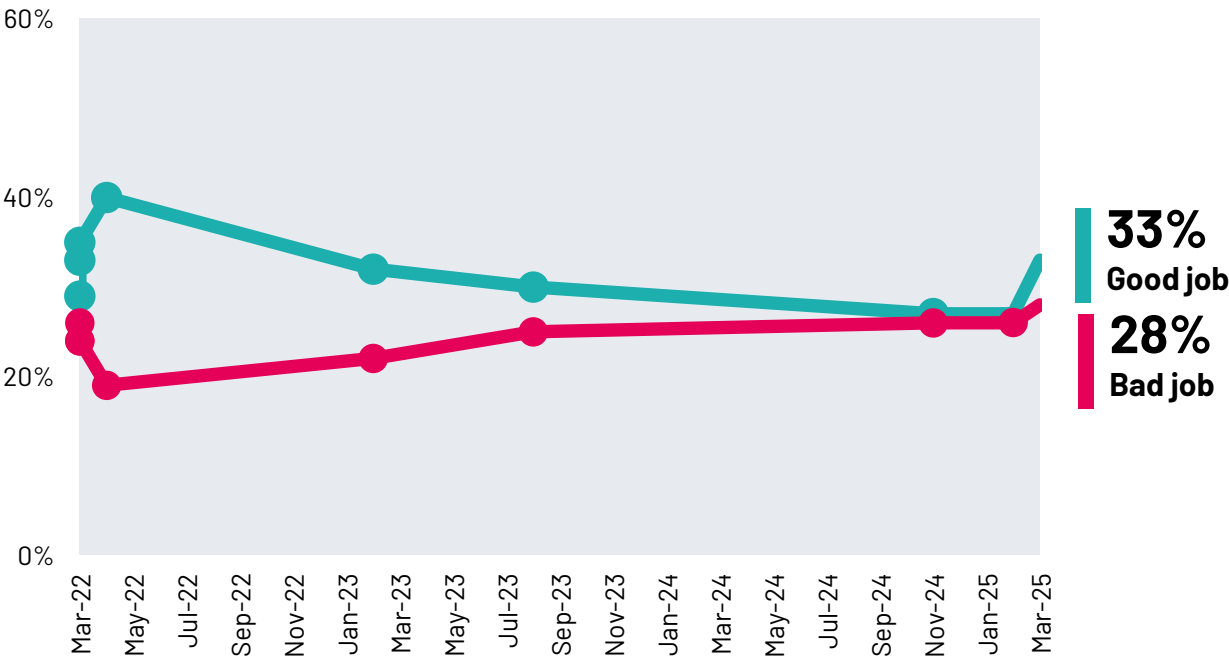

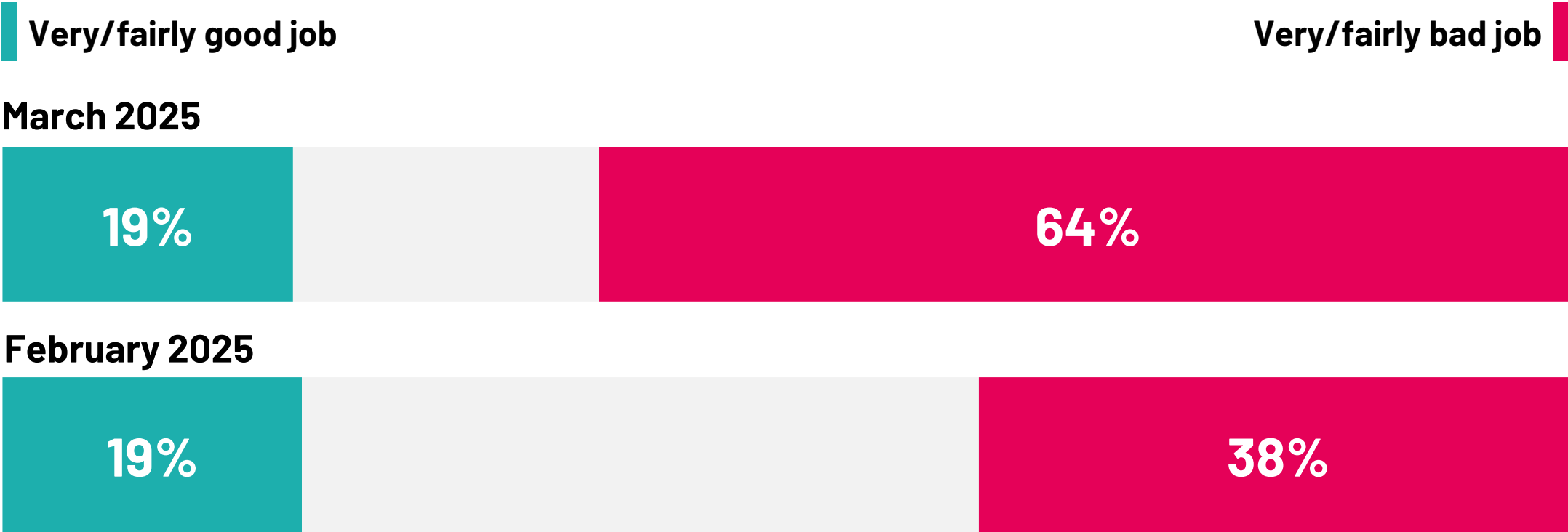

Britons have become sharply more critical of President Trump’s handling of the situation in Ukraine since last month

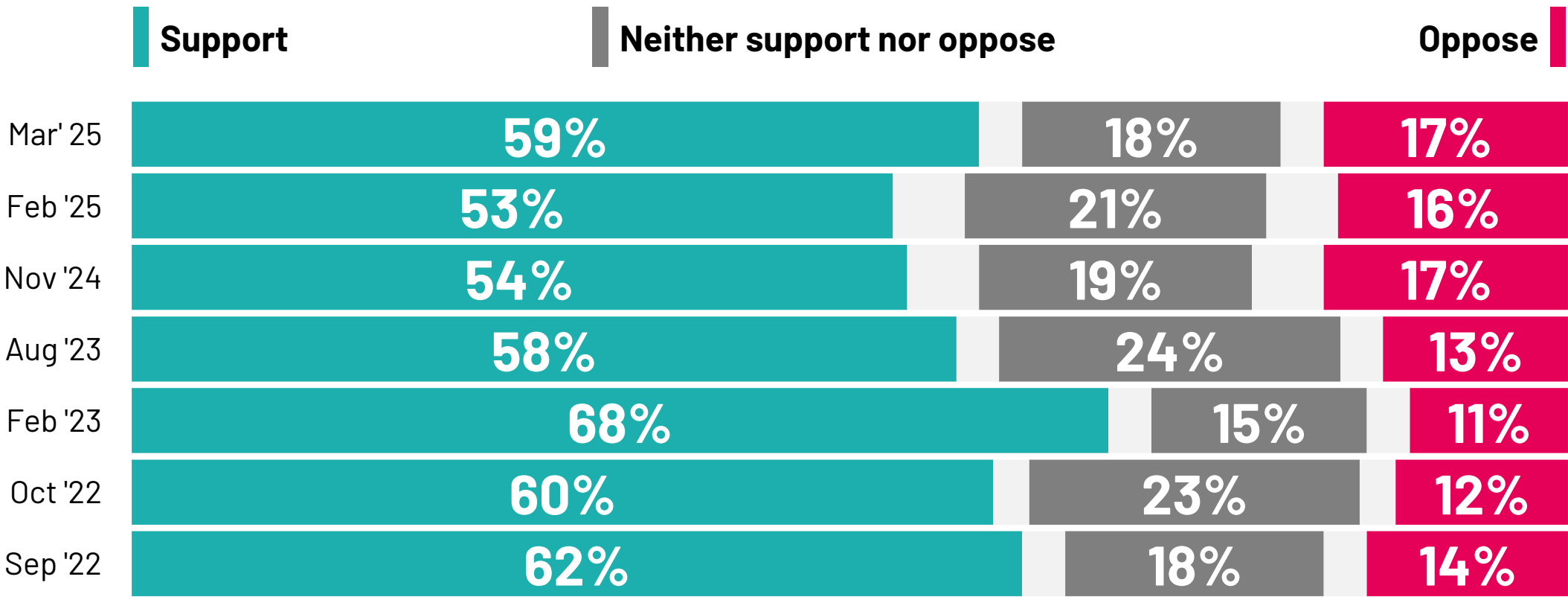
To what extent, if at all, do you think each of the following has done a good or bad job handling the Russian invasion of Ukraine? President Donald Trump

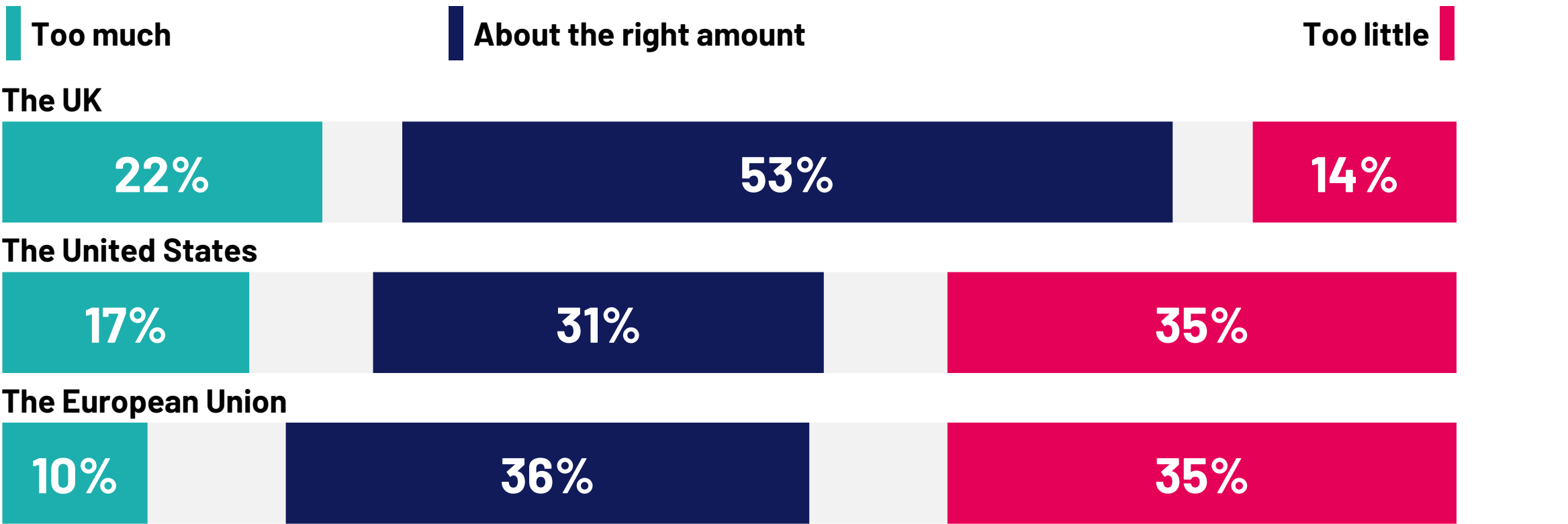

Half of Britons think the UK has provided the right about of support to Ukraine – 1 in 3 think the US and EU have not provided enough

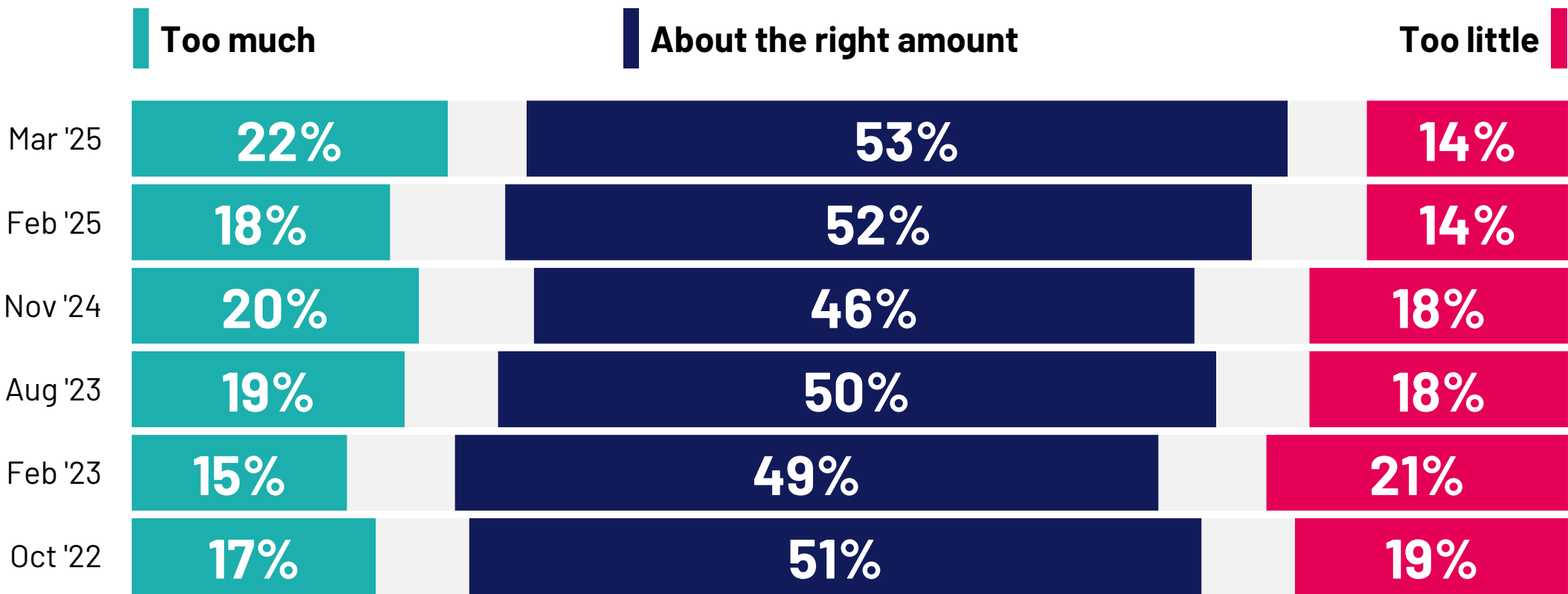
And taking everything into account, do you think the UK has provided too much, too little, or about the right amount of support to Ukraine?

Just over half of Britons continue to think that the UK has provided about the right amount of support to Ukraine

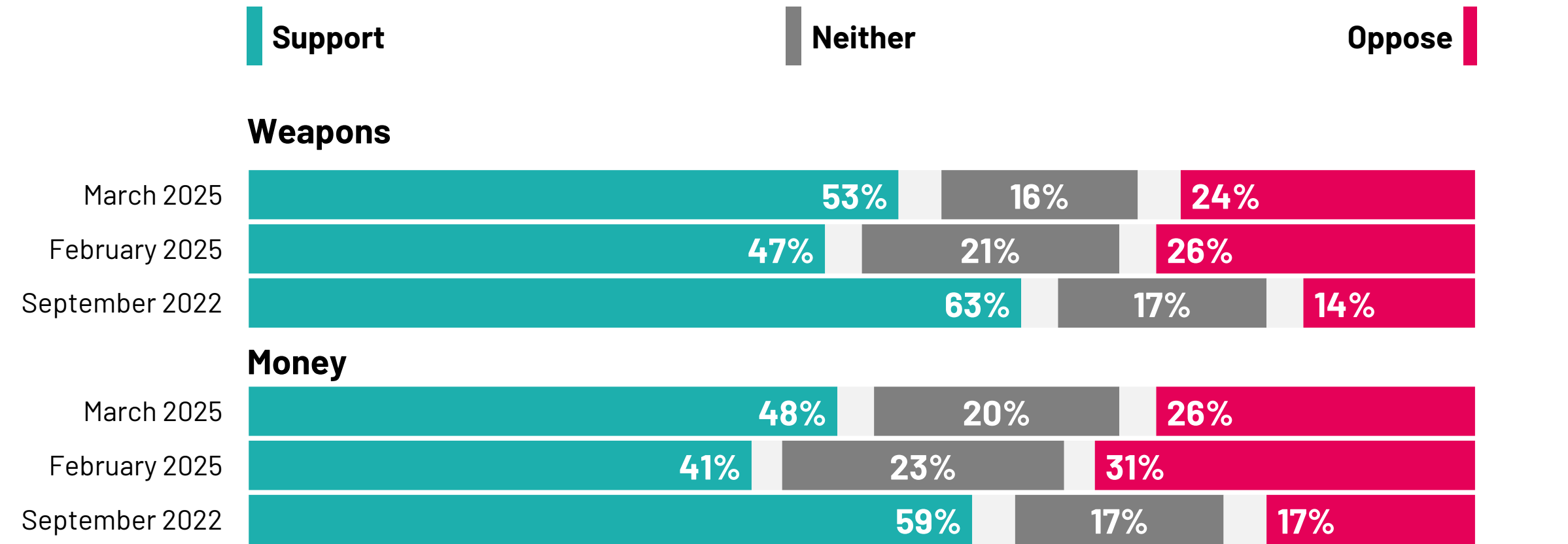

Around half of the public support Britain sending weapons and money to Ukraine, slightly up from last month.

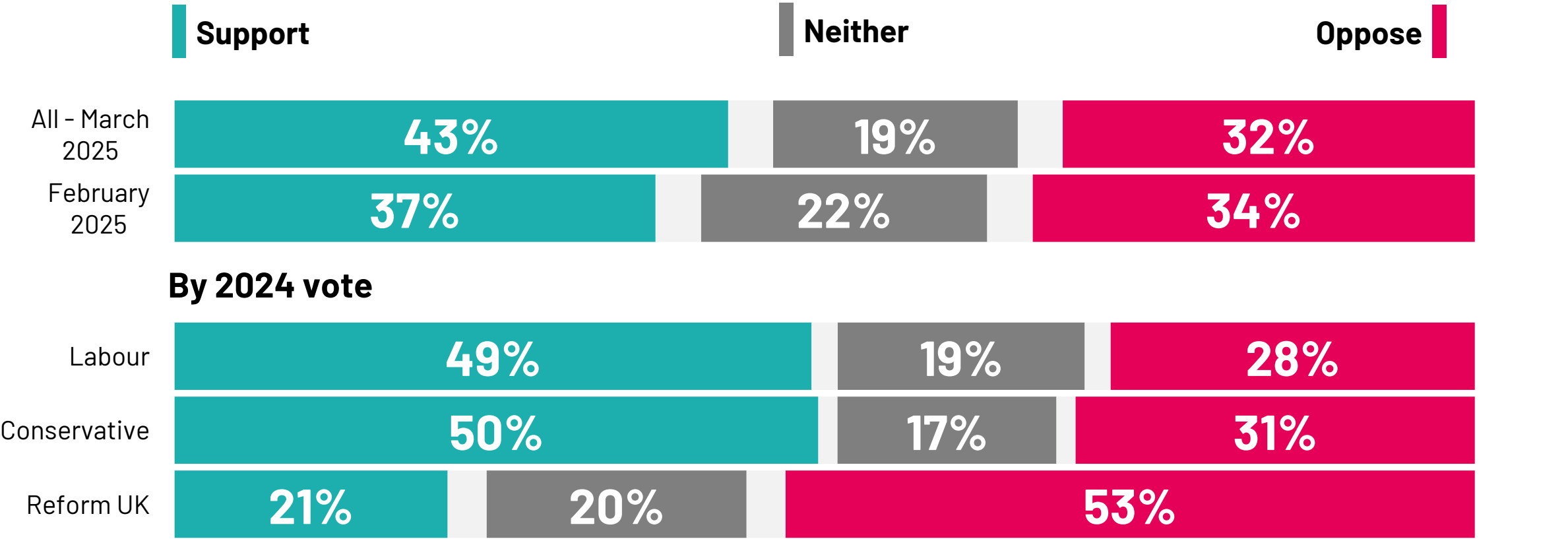
To what extent, if at all, do you support or oppose Britain sending ... to help Ukraine in their fight against Russia?
