



Two in five Britons think the UK Government is doing a bad job at negotiating with trade unions. This is better than the 60% bad job figure for Rishi Sunak's government, but despite this the public's current perceptions on whether the current government is doing a better job at negotiating with trade unions than the previous government are divided.


