


My mental health will be better in 2026 than it was in 2025

When it comes to global affairs, views are mixed, with around half expecting the conflicts in the Middle East and Ukraine to end in 2026








EXPECTATIONS FOR THE ECONOMY IN 2026








When it comes to AI, many see both opportunity and risk, anticipating new job creation alongside the loss of existing roles








Beyond employment, Al sparks worries over content reliability and data privacy, with growing expectations of deceptive content and heightened personal-data risks


