


British adults are split in terms of whether they would describe the UK's Armed Forces as being in a good or bad state





Thinking about how the UK defence budget is spent, which of the following areas, if any, do you think should be prioritised? Please choose up to three areas that you think are most important.












Britons are more likely to say they prefer Europe/Europeans to America/Americans across a range of statements.


