


A majority of Britons remain concerned about crime and ASB across the UK and think crime has risen over the past 12 months. They see this as less of a problem in their local area

How much of a problem, if at all, do you think crime and anti-social behaviour are in...




What do you think has happened to crime over the past 12 months?





People who live in a rural area are much less likely than those in an urban area to say crime is a big problem in their local area. This is despite people from a rural area being slightly more likely than people from an urban area to think crime and anti-social behaviour is a big problem for the UK as a whole

How much of a problem, if at all, do you think crime and anti-social behaviour are in...






The majority of those who think crime has gone up in the UK in the past 12 months think this because of things they've seen on the news. Those who think it has gone up in their local area cite an increase in anti-social behaviour, as well as things on the news






Two in five say they have witnessed or heard about littering/fly-tipping and the smell of people smoking cannabis in their local area in the past month

People who live in urban areas are more likely to have witnessed or heard about different types of crimes or anti-social behaviours, than those who live in rural areas.






To what extent, if at all, would experiencing each of the following in public bother you?

To what extent, if at all, do you think the number of times you have smelled cannabis in public, has increased, decreased or stayed about the same, in the past year?






Almost half of **Britons visit their** local high street or shopping area at least once a week

Net: At least once a week






A lack of shops that interest them and too many empty shops are the top reasons limiting Britons from visiting their local high street or shopping area


