


# Indonesians have a higher level of happiness than the global average and other developed countries in Asia.

### Taking all things together, would you say you are very happy and rather happy? (% Agree)







More than half of Indonesians are optimistic that life will be better, and it is also higher than the global average.

#### I think my life will be much better in five years than it is now (% Agree)








### Feeling loved and appreciated is very important for Indonesians.
