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METHODOLOGY

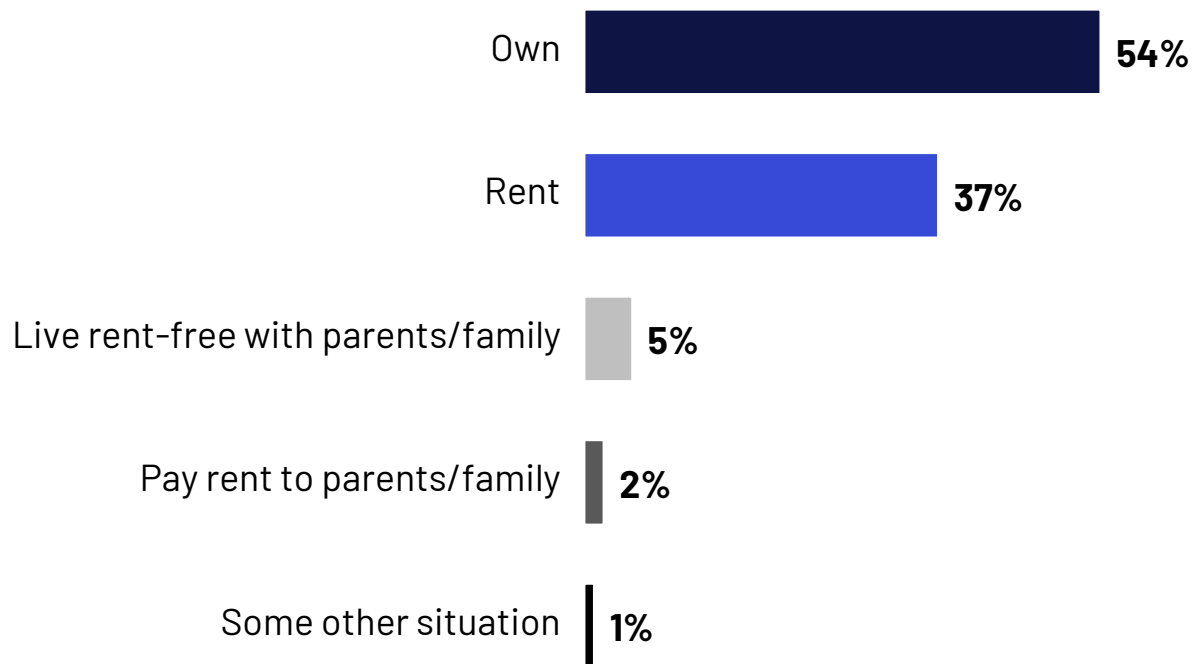
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- The survey was conducted by Ipsos for Century 21 online between February 6rd to 10th, 2026, via the Ipsos I-Say Panel. For the survey, a representative sample of n = 2,300 Canadians aged 18+ was interviewed.
- Data are weighted according to Statistics Canada census data to ensure that the data accurately reflect the population of Canada.
- The accuracy of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the results are considered accurate to within +/- 2.5 percentage points of what the results would have been had all Canadian adults been polled. Credibility intervals are wider among smaller subsets of the population, such as by region, or among likely buyers, for example.

Current Living Situation

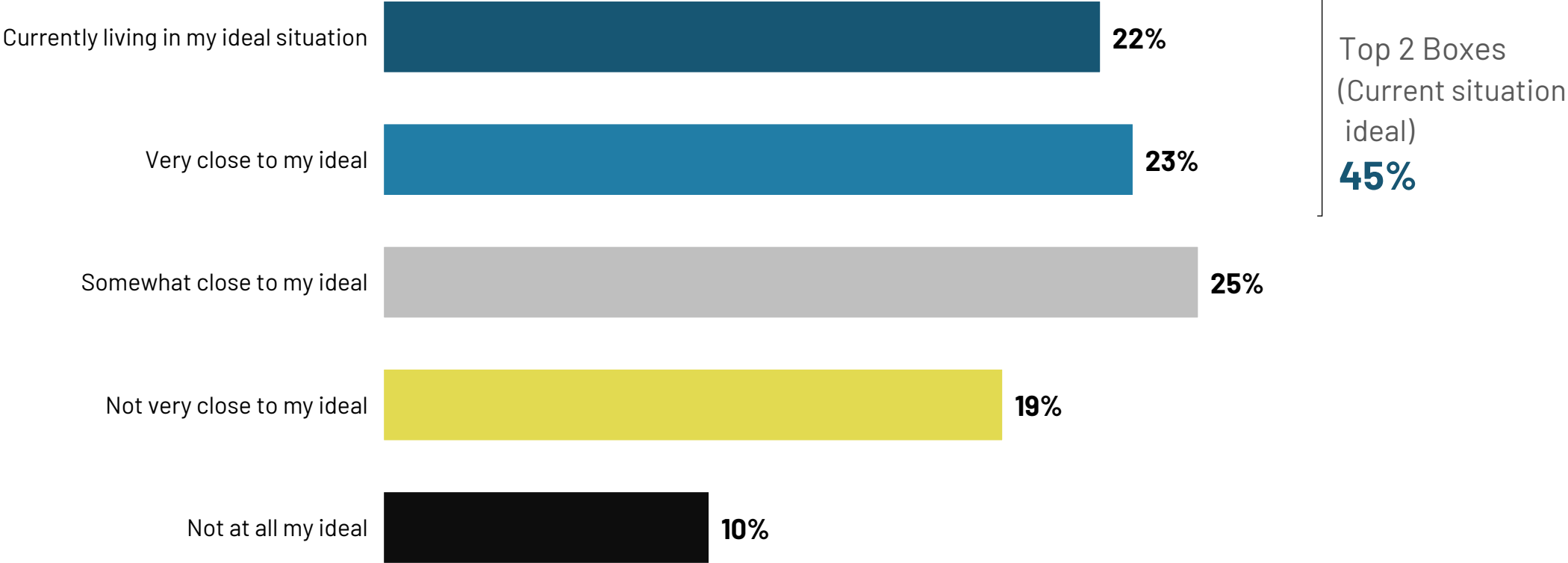
A majority (54%) of Canadians own their own home, while 37% pay rent to a landlord. Ownership is highest among those aged 55+ (74%) and drops among those aged 35-54 (56%) or 18-34 (26%).

Ideal Living Situation

Nearly half (45%) of Canadians say their current living situation is ideal (22%) or very close to it (23%), leaving the rest with significant room for improvement.

Ideal Living Situation by Current Housing

Owners (64%) are far more likely than renters (23%) to say their situation is ideal. Only 28% of those living with parents or family say the situation is ideal. 57% of those living in a single detached house say their situation is ideal, regardless of whether they rent or own, compared to just 25% of those living in a low-rise condo or apartment building.

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This graph represents the percentage of those who said they are currently living in their ideal situation or very close to it (the top 2 boxes for this question) by their current living situation - whether they rent or own. While 64% of those who own now say their situation is ideal or very close to it, only 23% of renters report the same. Just 28% of those living rent-free with parents or family say their situation is ideal or very close to it.

This graph represents the percentage of those who said they are currently living in their ideal situation or very close to it (the top 2 boxes) by their current home type, regardless of whether they rent or own. 57% of those currently living in a single detached home said it is their ideal situation or very close to it, compared to just 25% of those living in a low-rise condo or apartment building

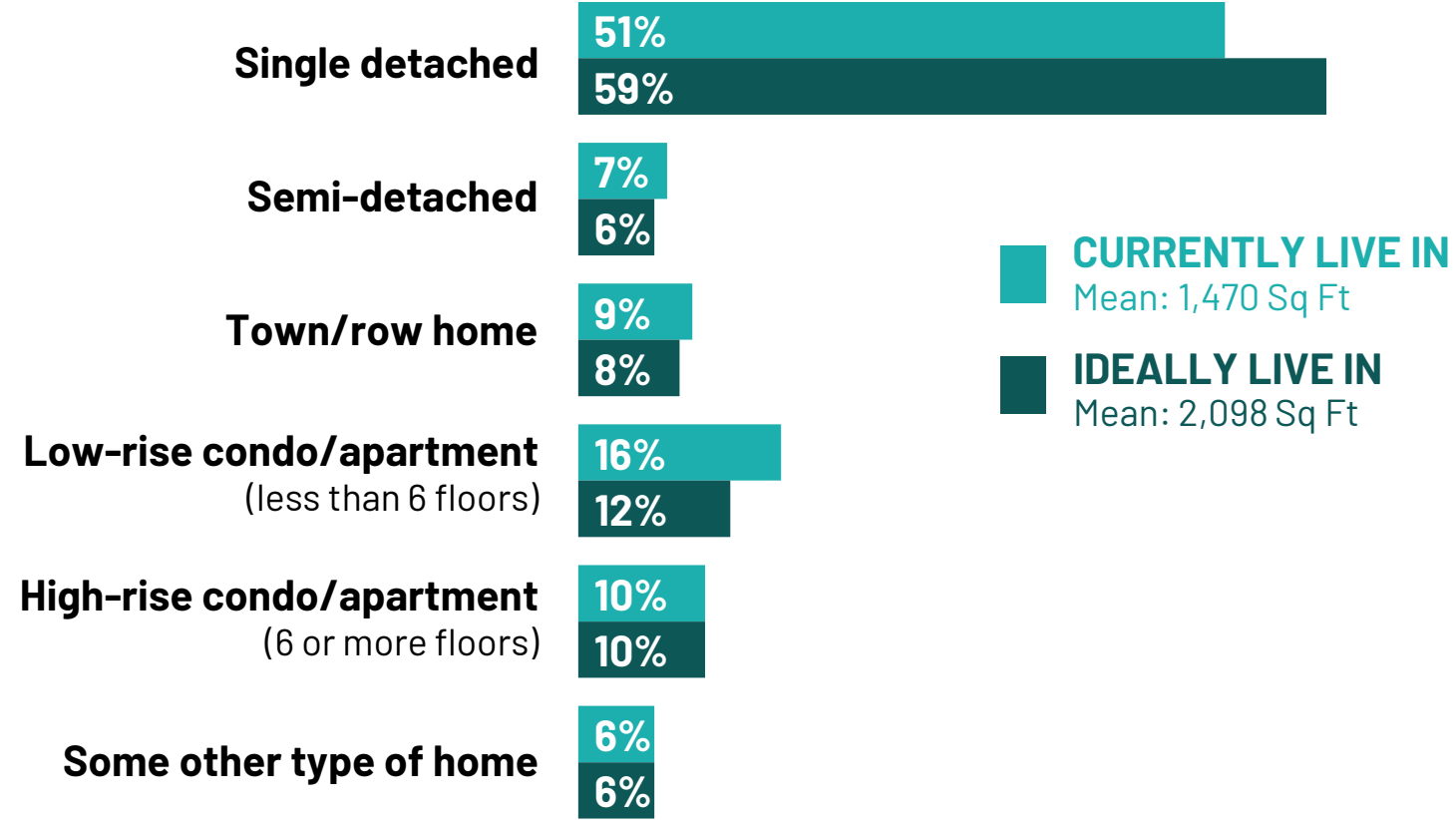

Current Home vs. Ideal Home

Detached homes are viewed as the ideal home for 65% of Canadians, yet only 58% live in a detached (single or semi). Only 22% say any apartment/condo is their ideal home.

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Current Home vs. Ideal Home

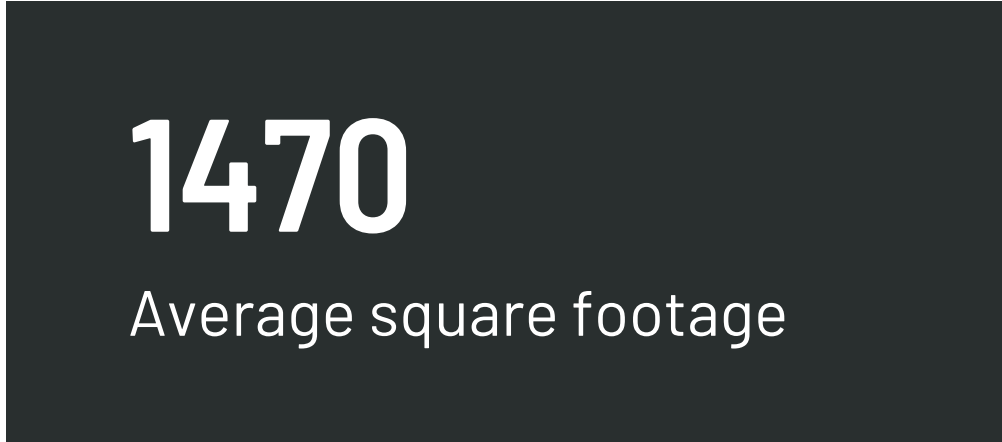
Among those who live in a detached house, 91% say it's their ideal situation. However, those living in a high-rise (73%), town/row home (57%), low-rise (57%) or semi (52%), fewer say it's their ideal type of home.

Current Square Footage by Region and Stock

Nationally, the average home size is 1,470 square feet. BC has the largest, on average, at 1,603 square feet, while Manitoba has the smallest at 1,285 square feet. Detached houses are the largest, of course, at 1,810 square feet, while low-rise condo/apartments and "some other type of home" are the smallest at 964 and 917 square feet, respectively.

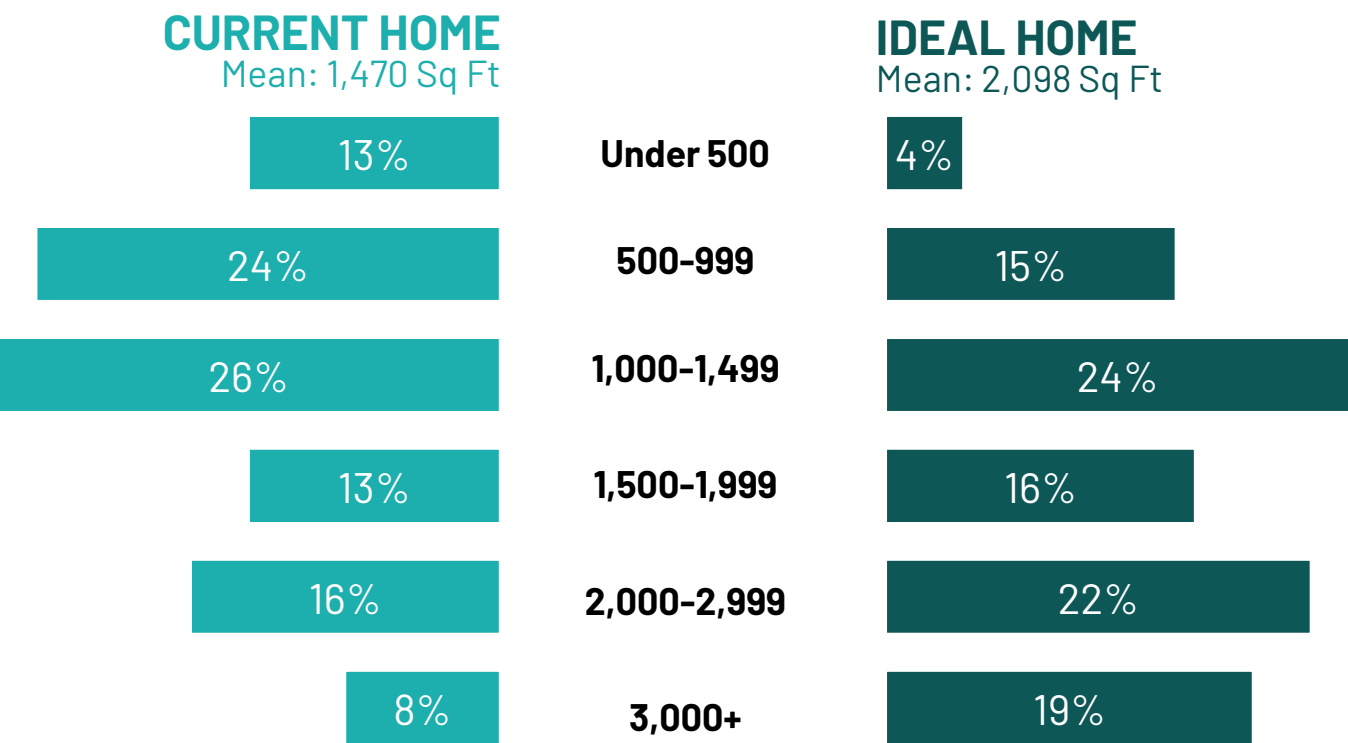

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Square Footage of Current vs. Ideal Home

Nearly four in ten (37%) Canadians live in a home of less than 1,000 square feet, while just 19% prefer to live in a home of this size. The average home in Canada is 1,470 square feet, but Canadians desire a home that is, on average, 628 square feet larger at 2,098 square feet.





Square Footage of Current vs. Ideal Home

A majority of Canadians (63%) say their ideal home would have more square footage than their current home. Just 12% would ideally have less space than they currently have, while 24% are living in a space that is the ideal size for them.

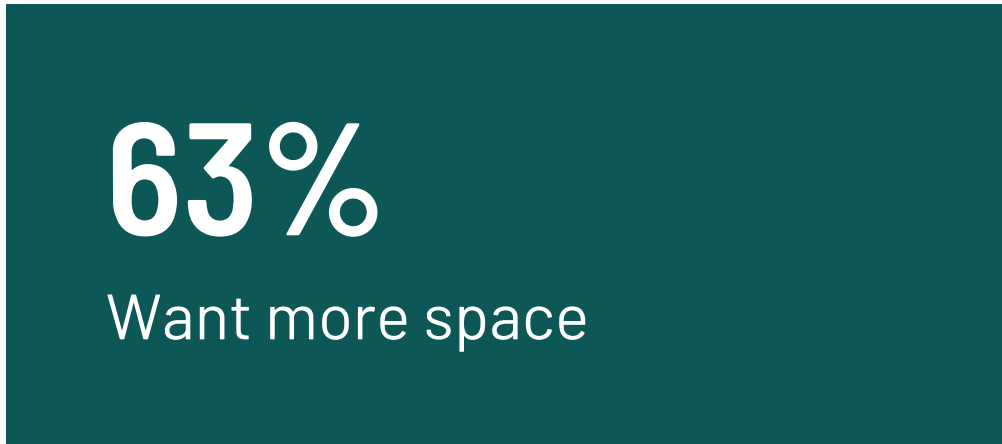

Square Footage of Current vs. Ideal Home by Age

Those aged 18-34 are most likely to want more space (76%), but nearly half (45%) of those aged 55+ say their ideal home would have more space than what they currently have. Only 19% of those aged 55+ presently want to downsize.



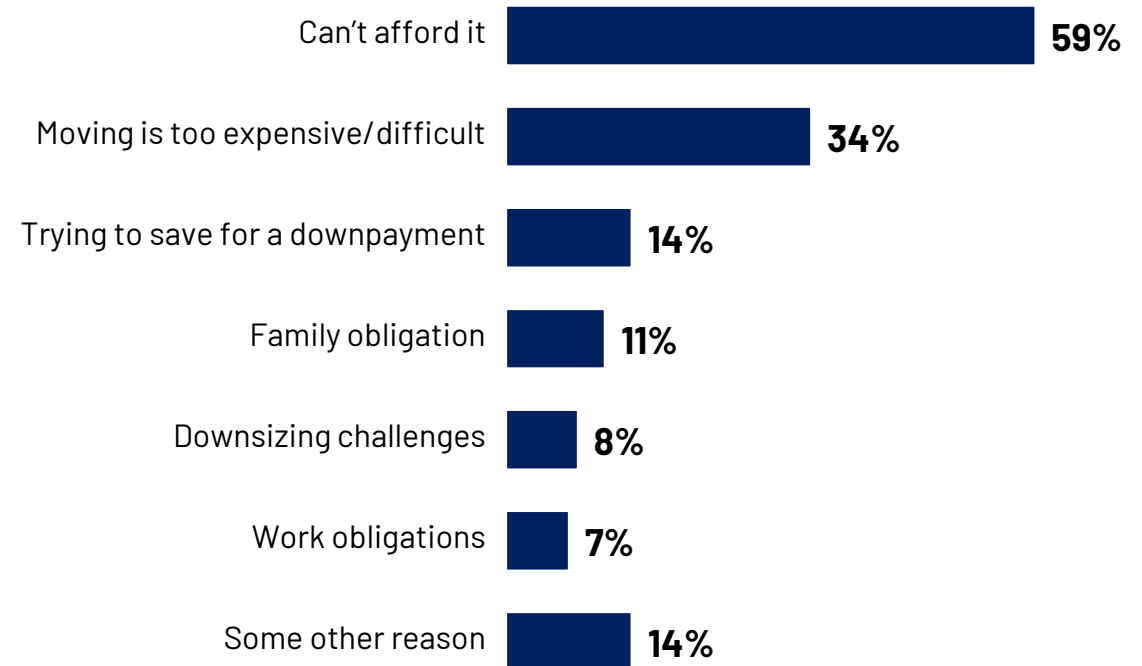

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Barriers to Living in Ideal Home

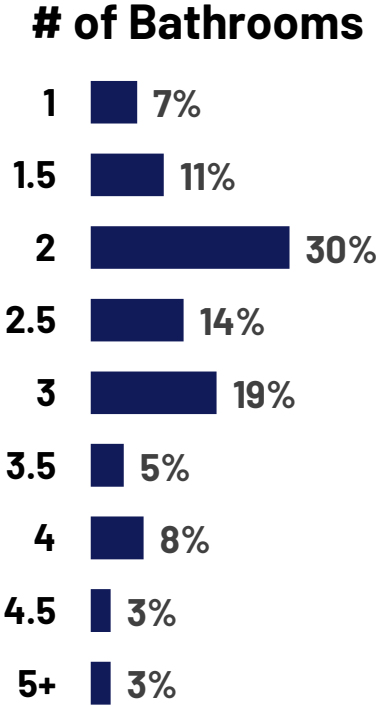
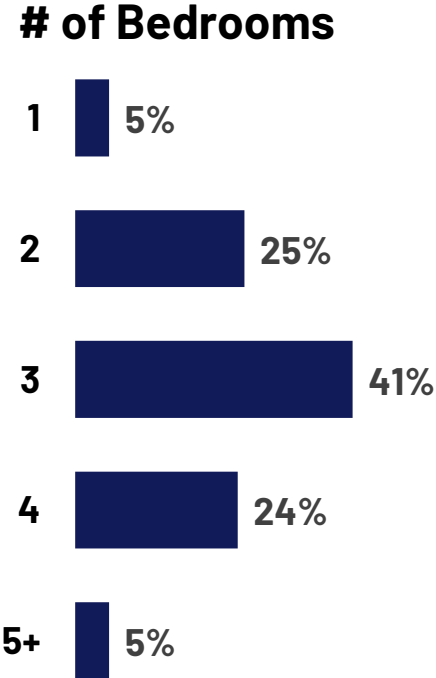
Among those not living in their ideal home, the primary barrier is price (59%), followed by the costs of moving (34%) and saving for a downpayment (14%). Affordability and downpayments are a larger barrier for those aged 18-34.

Number of Bedrooms and Bathrooms Within Budget

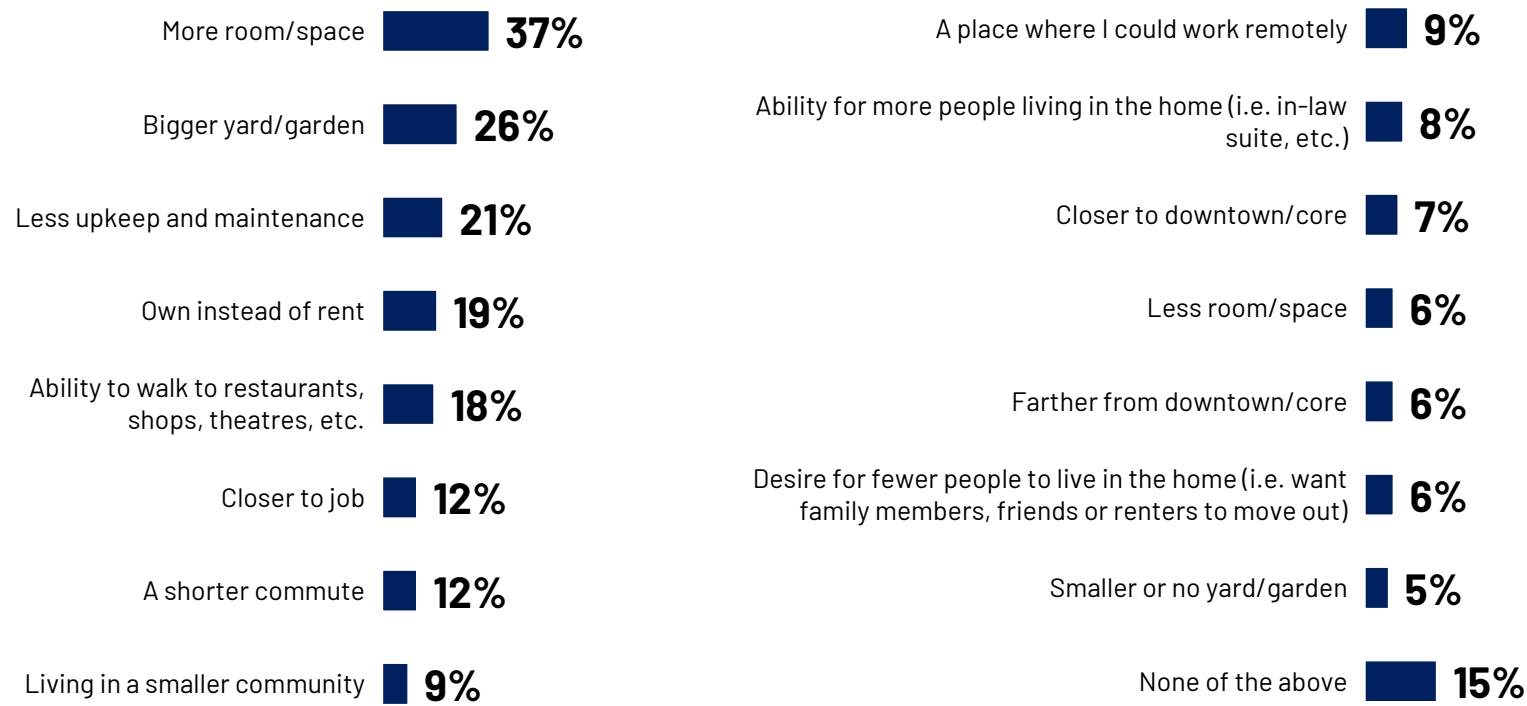
The average likely buyer in Canada is looking for a 3-bedroom home, with two-and-a-half baths.

What Could Make Home More Ideal

When asked what would make their current living situation more ideal, four in ten (37%) want more space, while 26% would ideal like a larger yard/garden. Others prefer less upkeep and maintenance (21%), to own instead of rent (19%), and more amenities nearby (18%).

While two in three (66%) Canadians, overall, love their home, owners (80%) are far more likely than renters (50%) to say so.

Likelihood of Buying Home in Next Year

Two in ten (19%) Canadians are at least somewhat likely to buy a home in the next year, rising to 23% of British Columbians (the strongest intentions in the country), and to 33% among those aged 18-34.

Incidence of First-Time Buyers among all Likely Buyers

Of all those likely to buy a home, 55% say it's their first time. The incidence is even higher in Alberta (69%), among women (63%) and among those aged 18-34 (73%).



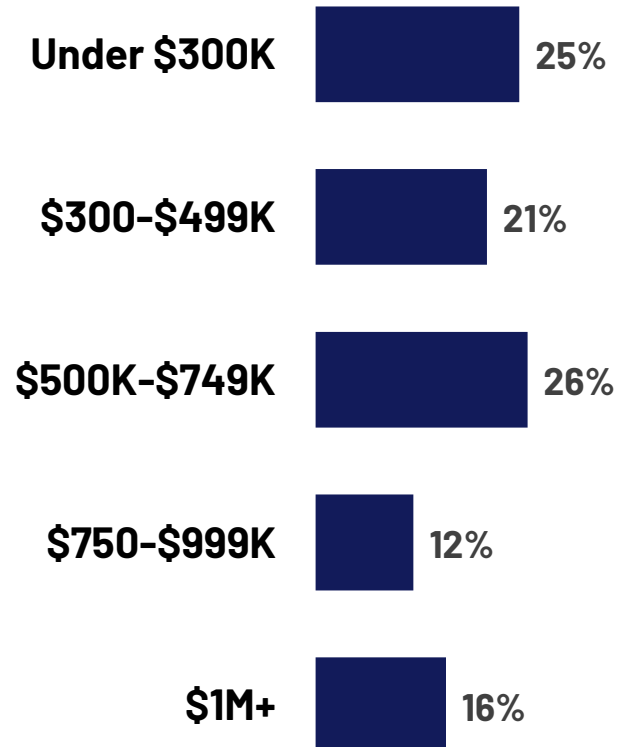

Budget or Anticipated Purchase Price

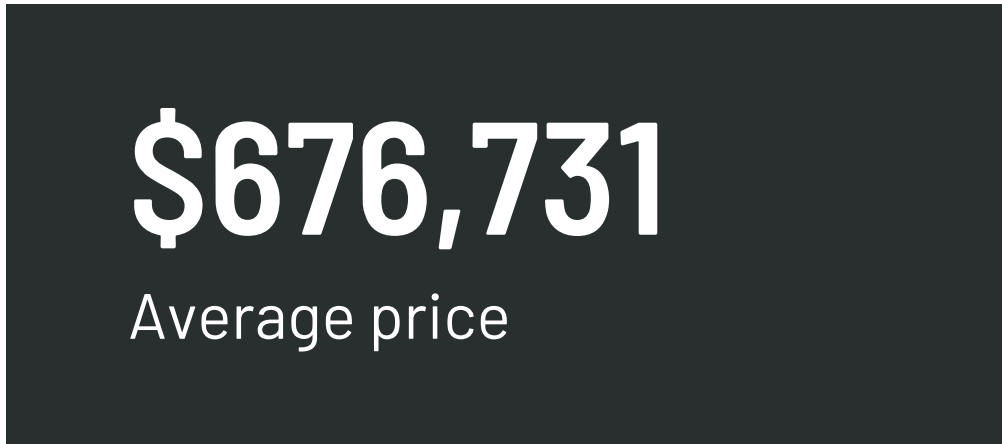
Among likely buyers, nearly half (46%) say their budget is less than \$500K. Relatively few (16%) have a budget of \$1 million or more.

Among those looking to buy, the average anticipated purchase price is \$677K, with Alberta seeing the highest anticipated prices (\$937K)



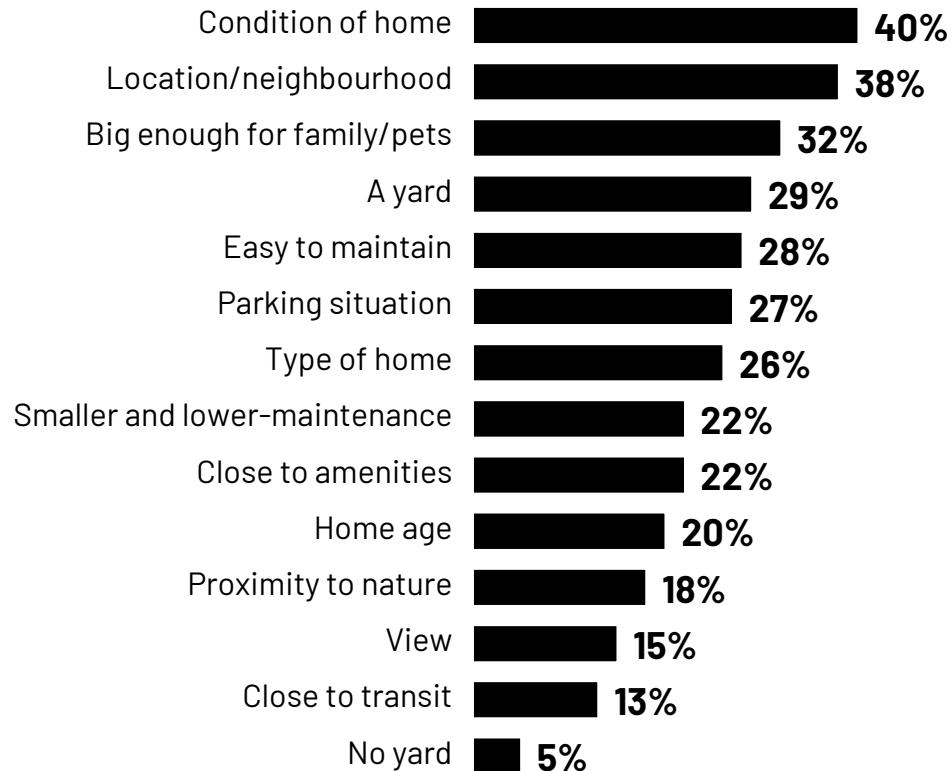

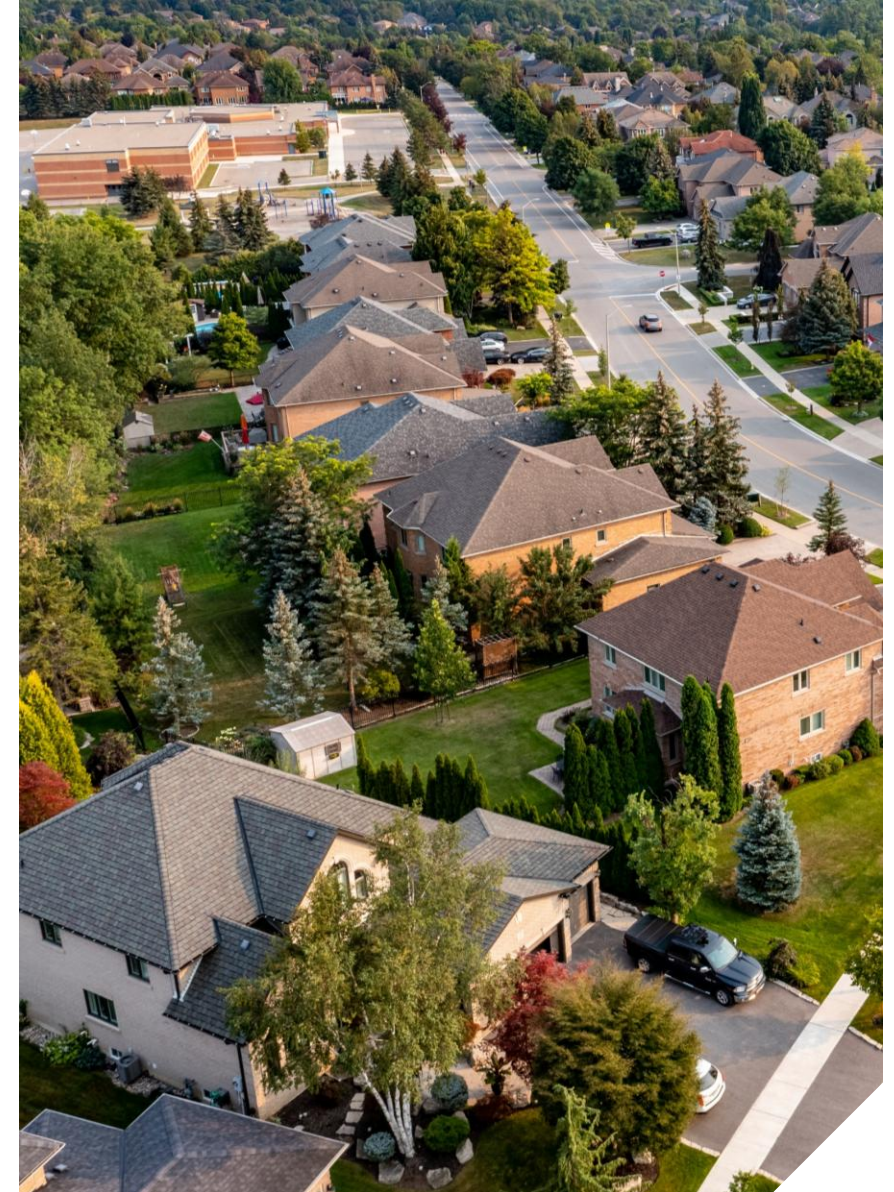
Top Factors Other Than Price

Among likely buyers, the top factors when choosing a home to purchase – other than price – are condition (40%), location (38%), size (32%), having a yard (29%) and easy to maintain (28%).

Older buyers are more concerned about condition, location, type and size.

59% of older buyers care about condition of home

58% of 55+ are concerned about location

40% of 55+ prioritize type of home

37% of 55+ want something smaller and lower-maintenance



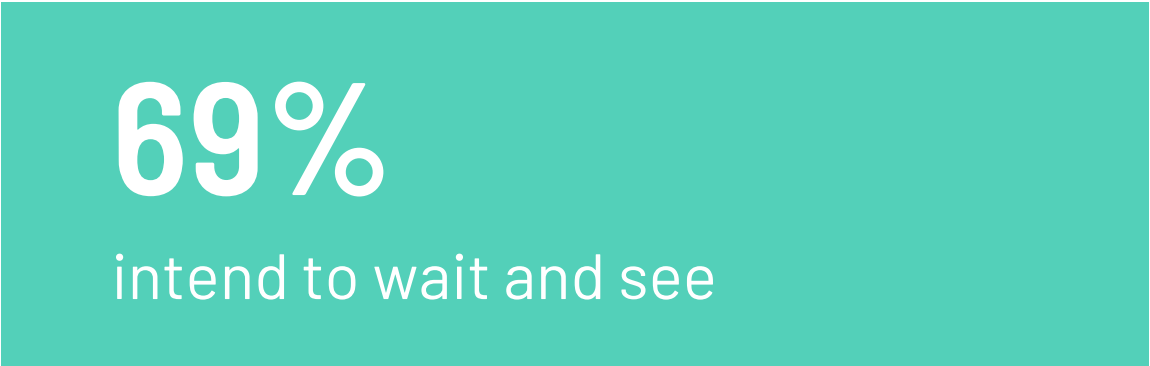
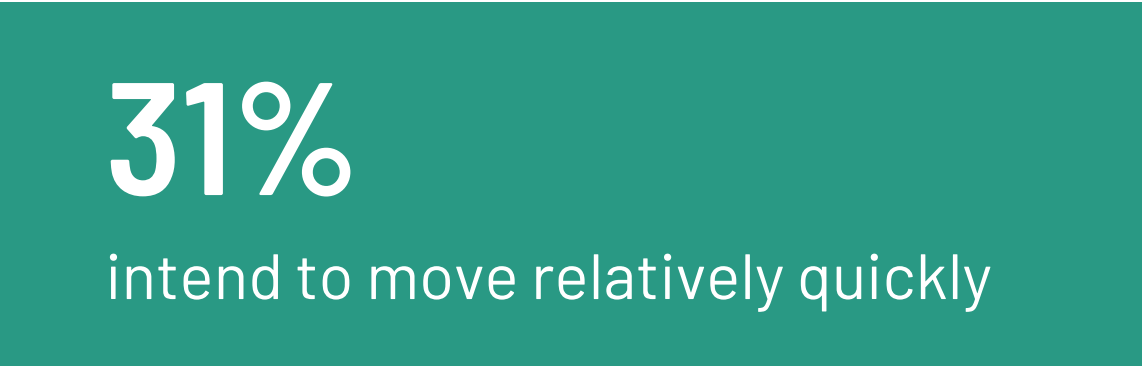

Moving Quickly or Waiting to see?

Among those looking to buy, there appears to be no rush for most: three in ten (31%) want to move quickly, while the majority 69% are taking a wait-and-see approach. Those looking to move more quickly are in British Columbia (46%) and under the age of 35 (40%), underscoring the importance that first-time buyers will have to the recovery of the real-estate market in Canada.

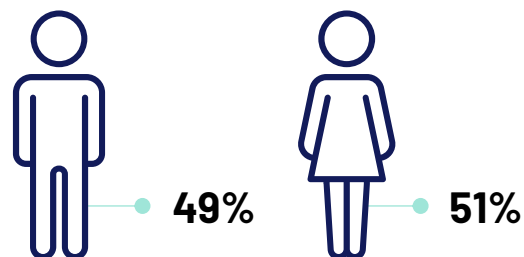

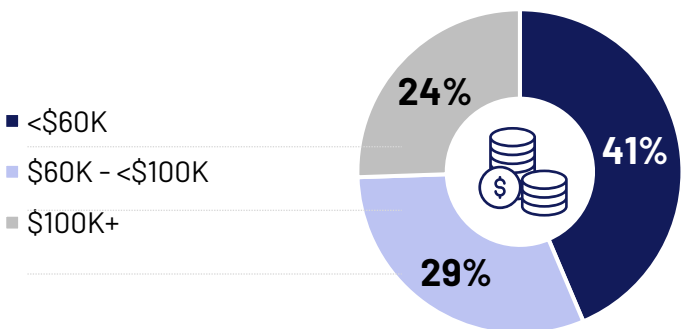

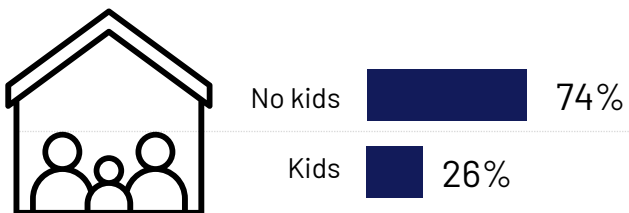
