About the Study

This Axios-Ipsos American Health Index survey was conducted from October 10 to 13, 2025 by Ipsos using our KnowledgePanel®. This poll is based on a nationally representative probability sample of 1,125 adults ages 18+.

One respondent was removed from the final data for refusing all of the survey items.

The survey was conducted using KnowledgePanel, the most well-established online probability-based panel that is representative of the adult U.S. population. Our recruitment process employs a scientifically developed addressed-based sampling methodology using the latest Delivery Sequence File of the USPS – a database with full coverage of all delivery points in the U.S. Households invited to join the panel are randomly selected from all available households in the U.S. Persons in the sampled households are invited to join and participate in the panel. Those selected who do not already have internet access are provided a tablet and internet connection at no cost to the panel member. Those who join the panel and who are selected to participate in a survey are sent a unique password-protected log-in used to complete surveys online. As a result of our recruitment and sampling methodologies, samples from KnowledgePanel cover all households regardless of their phone or internet status and findings can be reported with a margin of sampling error and projected to the general population. KnowledgePanel members receive a per survey incentive, usually the equivalent of \$1 (though for some it is \$2) in points, that can be redeemed for cash or prizes. One reminder email was sent for this study.

The study was conducted in both English and Spanish. The data were weighted to adjust for gender by age, race/ethnicity, education, Census region, metropolitan status, household income, and party identification, and 2024 presidential vote choice. The demographic benchmarks came from the 2025 Current Population Survey (CPS) from the U.S. Census Bureau. Party Identification benchmark came from the 2025 National Public Opinion Reference Survey (NPORS) while the 2024 presidential vote choice benchmark came from the federal elections 2024 election results for the U.S. President. The weighting categories were as follows:

- Age (18-29, 30-44, 45-59, 60+) by Gender (Male, Female)
- Race-Ethnicity (White/Non-Hispanic, Black/Non-Hispanic, Other or 2+ Races/Non-Hispanic, Hispanic)
- Education (Less than HS, HS graduate or equivalent, Some College, Bachelor's degree, Master's degree or higher)
- Household Income (Under \$25,000, \$25,000-\$49,999, \$50,000-\$74,999, \$75,000-\$99,999, \$100,000-\$149,999, \$150,000 and over)
- Region (Northeast, Midwest, South, West)
- Metropolitan Status (Metro, non-Metro)
- Party Identification (Republican, Lean Republican, Not Leaned/Refused, Lean Democrat, Democrat)
- 2024 Presidential Vote Choice (Harris, Trump, Another candidate, Did not vote)

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 3.0 percentage points at the 95% confidence level, for results based on the entire sample of adults. The margin of sampling error takes into account the





design effect, which was 1.07. The margin of sampling error is higher and varies for results based on sub-samples. Sampling error is only one potential source of error. There may be other unmeasured non-sampling error in this or any poll. In our reporting of the findings, percentage points are rounded off to the nearest whole number. As a result, percentages in a given table column may total slightly higher or lower than 100%. In questions that permit multiple responses, columns may total substantially more than 100%, depending on the number of different responses offered by each respondent.
