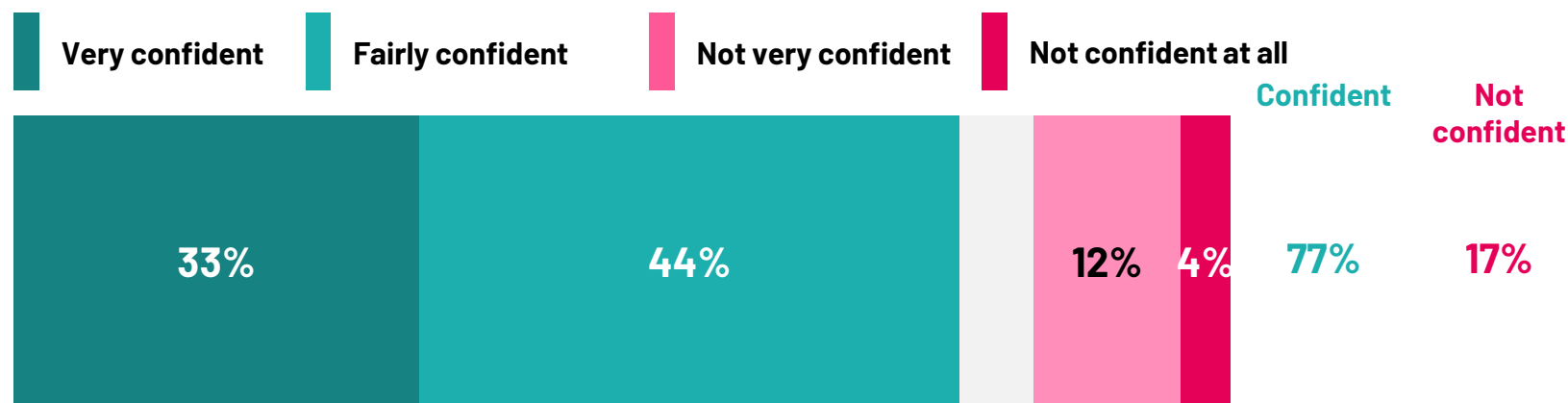

The majority of the British public feel confident that they understand the difference between refugees and other immigrants

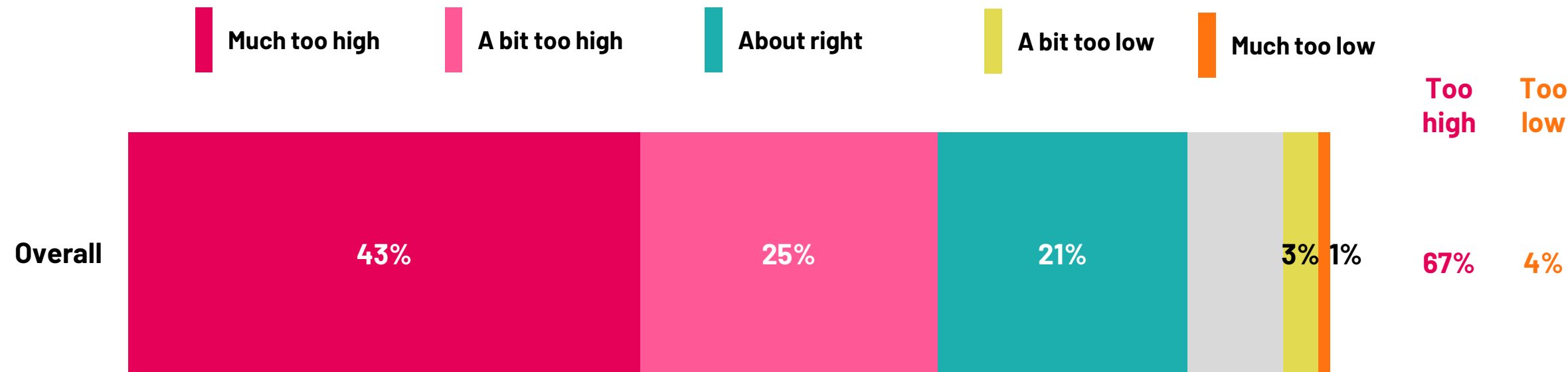
Q1. How confident are you that you understand the difference between refugees and other immigrants?

Most think that the total number of people coming into the UK is too high

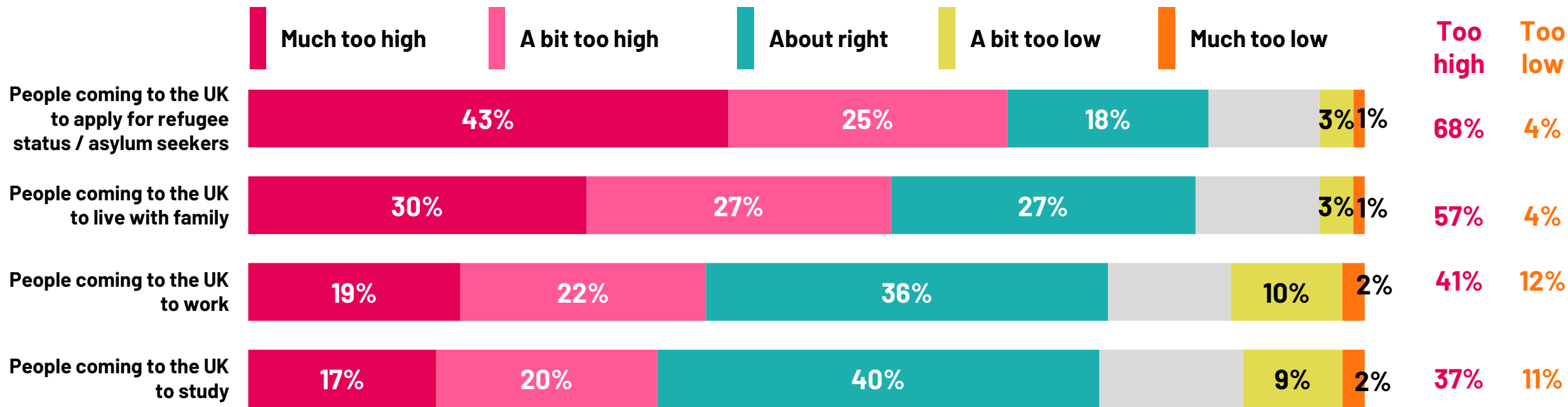
Q2A. Do you think the total number of people coming into the UK is too high, too low or about right?

The public are most likely to think that the number of people coming to the UK to apply for refugee status is too high and a majority think the same about those coming to live with family

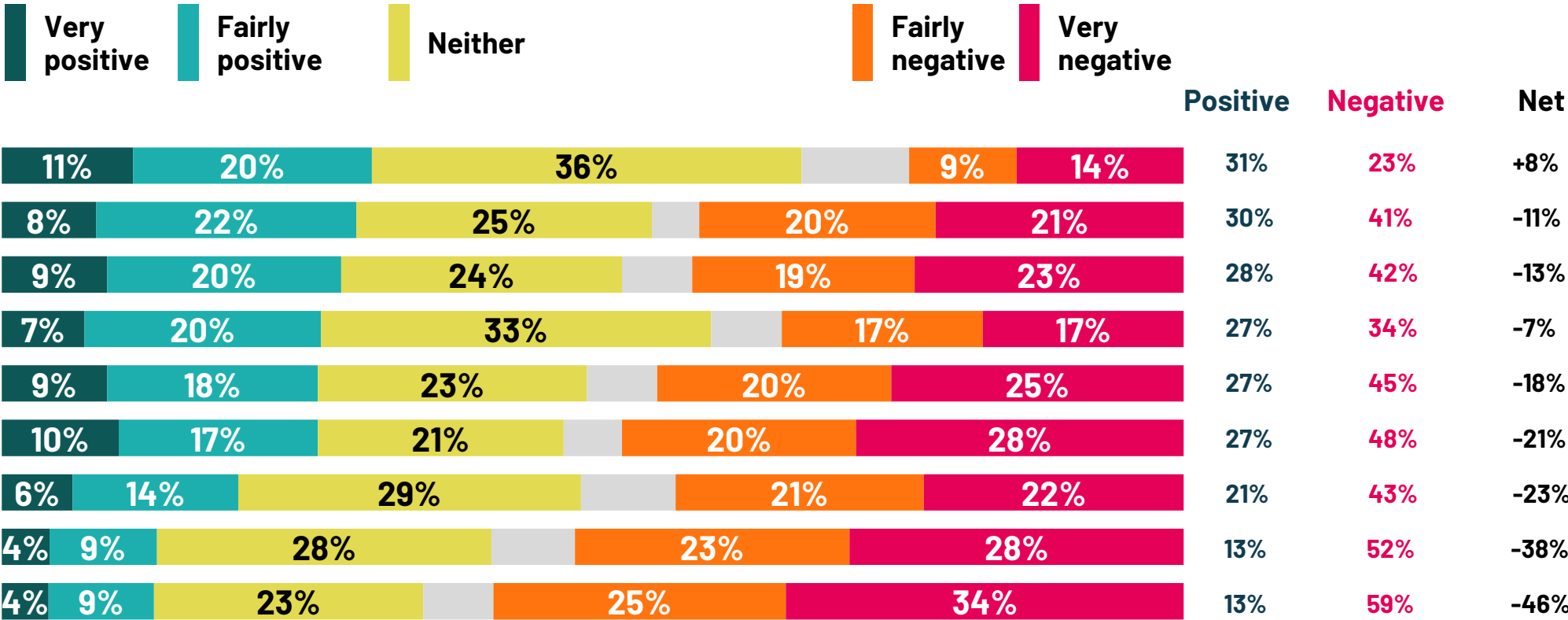
Q2B. Do you think the number of [...] is too high, too low or about right?

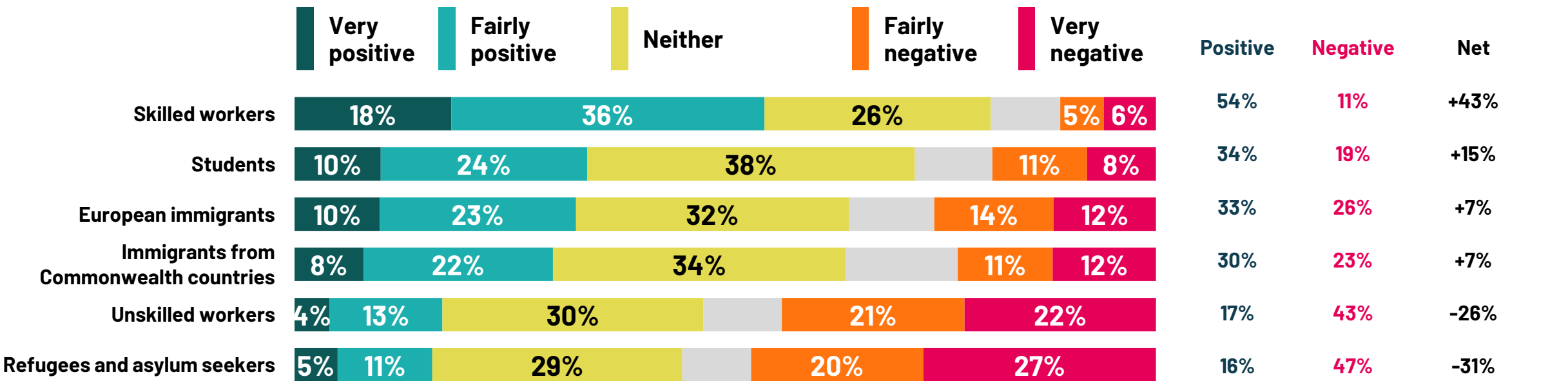
Britons are most likely to think immigrants in the UK have a positive impact on culture and arts and a negative impact on housing and crime

Q5. On balance, do you think each of the following groups of immigrants have a positive or negative impact, if either, on your local community?

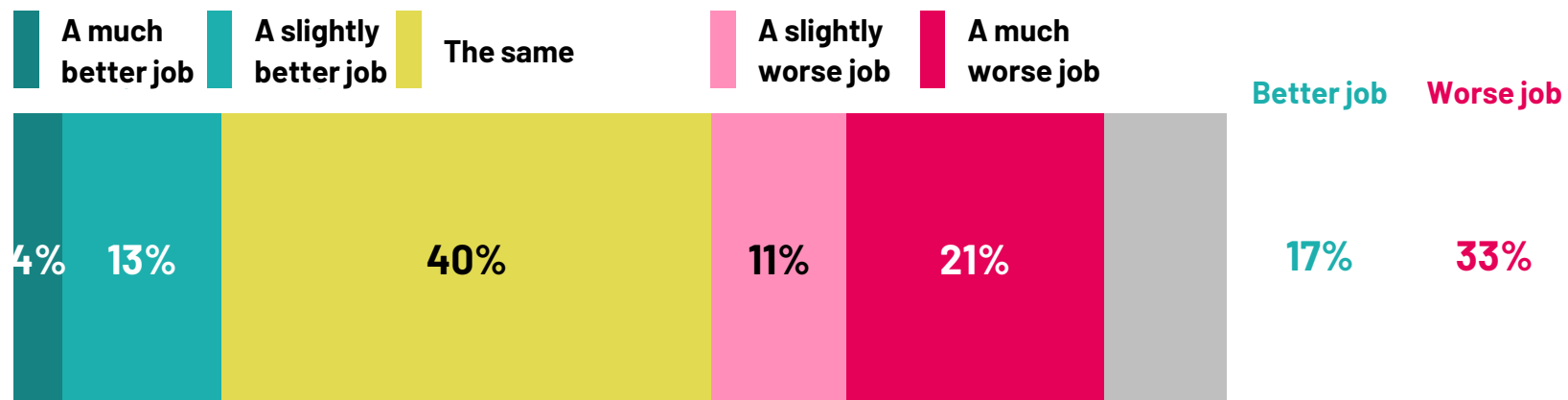

Two-fifths think the Labour government is doing about the same at managing immigration as the previous Conservative government, while a third say it is doing a worse job

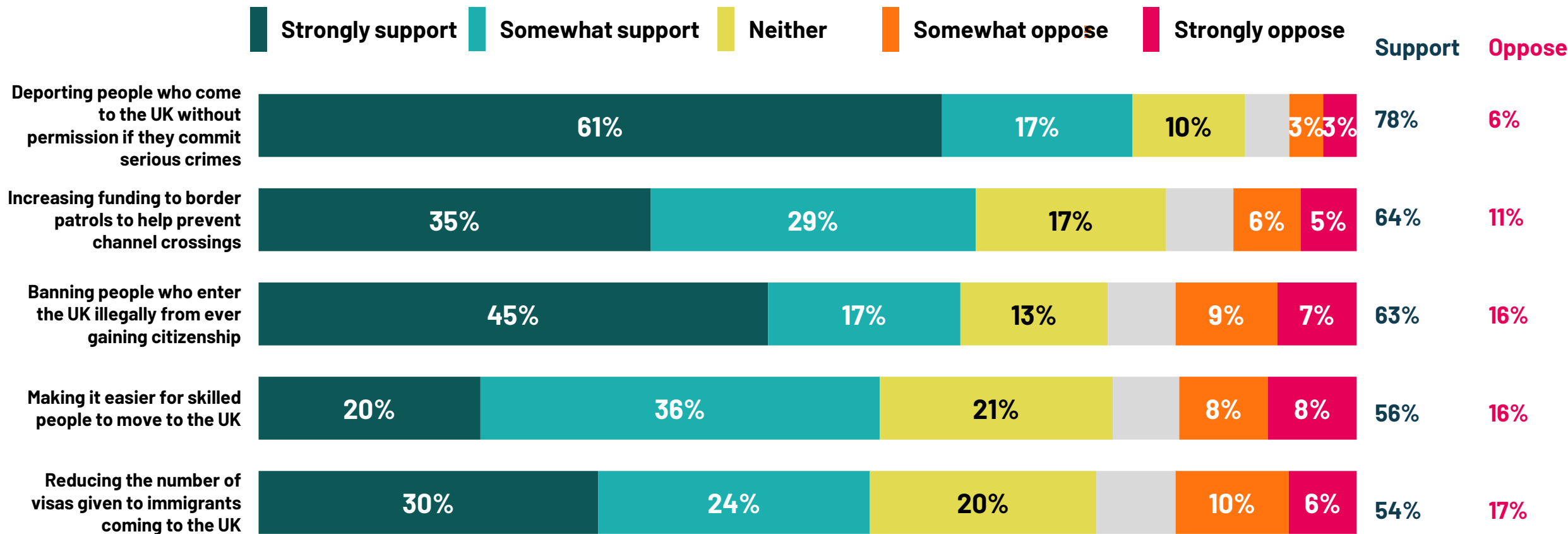
Q6A. Is Keir Starmer's Labour government doing a better or worse job managing immigration than the previous Conservative government, or is it about the same?

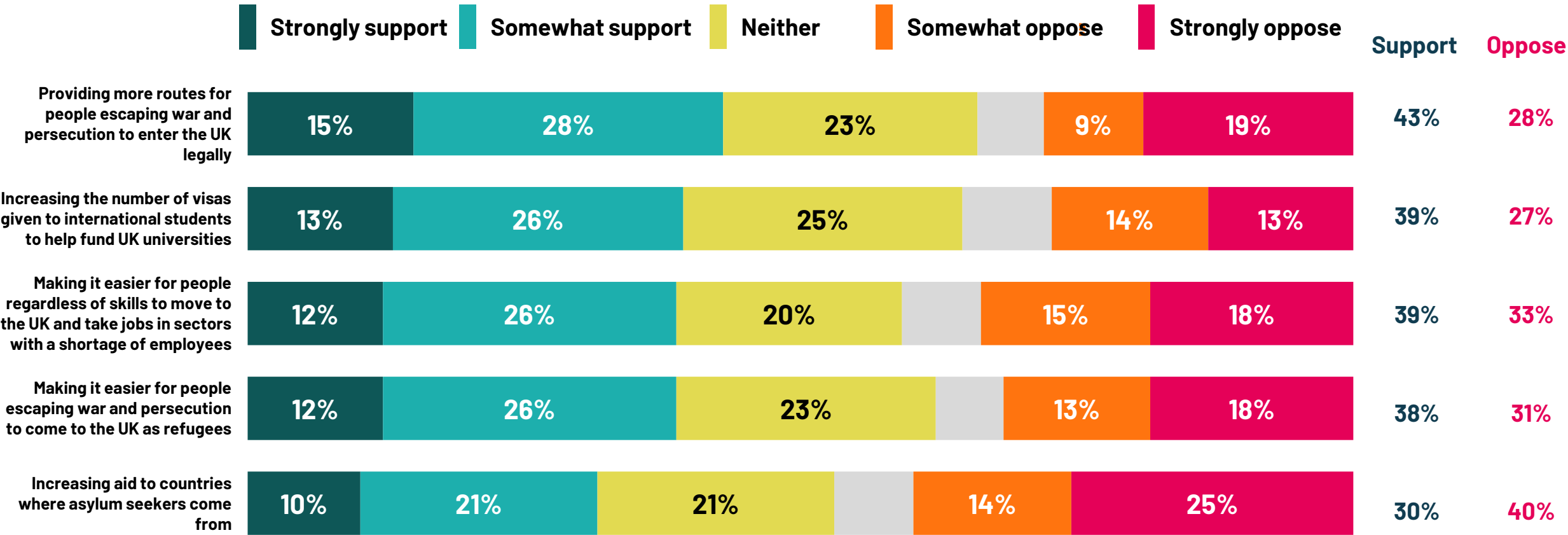
The majority of the public support deporting people who come to the UK without permission if they commit serious crimes
