


Out of a list of sports, the public are most likely to have attended football in the past 12 months. However, 3 in 5 have not attended any of the list sports in the past 12 months

For which of the following sports, if any, have you attended a live event in the past 12 months? Please select all that apply?








Over half of those who have attended a football or tennis match in the past 12 months have attended at least monthly

You mentioned you have attended live events for the following sports in the past 12 months. How often, on average, do you attend each one?





Thinking about the price of tickets for the events you have attended in the past year, to what extent do you think they offered good or poor value for money, if either?








The public are most likely to think football fans are paying more for a ticket than they were 5 years ago

% that think fans of these sports are paying more for a ticket than 5 years ago






Those who have attended a sporting event in the past 12 months are split between whether ticket prices have meant they have attended less often or whether it has had no impact






7 in 10 who have attended a football match in the past 12 months think traditional football fans are being priced out of going to games
