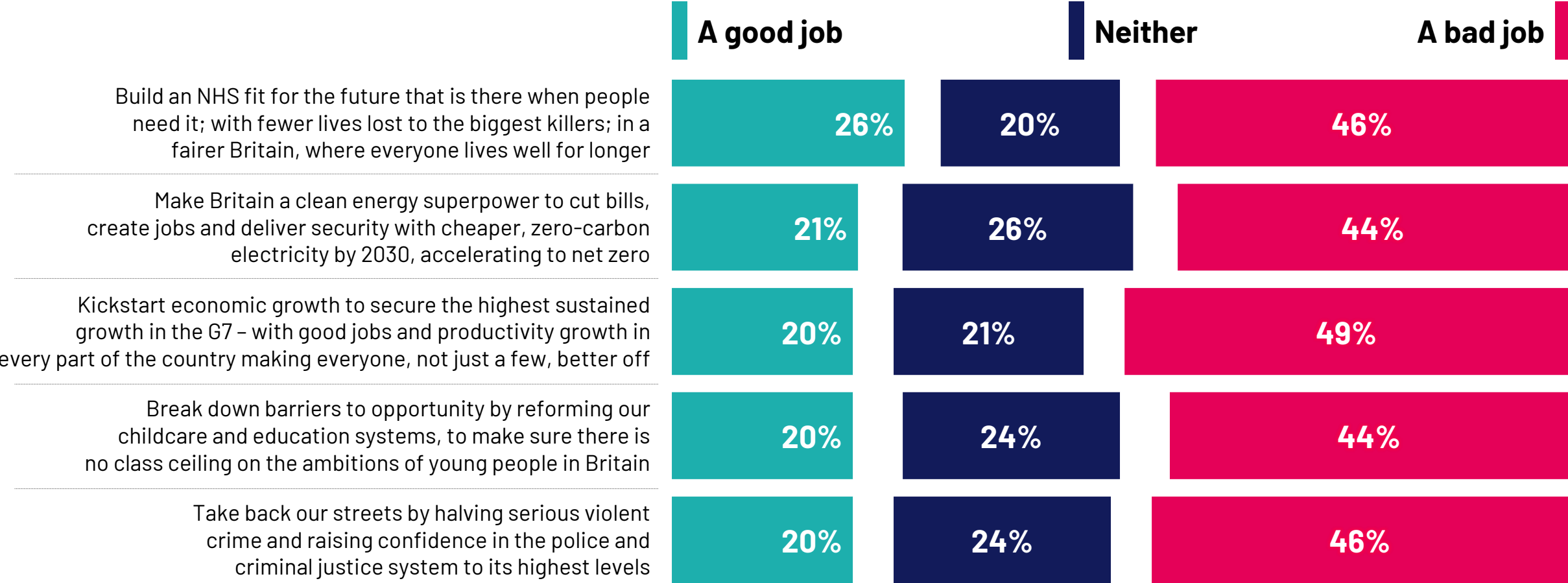

Labour’s performance on their five missions

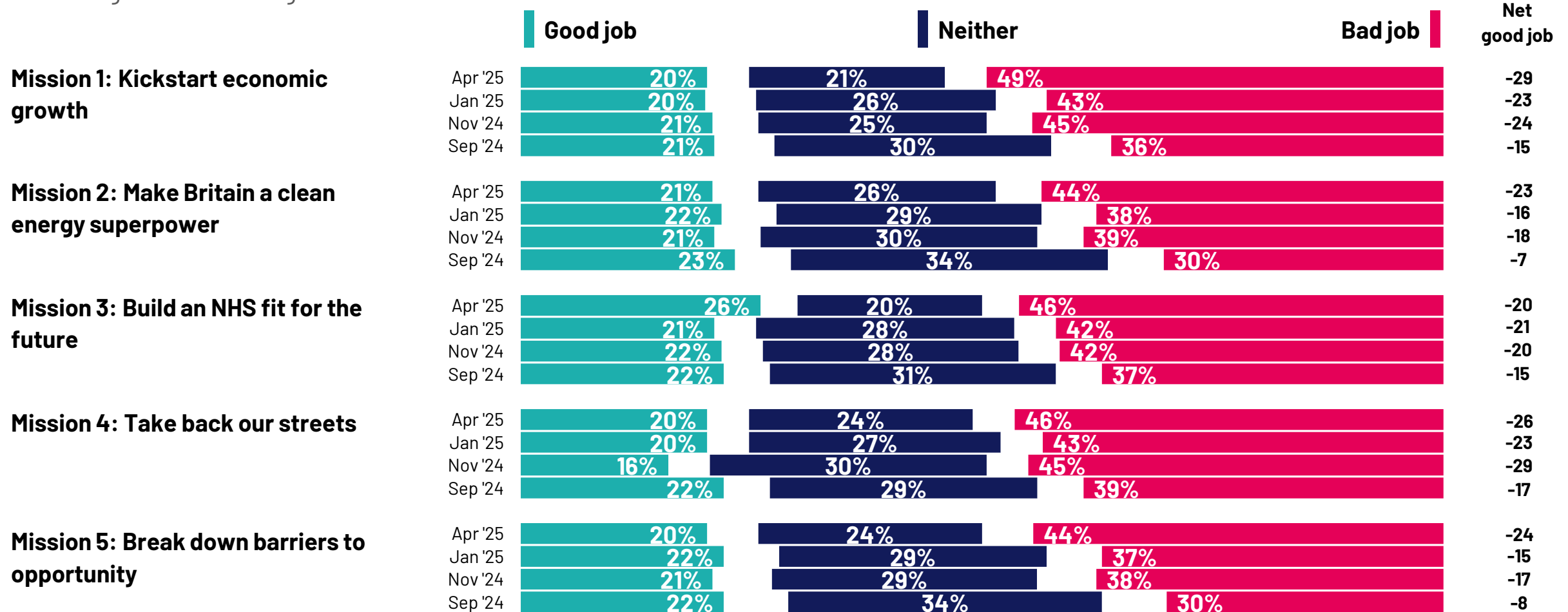
In your opinion, do you think the current Labour government led by Keir Starmer is doing a good job or a bad job, if either, at delivering in the following areas?

The public continue to be more likely to think Labour are doing a bad job, rather than a good job, at delivering their five key missions

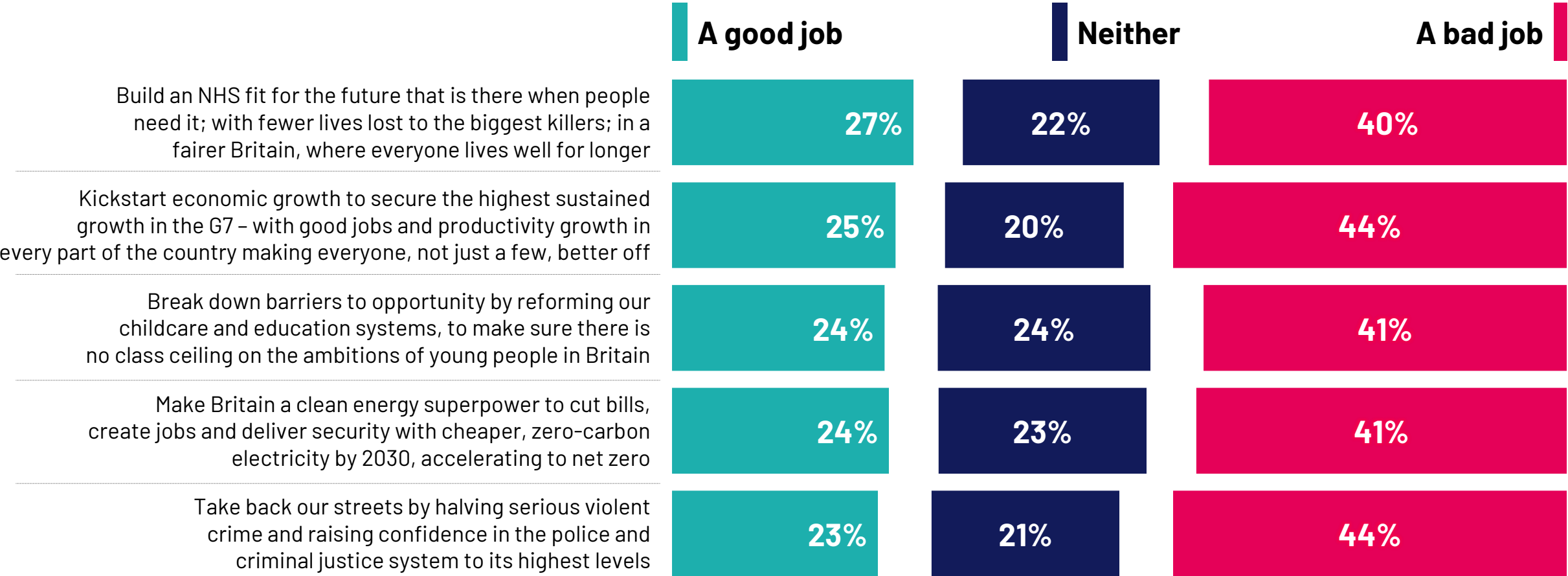
In your opinion, do you think the current Labour government led by Keir Starmer is doing a good job or a bad job, if either, at delivering in the following areas?

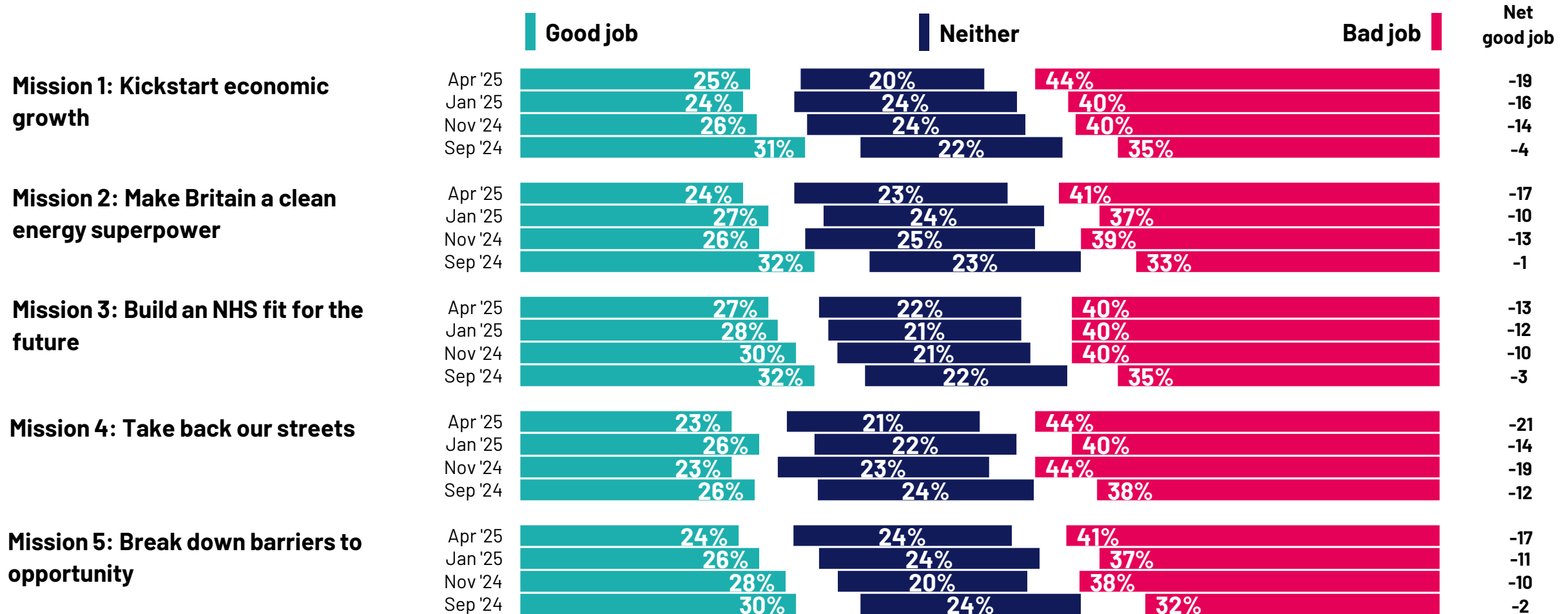
And do you think the current Labour government led by Keir Starmer will do a good job or a bad job, if either, at delivering in the following areas by the next General Election (due latest August 2029)?

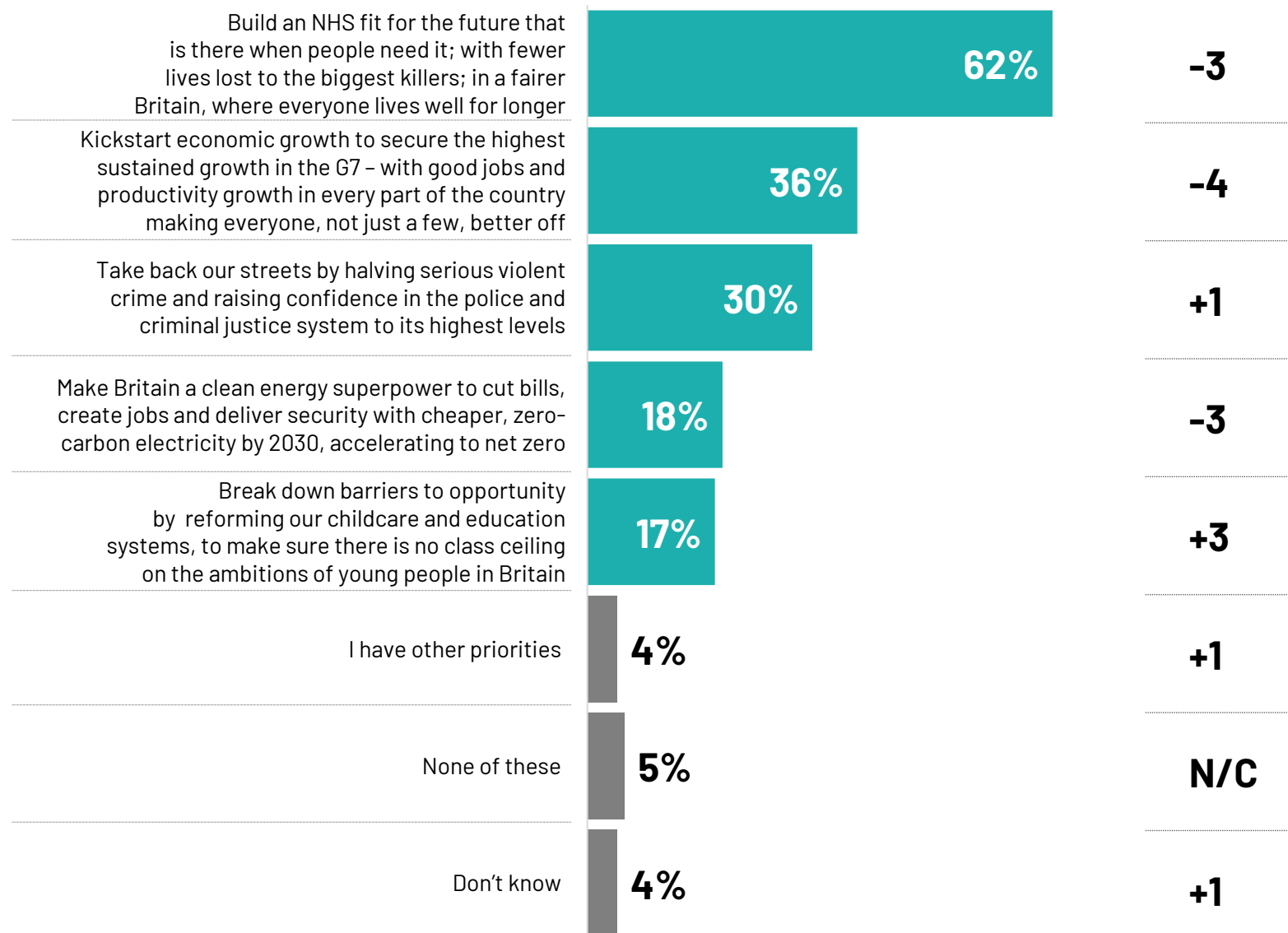
