


Levels of opposition to the resident doctors' strikes has continued to increase, from 31% in June 2024 to 45% in November 2025.



Ahead of the strikes, the public continue to have most sympathy for NHS patients. Fewer have sympathy for resident doctors than in June 2024.


Based on what you know or have heard about these strikes, how much sympathy, if any, do you have for the
