

To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians and political parties?

















































To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians and political parties?







Perceptions of the Government's performance so far




Who to vote for at the next General Election?

Healthcare continues to be the issue that Britons are most likely to think will be very important to them in deciding which party to vote for at the next General Election


Which, if any, of the following issues do you think will be very important to you in helping you decide which party to vote for at the next General Election?

Three in ten Britons would describe the views of Nigel Farage and Reform UK as being “extreme right”


Some people describe their political views as being left or right wing. How would describe the views of the following, would you say they are...?

Half of Britons think that Britain needs radical change.


Which of the following, if any, best describes the type of change you think Britain needs?

Reform UK are both most trusted to deliver the kind of change Britain needs but also seen as most likely to deliver the wrong kind of change too.



Those that want radical change are most likely to trust Reform UK or the Greens to deliver it whereas those seeking moderate change are most likely to trust Labour.


Which of the following parties, if any, would you trust most to deliver the kind of change you think Britain needs?
