


## Most Britons think climate change is important, including one in two thinking it is one of the or single most important problem


Compared to all the other problems facing the UK, would you say that climate change is...





### A third say they used their heating less this winter than previous winters


This winter, have you used your heating less often than in previous winters, more often, or about the same amount?





Nearly 9 in 10 are concerned about the price of energy. While still high, concern about reliance on energy imports and supply interruptions is lower than in 2022.


Please now think specifically about how we generate and supply energy in this country. How concerned, if at all, are you about these things?

Below are two different aims a political party could have. For these statements, please choose which would make you more likely to vote for a political party, or if it would make no difference.





### There is continued support for investing in renewable energy and reducing energy use by improving energy efficiency, and low support for restarting fracking



# Two thirds support building more sources of clean energy generation in their local area


Thinking again about where you live, to what extent would you support or oppose having more sources of clean energy generation (such as wind turbines, solar panels and so on) built in your local area?
