Key Findings

1 Little movement in attitudes toward gender equality

Overall attitudes toward gender equality amongst the 24-country trend average are broadly level with those seen in 2025, with 59% saying things would work better with more women in positions of responsibility in business and government, but also half (50%) saying that efforts toward gender equality have gone far enough.

2 Optimism about the future is steady for young women, but declining for young men

Across all 29 countries surveyed, 55% think young women in their country today will have a better life than women in their parents' generation, level with last year. However, optimism about the future of young men has fallen by five percentage points (ppts) since last year, to 40%.

3 Divided views on who benefits from traditional gender roles

Almost three in 10 (29%) think men benefit most when women keep to traditional roles, while 19% feel men benefit most when women don't keep to tradition. Close to one-quarter (23%) feel women benefit most from men's traditional roles, with as many thinking women benefit most when men don't keep to a traditional role (26%).

4 Women perceived to have more choice about self-expression, but men hold more choice around jobs

Women are more likely than men to be seen to have more choice when it comes to how to dress (34%), dating (24%), and the roles they can hold in the household (22%), while men are more likely than women to be viewed as having more choice about the jobs they can have (39%).

5 Most have an egalitarian view of gender roles, but norms persist

When asked about personal views, the majority say that things like childcare, housework, and earning money should be shared equally. However, when asked about societal views in their country, childcare and housework are more closely linked with women, while earning money is more strongly associated with men.

6 Gen Z men hold most traditional views of both women's roles in society, as well as men's

Relative to other groups, Generation Z* men are the most likely to agree with traditional ideas about not only women's roles (such as that a wife should always obey her husband), but also men's (such as that young men should try to be physically tough, even if not naturally big).

*Generation Z (born between 1996-2012), Millennials (born between 1980-1995), Generation X (born between 1966-1979), Baby Boomers (born between 1945-1965) and Silent Generation (born between 1925-1944).

On average across the countries surveyed, three in five (60%) agree that things would work better if more women held positions with responsibilities in government and companies. A similar number also note that women won't achieve equality with men in ... unless there are more female leaders in business and government (54%).

However, around half (52%) believe that when it comes to giving women equal rights with men, things have gone far enough in their country. More than four in 10 further say that men are being expected to do too much to support equality (46%) and that we have gone so far in promoting women's equality that we're discriminating against men.

Although there hasn't been much change since last year, the long-term trends show some attitudinal plateaus across a 24-country average.*

The proportion of people who think that men are being expected to do too much to support equality barely budged (-1ppt versus 2025), as has the share of those who agree that, when it comes to giving women equal rights with men, things have gone far enough in their country.

And there has been a slight decline in those who agree that we have gone so far in promoting women's equality that we are discriminating against men (-4ppt vs 2024) and that a man who stays home to look after his children is less of a man (-3ppt vs 2024).

Meanwhile, the proportion of people who identify as a feminist has also declined a bit from last year (-3ppt vs 2024).

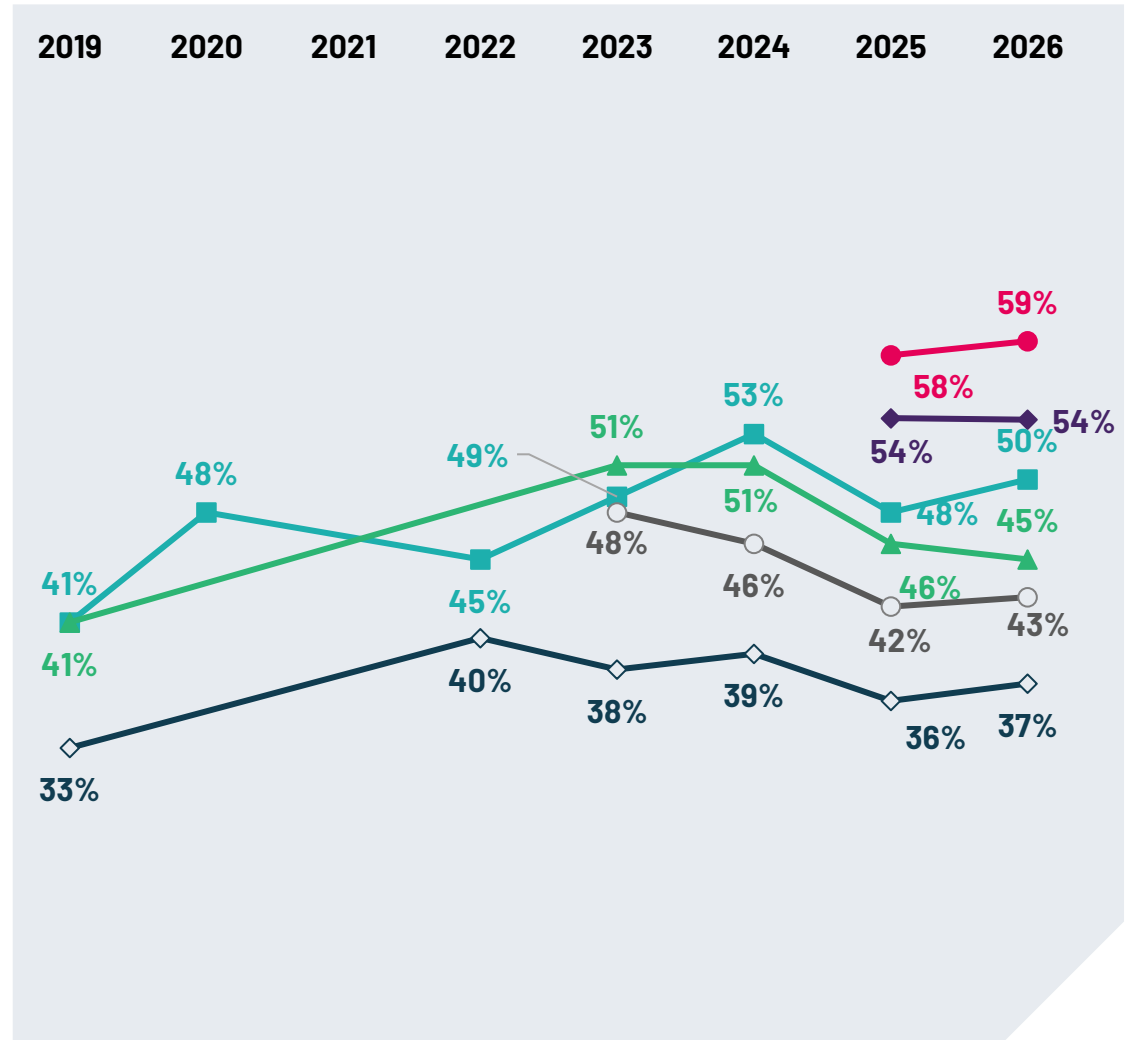

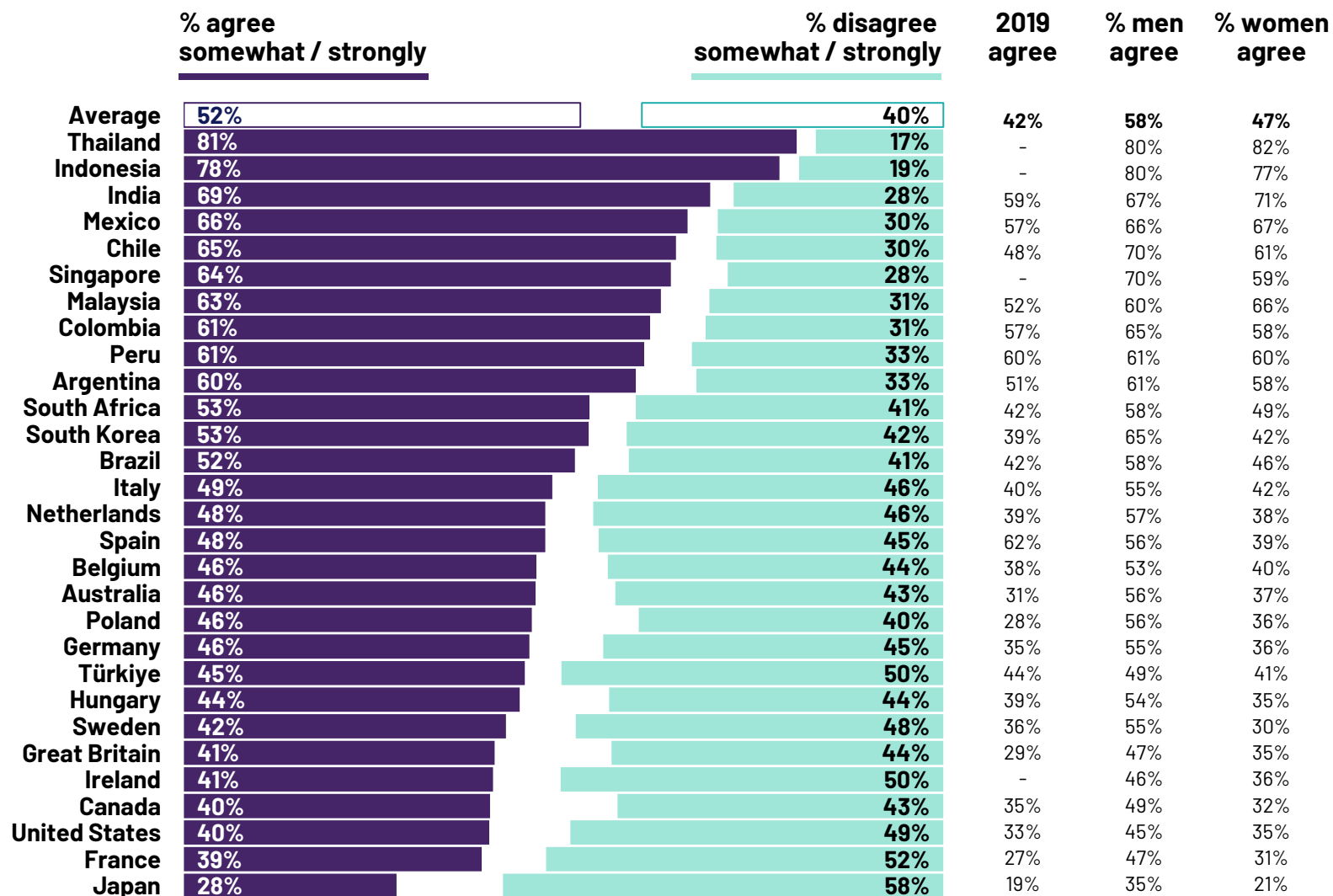

Across a 29-country average, around half of people (52%) believe that when it comes to giving women equal rights things have gone far enough in their country.

Men are more likely than women to agree with this statement (55% vs. 44%).



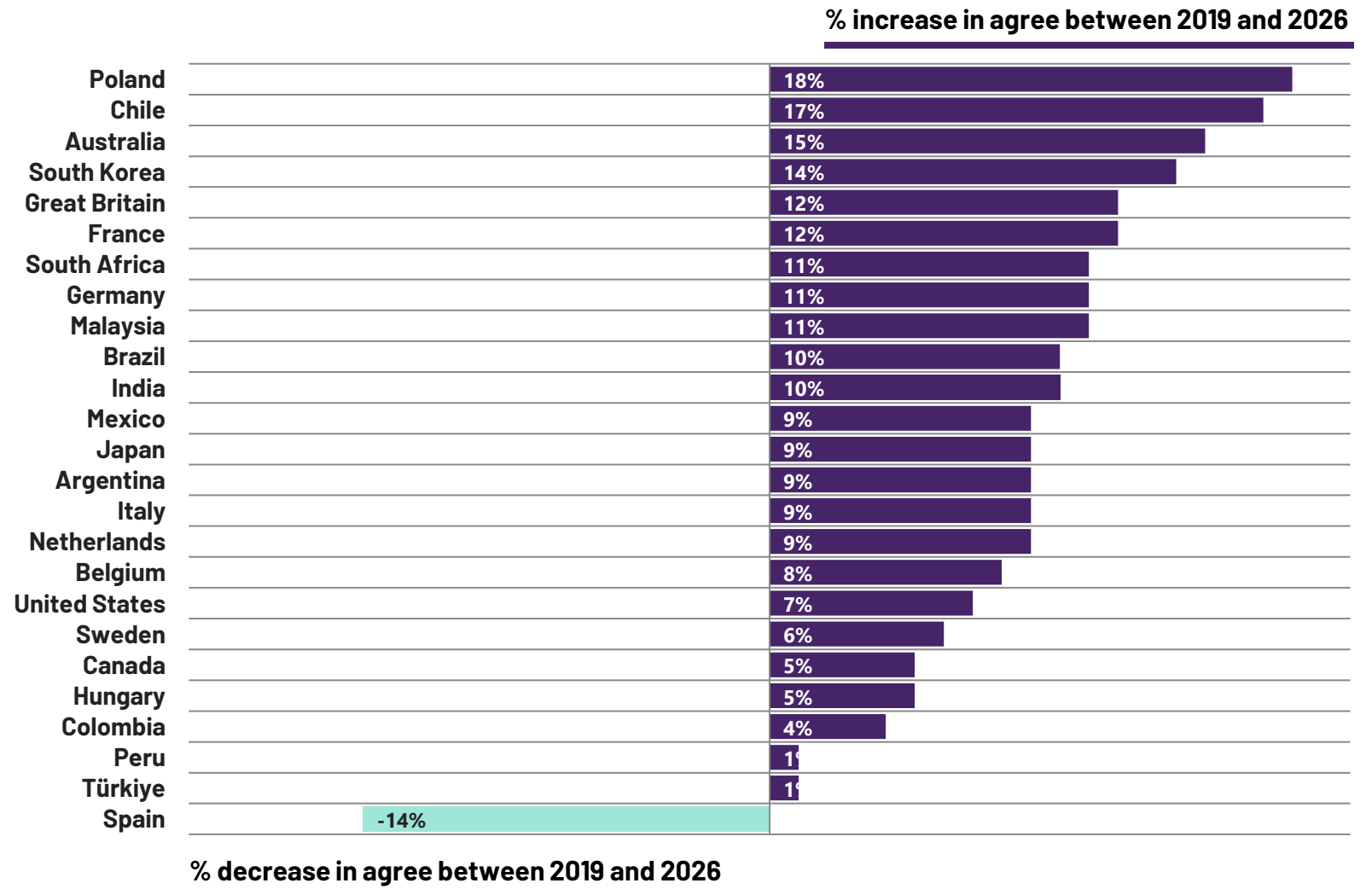

In 23 of the 24 countries surveyed in 2019 and 2026 have seen an increase in belief that on equality things have gone far enough. Poland has seen the biggest rise. In 2025 46% of Poles say things have gone far enough compared to 28% in 2019. Spain is the only country less likely to think enough has been done on gender equality.



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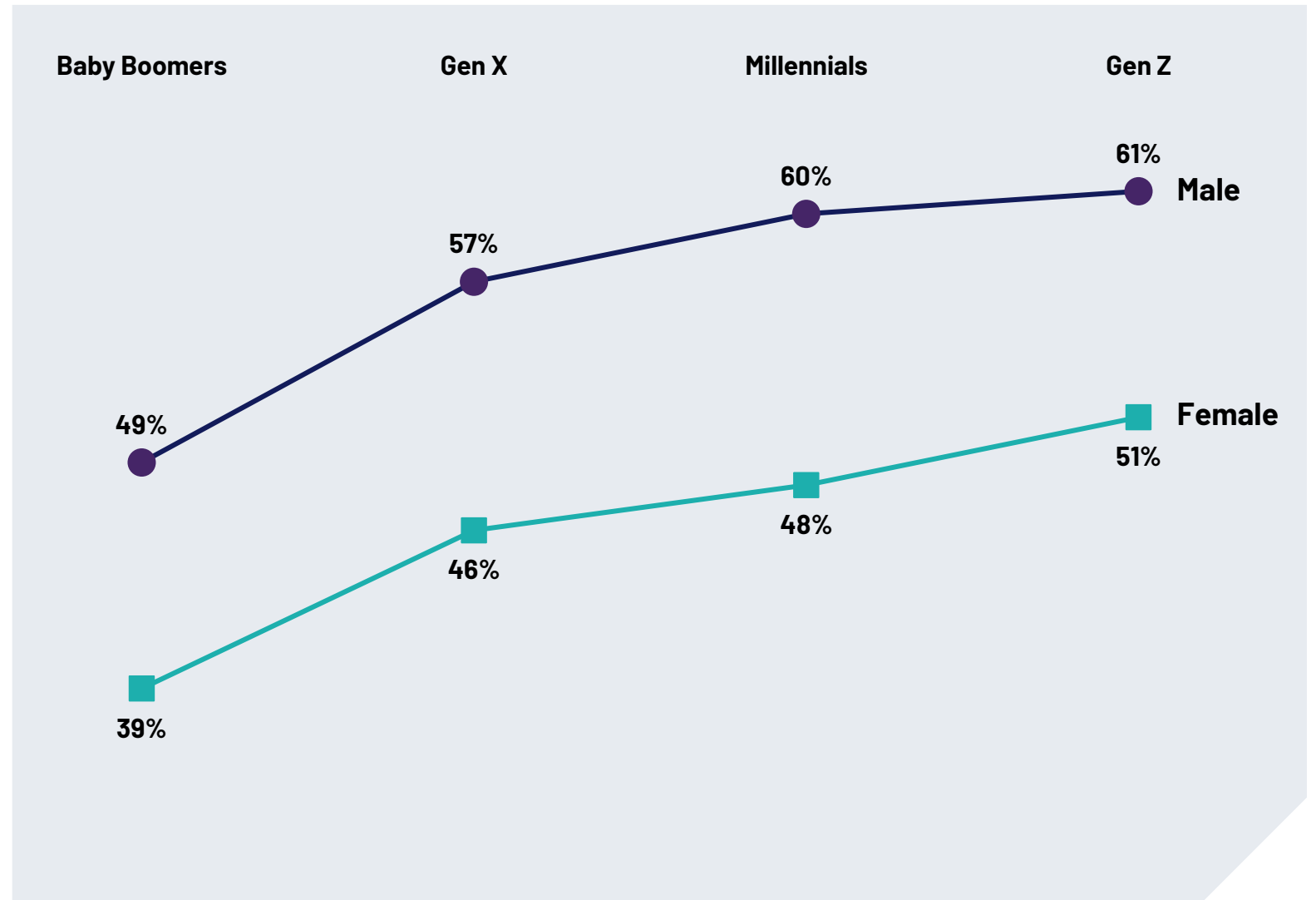

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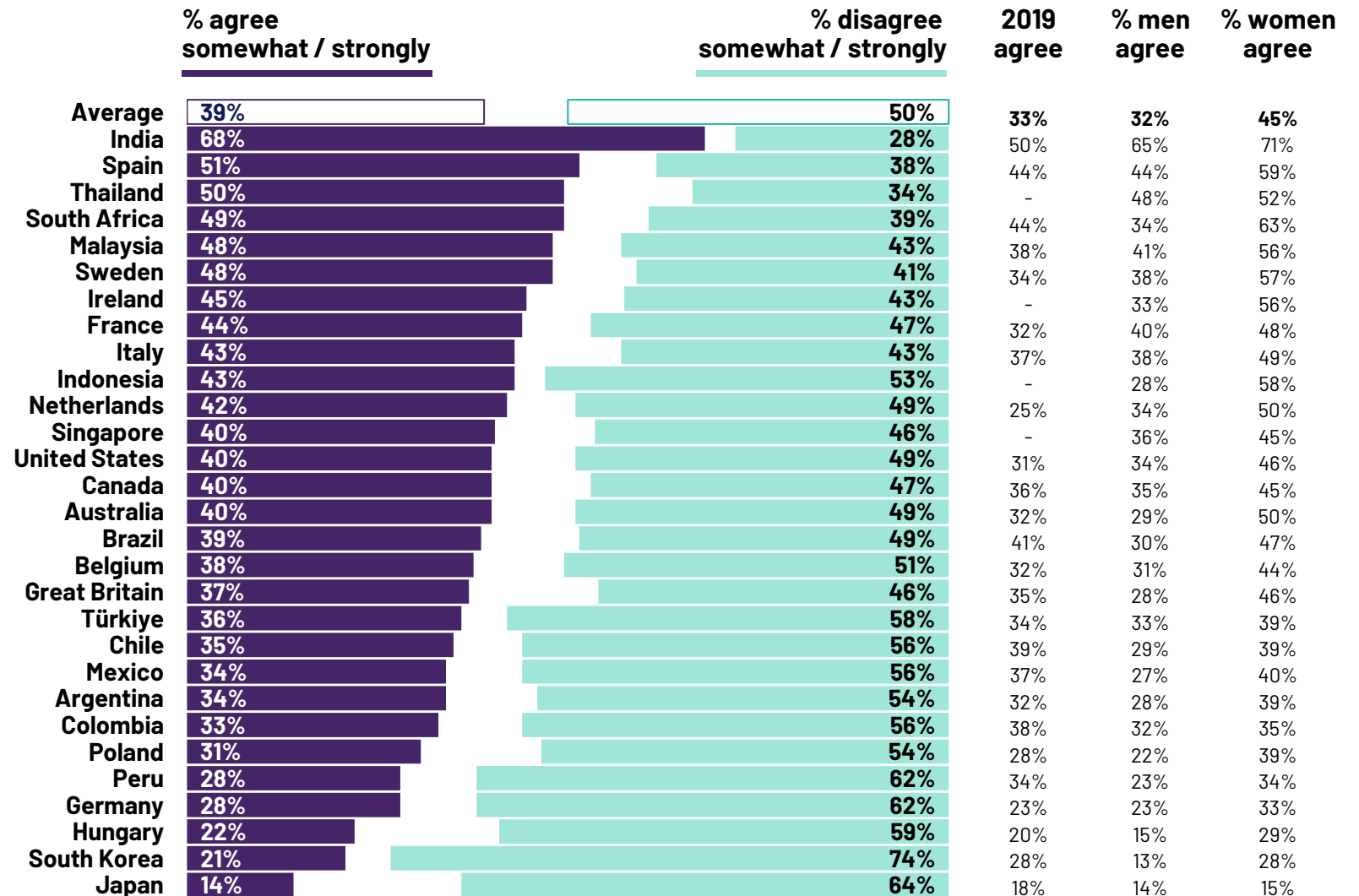

Around two in five (39%) people across a 29-country average define themselves as feminists. Women are more likely than men to define themselves in this way (44% vs. 31%).

Half of people across a 29-country average would not define themselves as a feminist (50%).



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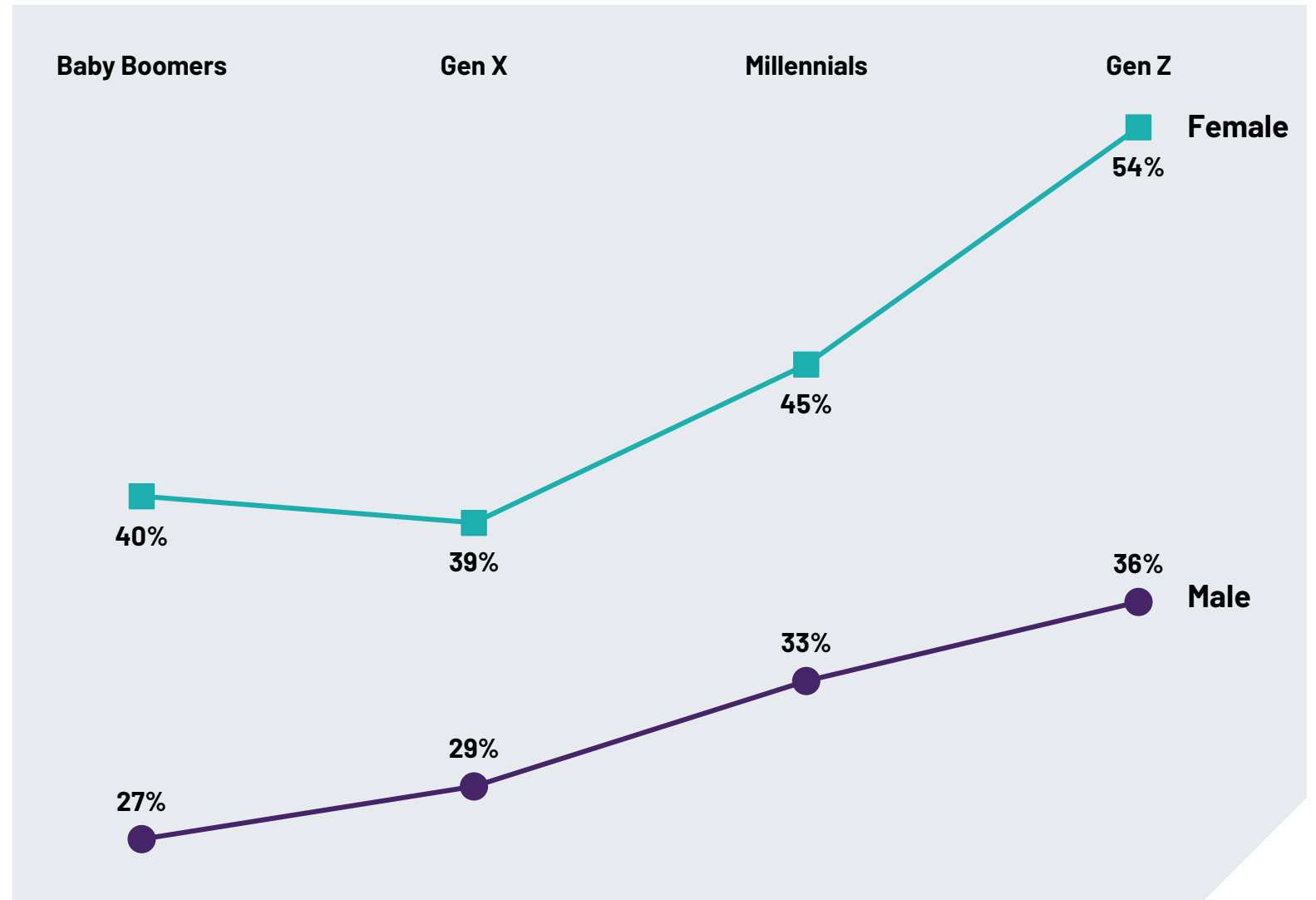

Younger women are more likely to say they are a feminist compared to older women. A majority of Gen Z women (54%) define themselves as a feminist, compared with 36% of Gen Z men.



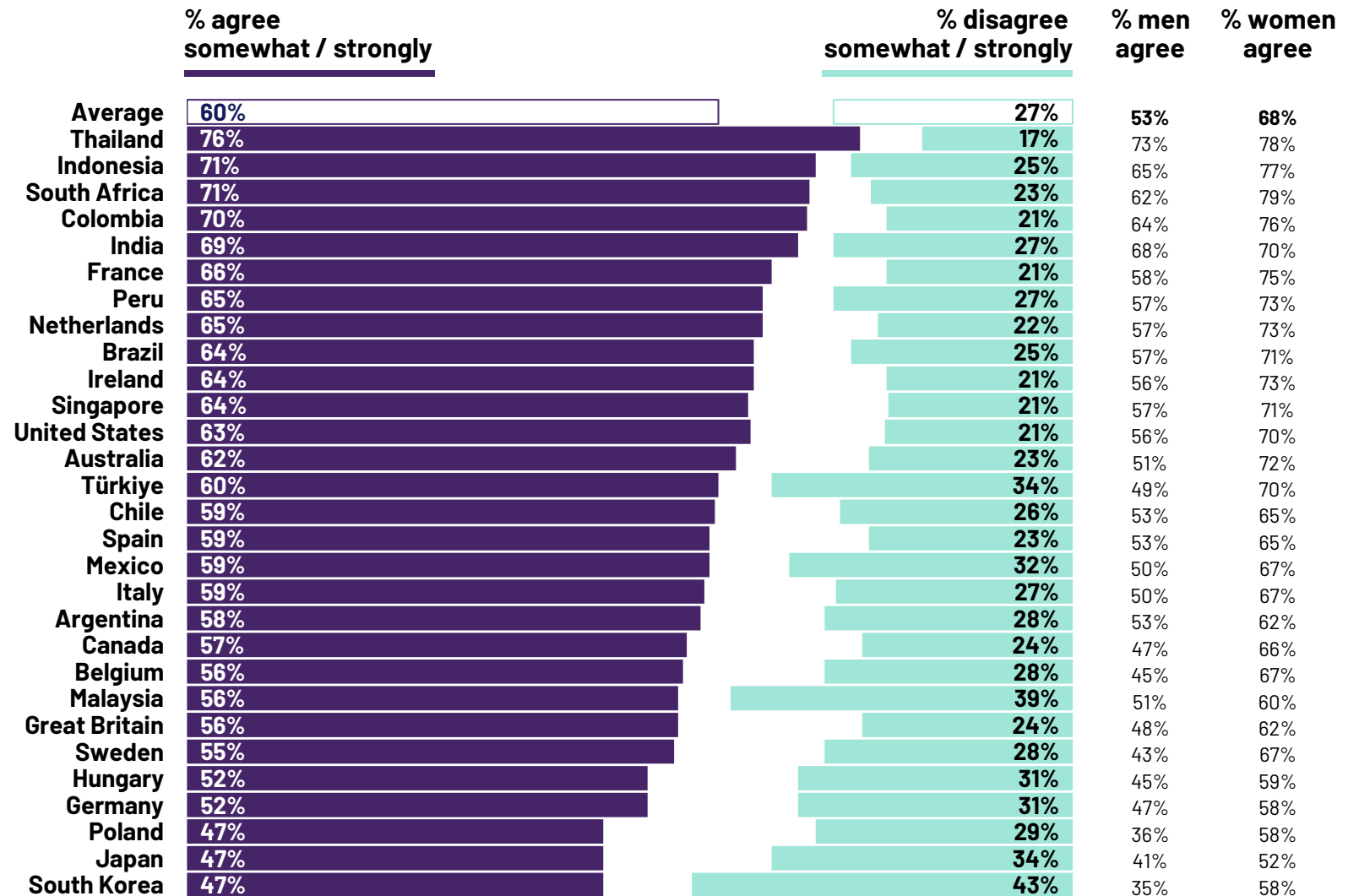

Across a 29-country average, three in five people (60%) agree things would work better if more women held positions with responsibilities in government and companies. This includes half of men (52%), rising to two in three women (66%).



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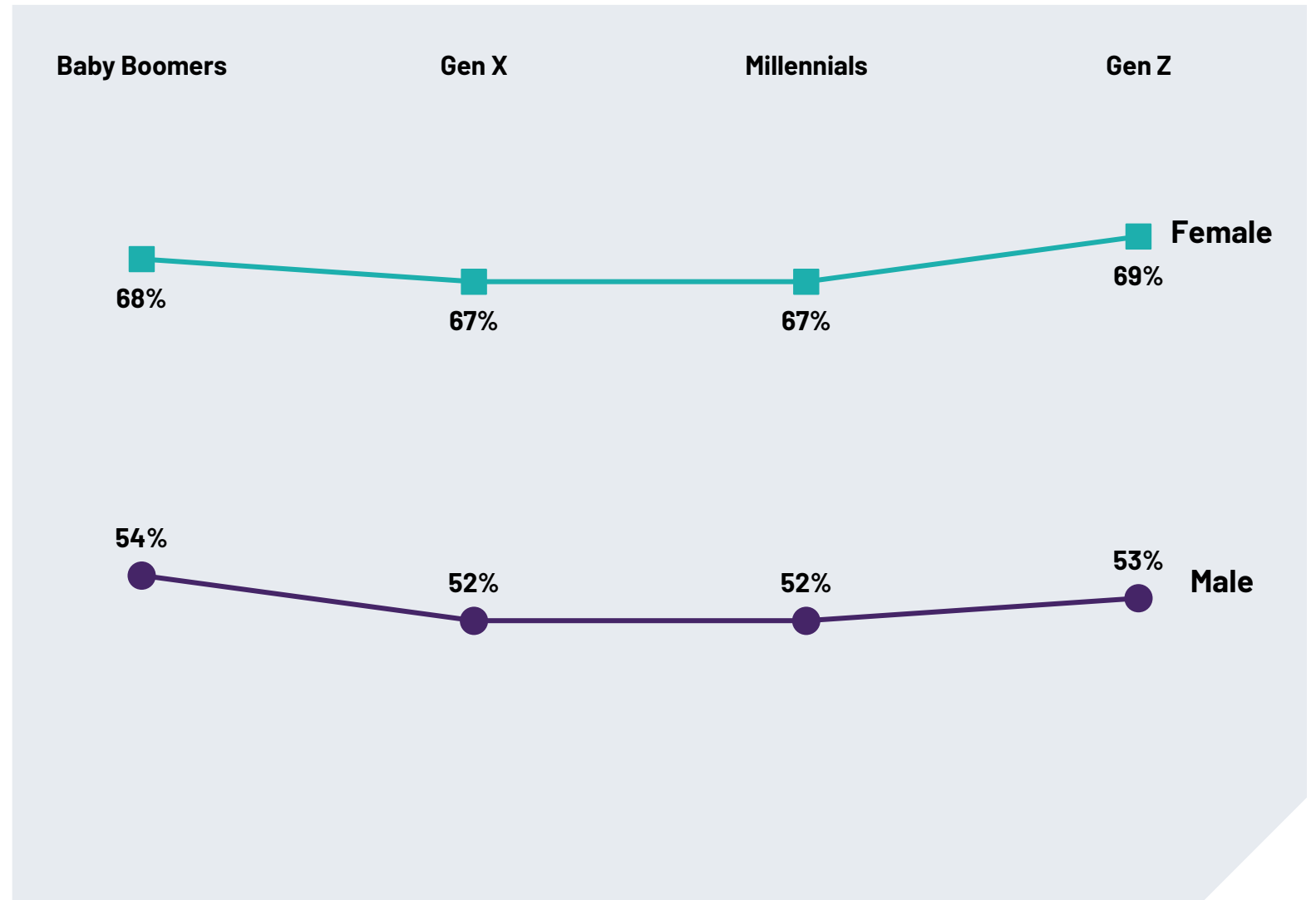

Around two in three women of all generations agree that things would work better if more women held positions with responsibilities in government and companies. This share falls to around one in two men, though also with little generational variation.



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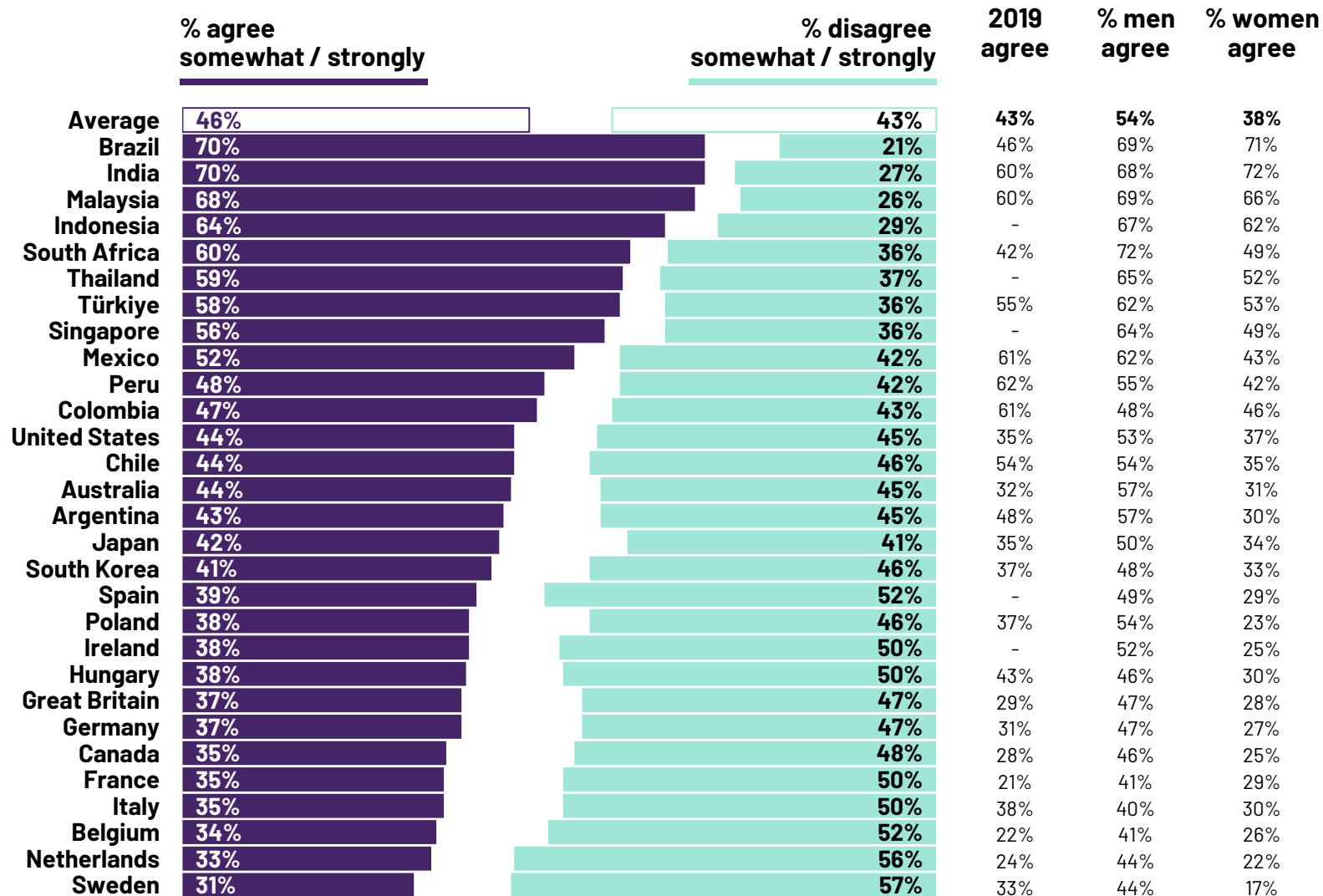

Men (54%) are more likely than women (36%) to agree with this statement.



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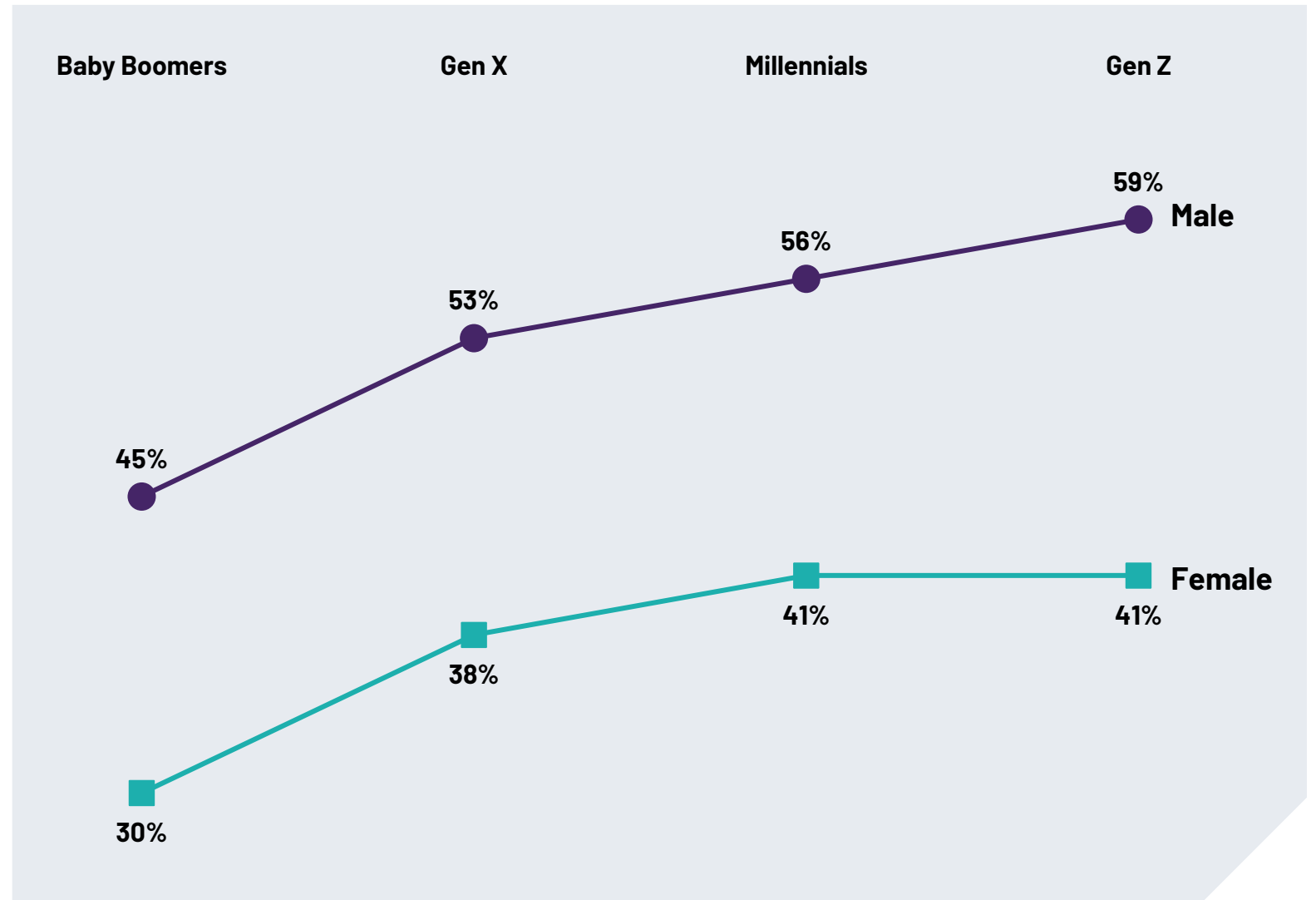

Across age groups, men are more likely than women to think men are being expected to do too much for gender equality. Younger men are more likely to agree with this statement than older men.



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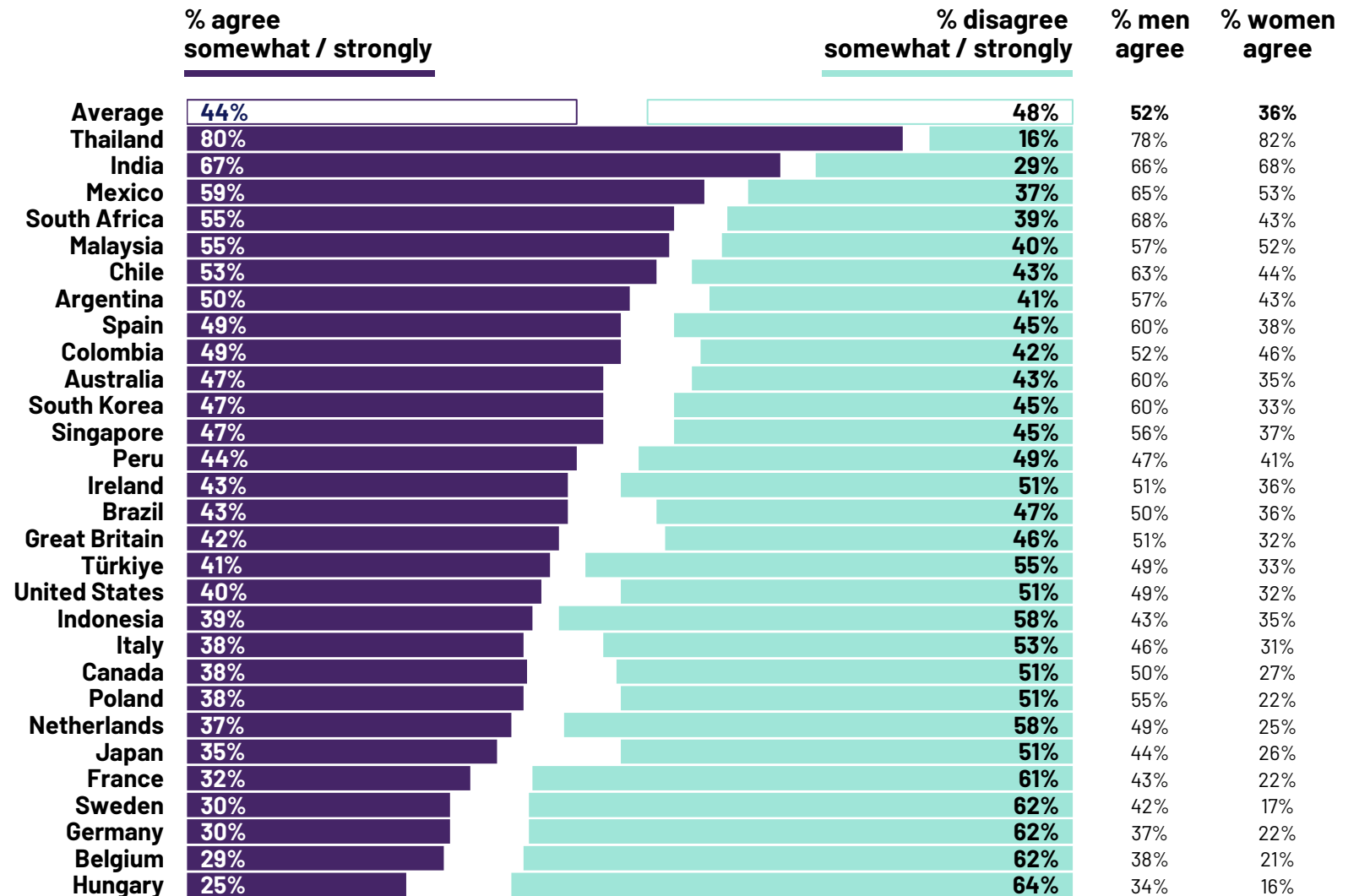

Across a 29-country average, people are divided on whether we have gone so far in promoting women's equality that we are discriminating against men (44% agree vs. 48% disagree).

Just over half of men (53%) agreed with this statement compared to 35% of women.



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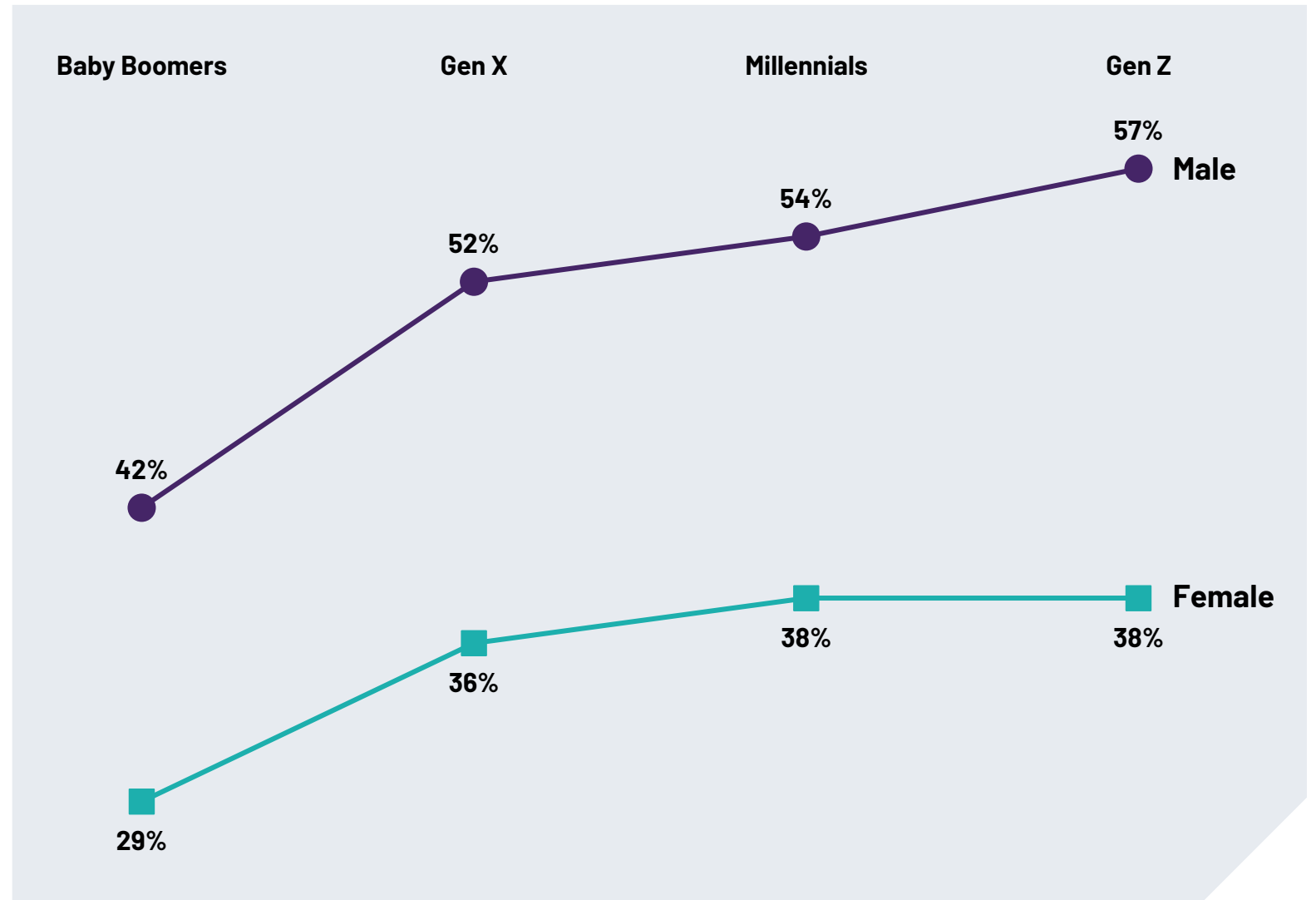

There is a 19-percentage point difference between Gen Z men and Gen Z women when it comes to thinking women's equality discriminates against men, with 57% of Gen Z men saying this is the case, compared to 38% of Gen Z women.



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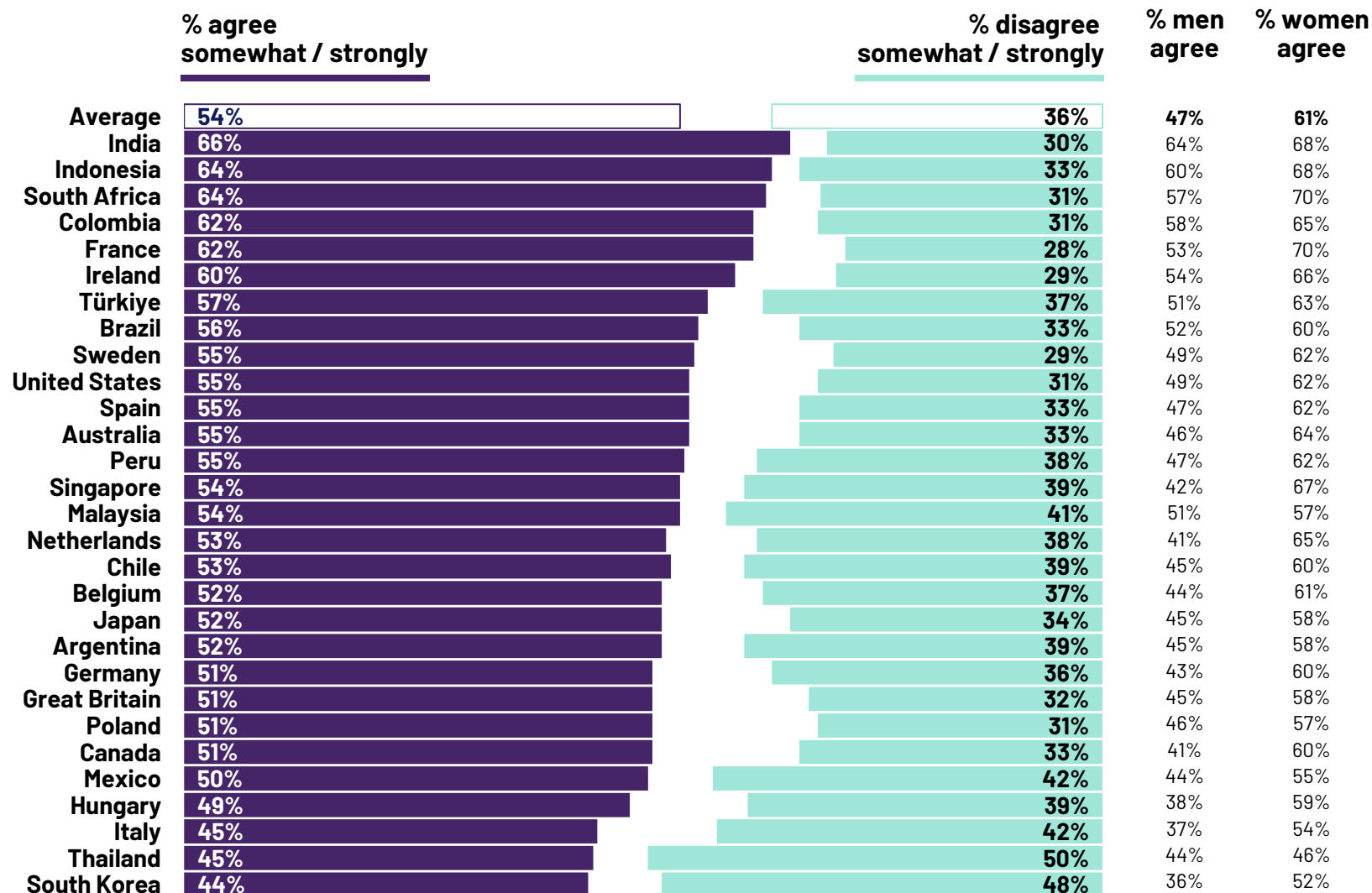

Across a 29-country average, more than half of people (54%) think that women won't achieve equality in their country unless there are more female leaders in business and government.

Women are more likely than men to agree with this statement (60% vs. 47%).



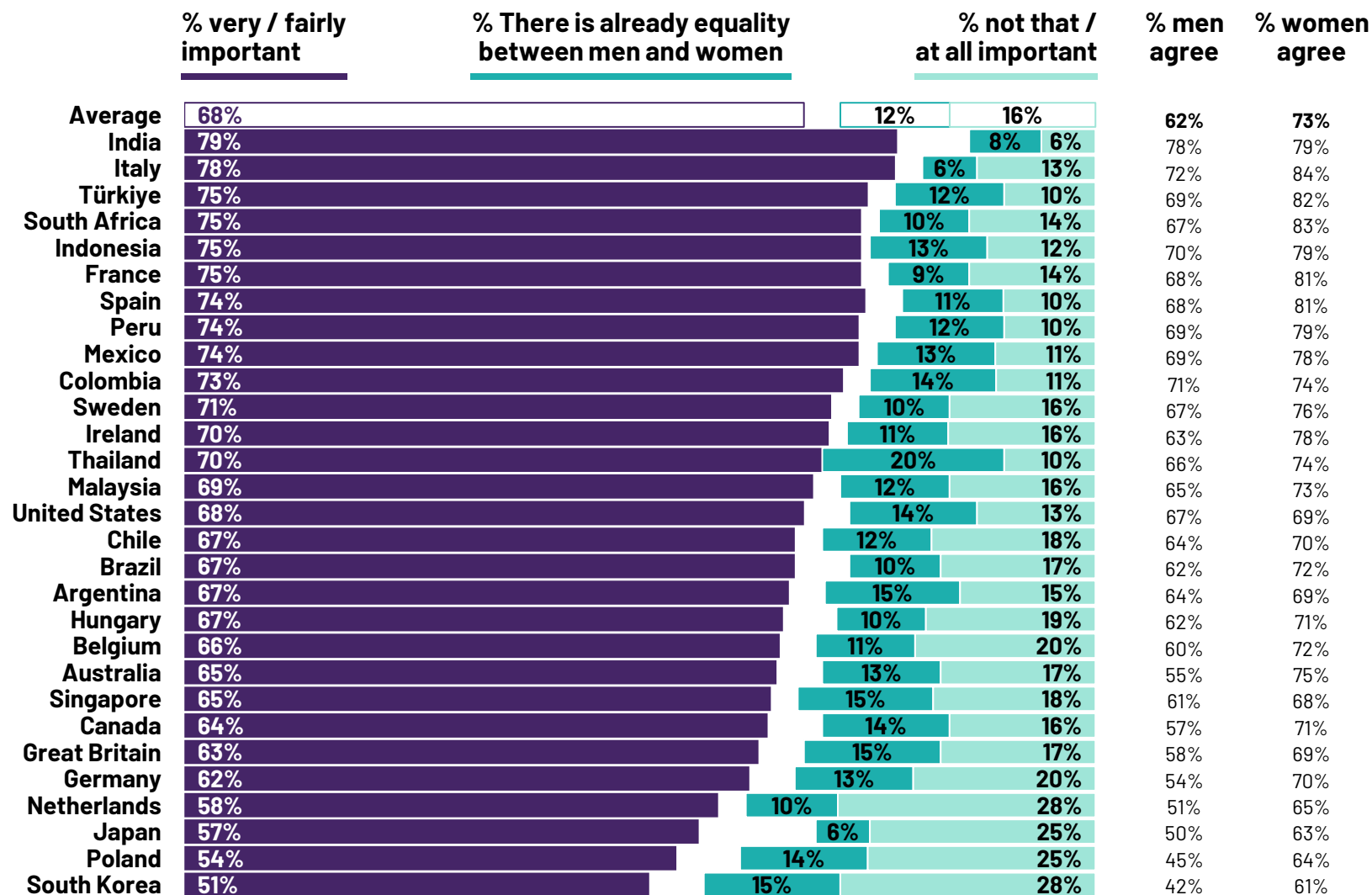

Two in three people (68%) say that achieving equality between men and women is important to them personally, with fewer than one in five (16%) saying it's not important.

Women (74%) are more likely than men (62%) to say gender equality is important to them personally.



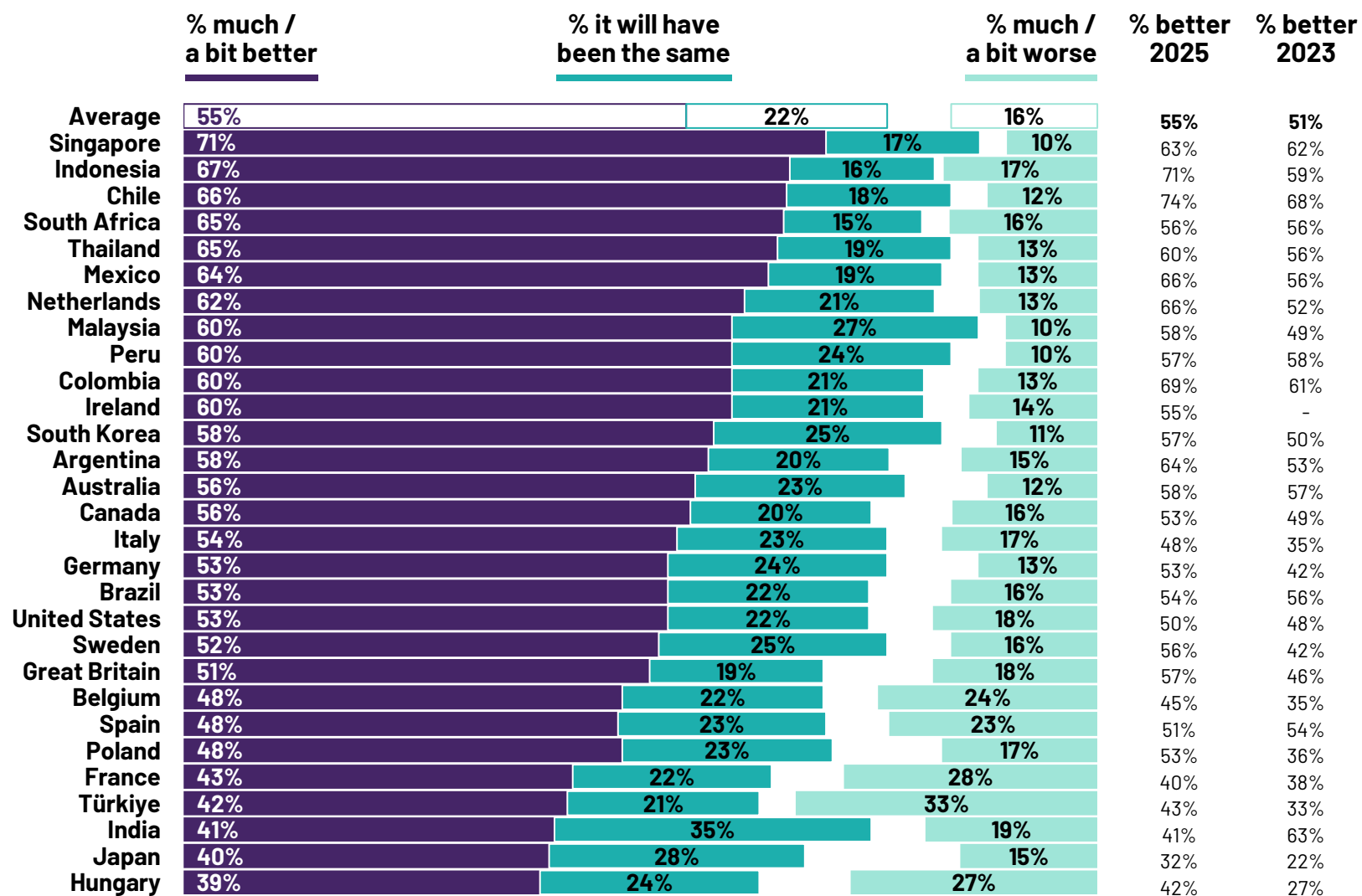
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FREEDOM AND FUTURE

To what extent, if at all, do you feel that young women today in ... will have had a better or worse life than women from their parents' generation, or will it have been the same?

More than half of people across the 29-country average think that young women will have had a better life than women from their parents' generation in their country (55%), on a par with 2025. By contrast, one in five (22%) think it will have been the same, and 16% think it will have been worse.

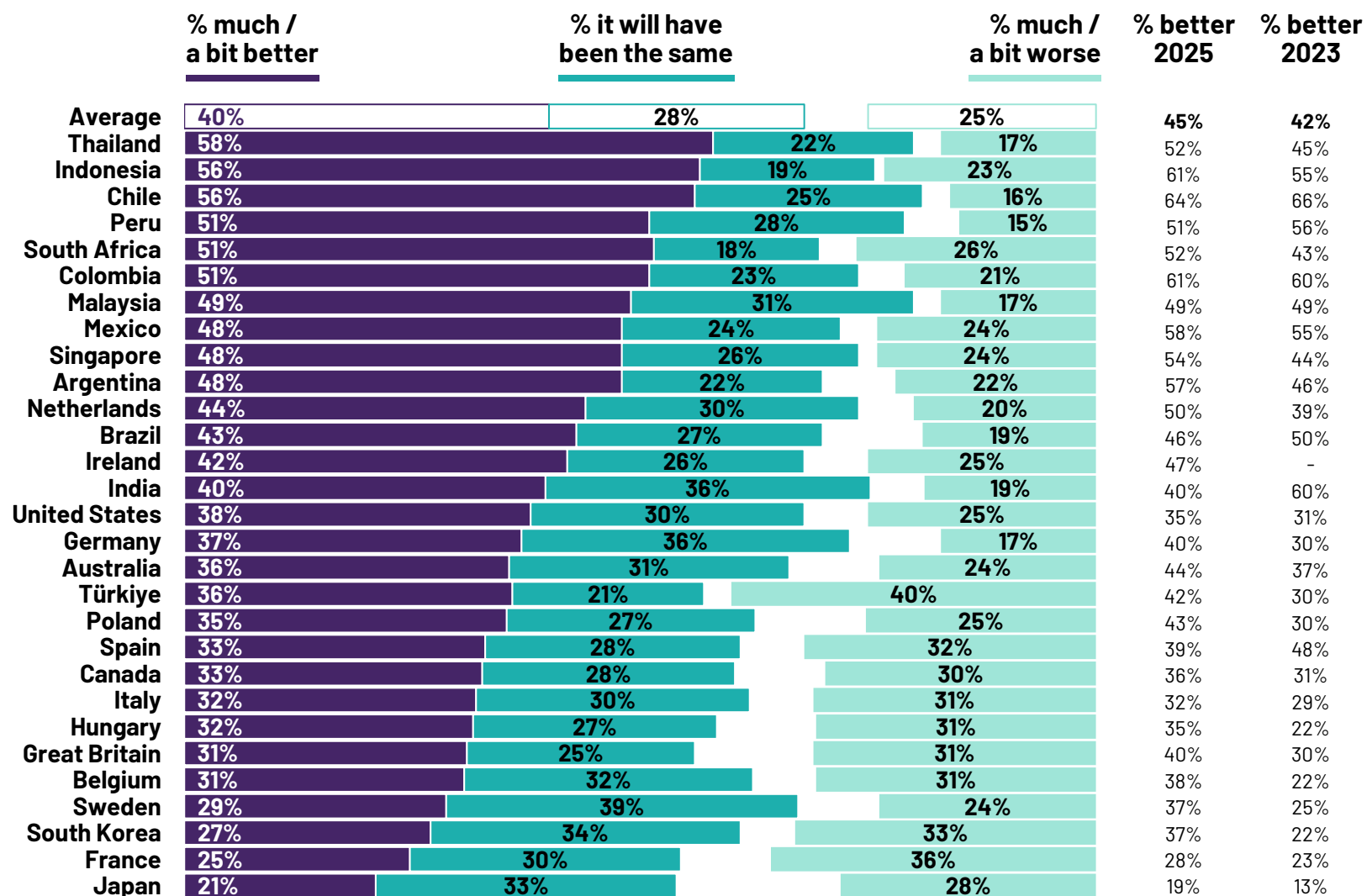

Four in 10 people across the 29-country average think that young men will have had a better life than women from their parents' generation in their country (40%), a decline of 5ppts from 2025. By contrast, around three in 10 (28%) think it will have been the same, and 25% think it will have been worse.

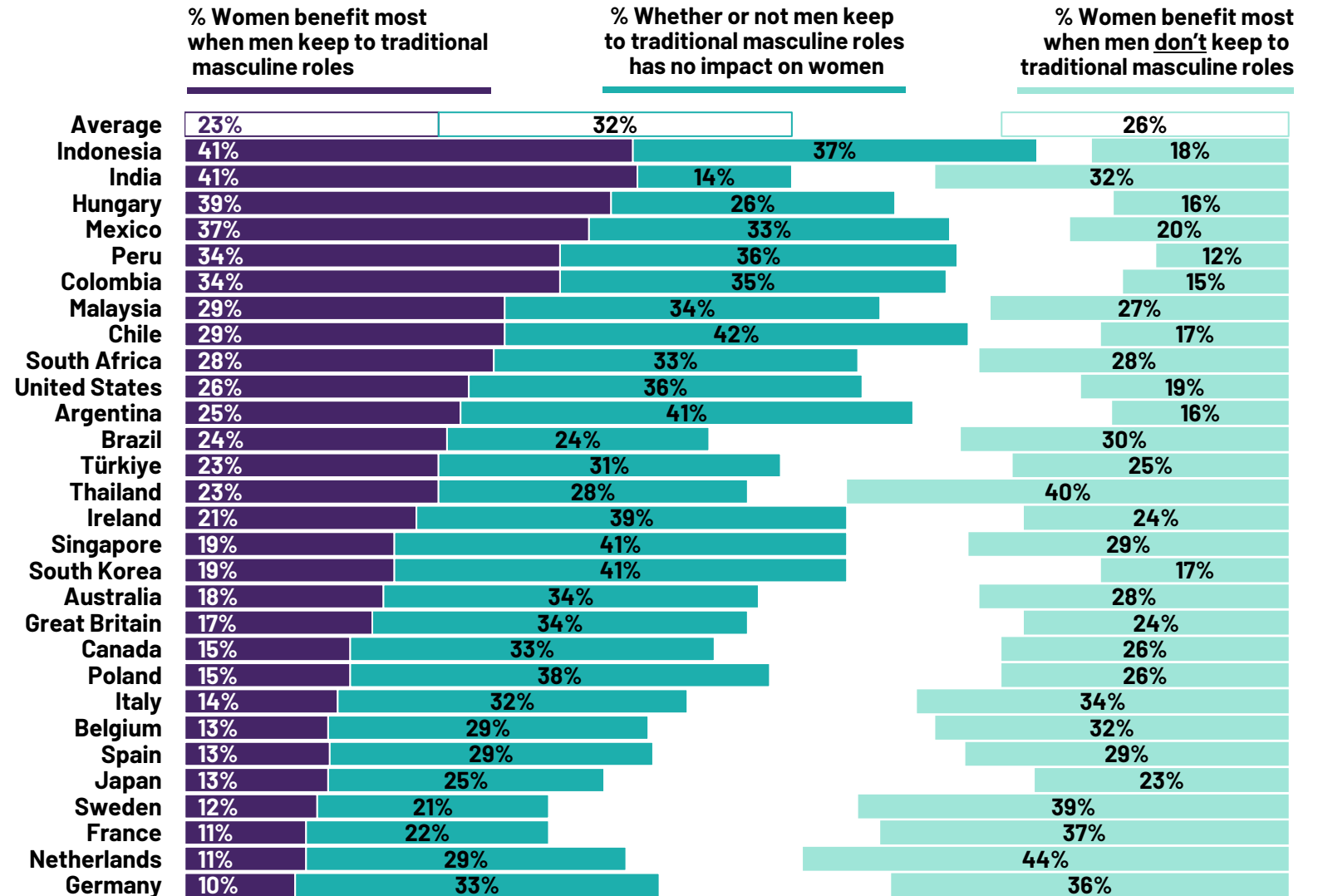

Around one in three (32%) people across the 29-country surveyed think men keeping traditional masculine roles has no impact on women. The remainder are divided between thinking that women benefit the most when men keep traditional masculine roles (23%), as well as that women benefit the most when men do not keep traditional masculine roles (26%).

Which of the following statements comes closest to your view about women in [COUNTRY]?

Men are divided as to whether women benefit more when men do or don't keep to traditional masculine roles (25% to 24%). By contrast, a larger share of women perceive women to do better when men don't keep to traditional masculine roles (29%) than when they do (20%).

Baby Boomers are twice as likely to think that it's better for women when men don't keep traditional masculine roles (28%) than when they do (14%). Other generations are divided roughly equally, with around one in four saying that each is more beneficial to women.

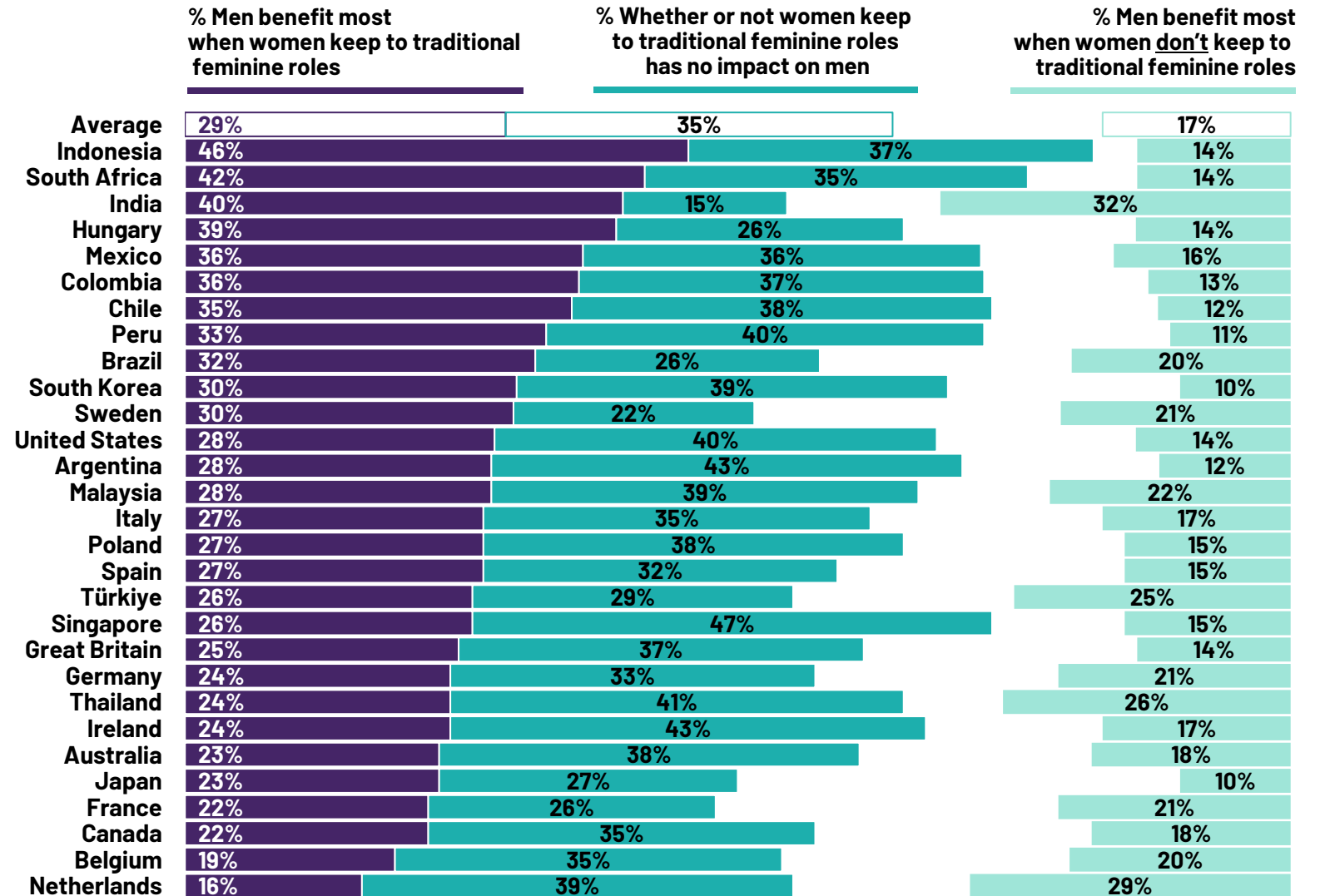

Around three in 10 across the 29-country average think that men benefit the most when women keep to traditional feminine roles (29%), while nearly one in five (17%) think men benefit the most when women do not keep to these roles. More than one in three (35%) say it has no impact on men if women keep to these roles or not.



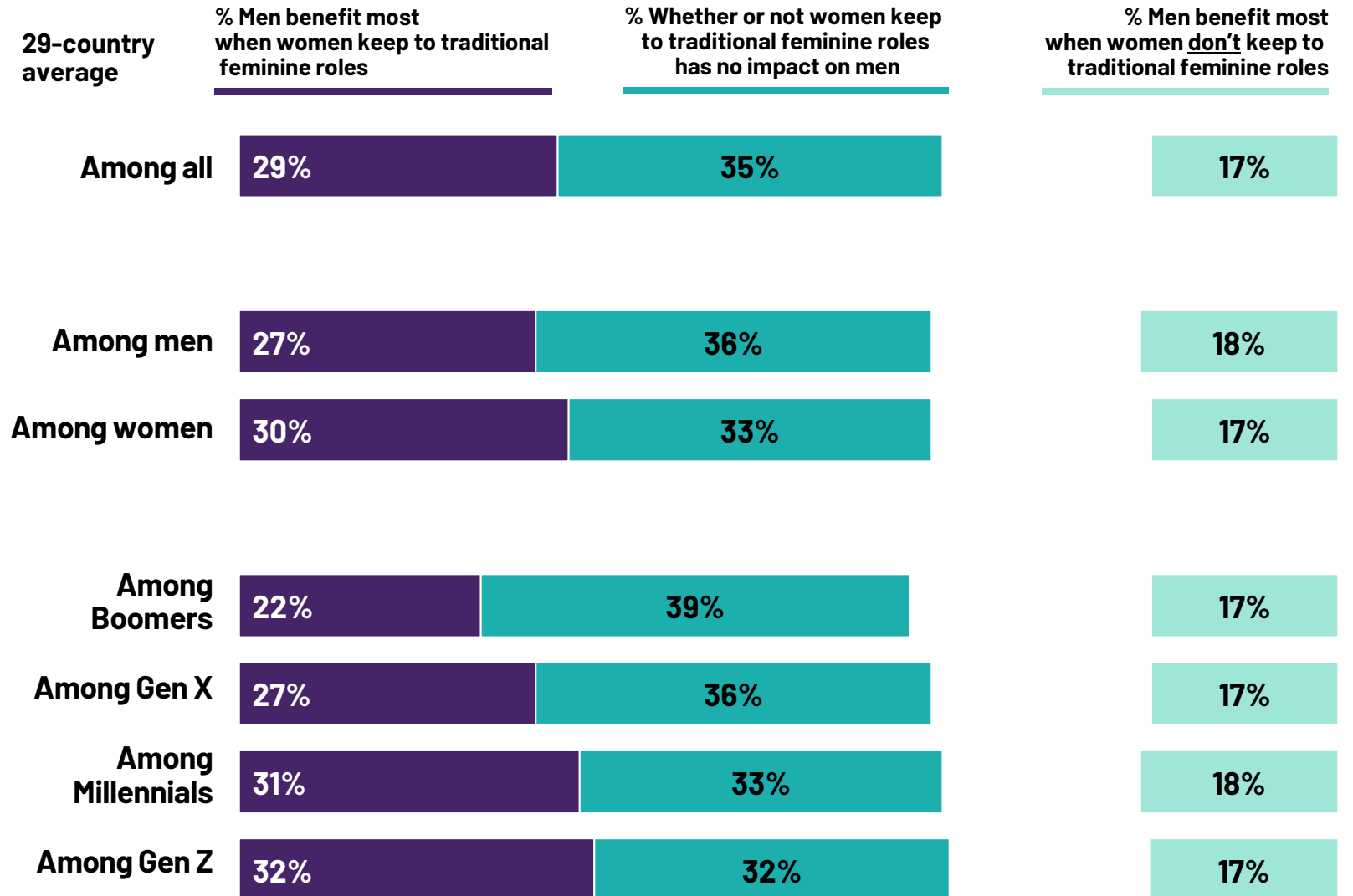

Among both men and women, around three in 10 think men benefit most when women keep to traditional feminine roles, as compared to roughly one in five who think men benefit most when they don't.

Millennials and Gen Z are more likely than either Generation X or Boomers to say that men benefit most when women keep to traditional feminine roles. Across generations, just under one in five think men benefit most when women don't keep to traditional feminine roles.



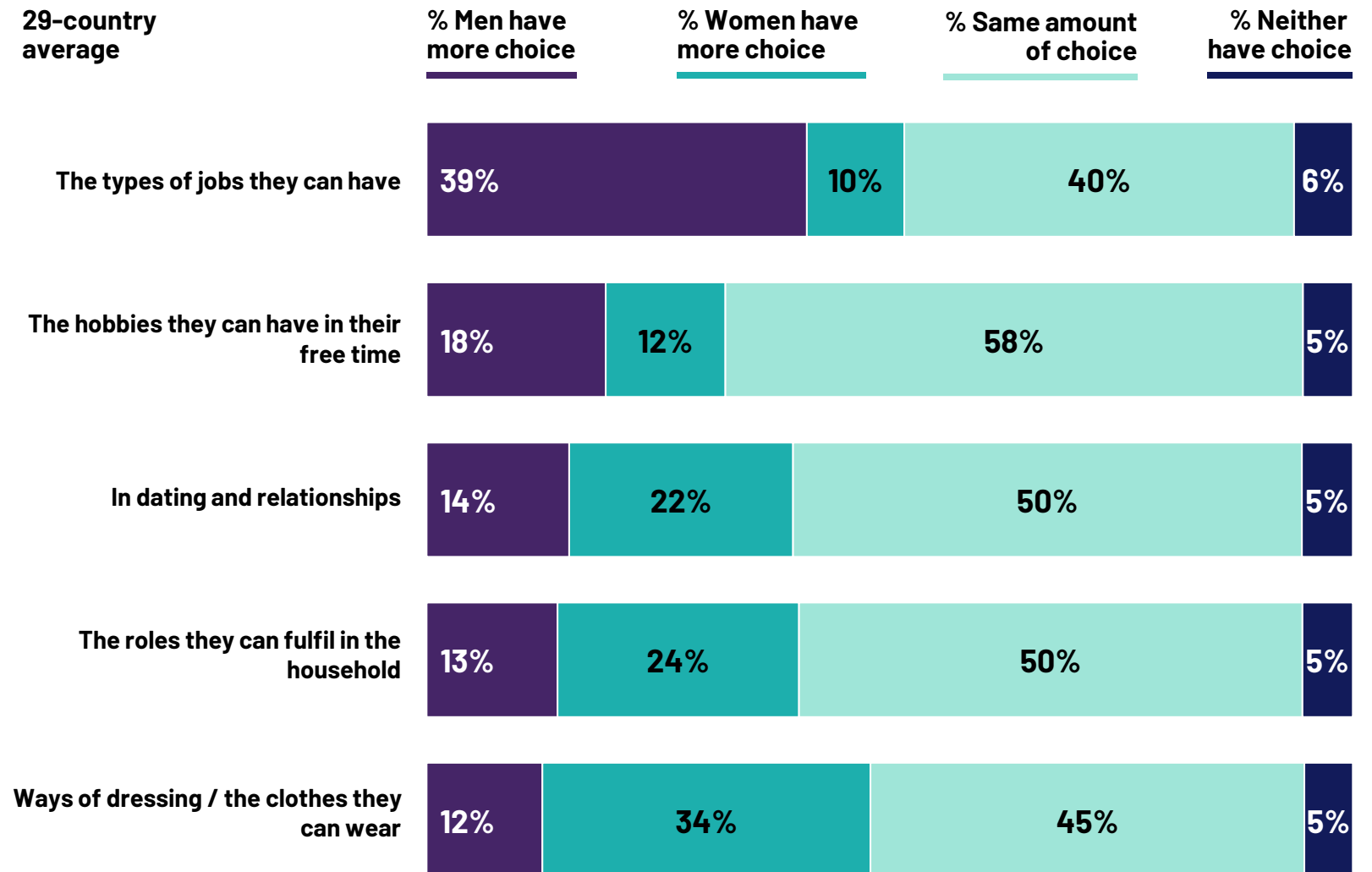

Across 29 countries, the largest share of respondents think that men and women have the same amount of choice when it comes to the hobbies they can have in their free time, dating and relationships, the roles they can fulfil in the household, and the clothes they can wear.

Of the remainder, a larger share feel that women have more choice when it comes to dating and relationships (22%), the roles they can fulfil in the household (24%), and the clothes they can wear (34%). By contrast, men are considered to have more choice when it comes to hobbies (18%) and the types of jobs they can have (39%).



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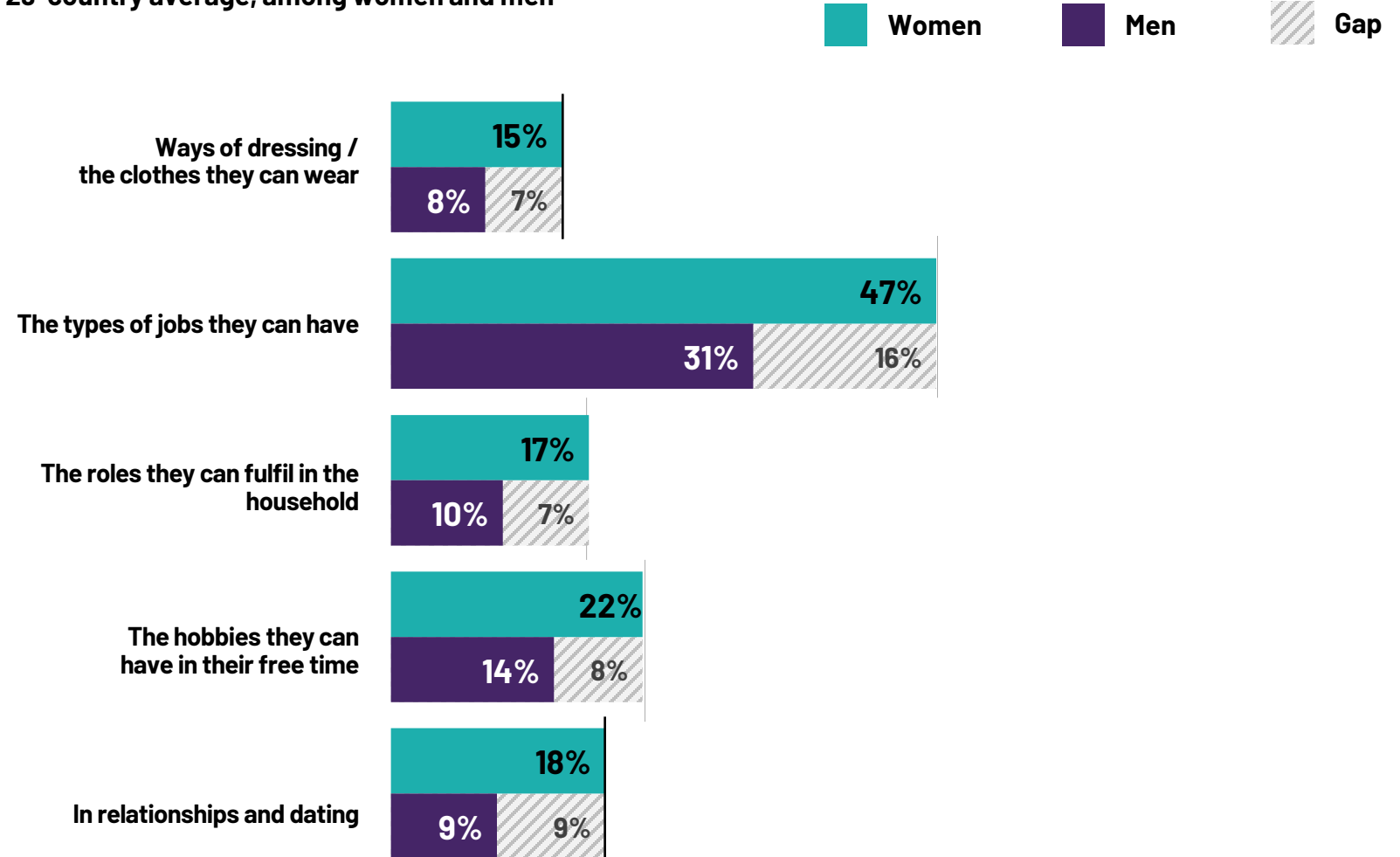

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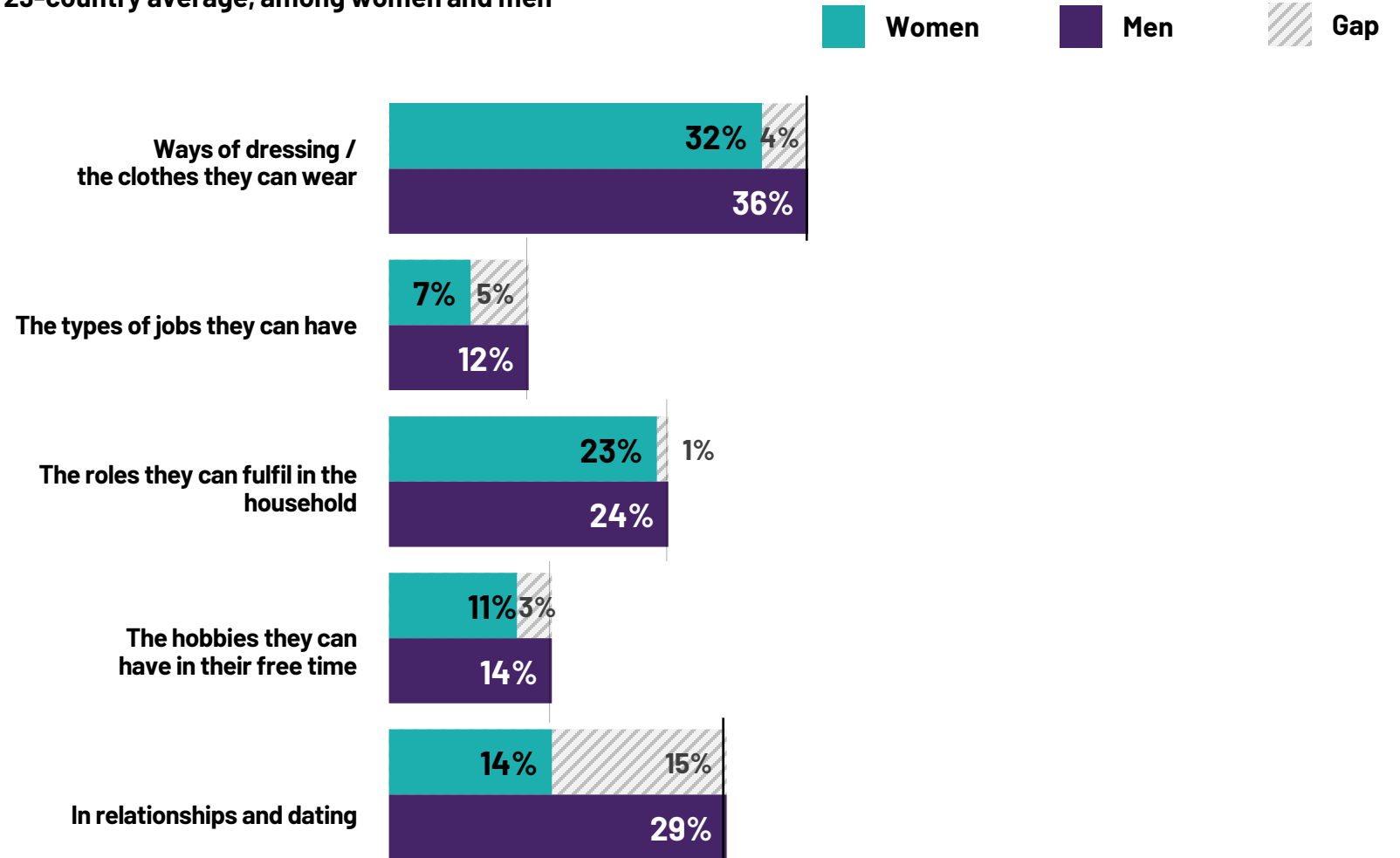

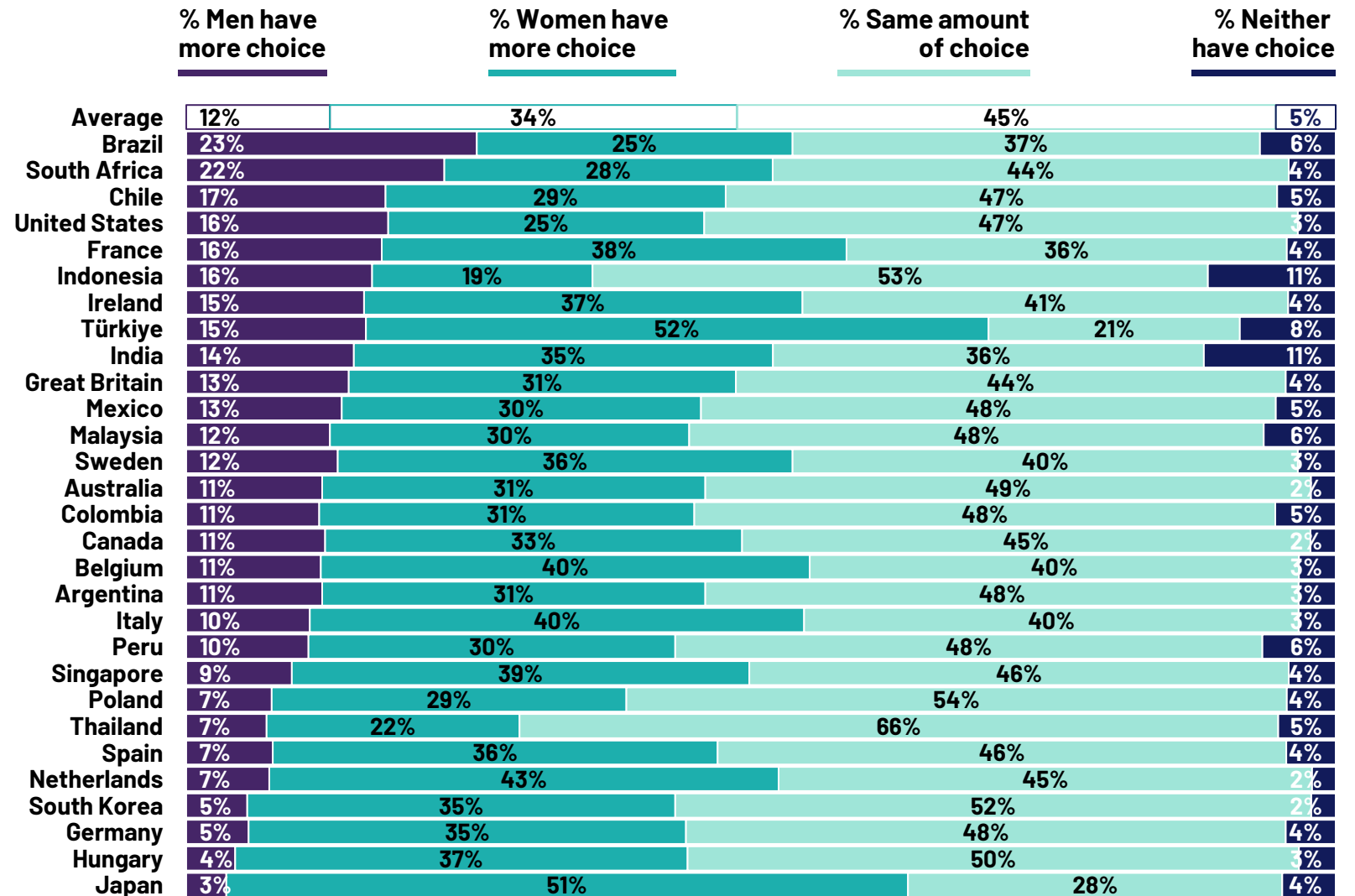

Ways of dressing / the clothes they can wear

Women are broadly considered to have more choice than men when it comes to how they can dress, with the largest disparities seen in Japan (+48ppts), Türkiye (+37ppts), the Netherlands (+36ppts), and Hungary (+33ppts).



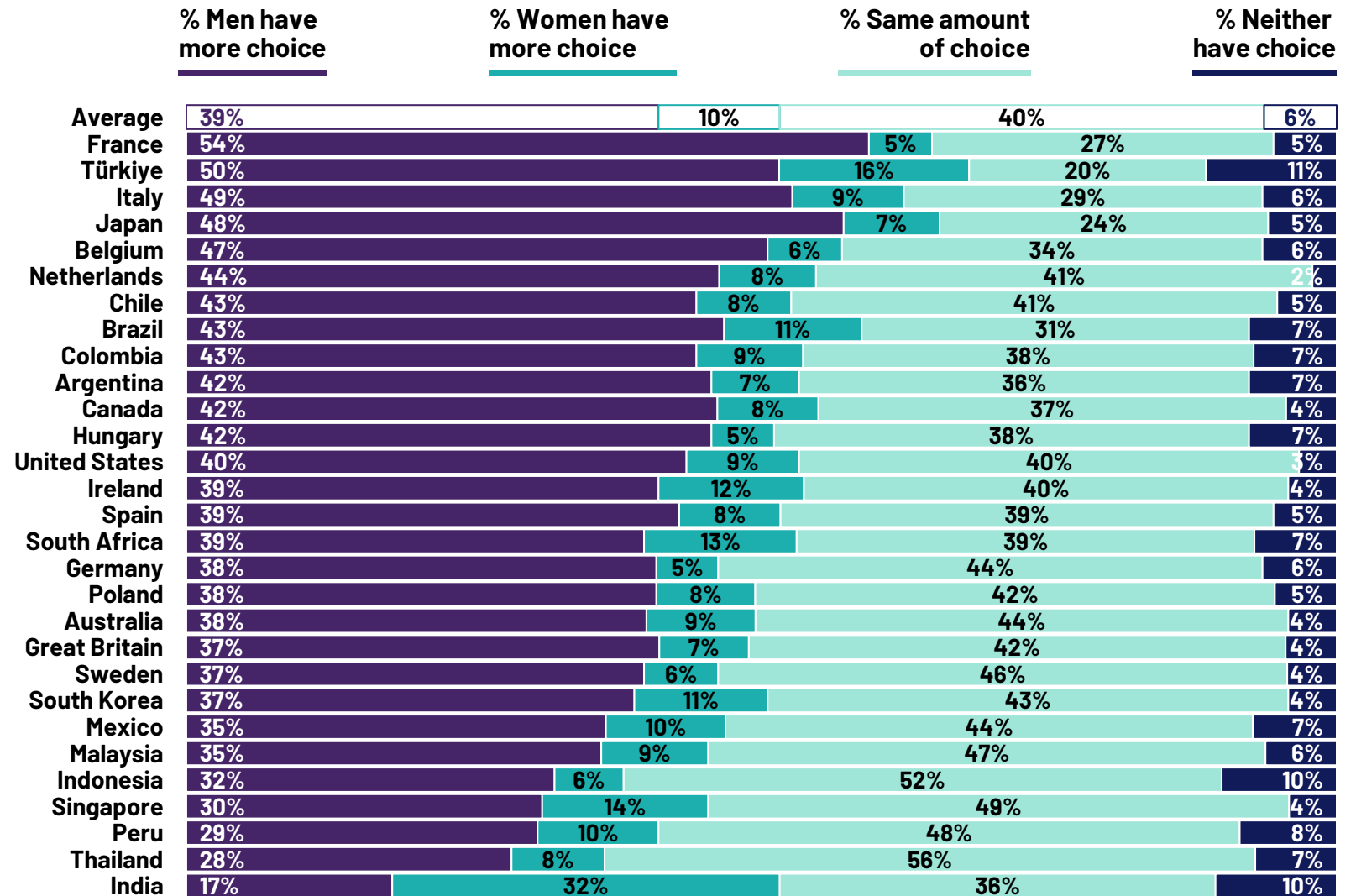

The types of jobs they can have

Across the 29-country average, respondents were four times as likely to say that men have more choice about the types of jobs they can have (39%) than to say that women have more choice in this area (10%). This disparity is greatest in France (+49ppts), Japan (+41ppts), Belgium (+41ppts), and Italy (+40ppts).



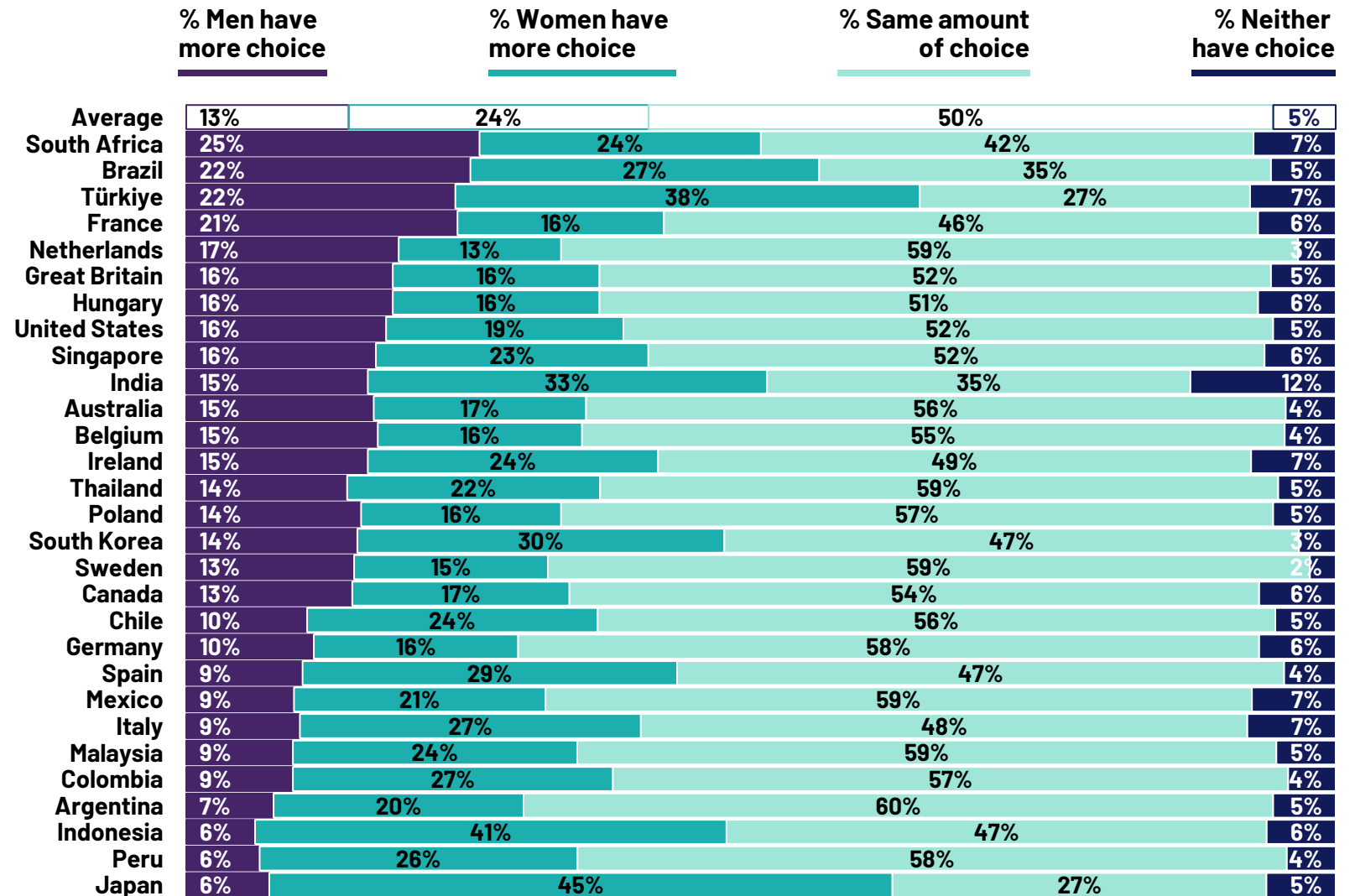

One in two across the 29-country average think that men and women have the same amount of choice when it comes to the roles they can fulfil in the household. Among the remainder, women are widely considered to have more choice than men.



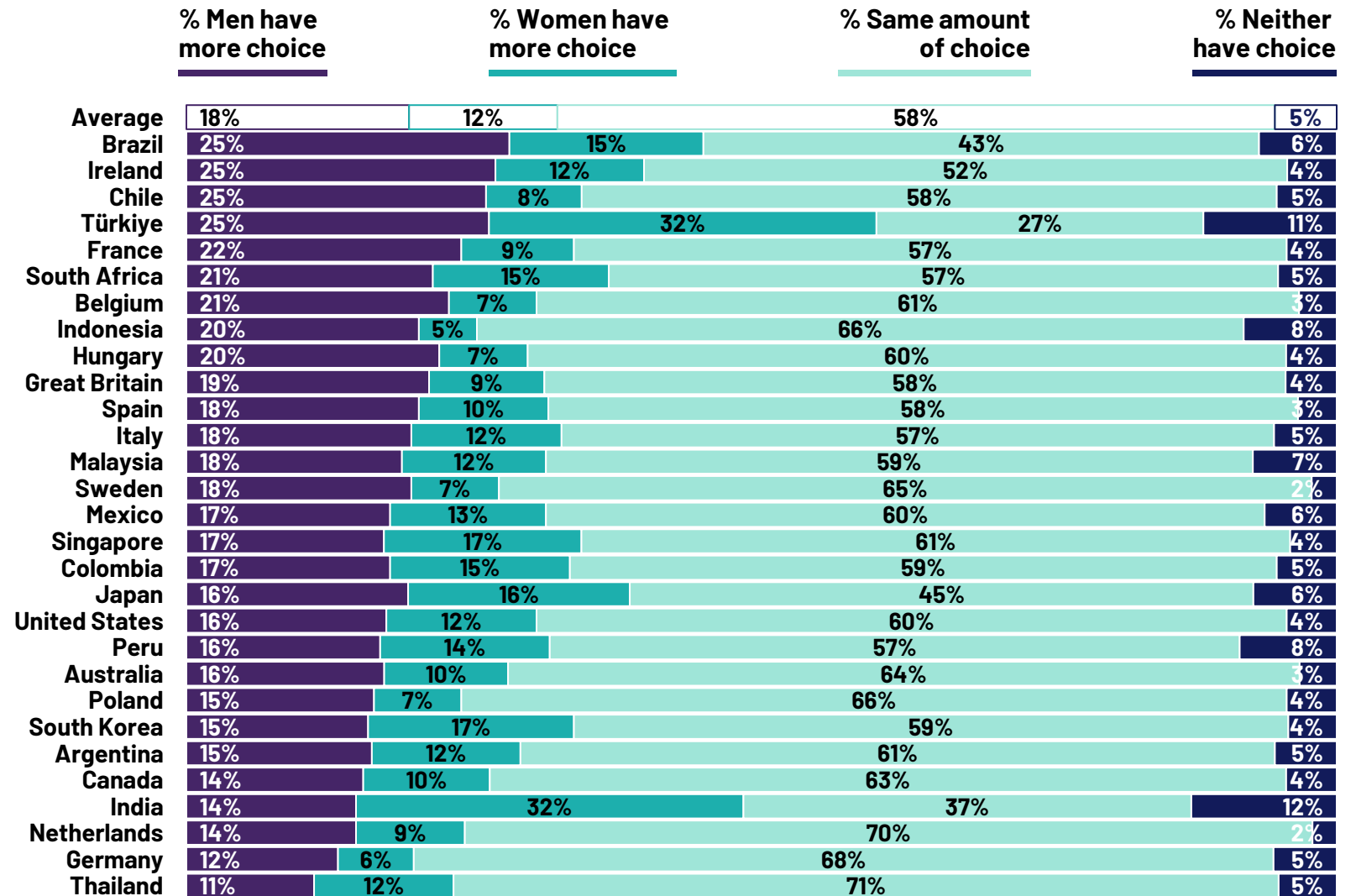

The hobbies they can have in their free time

Around three in five (58%) think that men and women have the same amount of choice when it comes to the hobbies they can have in their free time. Amongst the remainder, a slightly larger share tend to say that men have more choice as compared to women.



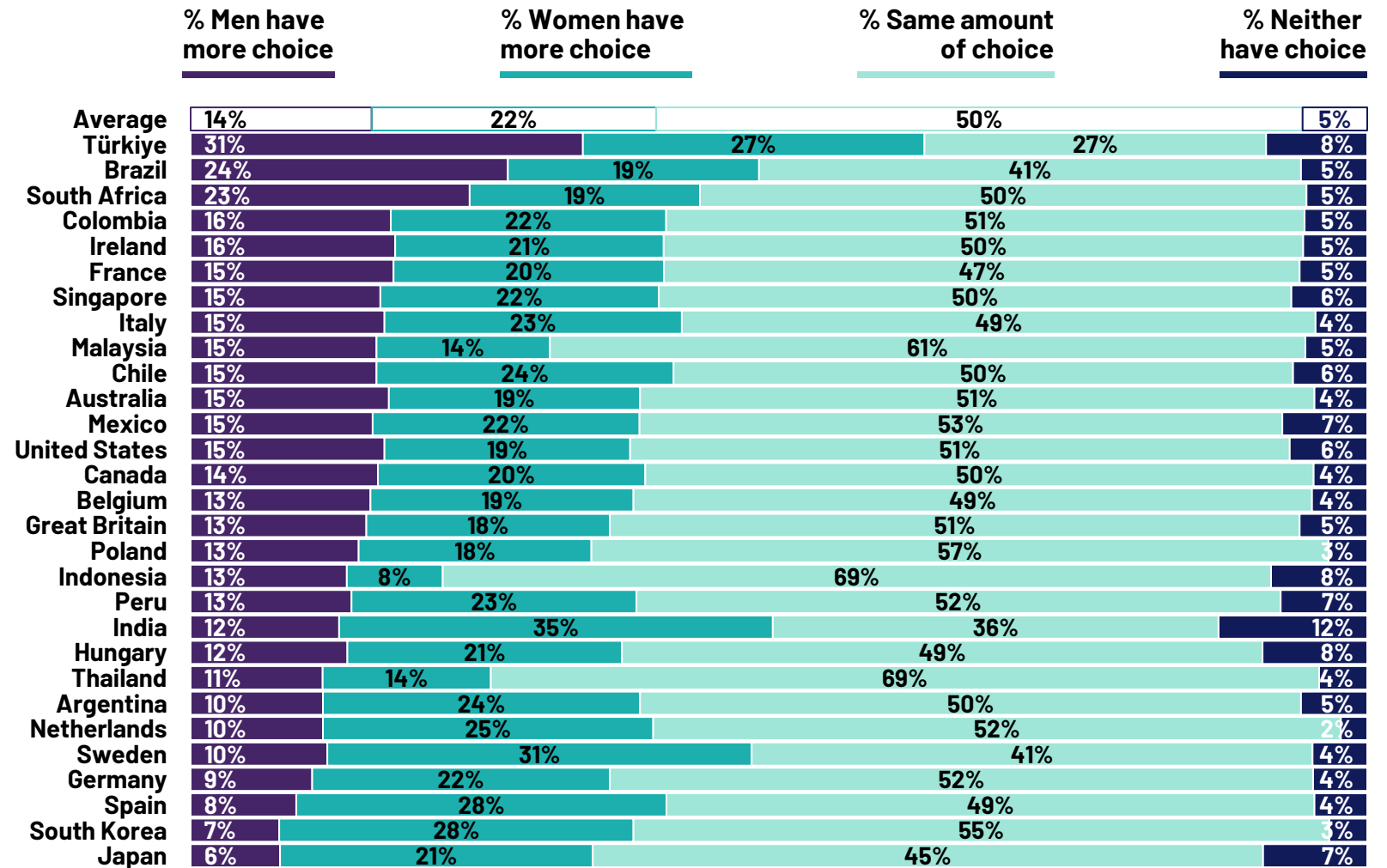

In dating and relationships

Around half of those surveyed think that men and women have the same amount of choice when it comes to dating and relationships. Those who see it as unequal are more likely to say women have more choice relative to men, with the exception of Türkiye, Brazil, and South Africa.

GENDER ROLES

Q

Do you personally believe that men or women should be mainly responsible for each of the following tasks, or do you think they should be shared equally?

Across the 29 countries surveyed, the majority of people think the responsibility of household duties should be shared equally. Earning money as a shared responsibility has the lowest agreement at around 66%, while making important decisions about the household had the highest at 77%.

Childcare (17%) and housework other than childcare (16%) share the highest number of people who think women should be more responsible, while earning money is seen as men's responsibility by 24% of people.



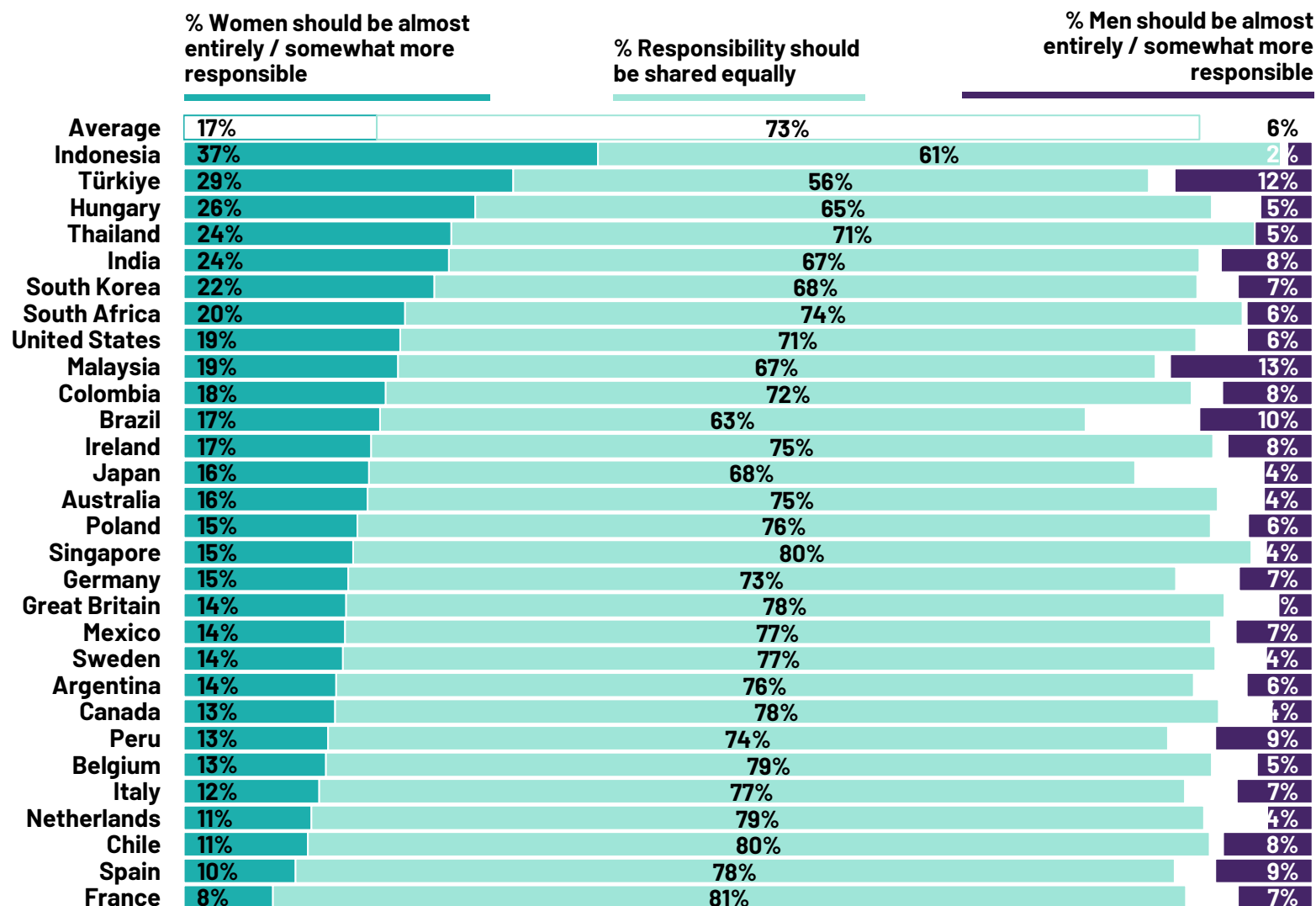

Childcare

While the majority of people in all countries surveyed consider the responsibility for childcare should be shared equally between men and women (73%), the remainder are much more likely to consider it to be women's responsibility (17%) rather than men's (6%).



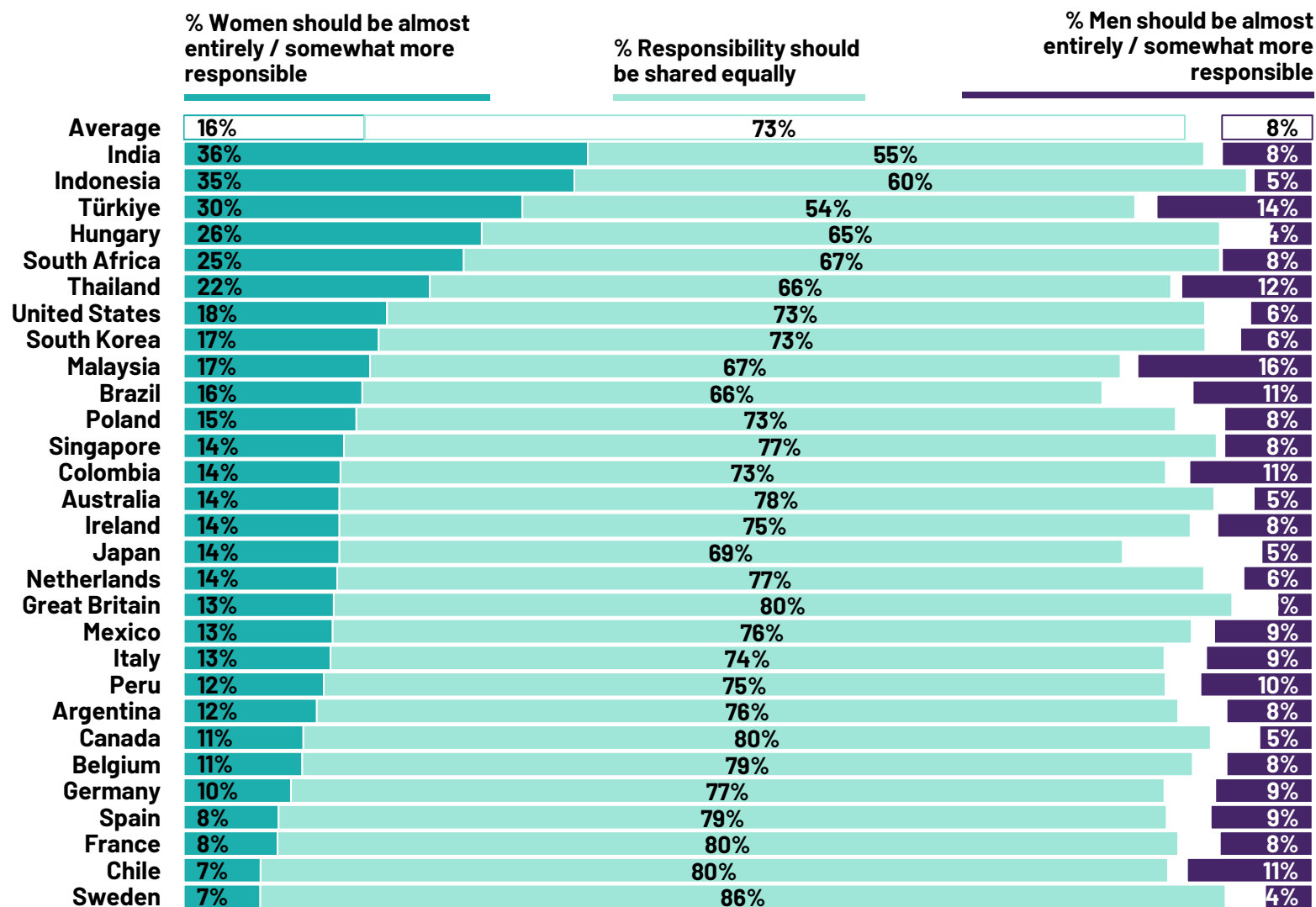

Similar to childcare, the majority of the 29-country average think that housework other than childcare should be shared equally (73%), with a larger share of the remainder attaching responsibility to women (16%) rather than men (8%).



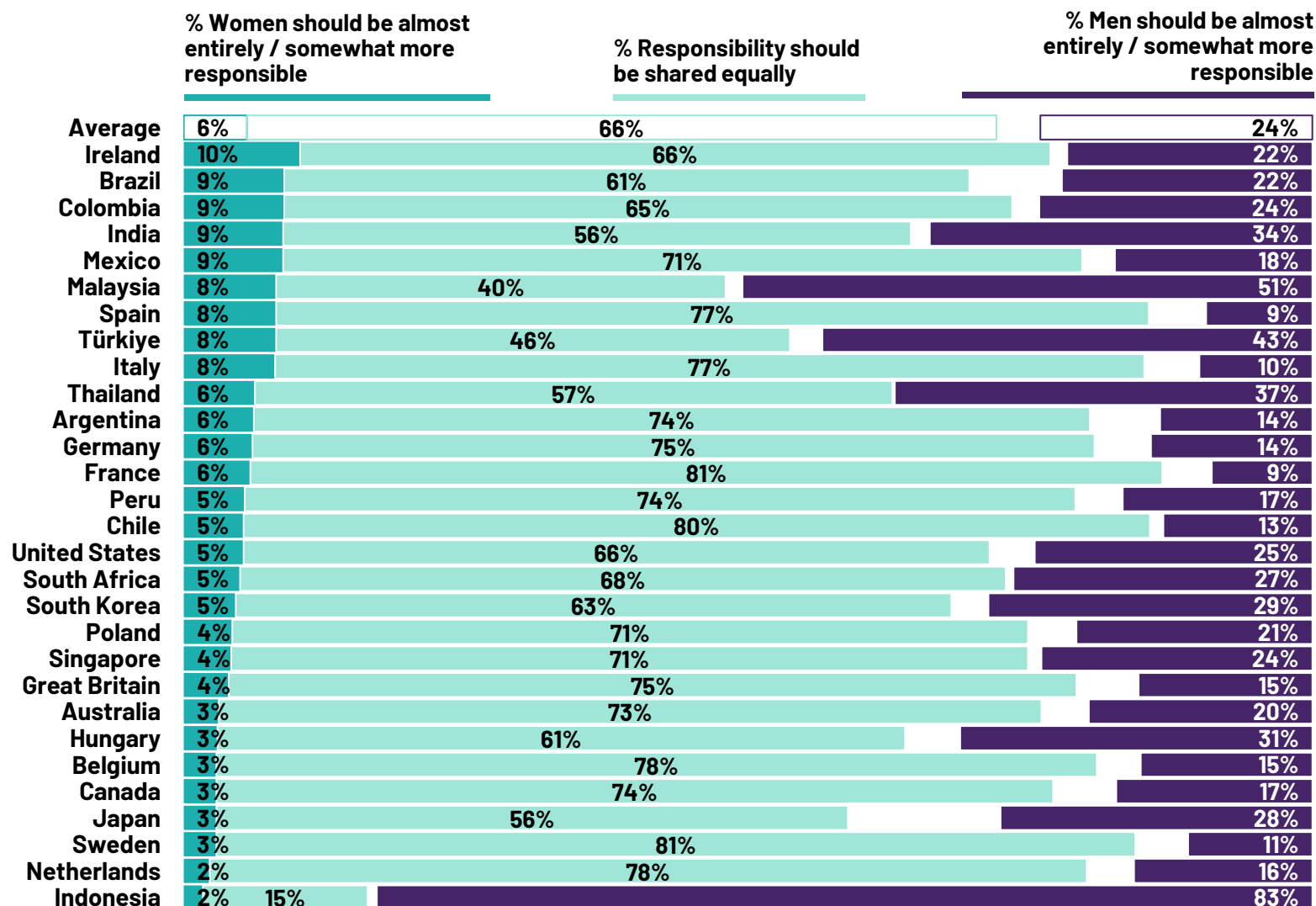

Earning money

On average, the majority of people across all countries surveyed consider the responsibility for earning should be shared equally between men and women (66%), with Malaysia, Türkiye and Indonesia being the only countries where a larger share attribute responsibility to men. Of those who do not feel responsibility should be shared equally, respondents were four times as likely to associate this task with men (24%) rather than women (6%).



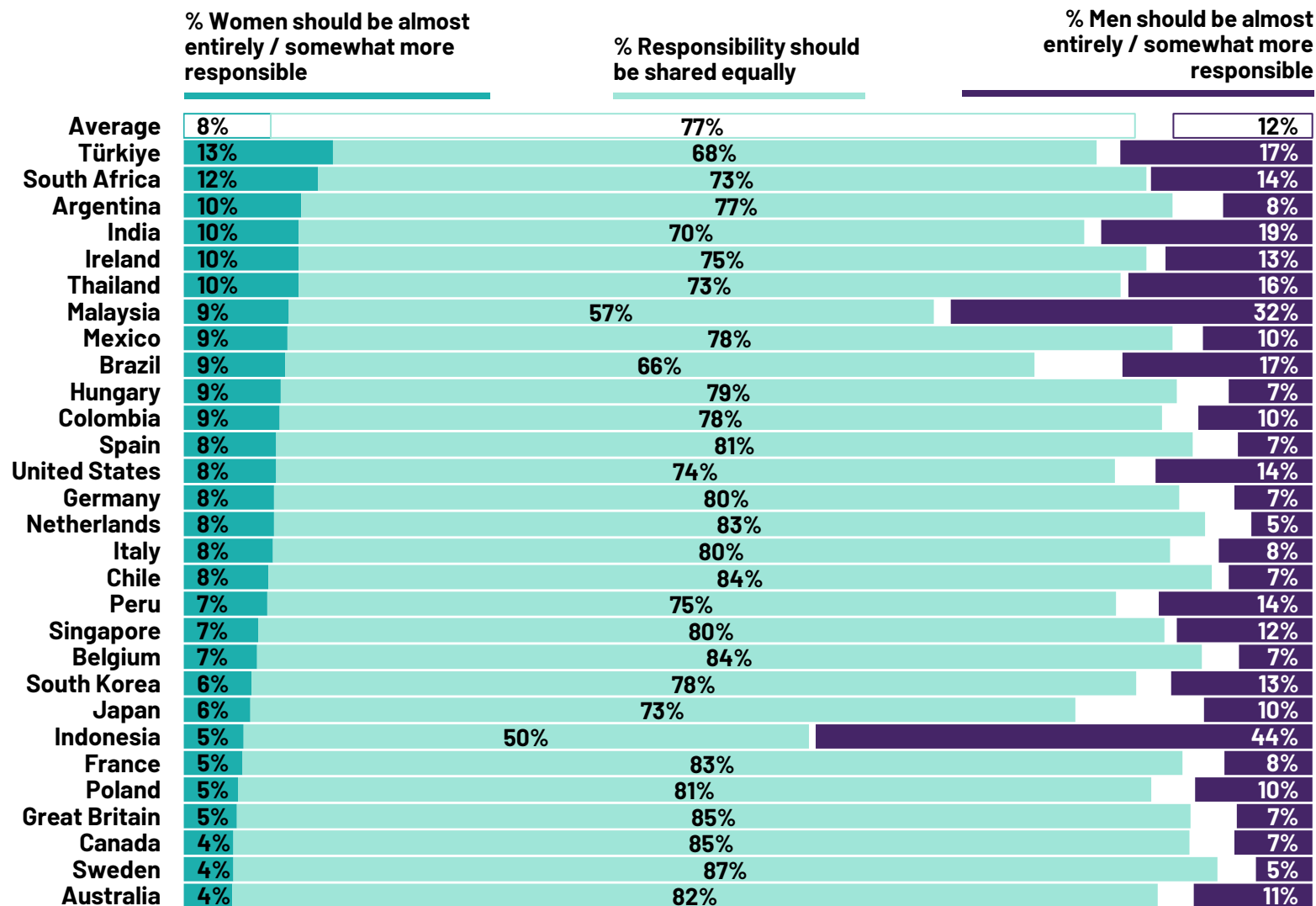

Making important decisions about the household

More than three in four (77%) of those surveyed globally think that the responsibility for making important household decisions should be shared equally between men and women. By contrast, just over one in 10 (12%) think this should sit more with men, while just under one in 10 (8%) think it should sit more with women.

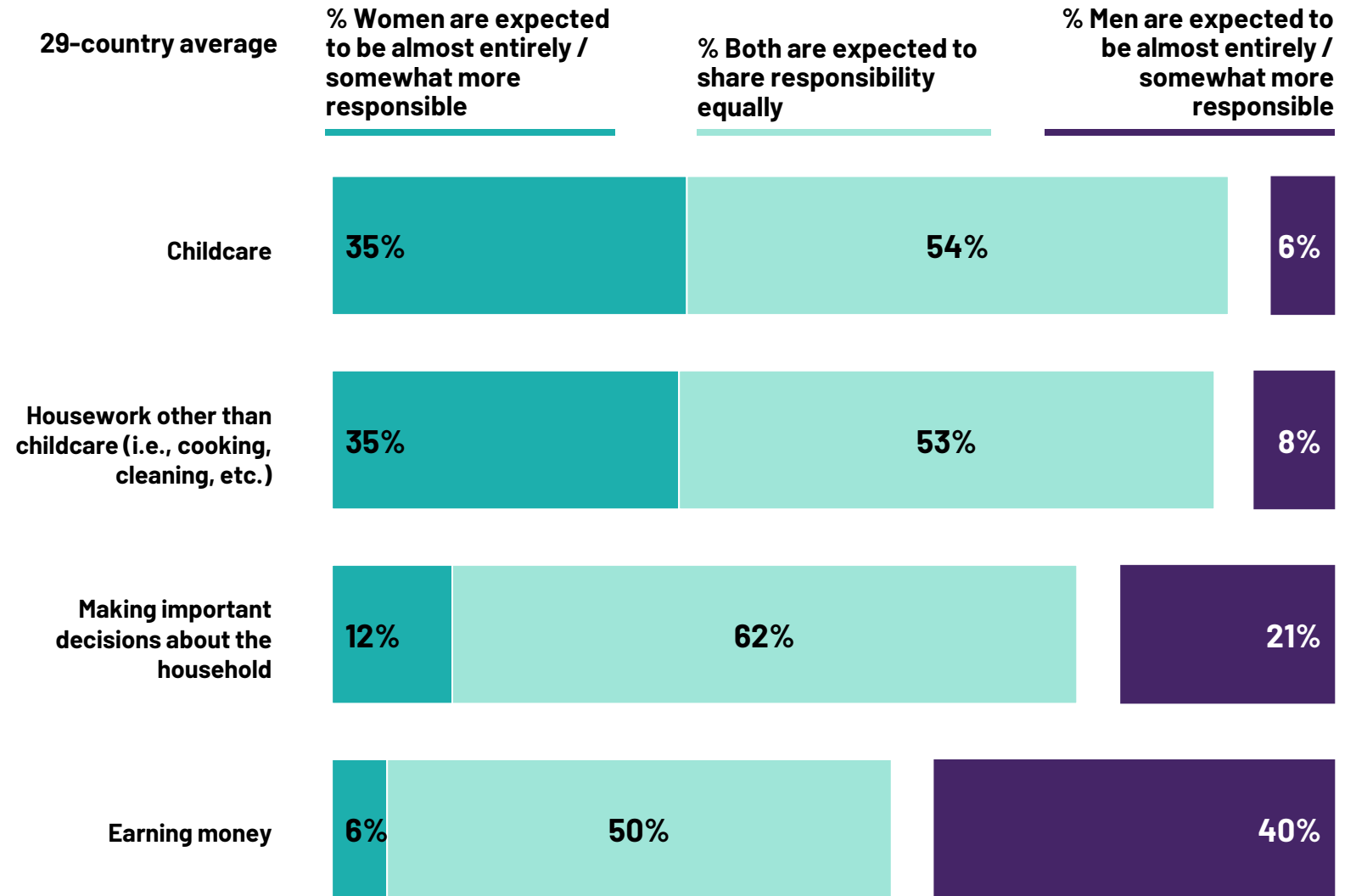

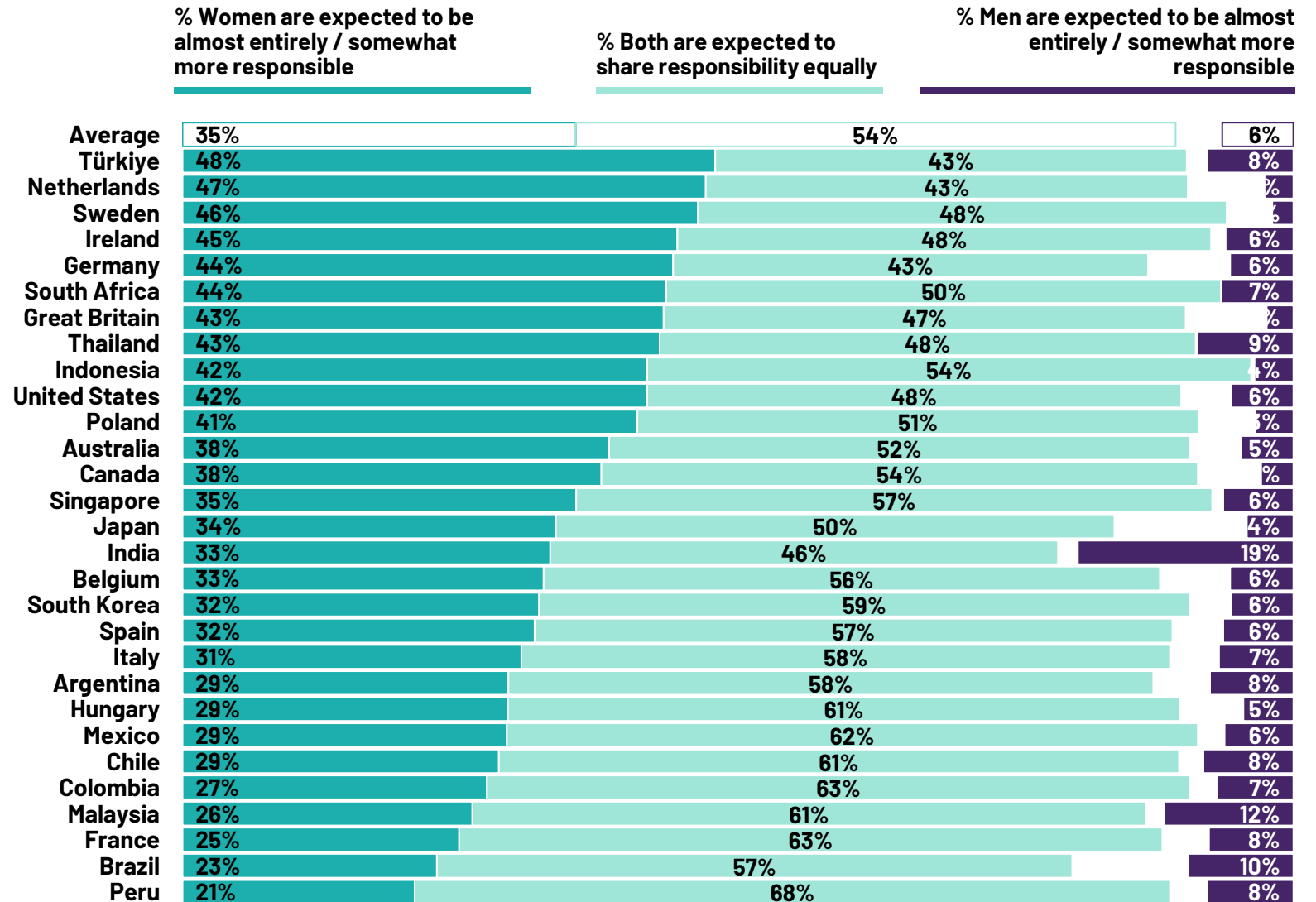

Childcare

Among the 29 countries surveyed, just over half (54%) think that more people in their country will expect men and women to share childcare responsibility equally. A third (35%) think more people will attribute the responsibility to women, while just 6% think more people in their country will attribute the responsibility to men.



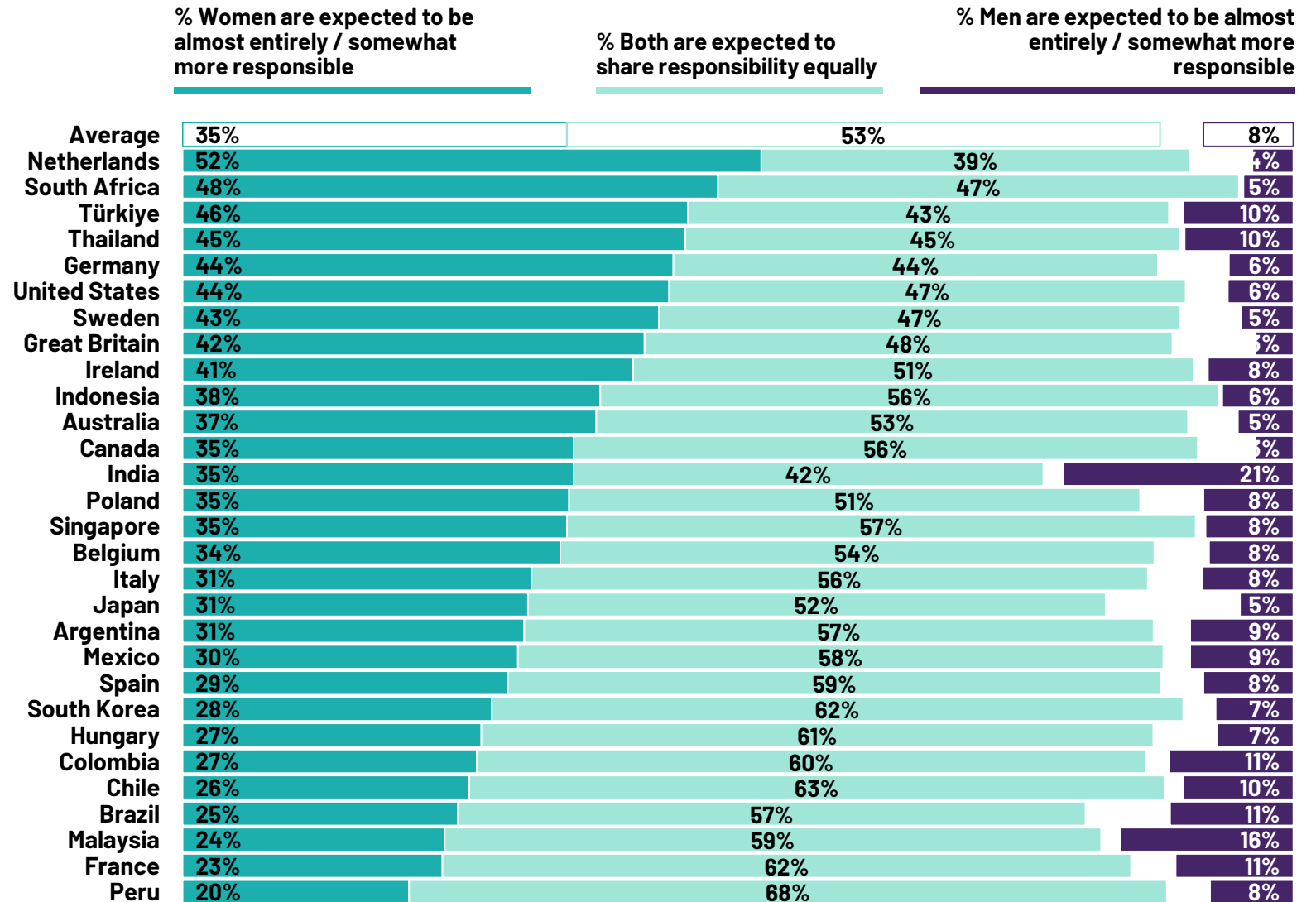

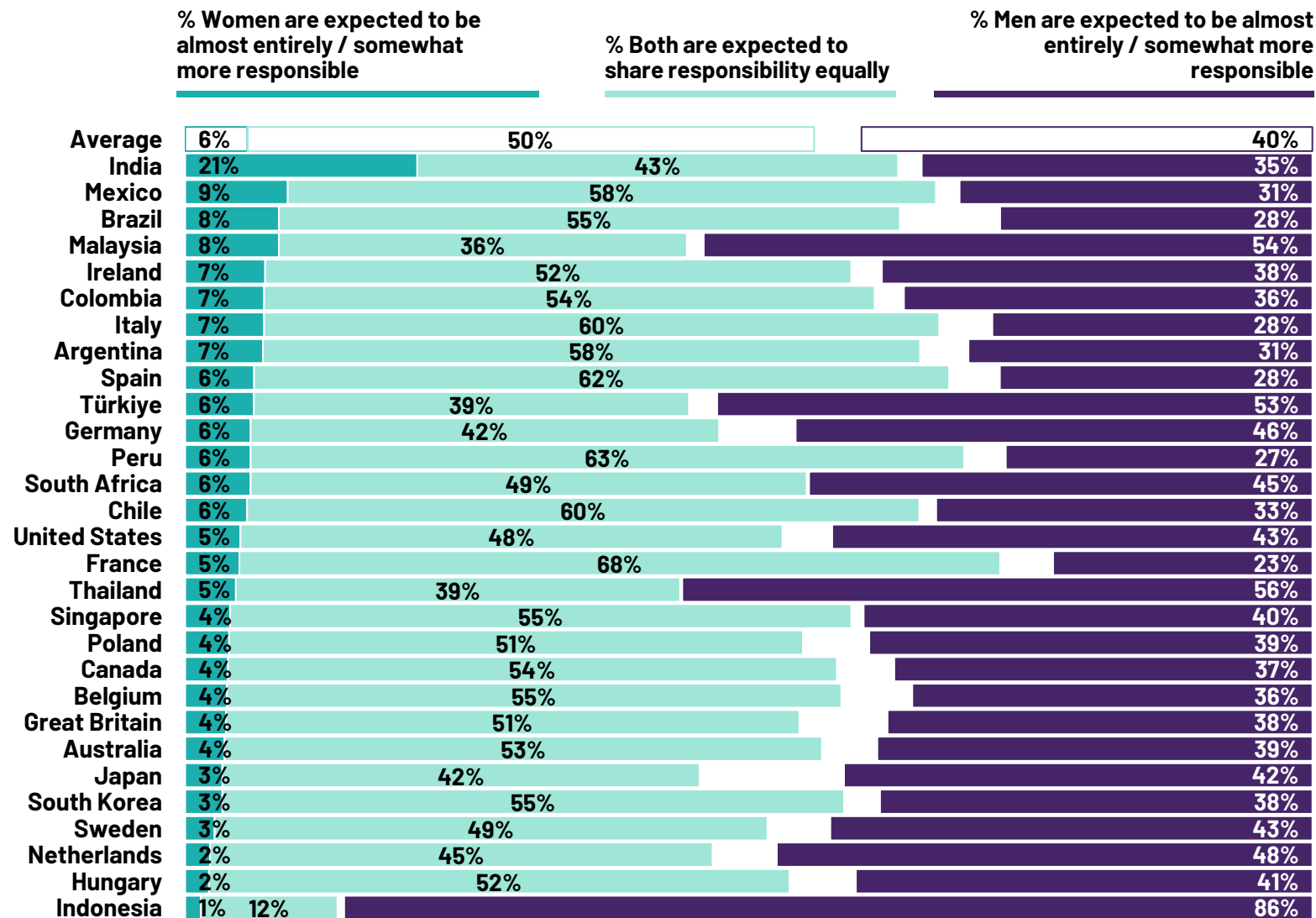

Globally, half (50%) of respondents think that people in their country will expect men and women to share the responsibility for earning money equally. Two in five (40%) think more people will expect this to be men's responsibility, while fewer than one in 10 (6%) think more people will expect it to be women's.



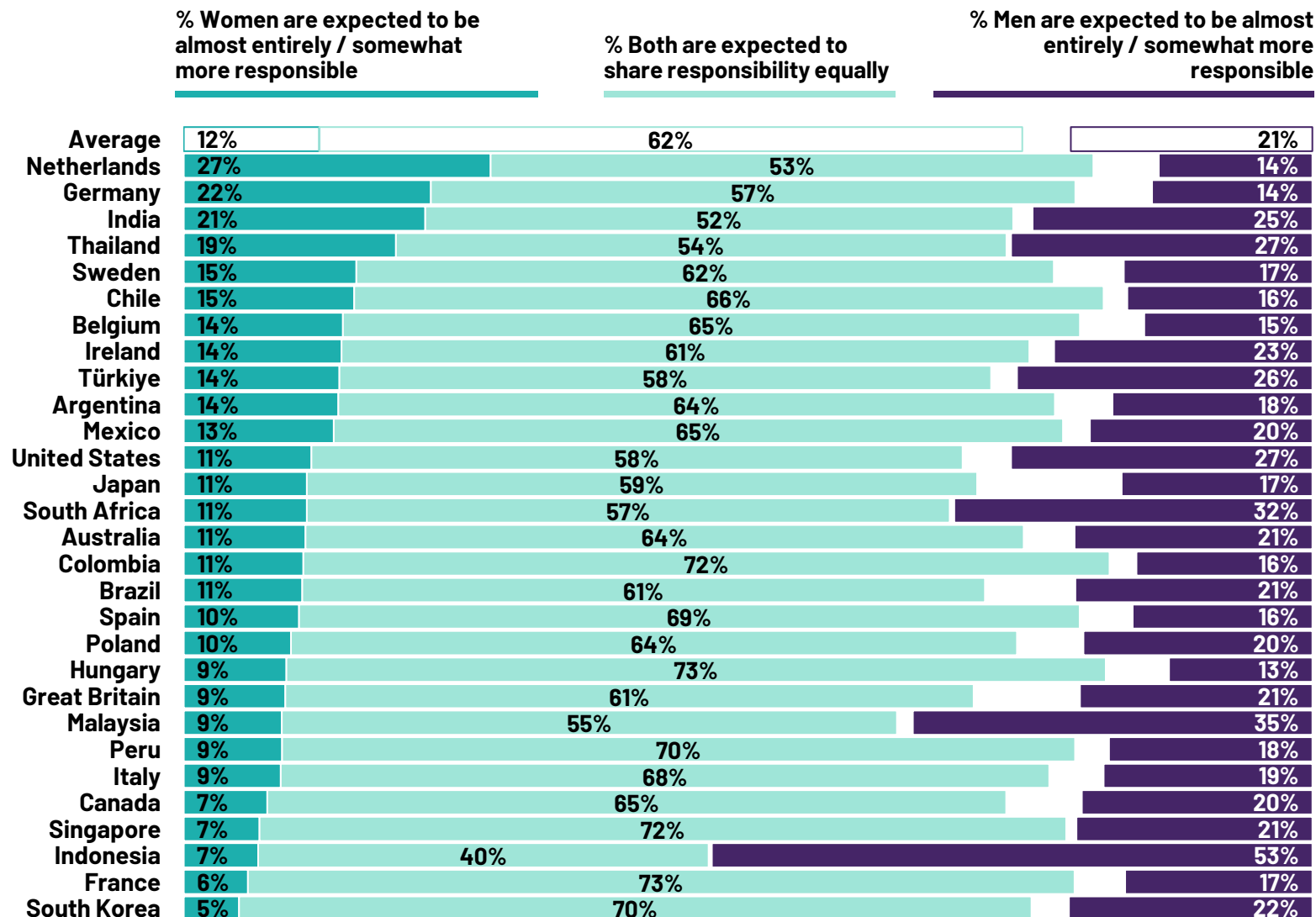

Making important decisions about the household

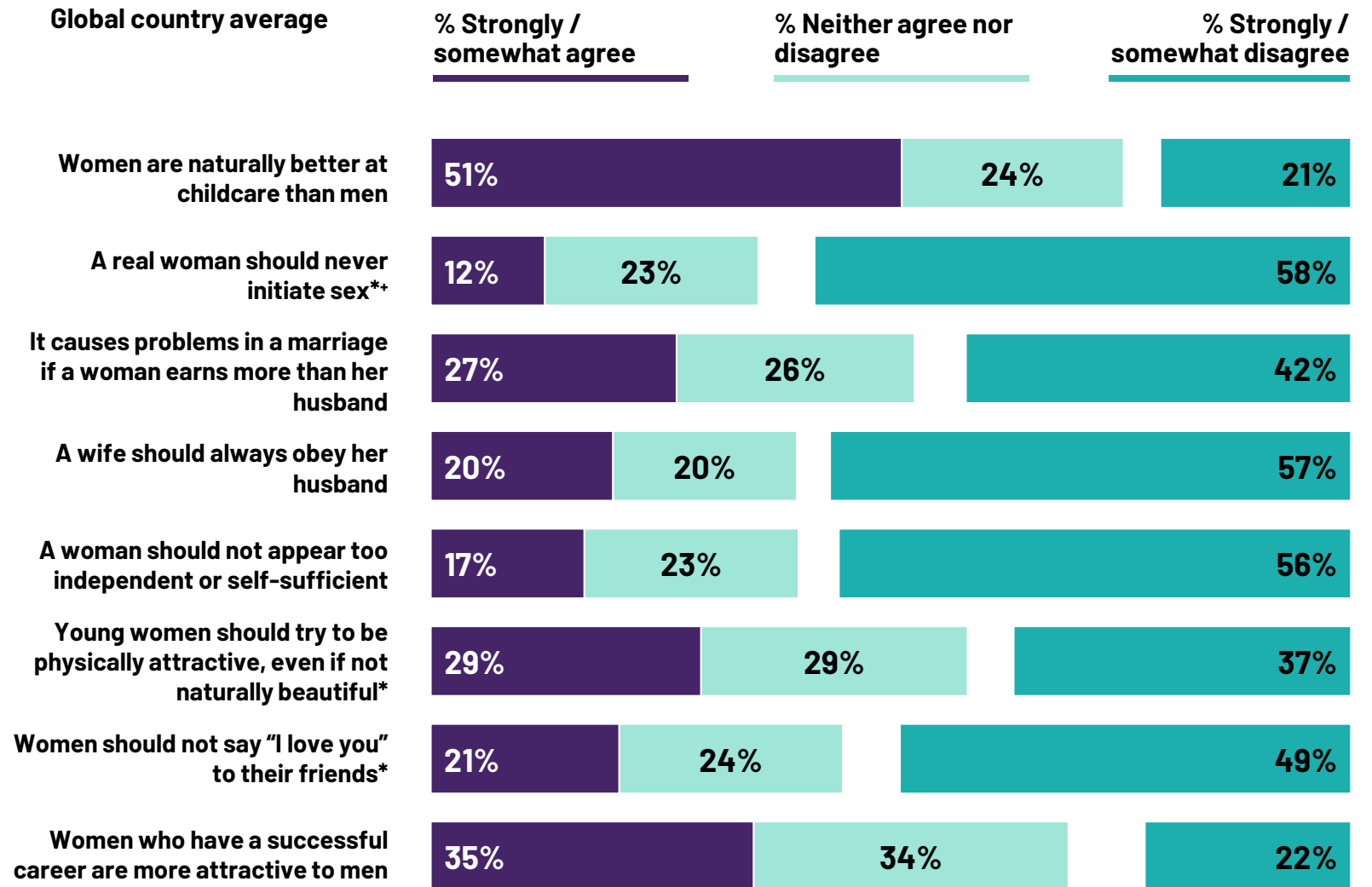
Just over three in five (62%) of the global country average expects more people in their country to say that men and women should share the responsibility for making important household decisions equally. Of the remainder, nearly twice as many think that more people in their country will say the responsibility should sit with men (21%) than with women (12%).

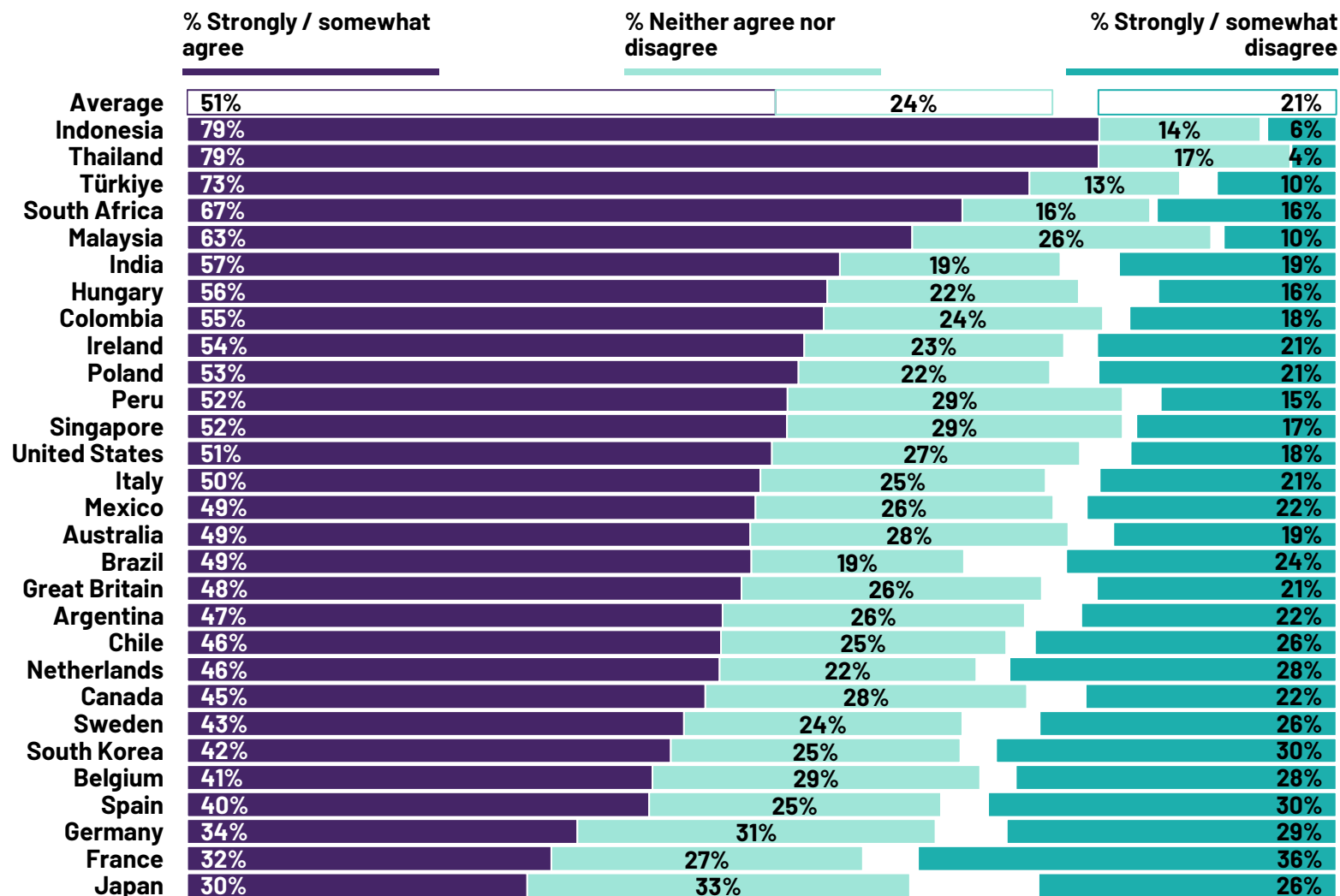

Women are naturally better at childcare than men

Half of the people across all countries surveyed believe women are naturally better than childcare (51%), while one in five disagree (21%). Agreement is highest in Indonesia, Thailand, Türkiye, and South Africa, while disagreement is highest in France, South Korea, Spain, and Germany.

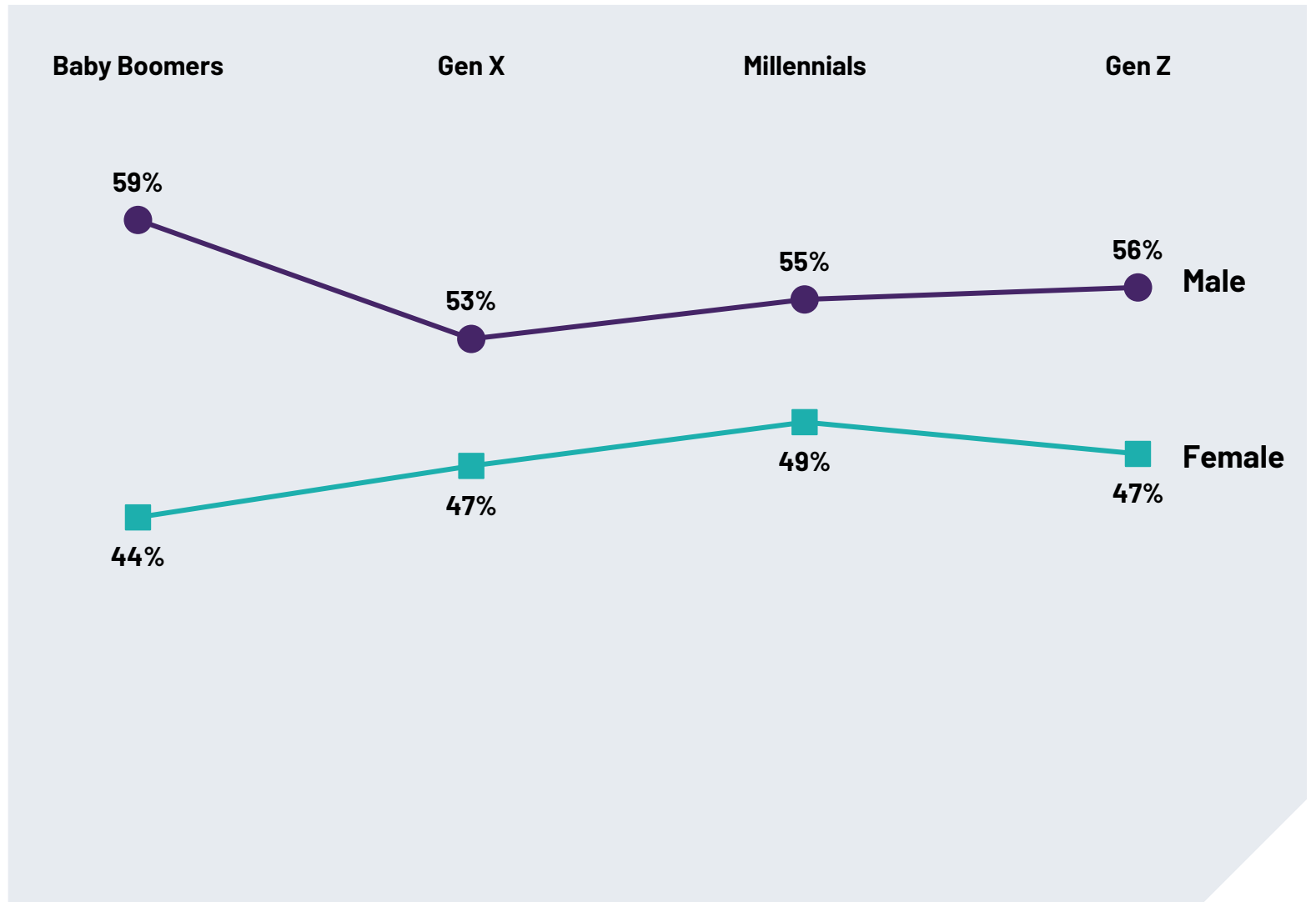

Boomers have the largest gender disparity when it comes to agreement that women are naturally better at childcare than men, with 59% of men agreeing compared to 44% of women. The gap narrows to less than 10 ppts across all other generations.



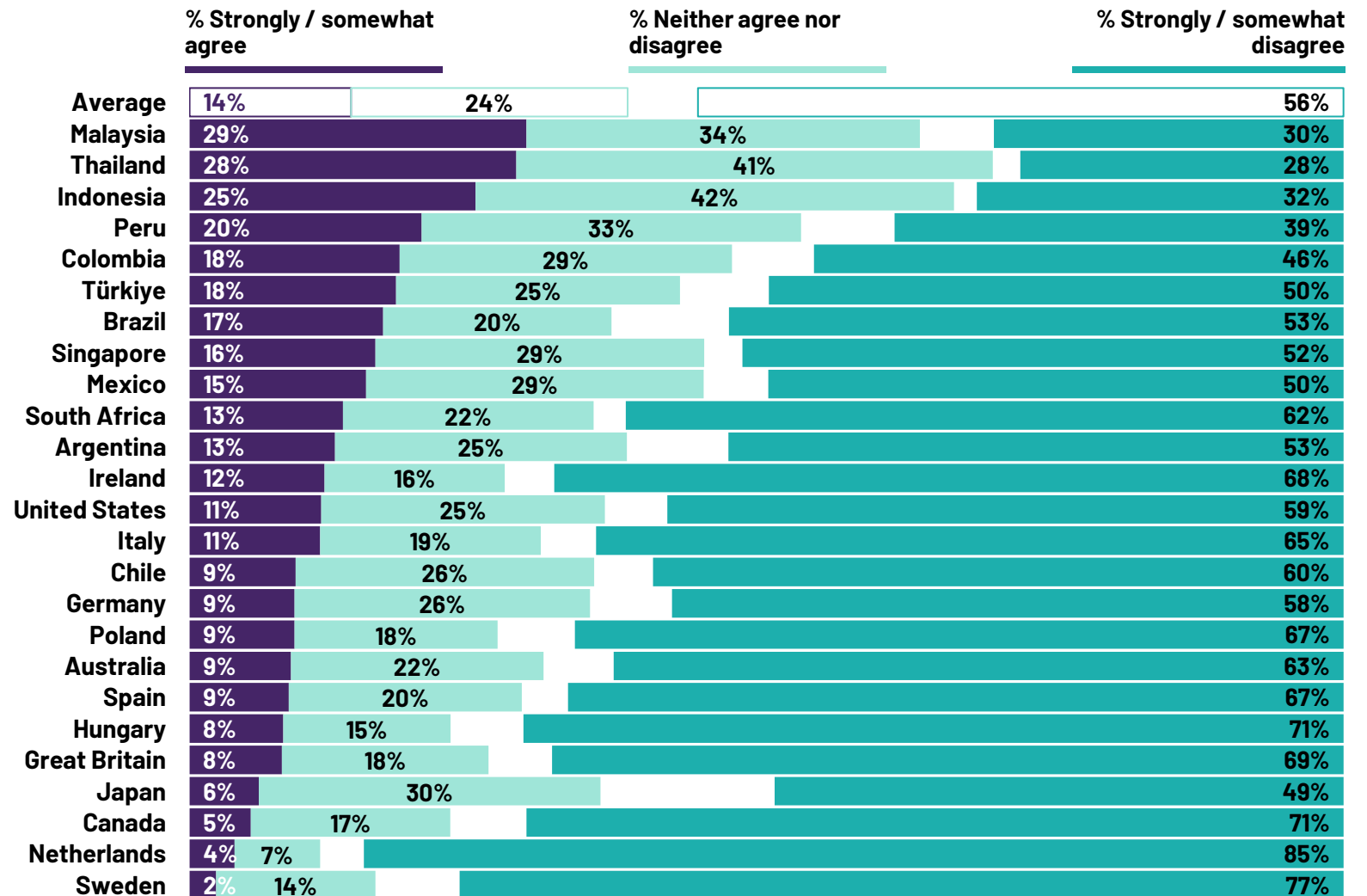

Around three in five people across all countries surveyed (58%) disagree that a real woman should never initiate sex, while around one in 10 (12%) agree. Agreement is highest in Malaysia, Thailand, and Indonesia, while disagreement peaks in the Netherlands, Sweden, Canada, and Hungary.

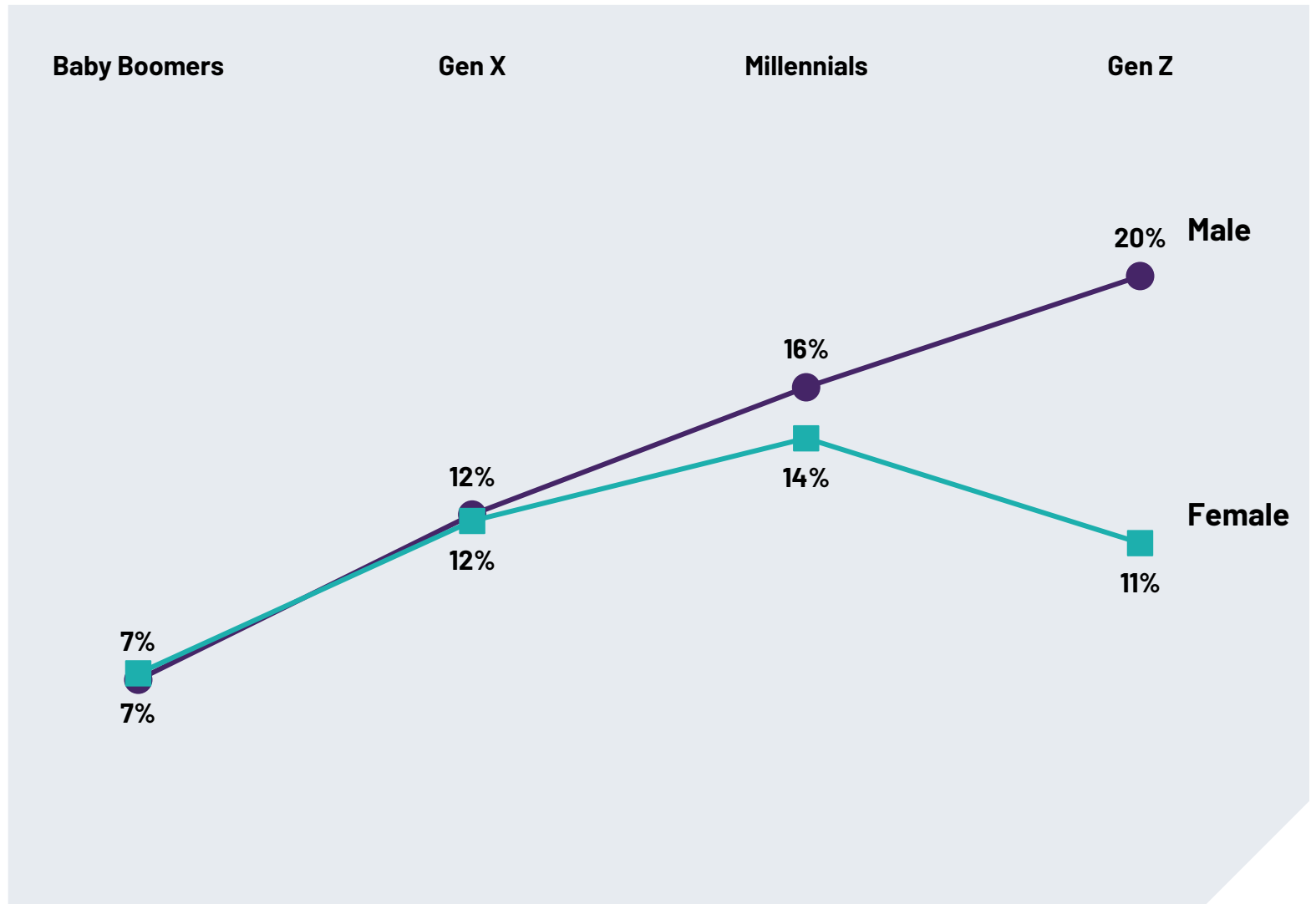

Amongst Boomers, Gen X, and Millennials, there is little difference in gendered agreement that a real woman should never initiate sex. However, in Gen Z, men are nearly twice as likely to agree with this statement (21%) compared to women (12%).

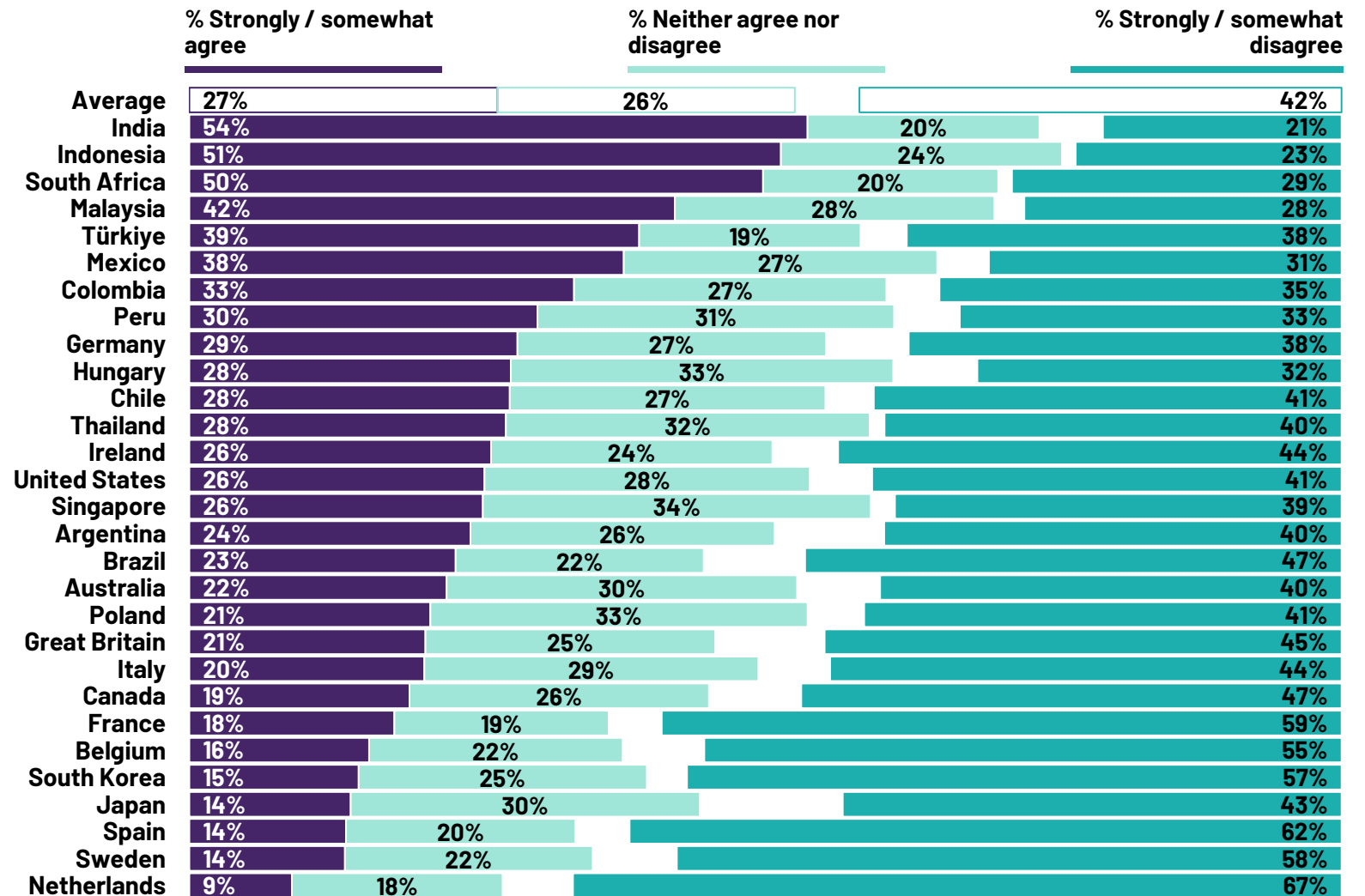

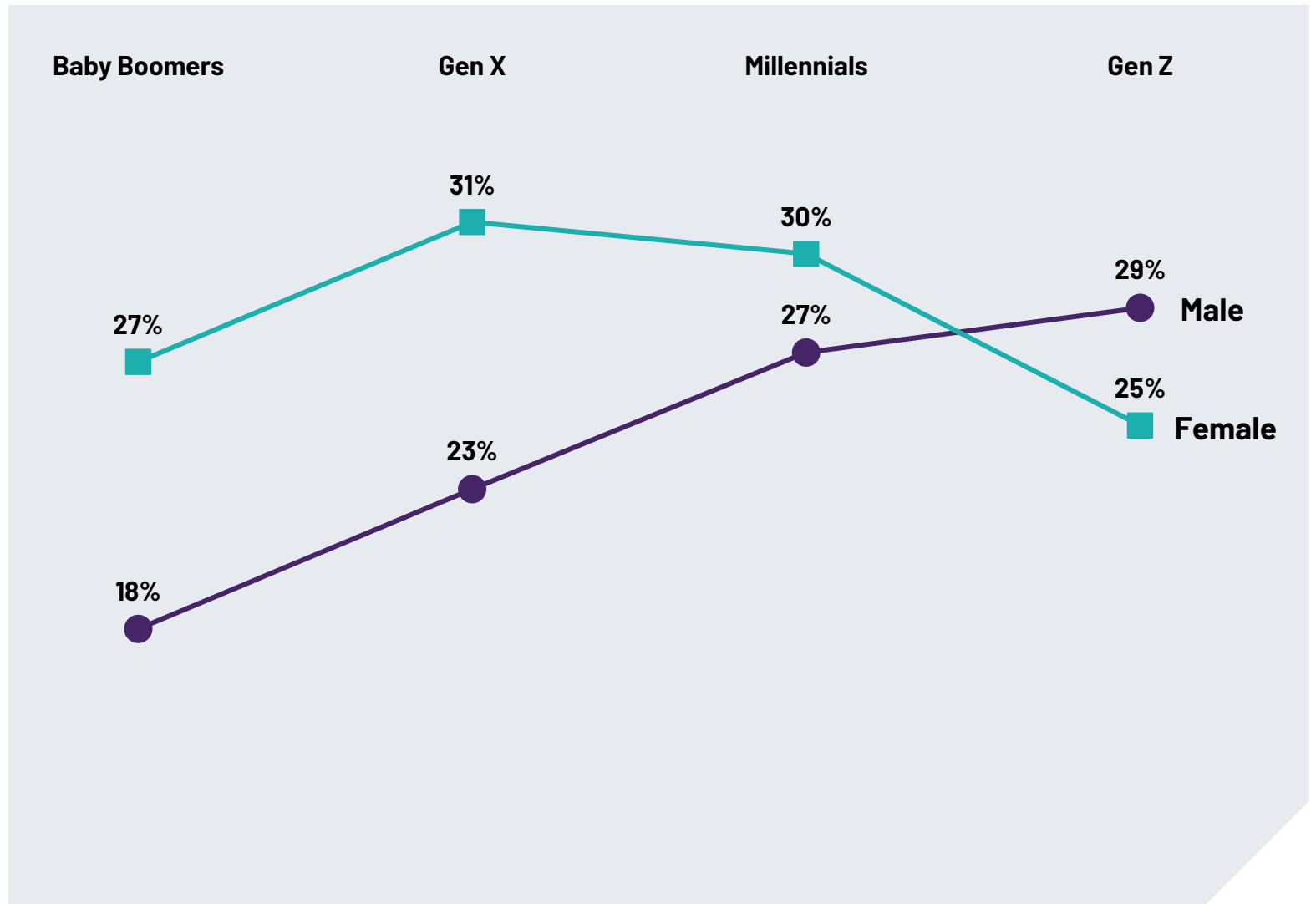

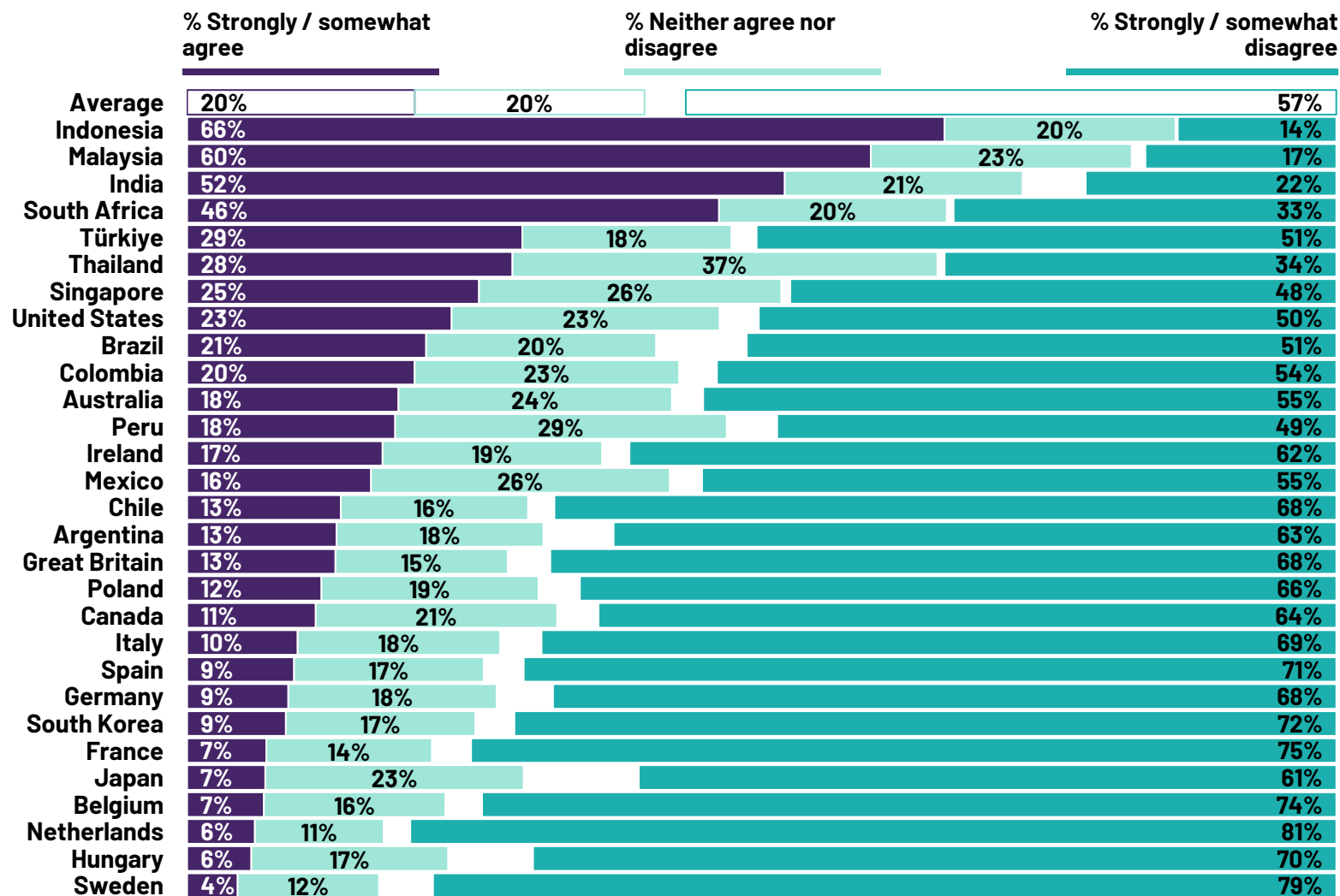

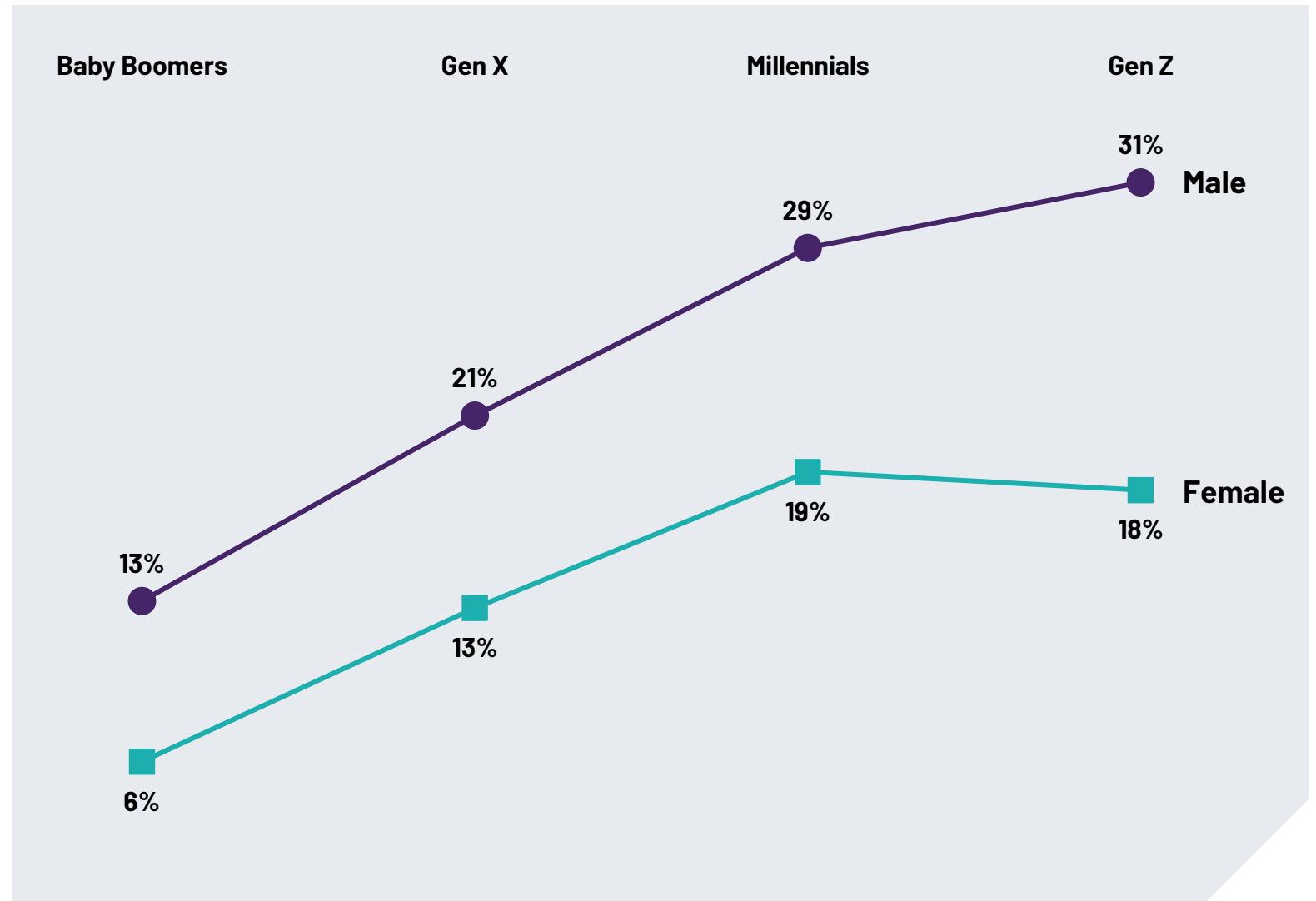

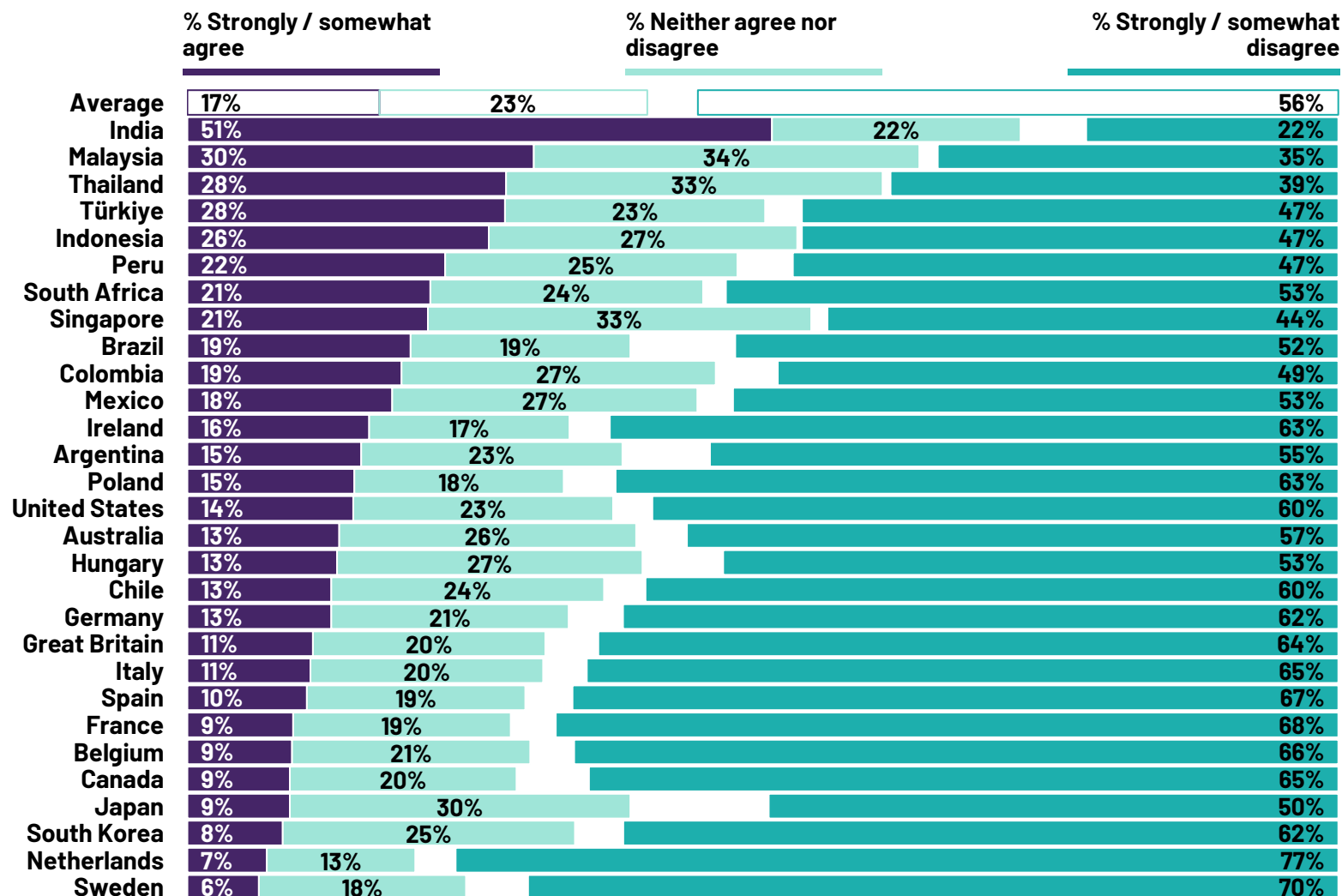

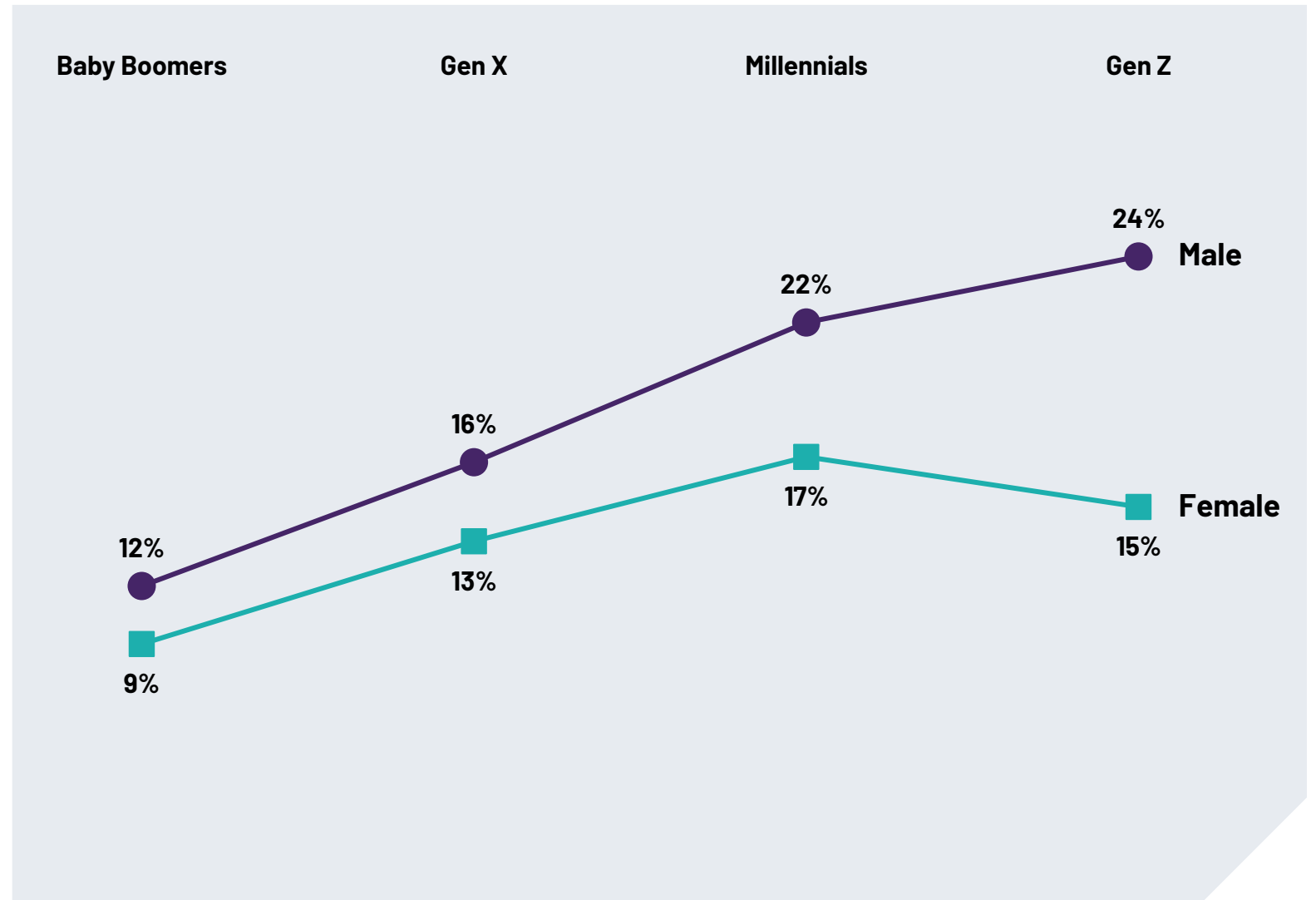

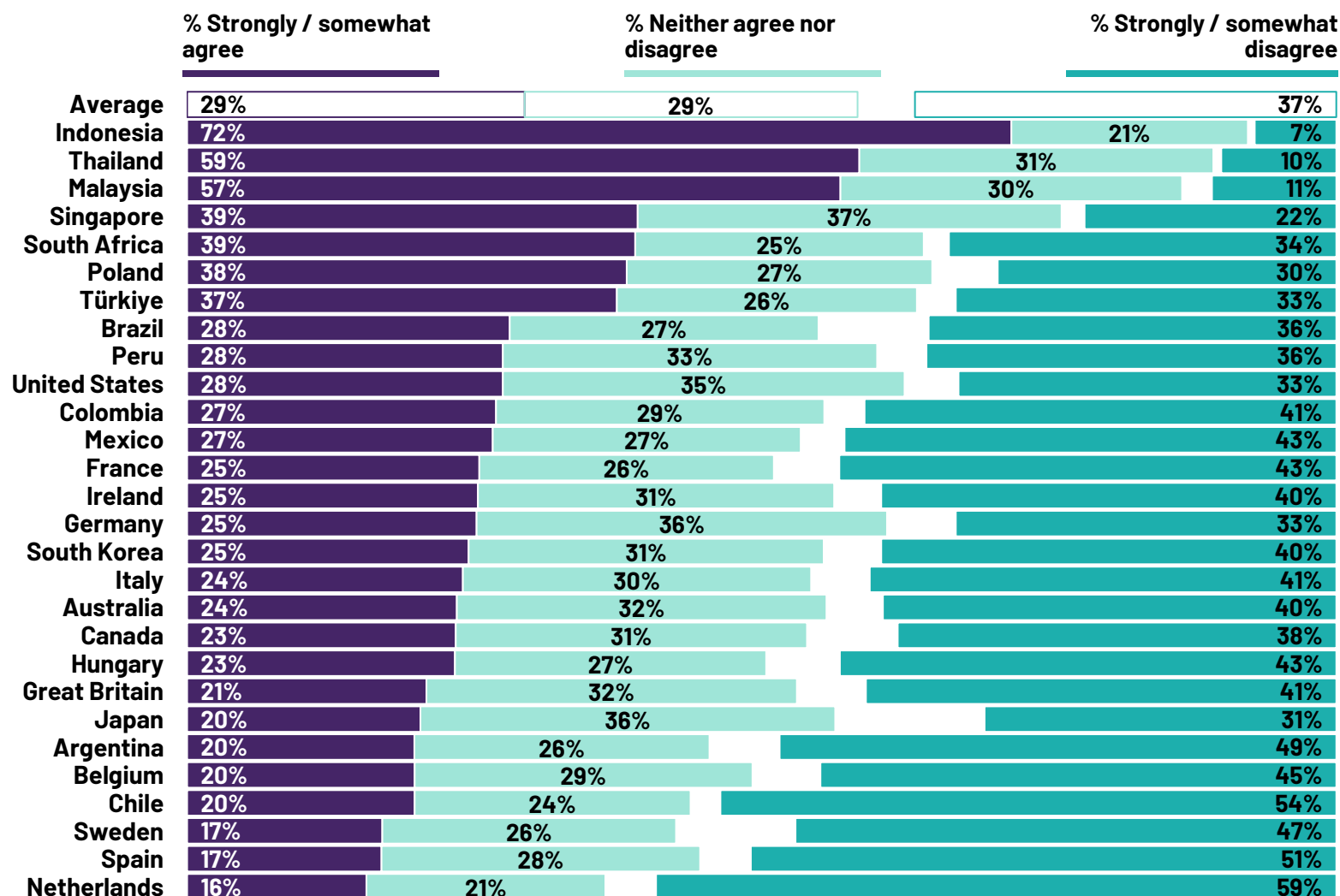

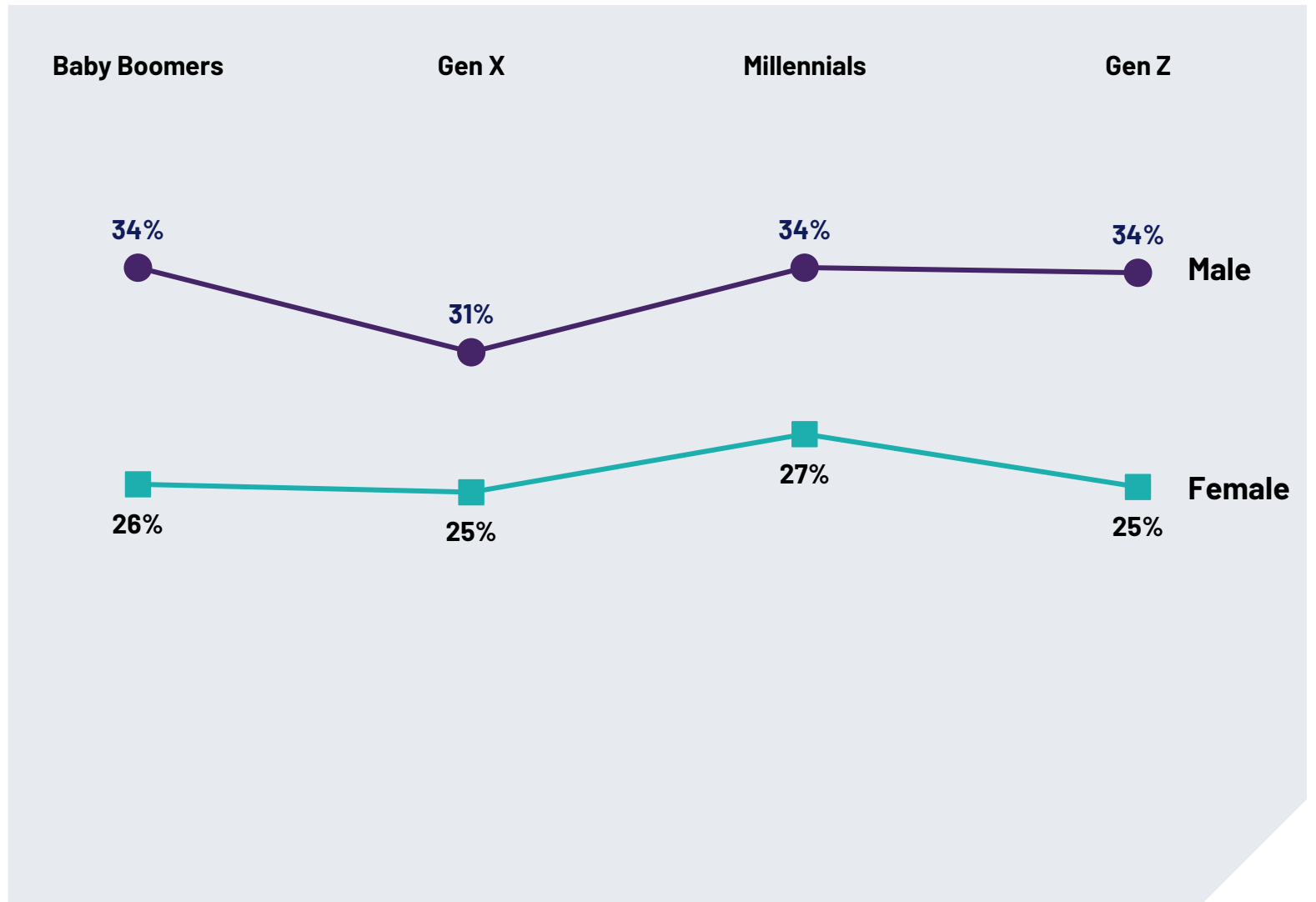

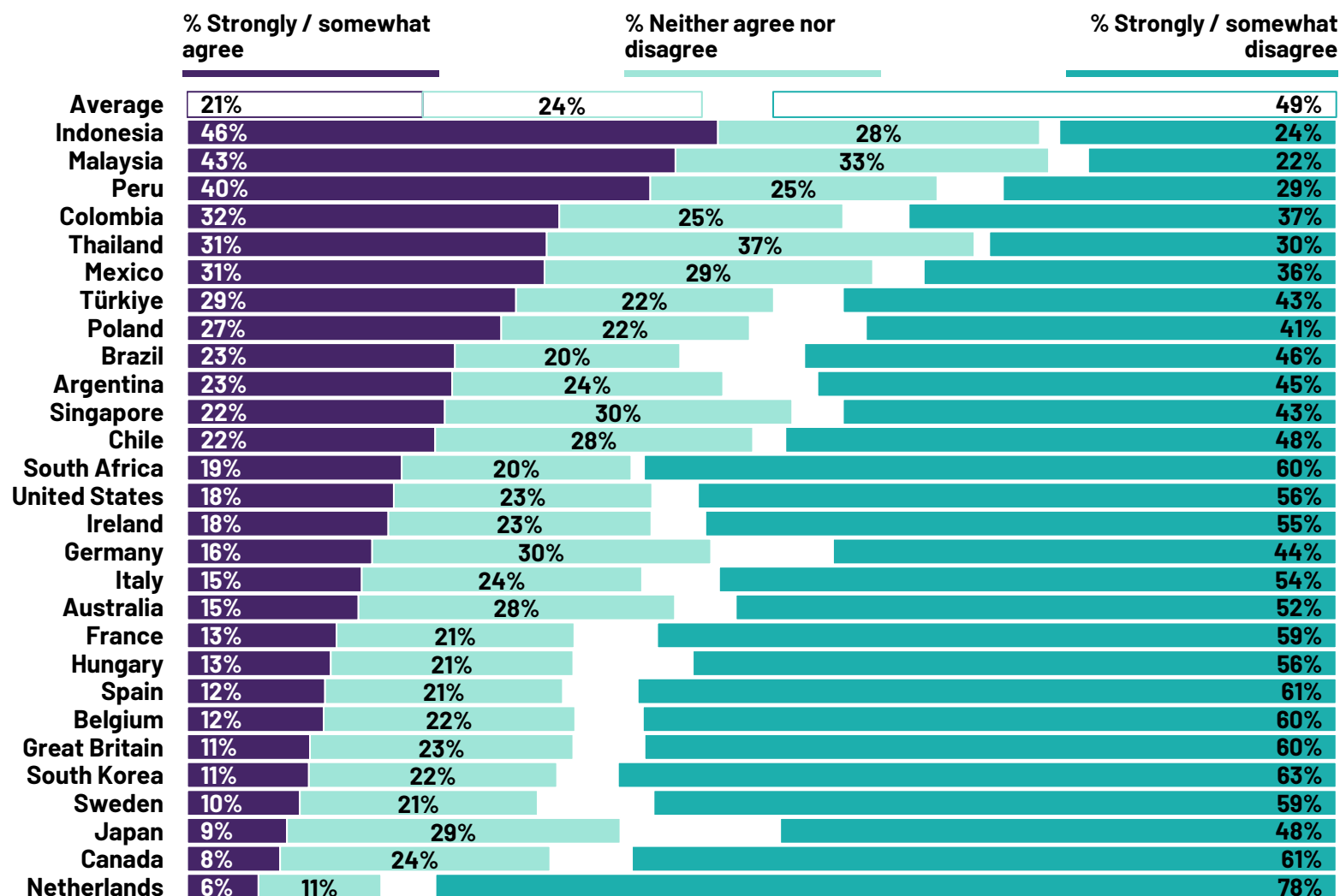

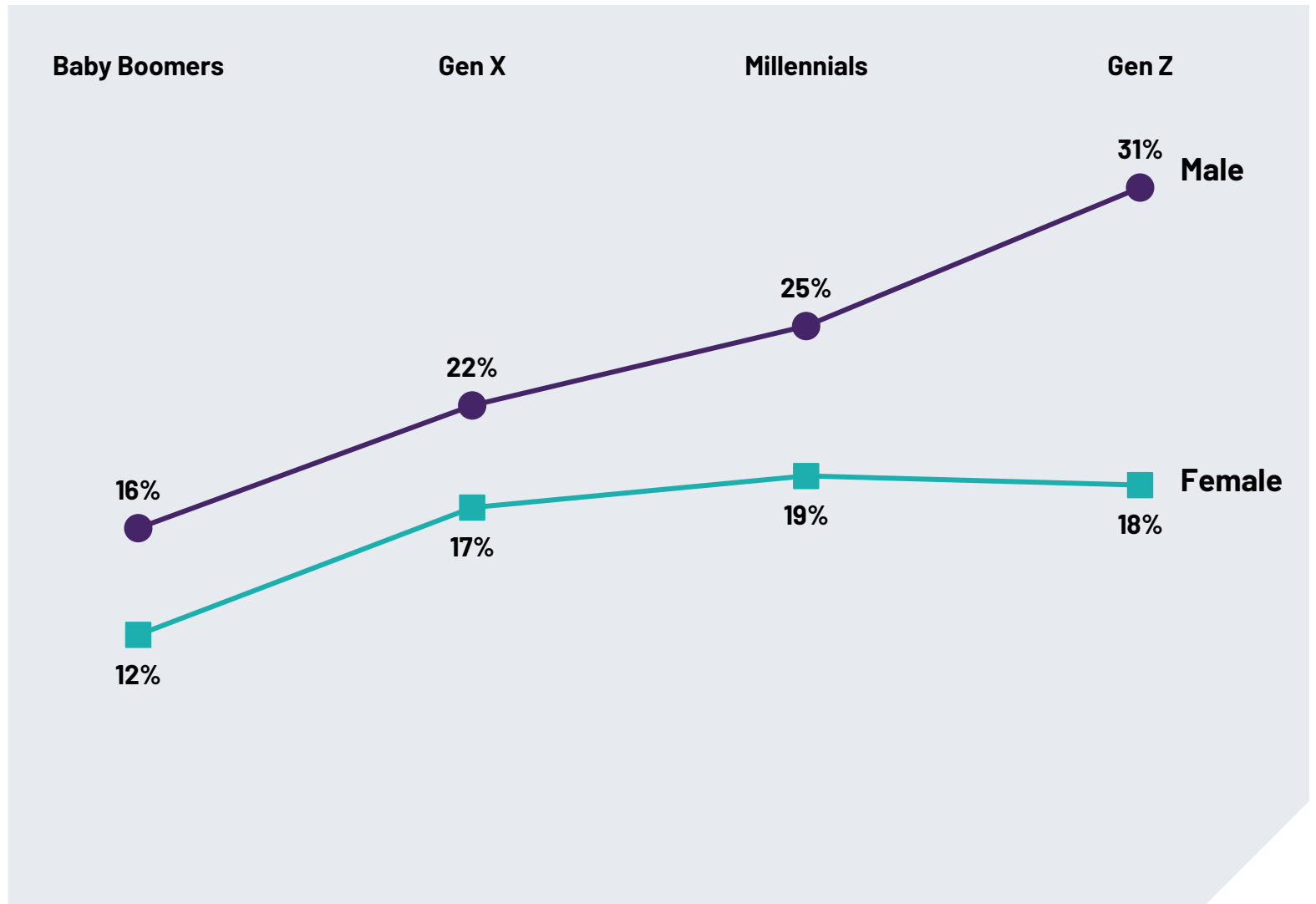

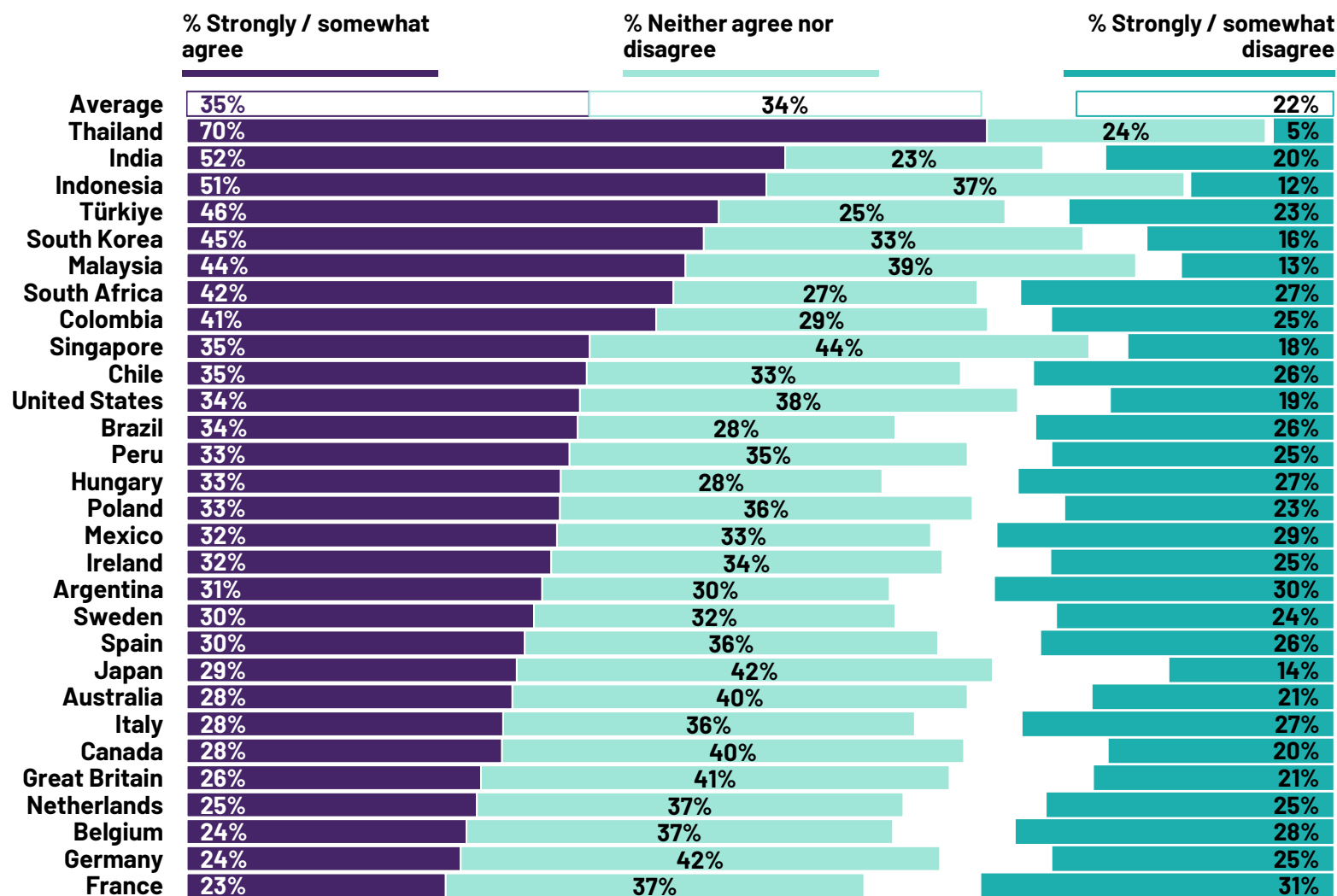

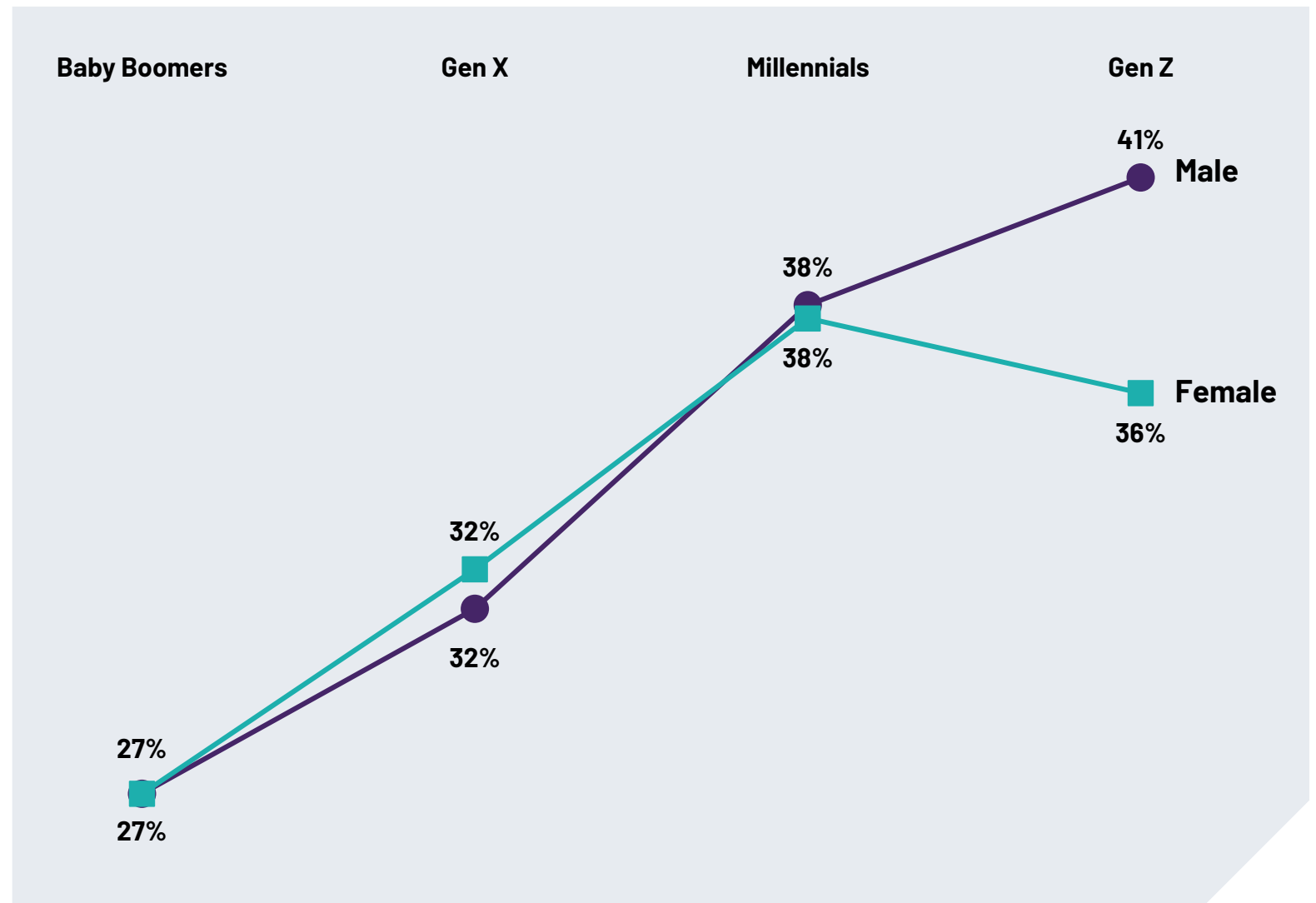

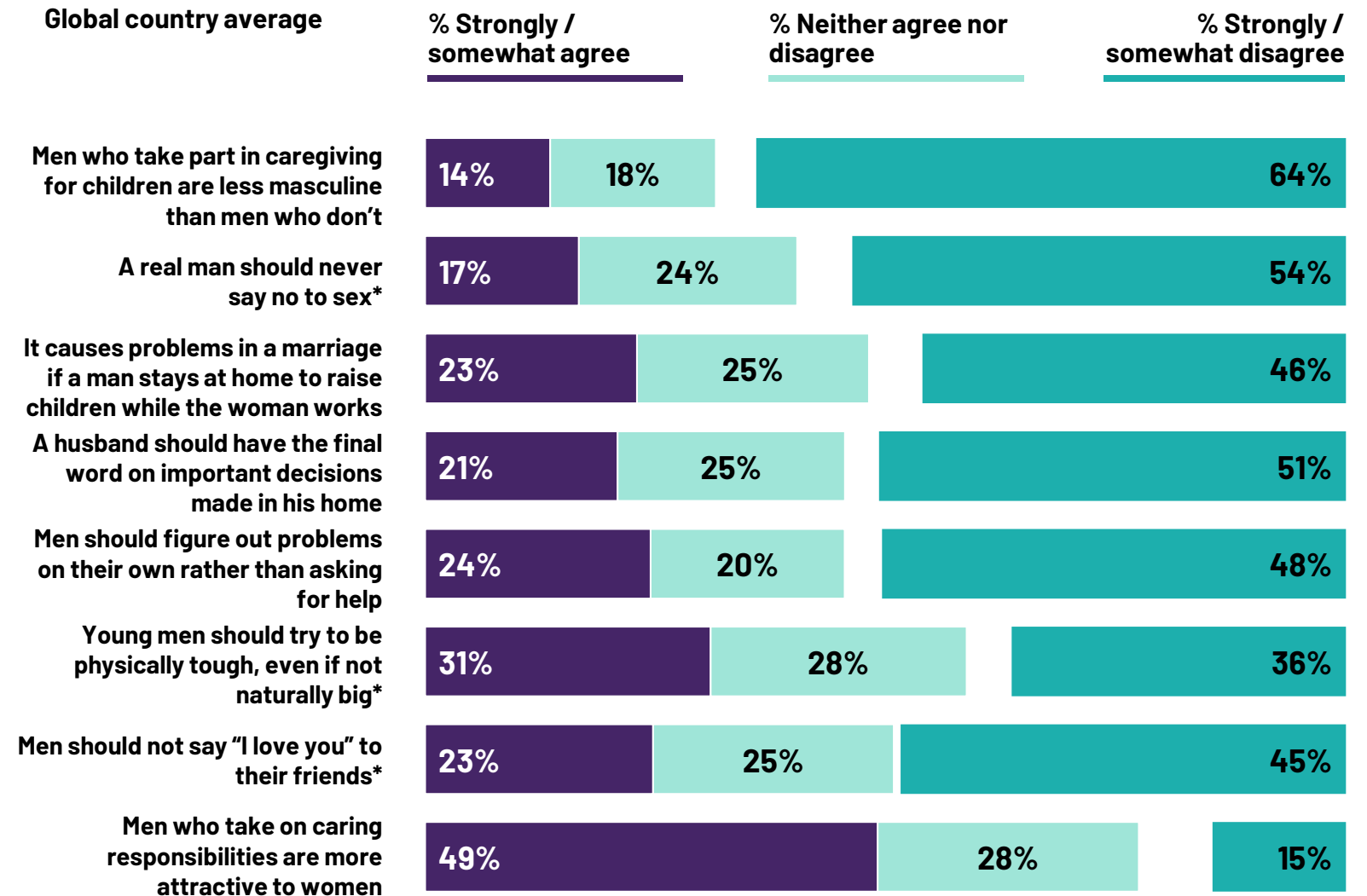

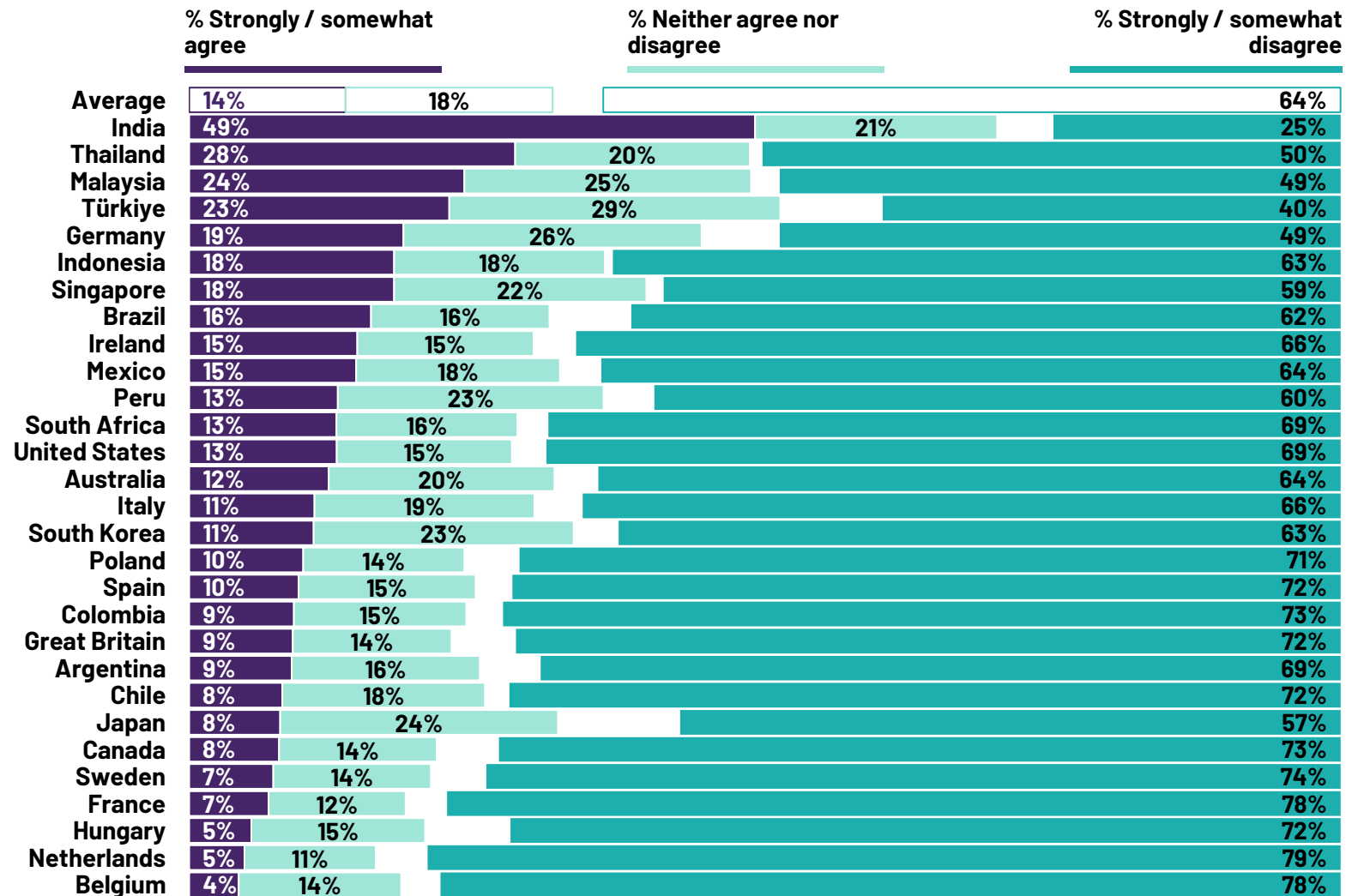

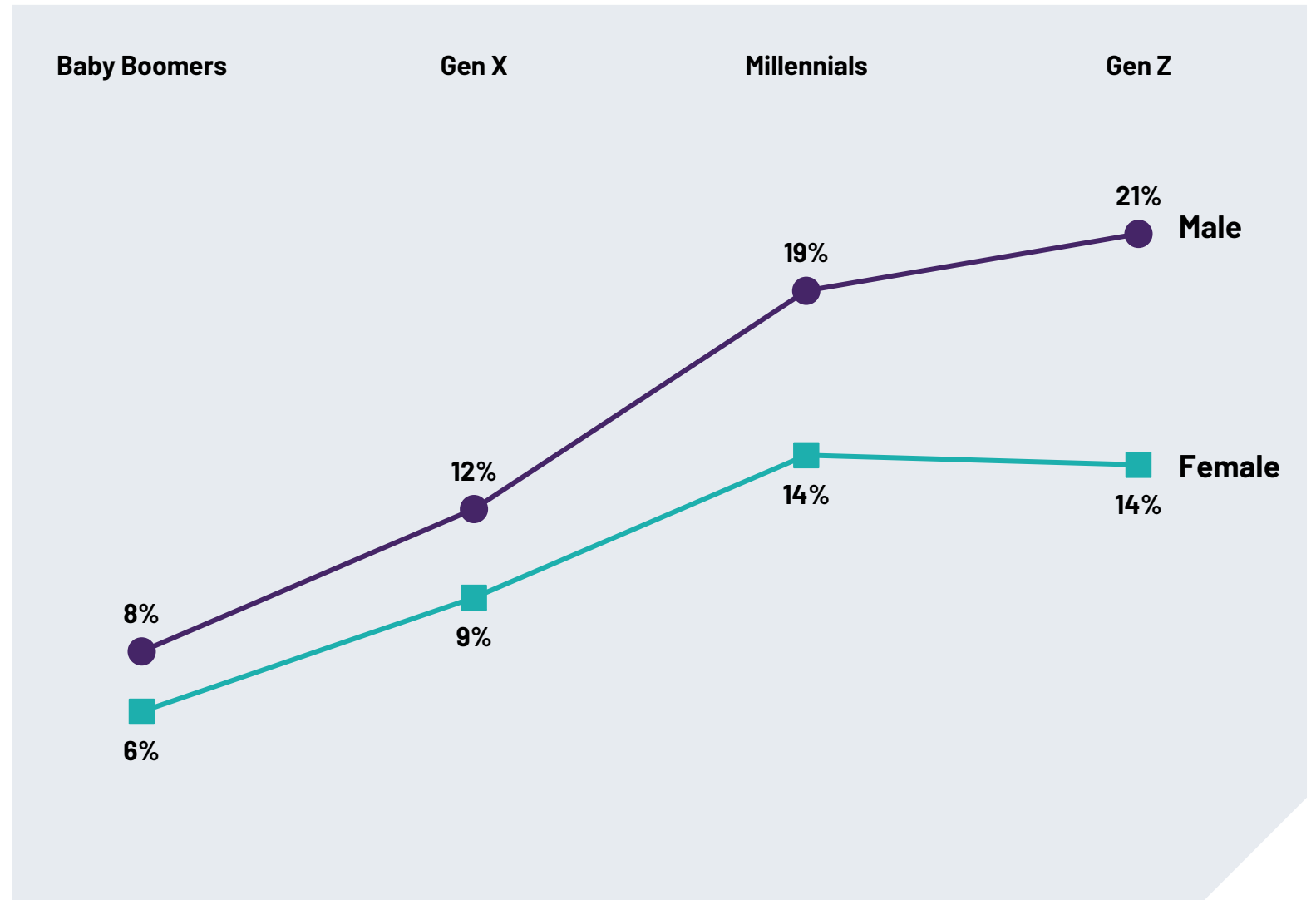

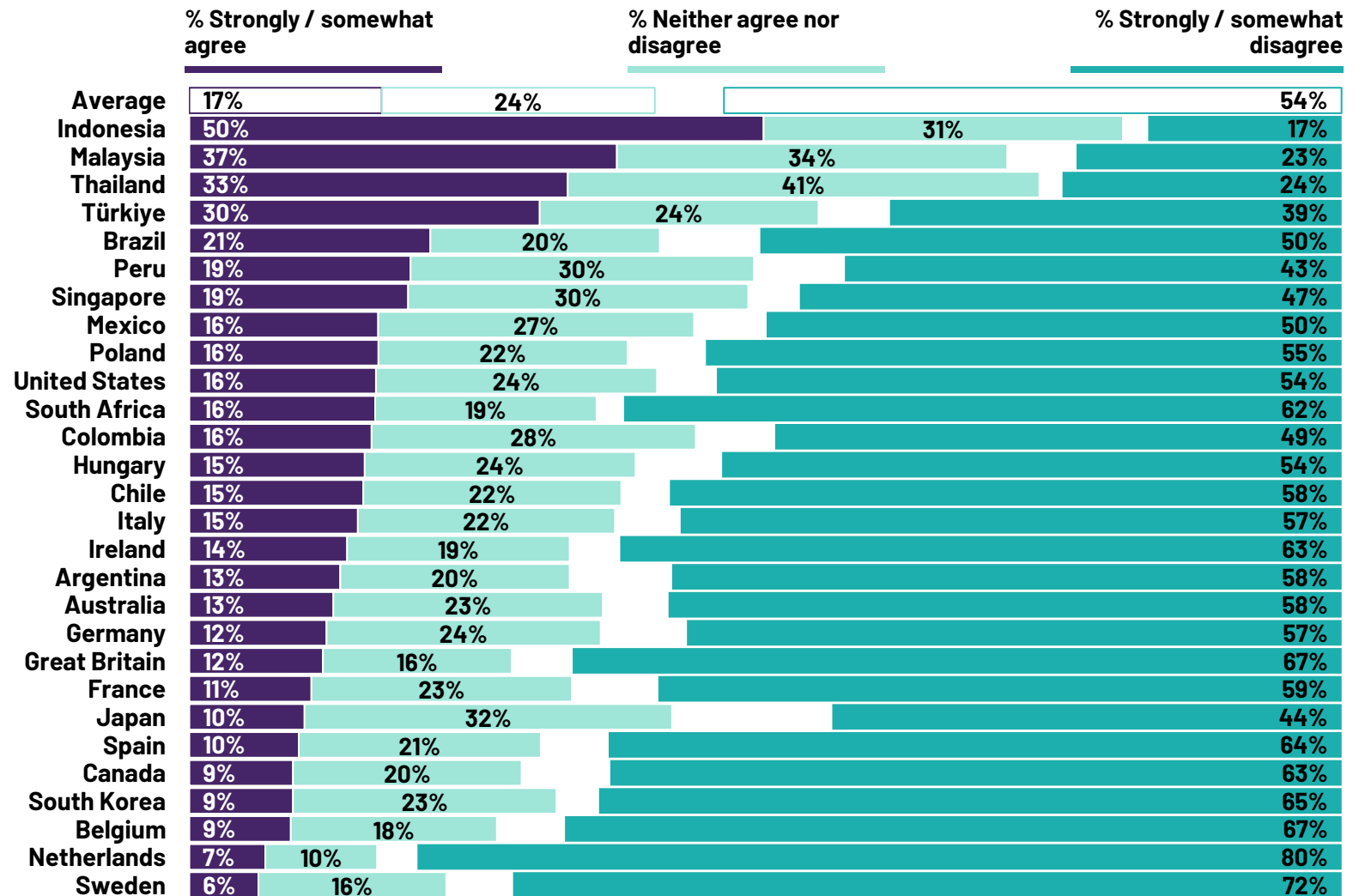

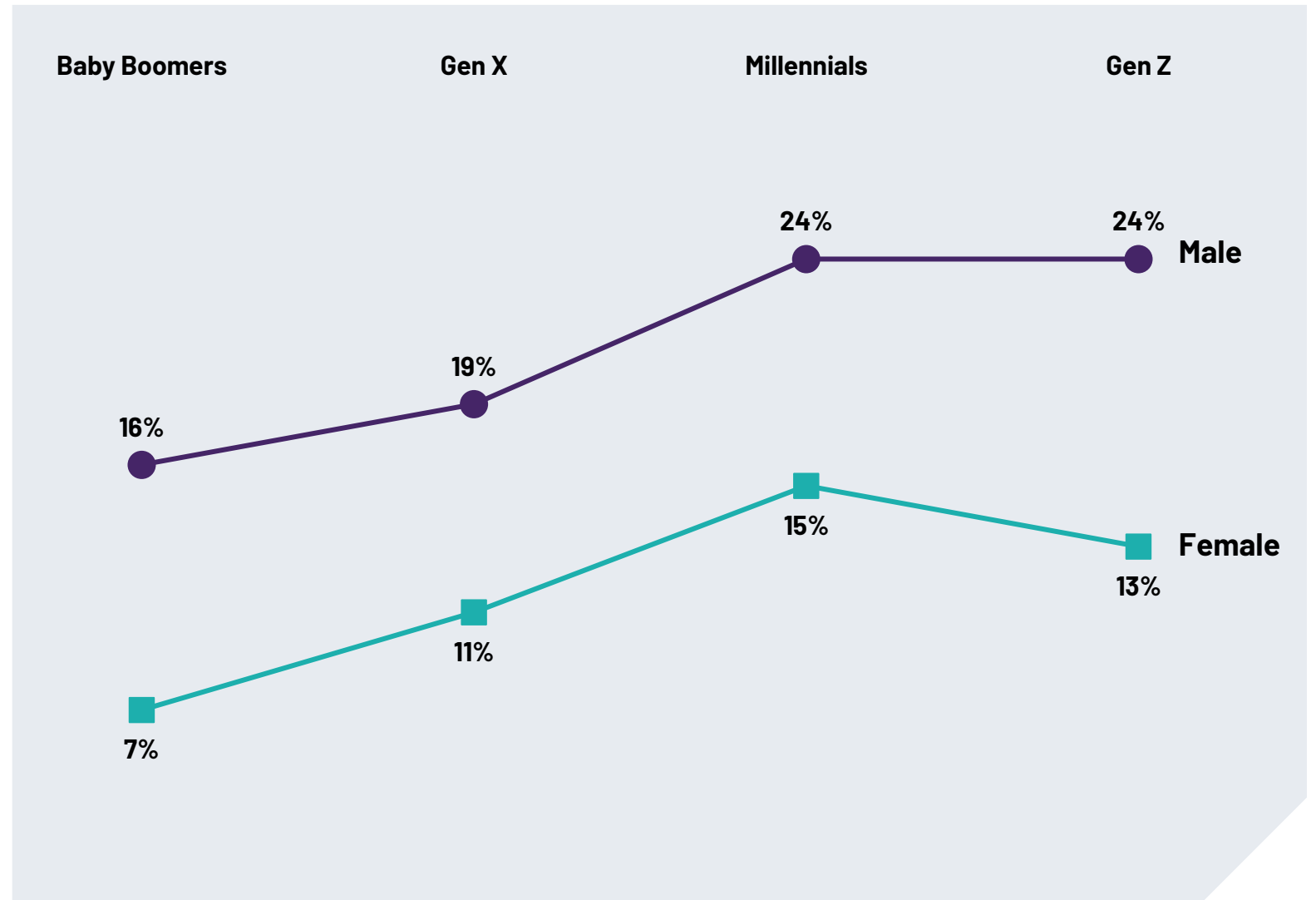

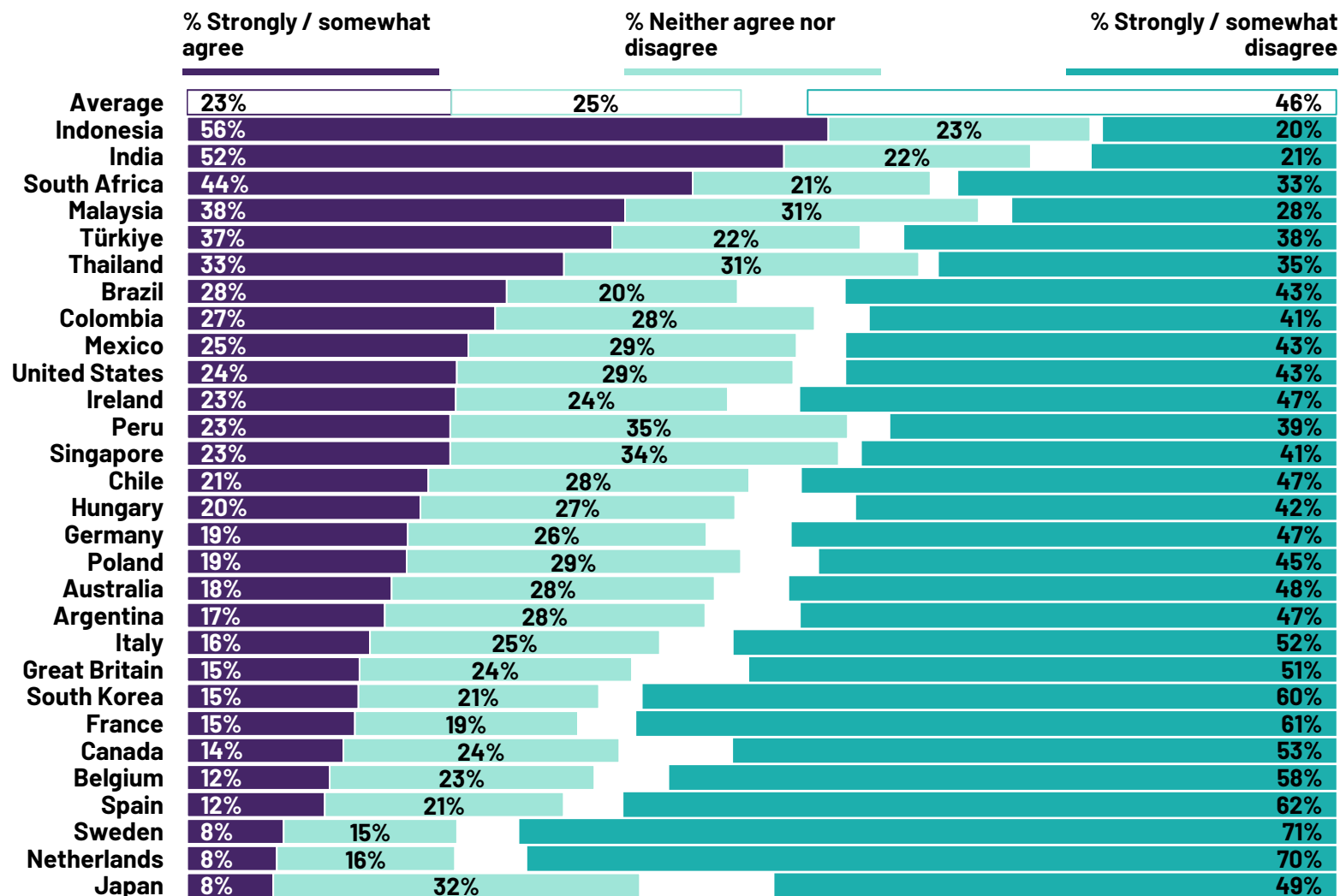

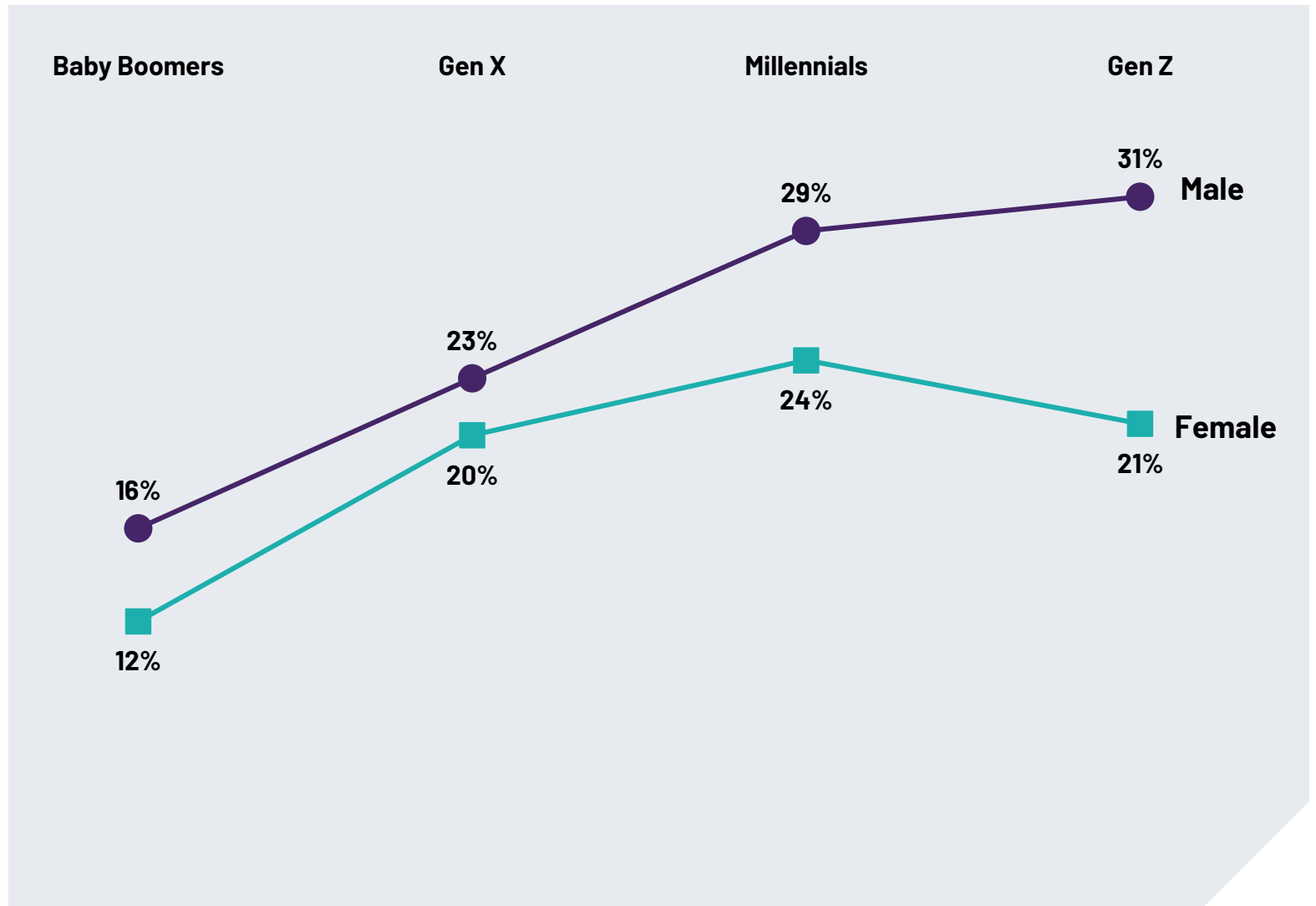

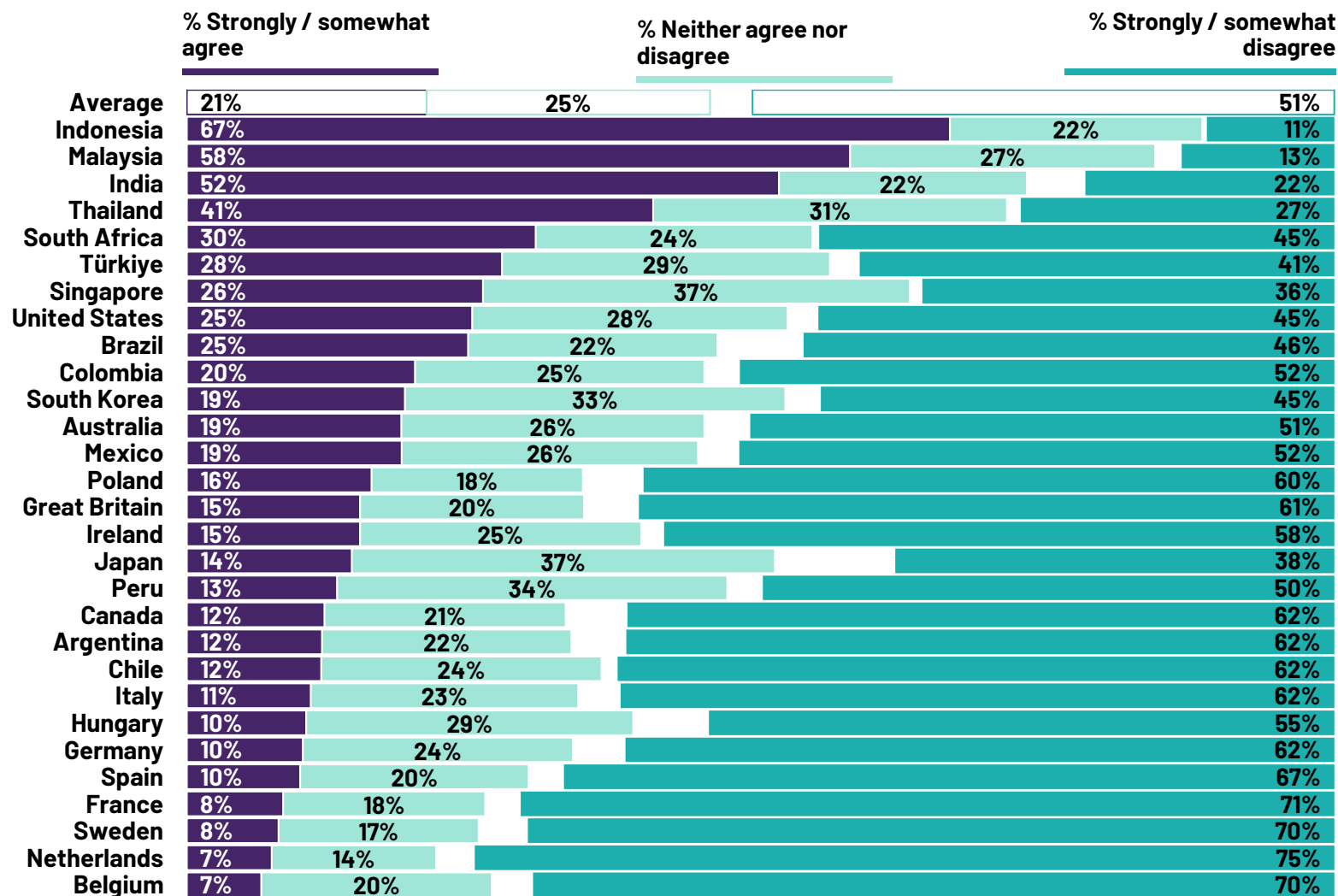

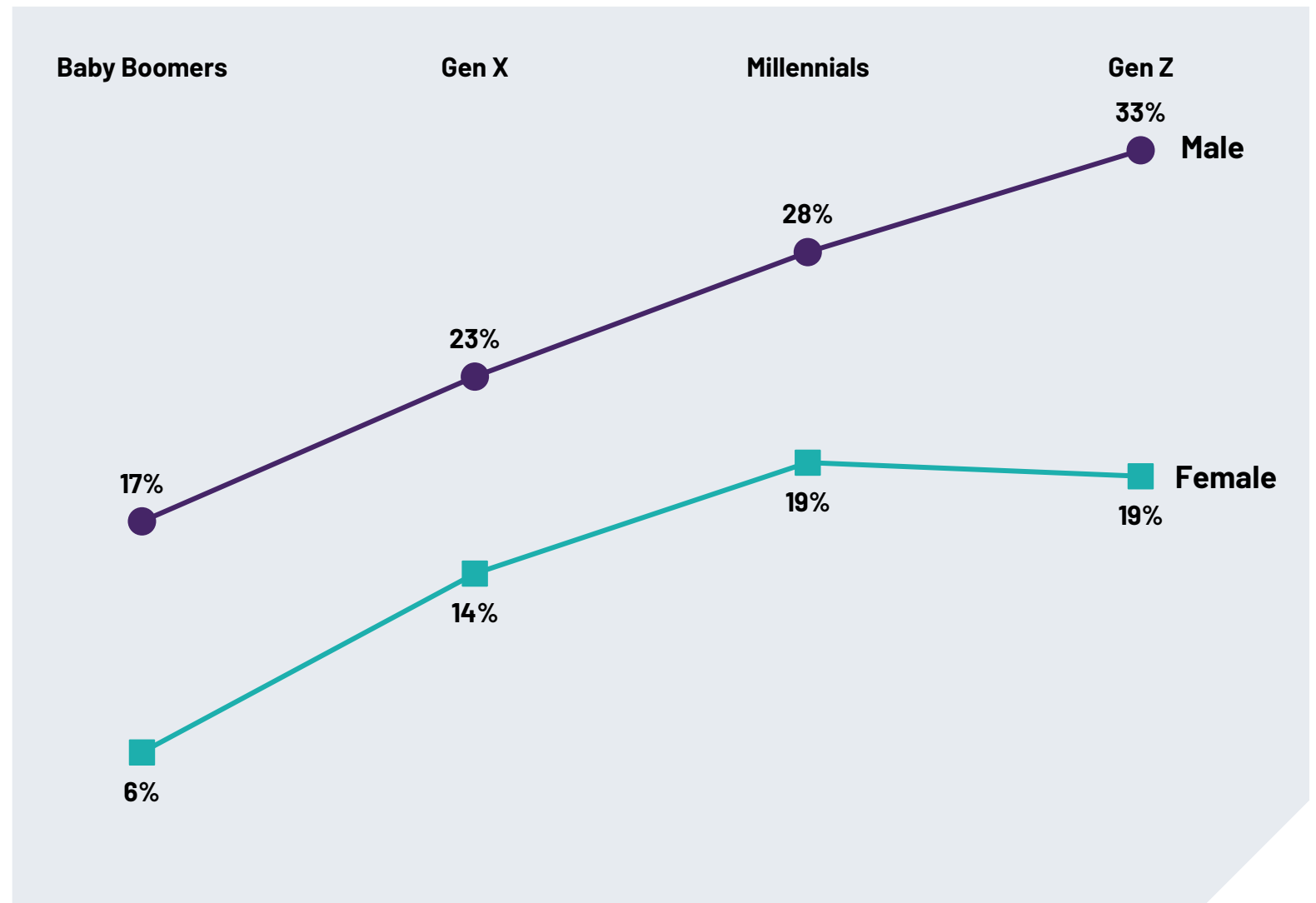

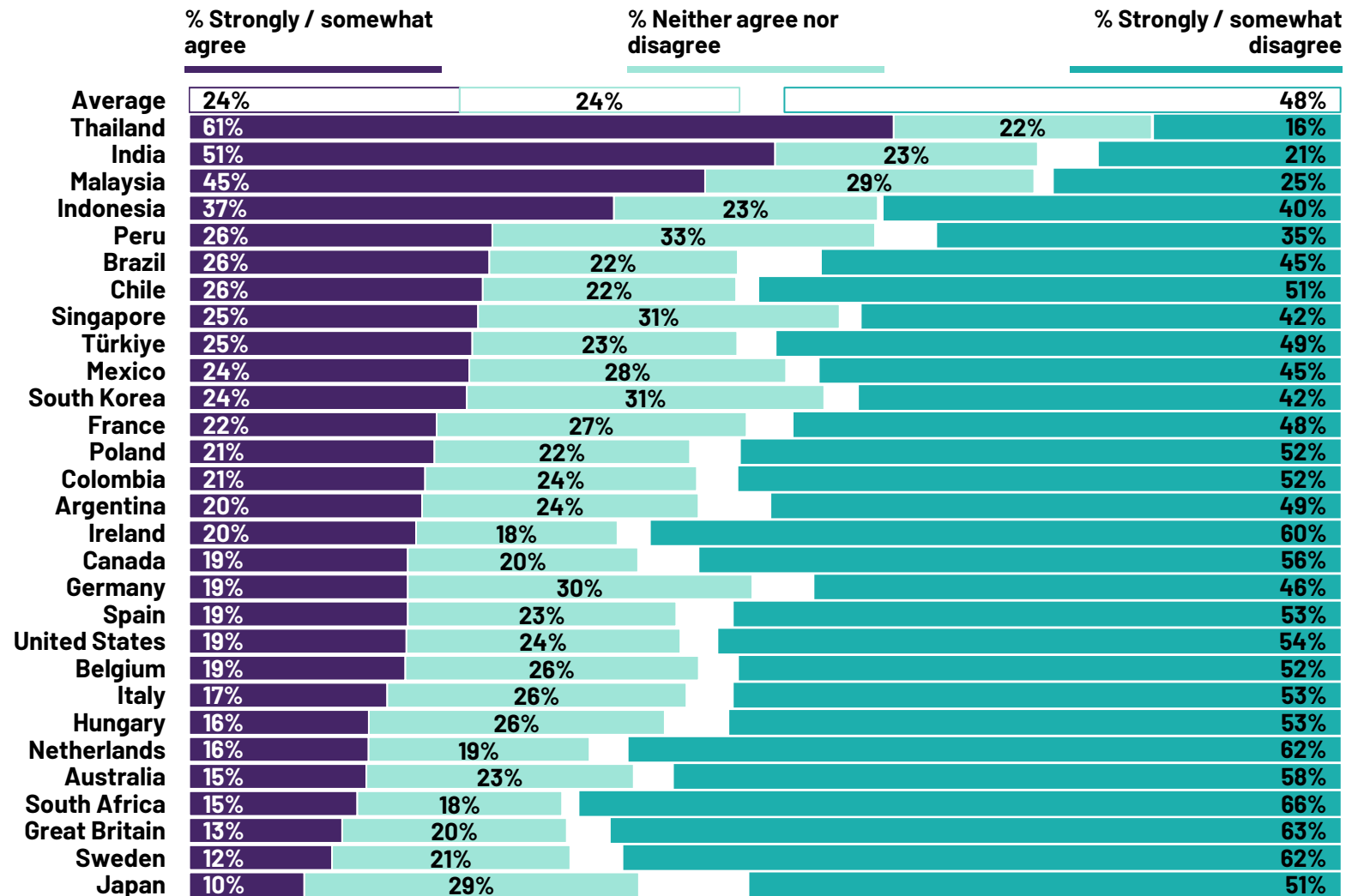

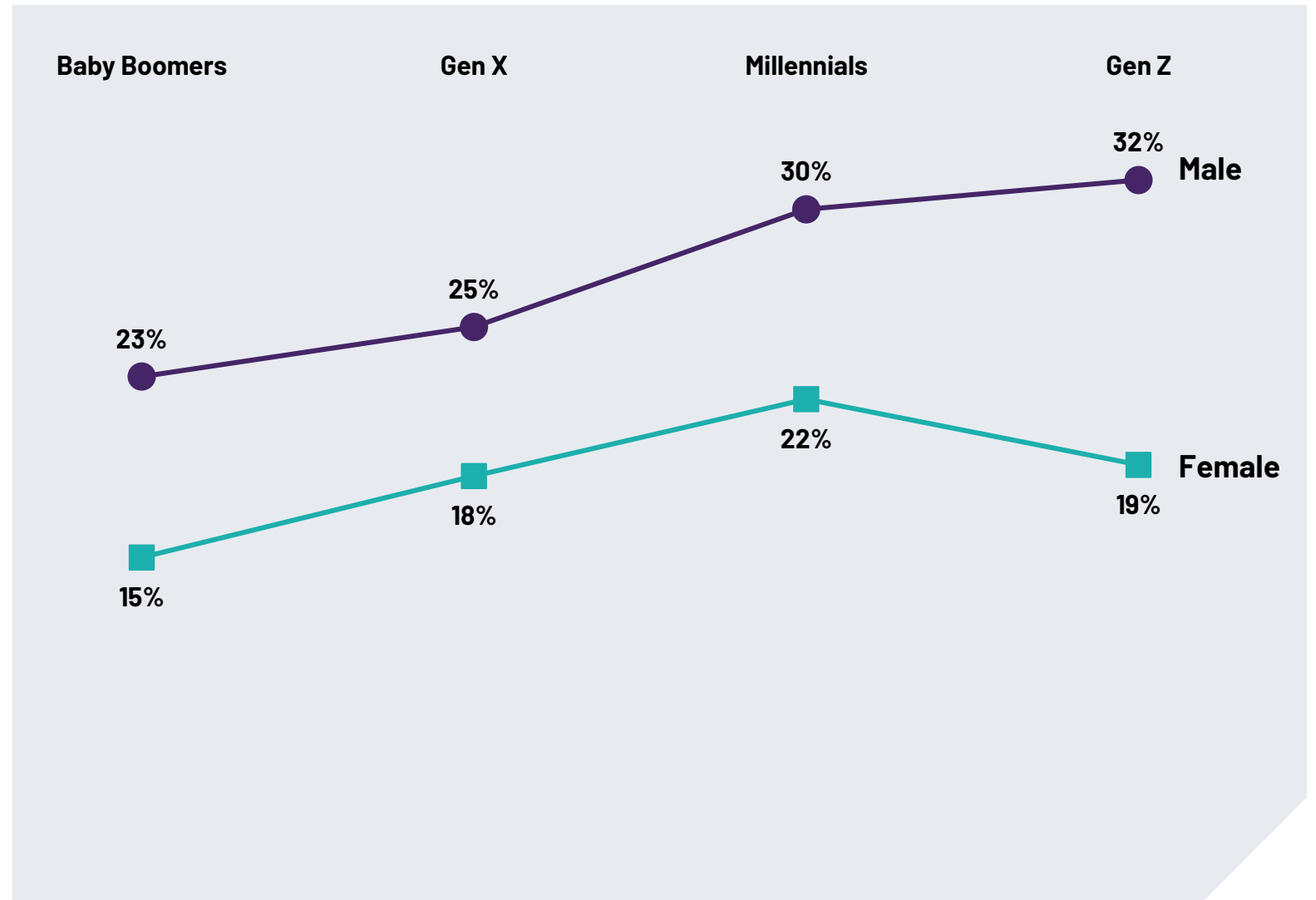

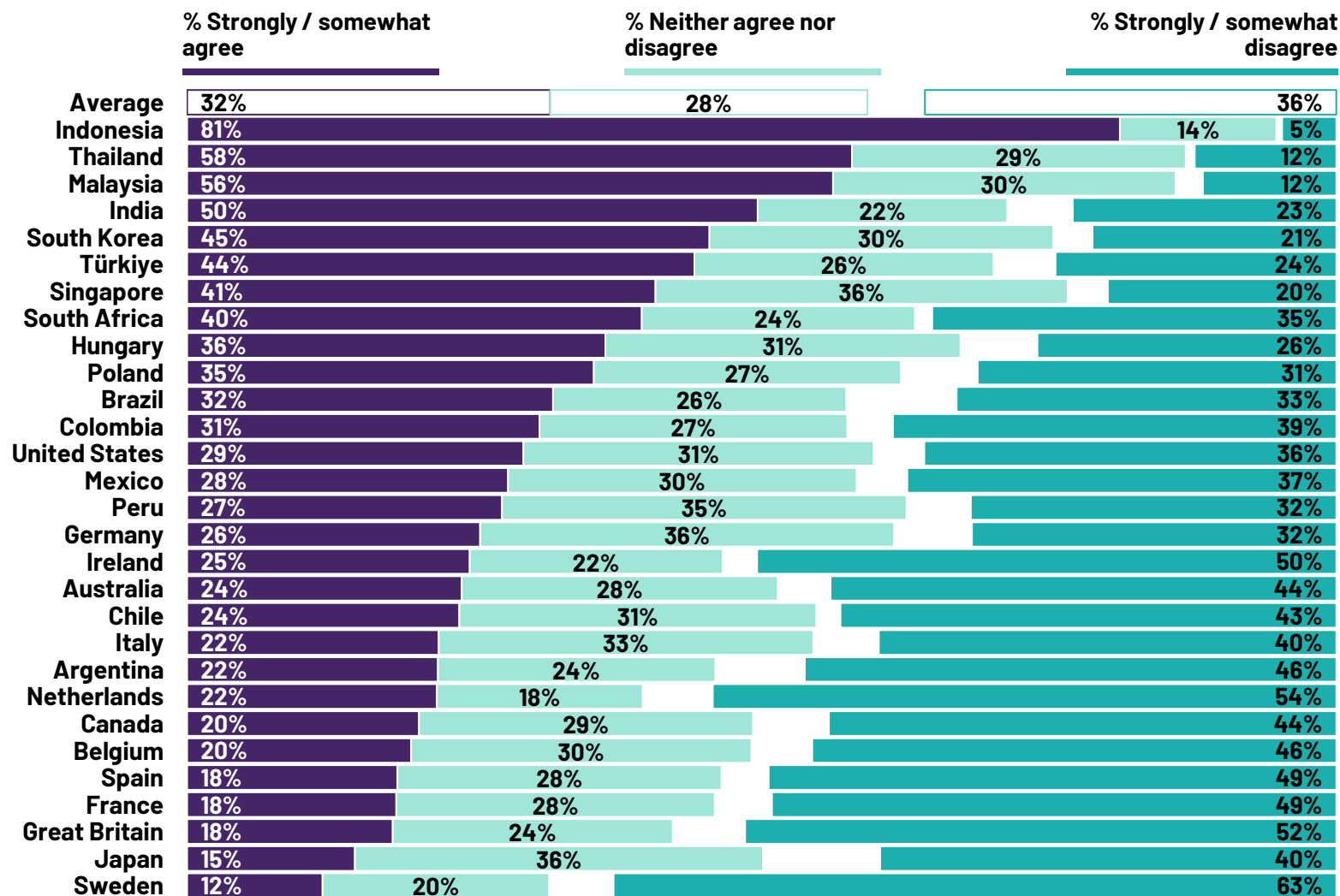

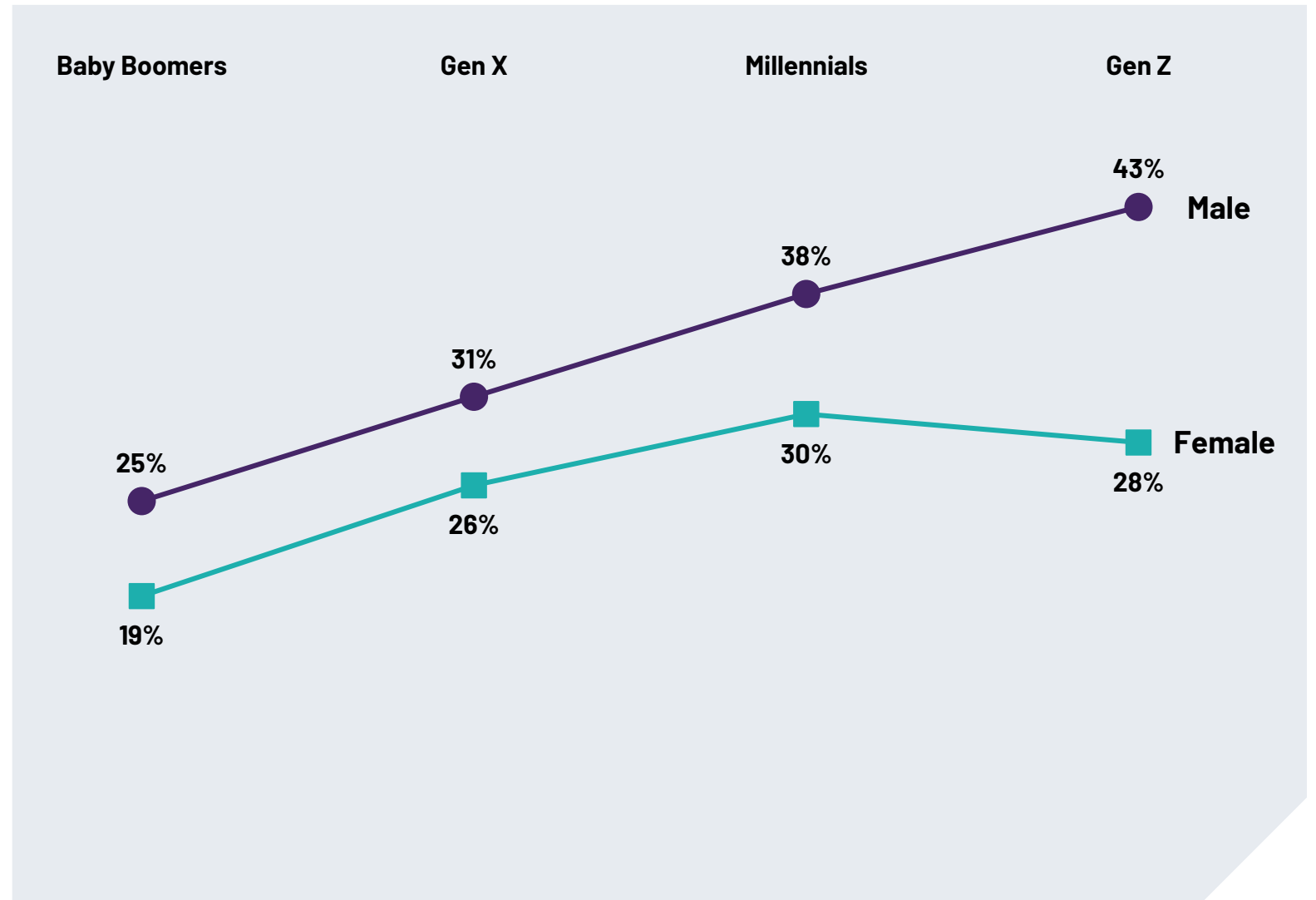

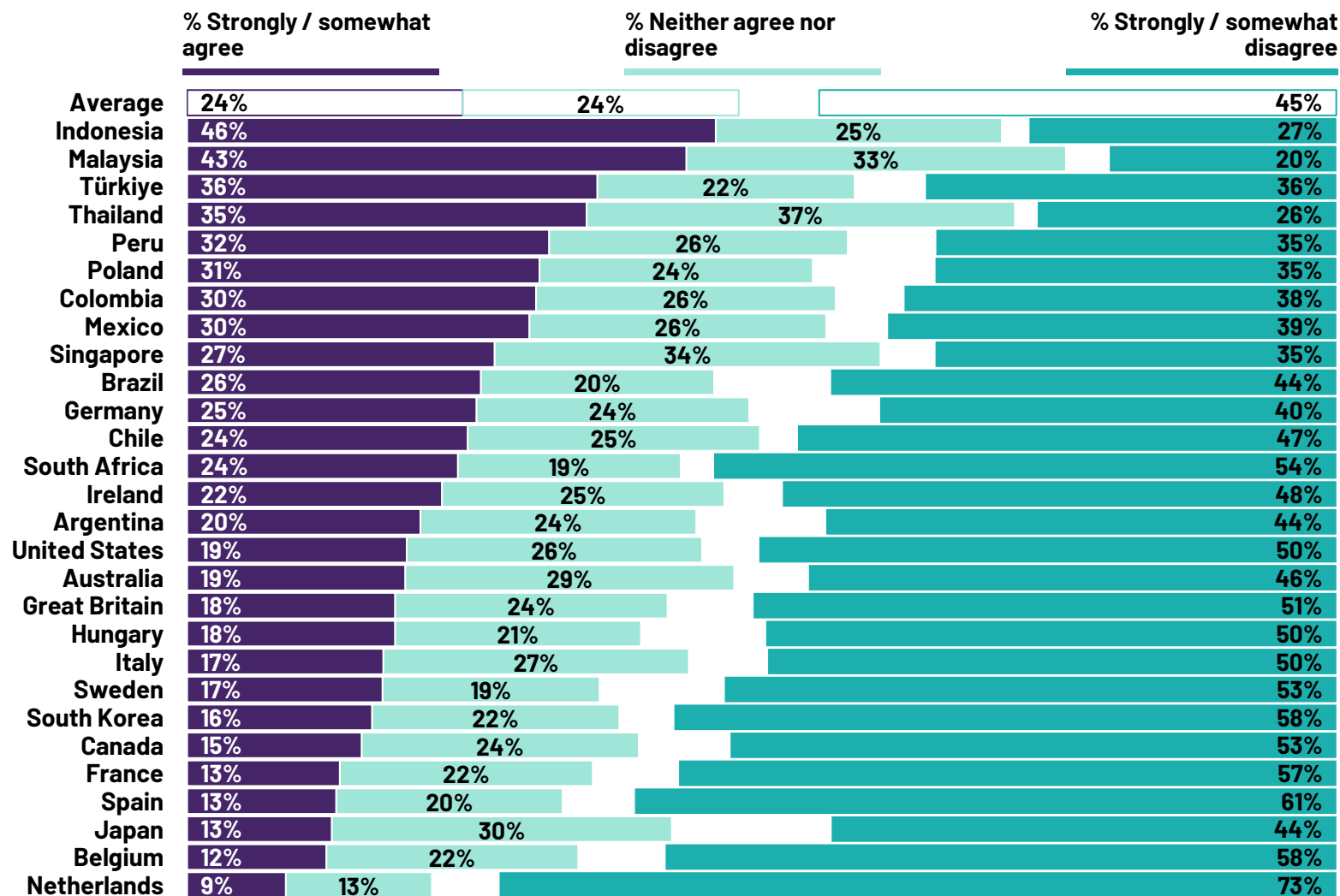

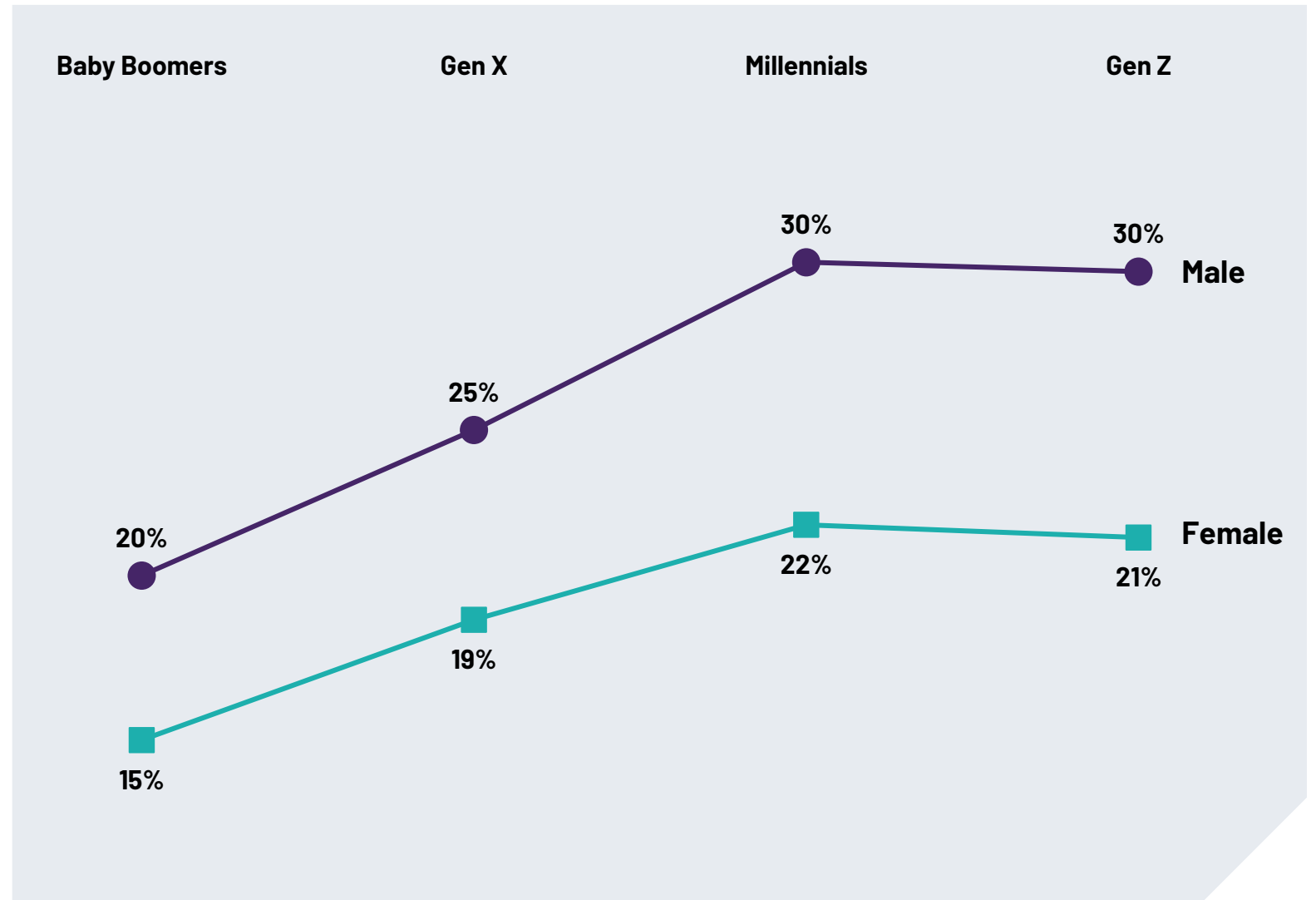

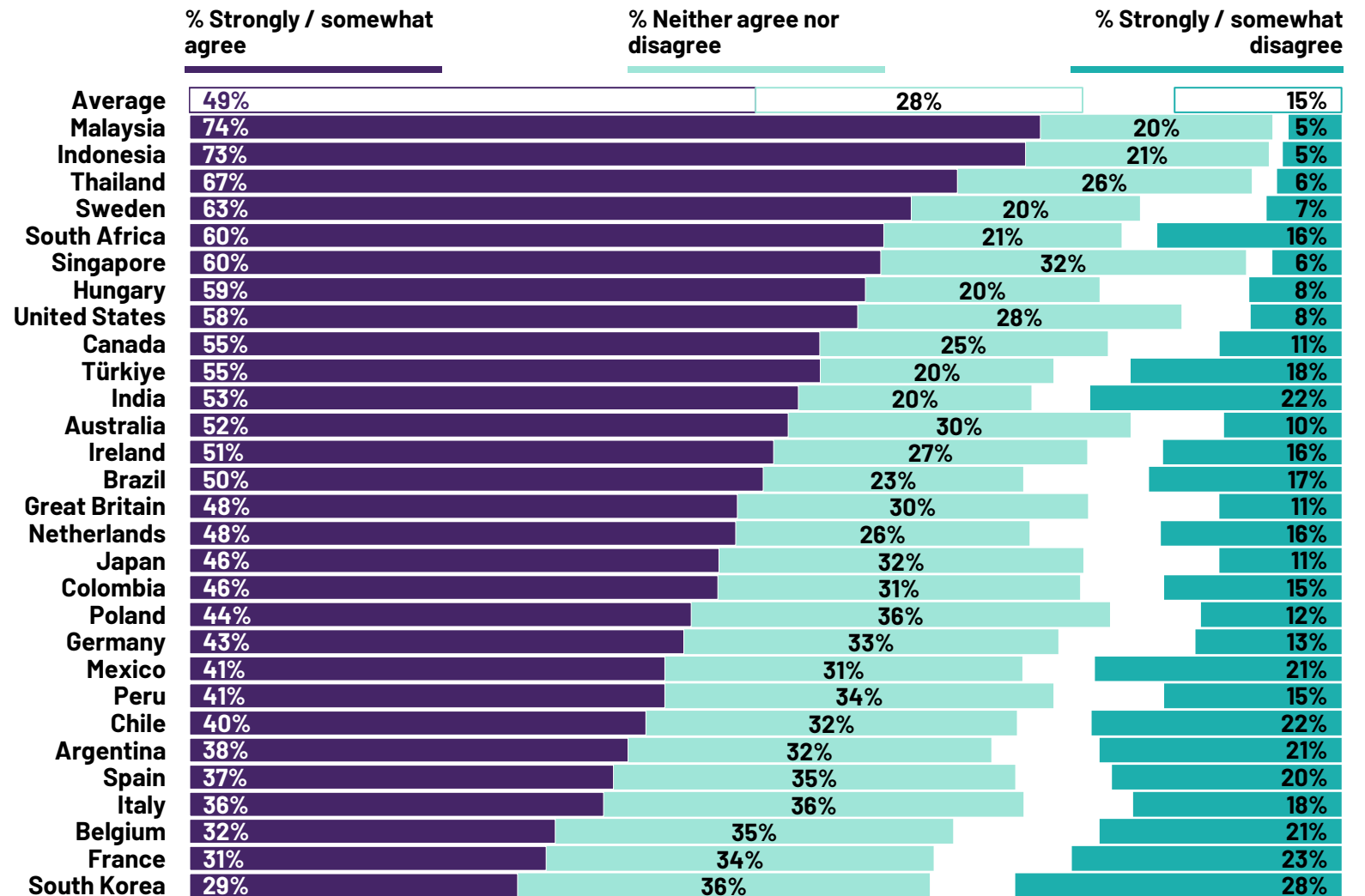

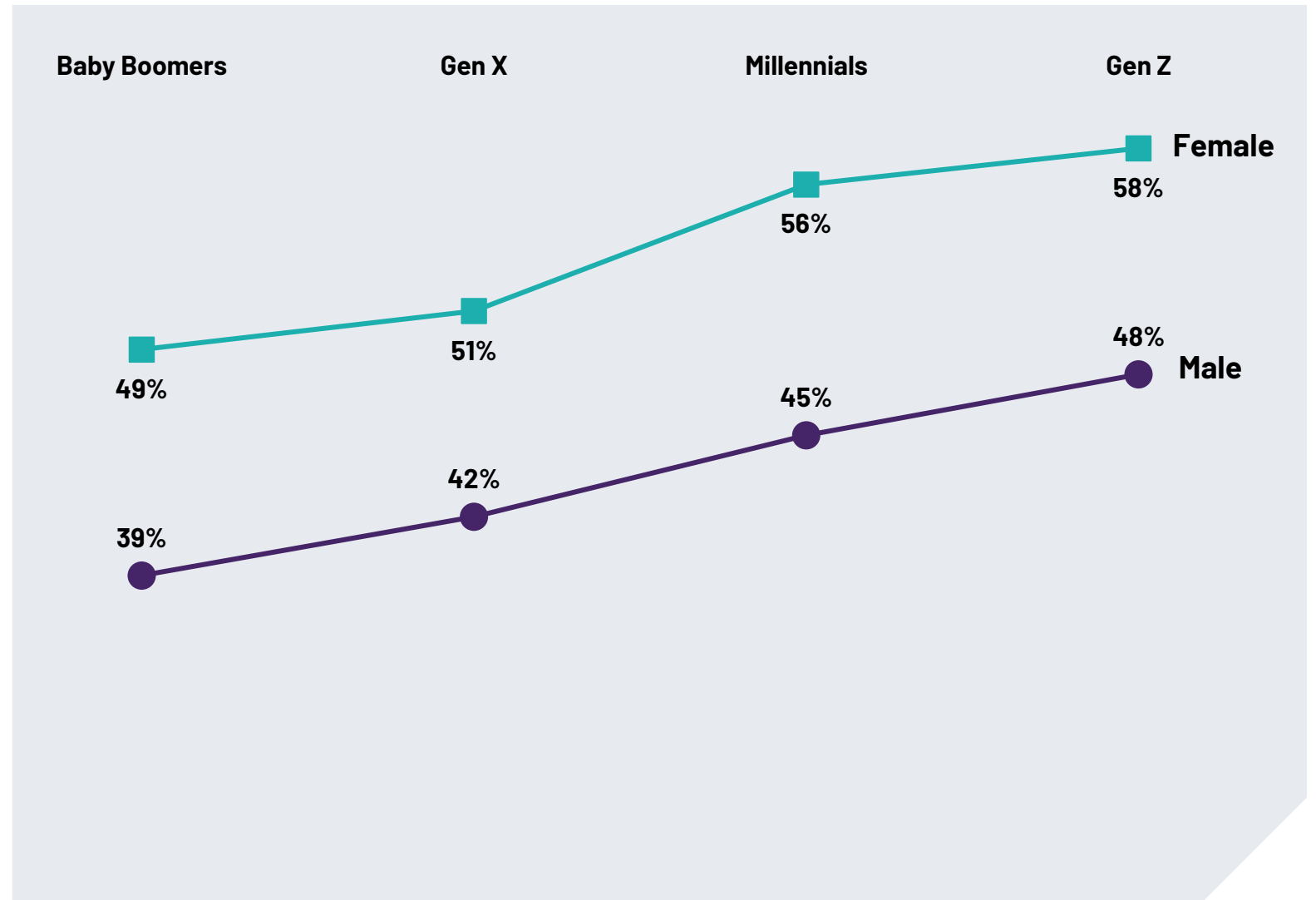

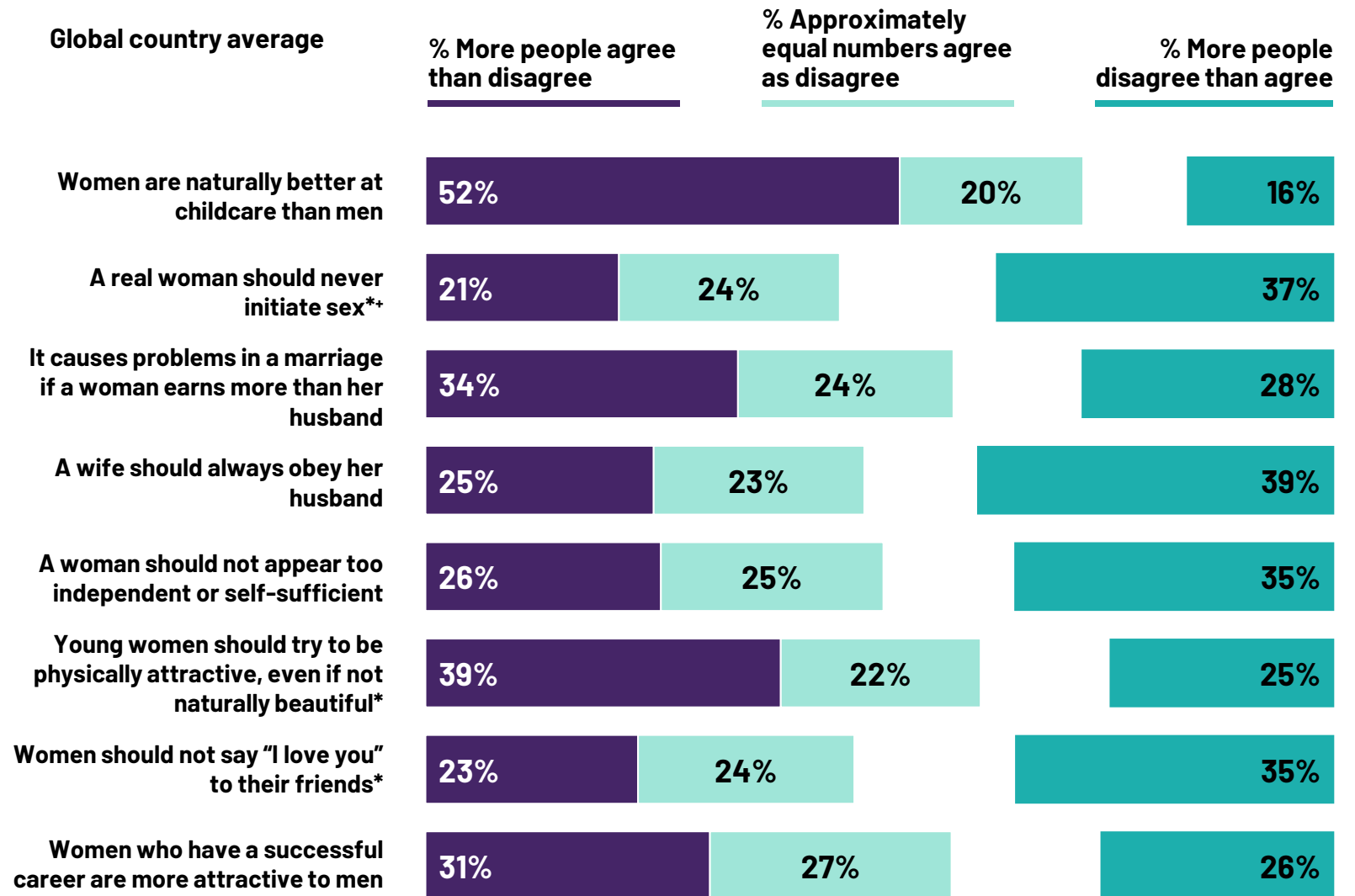

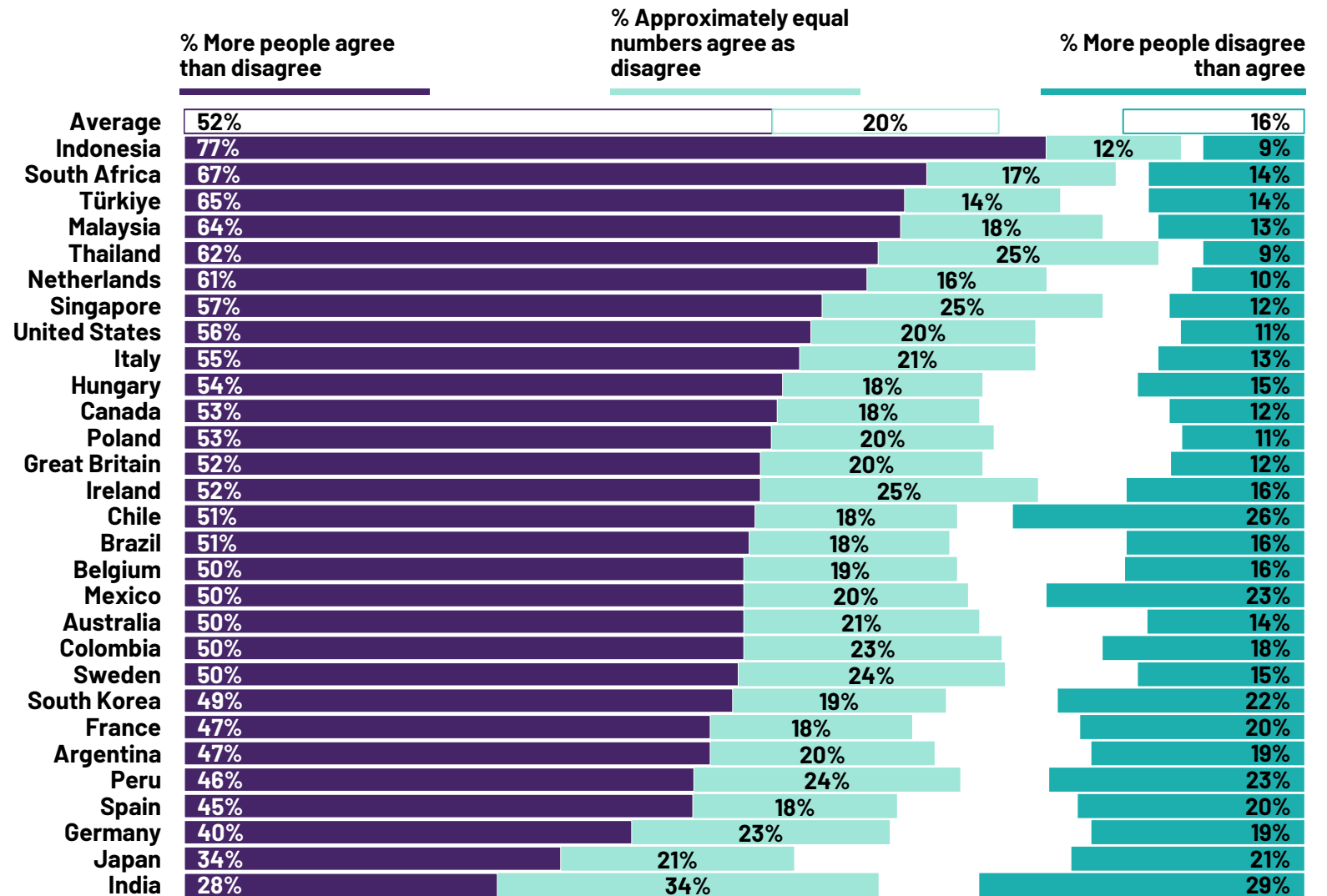

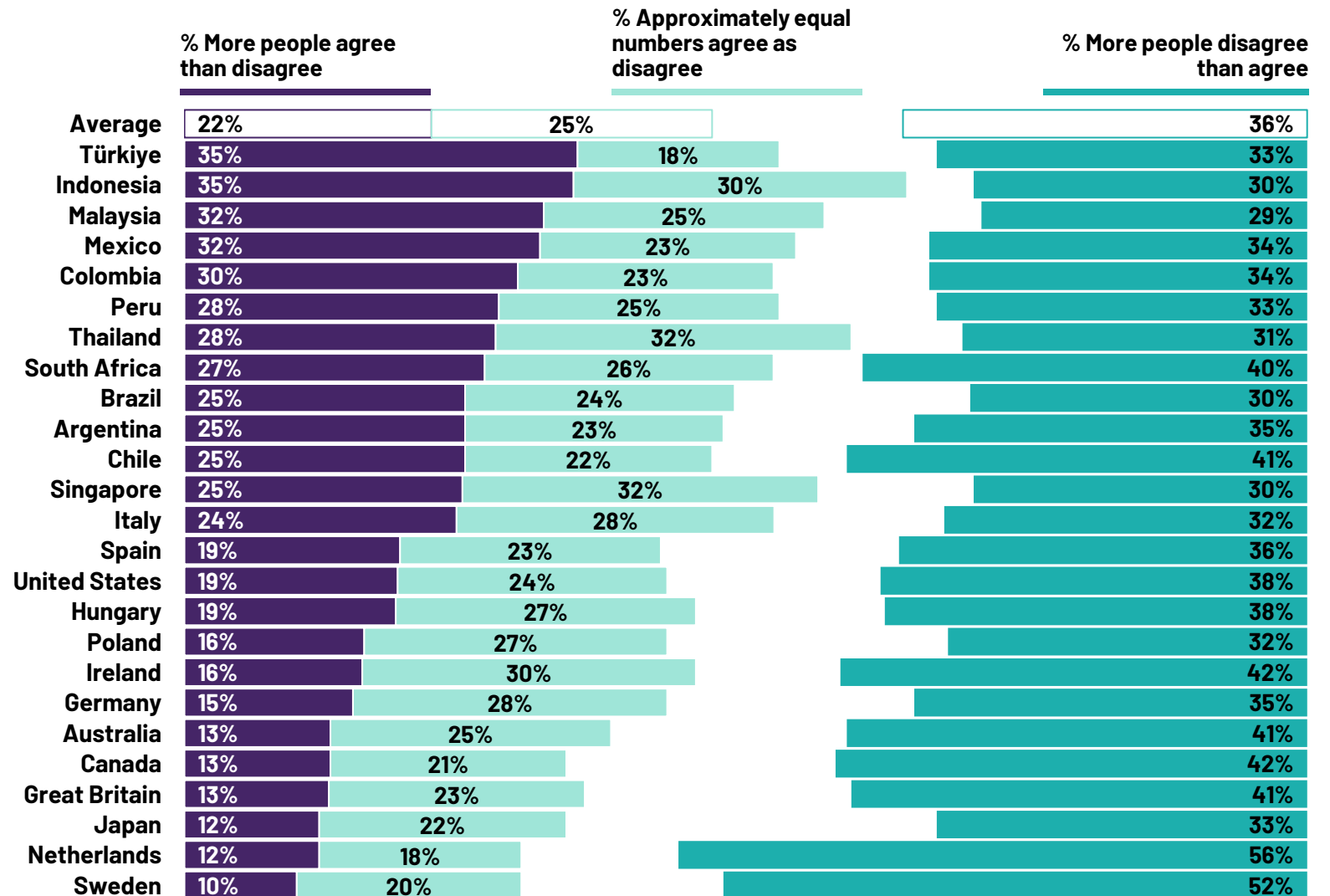

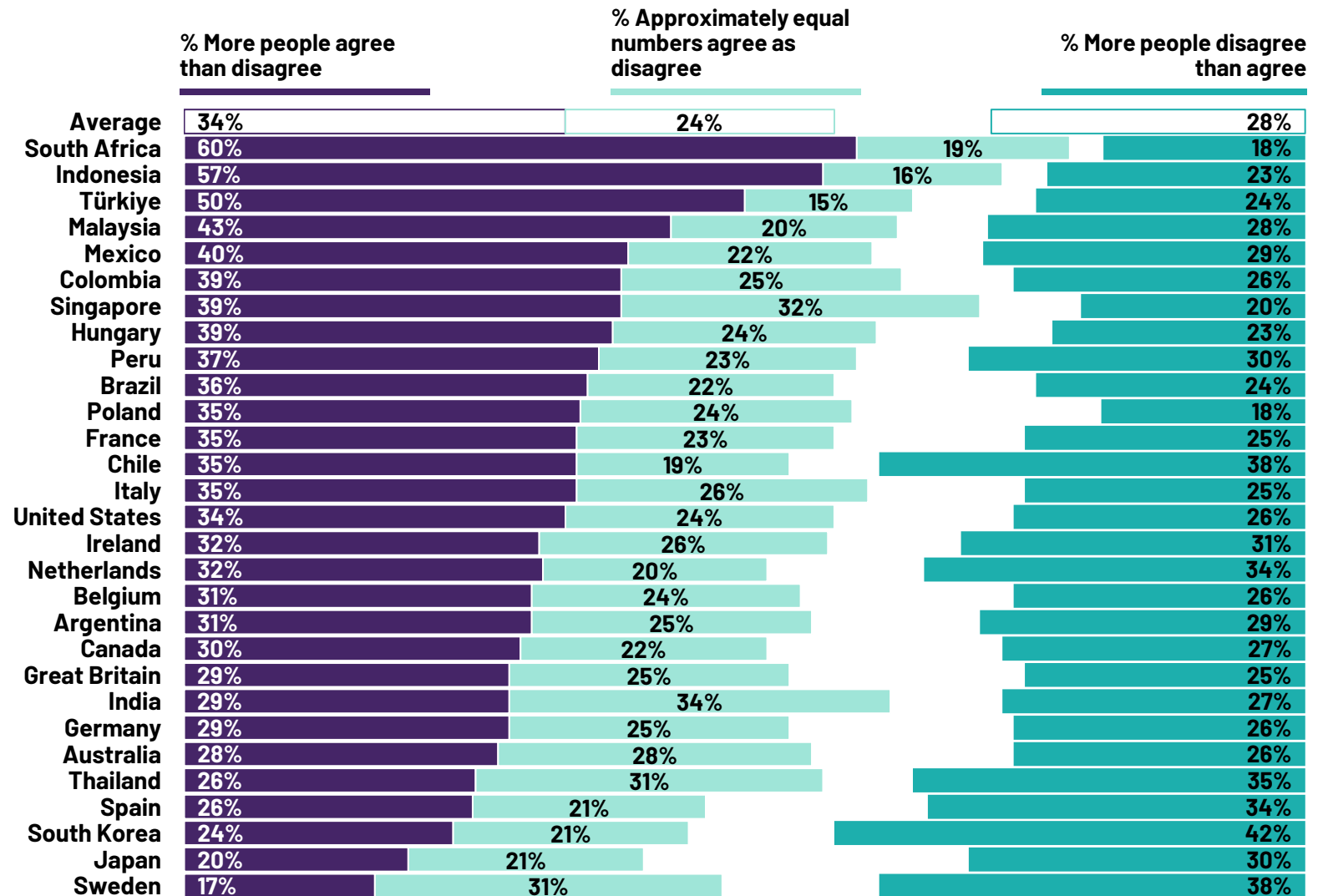

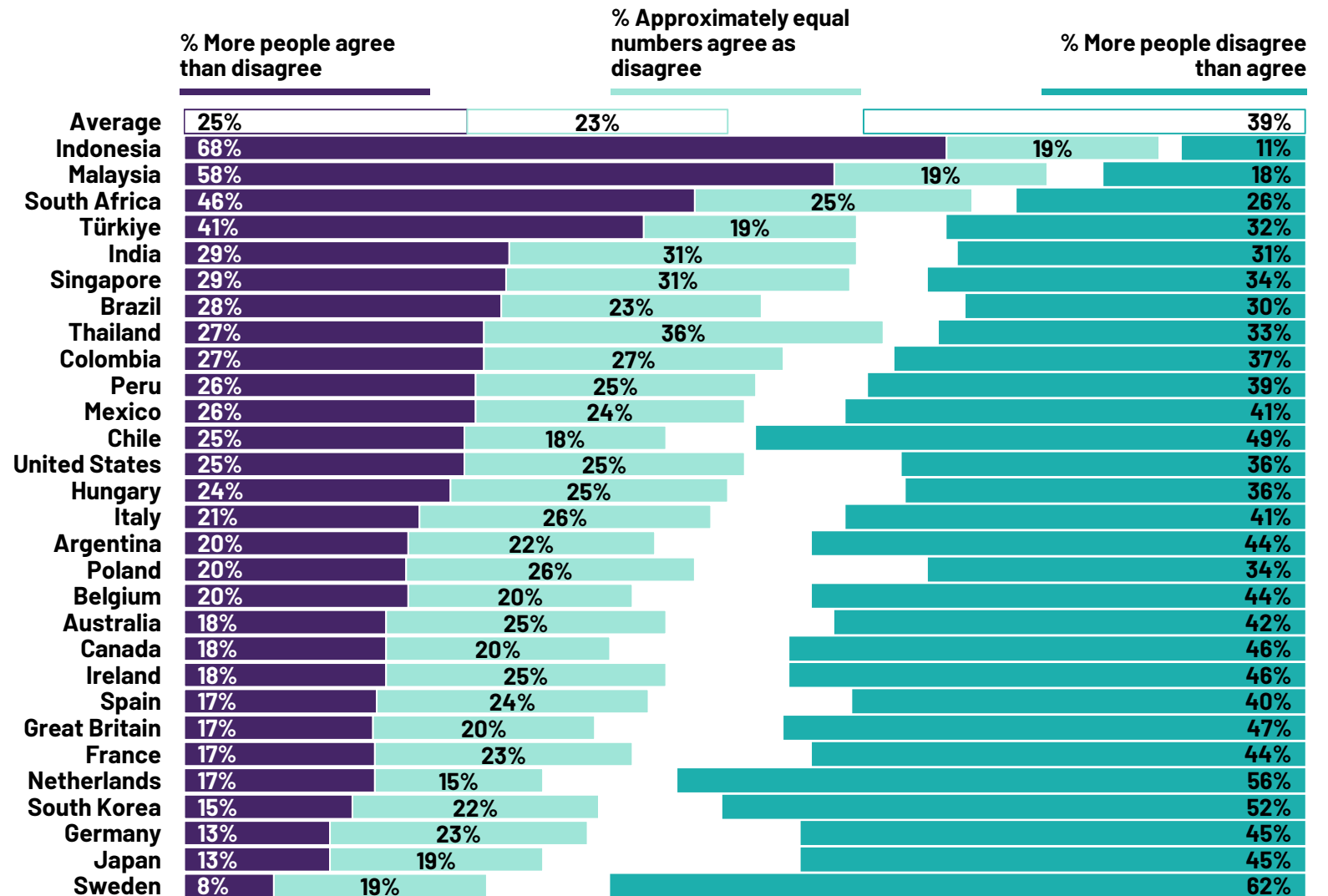

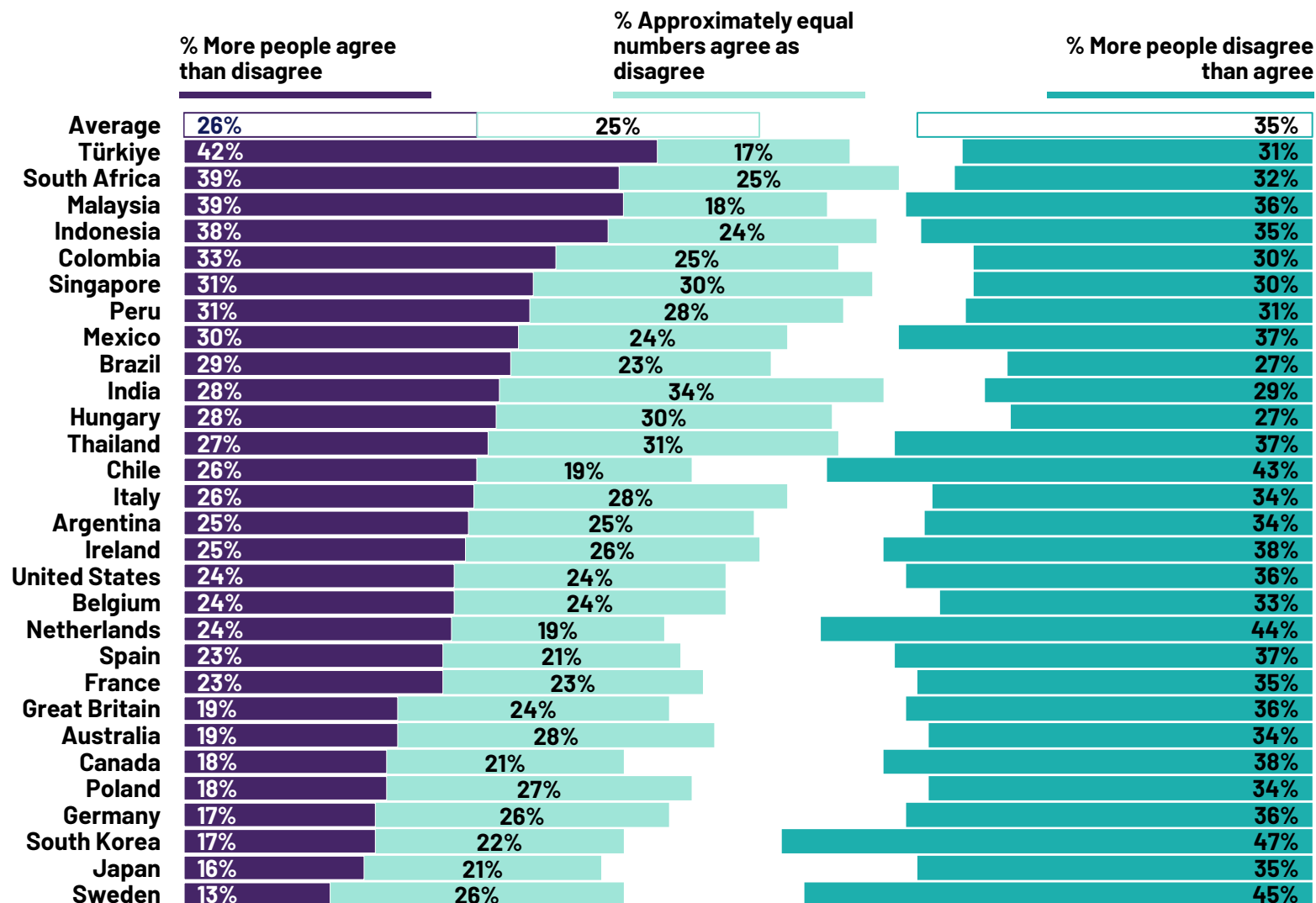

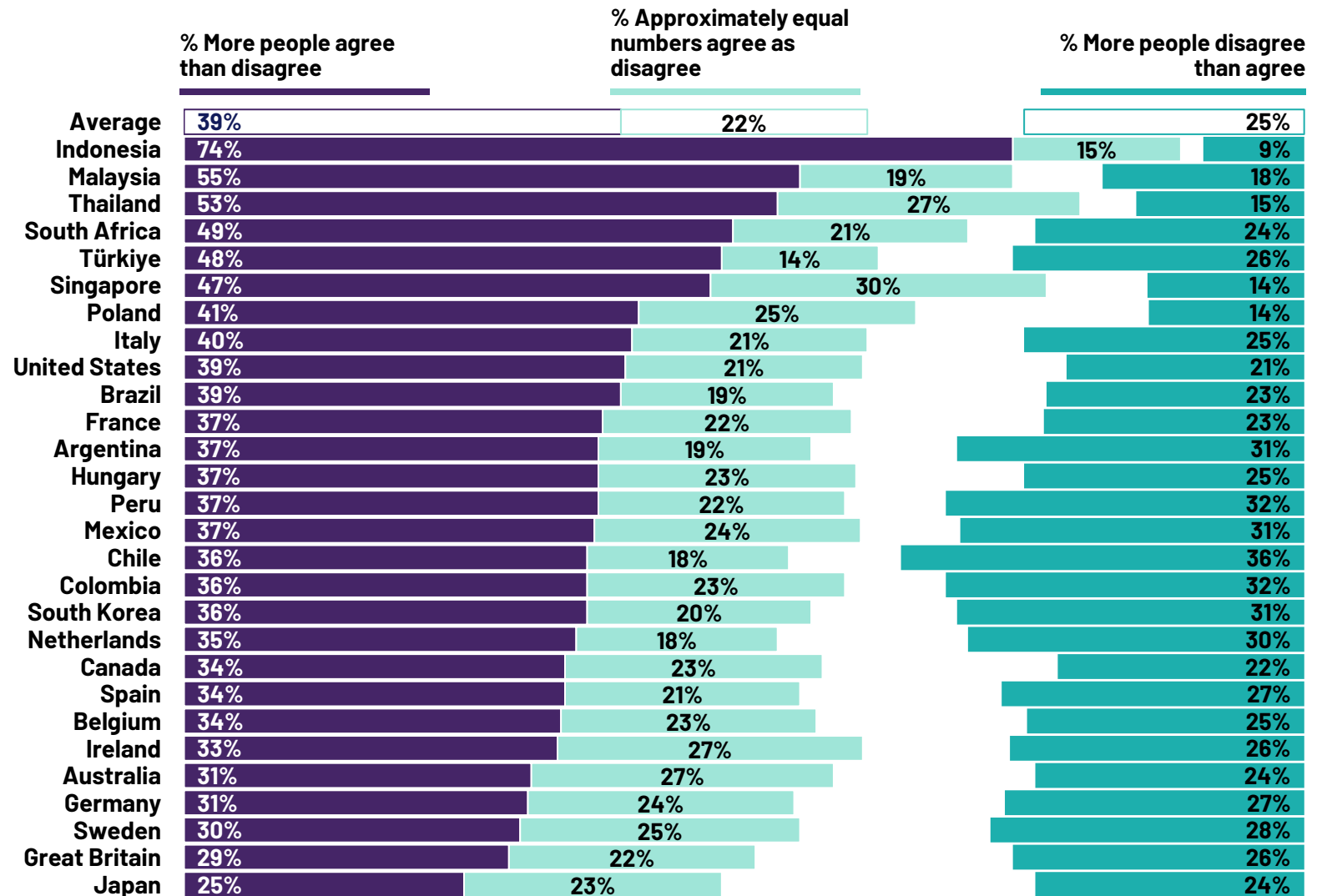

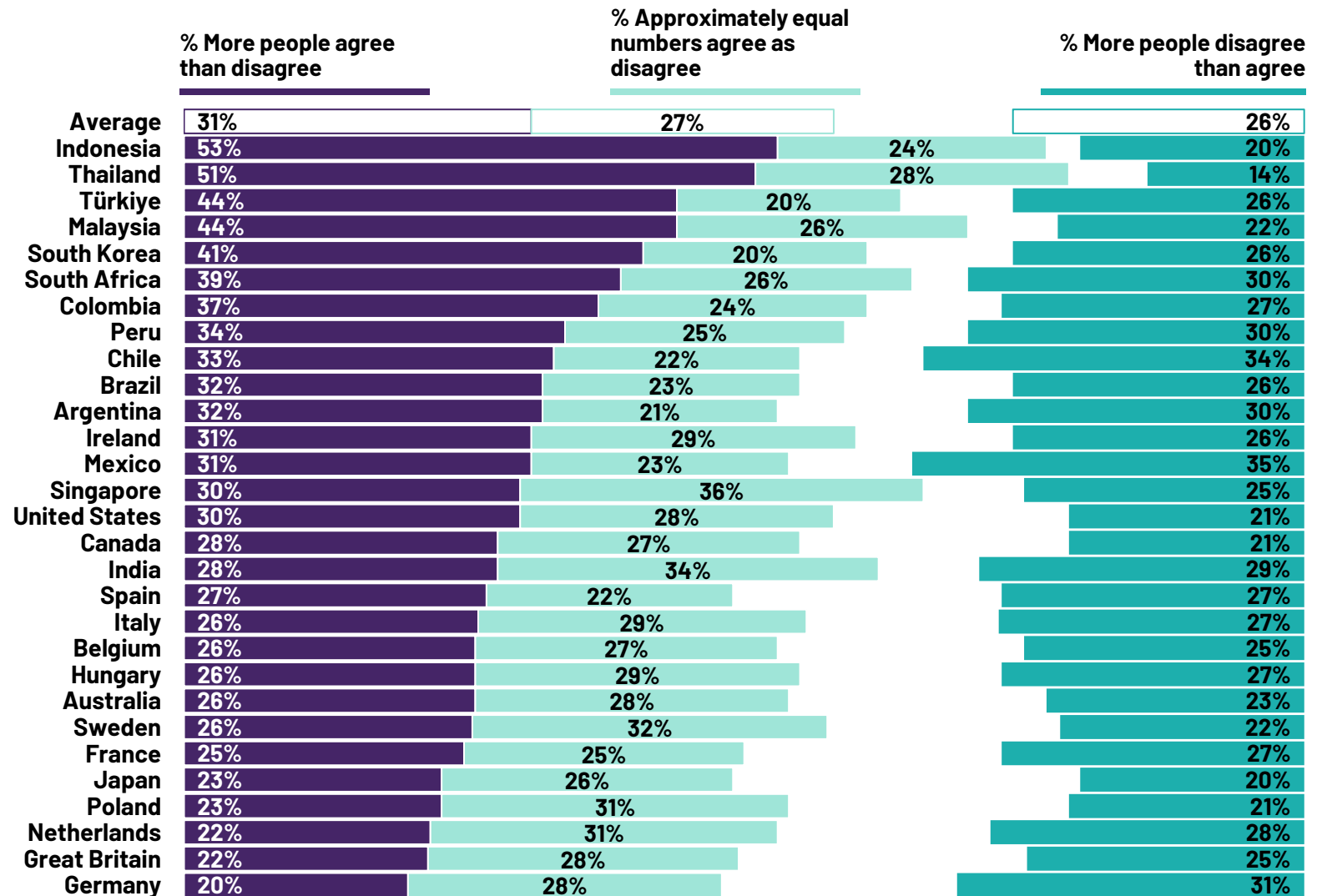

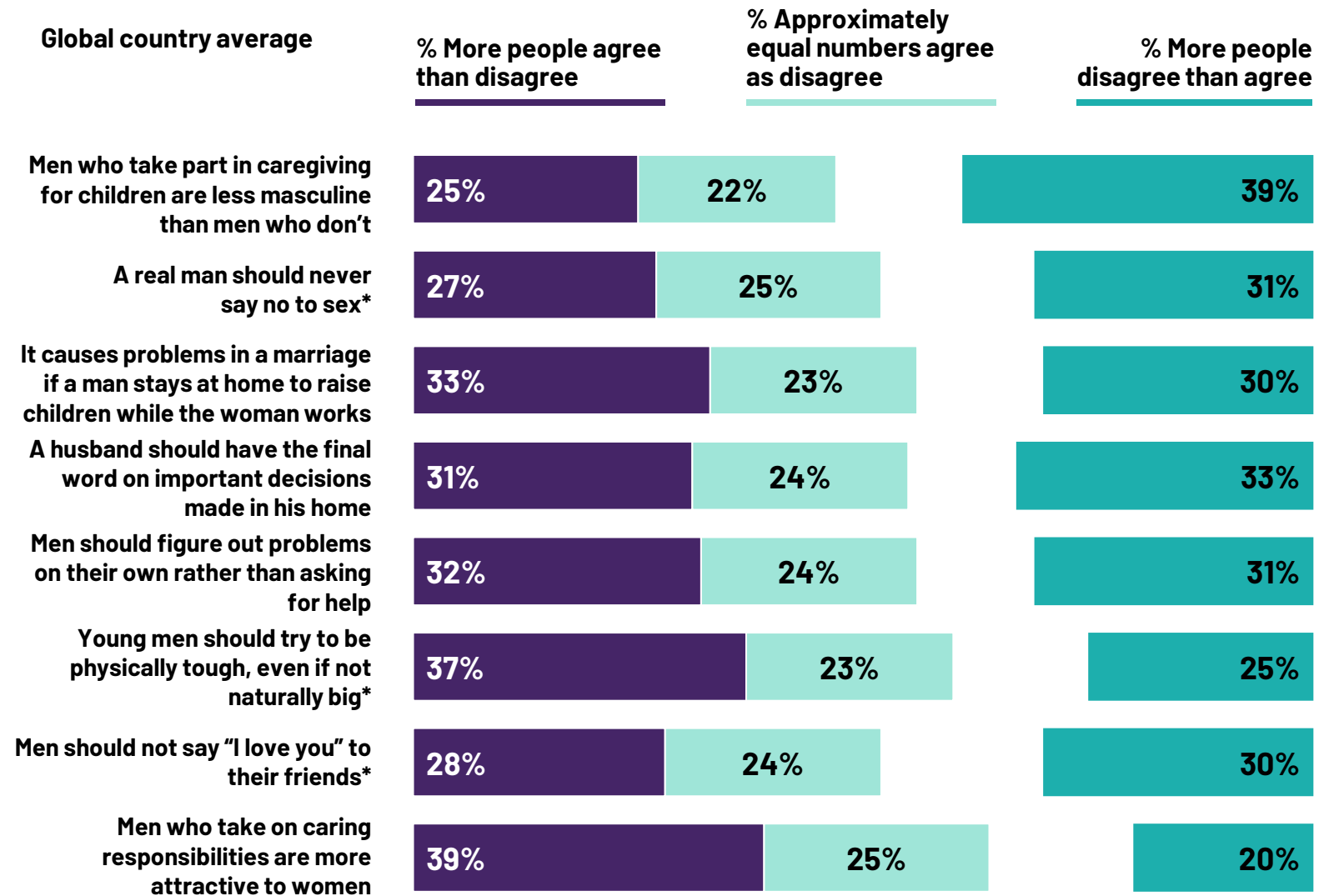

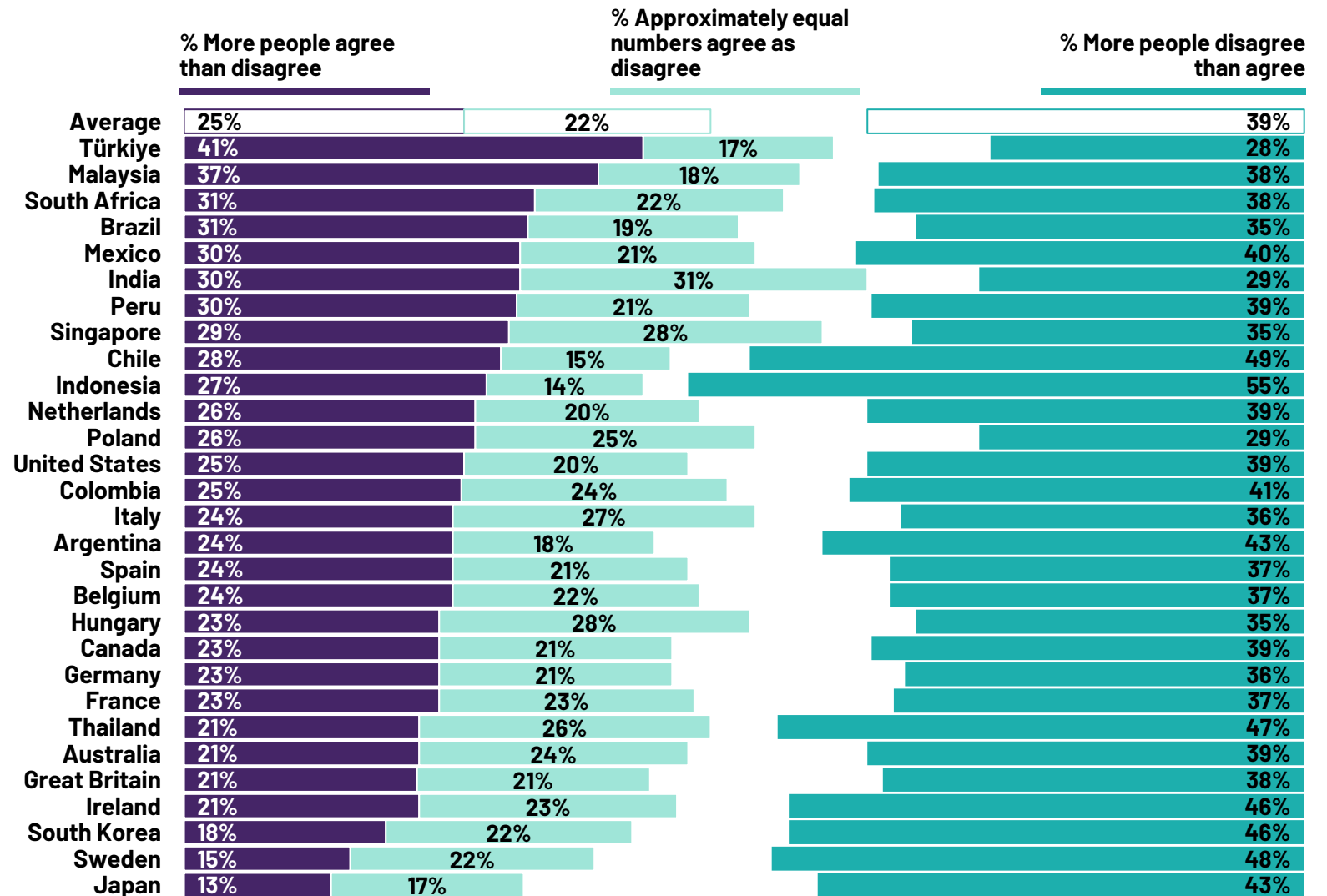

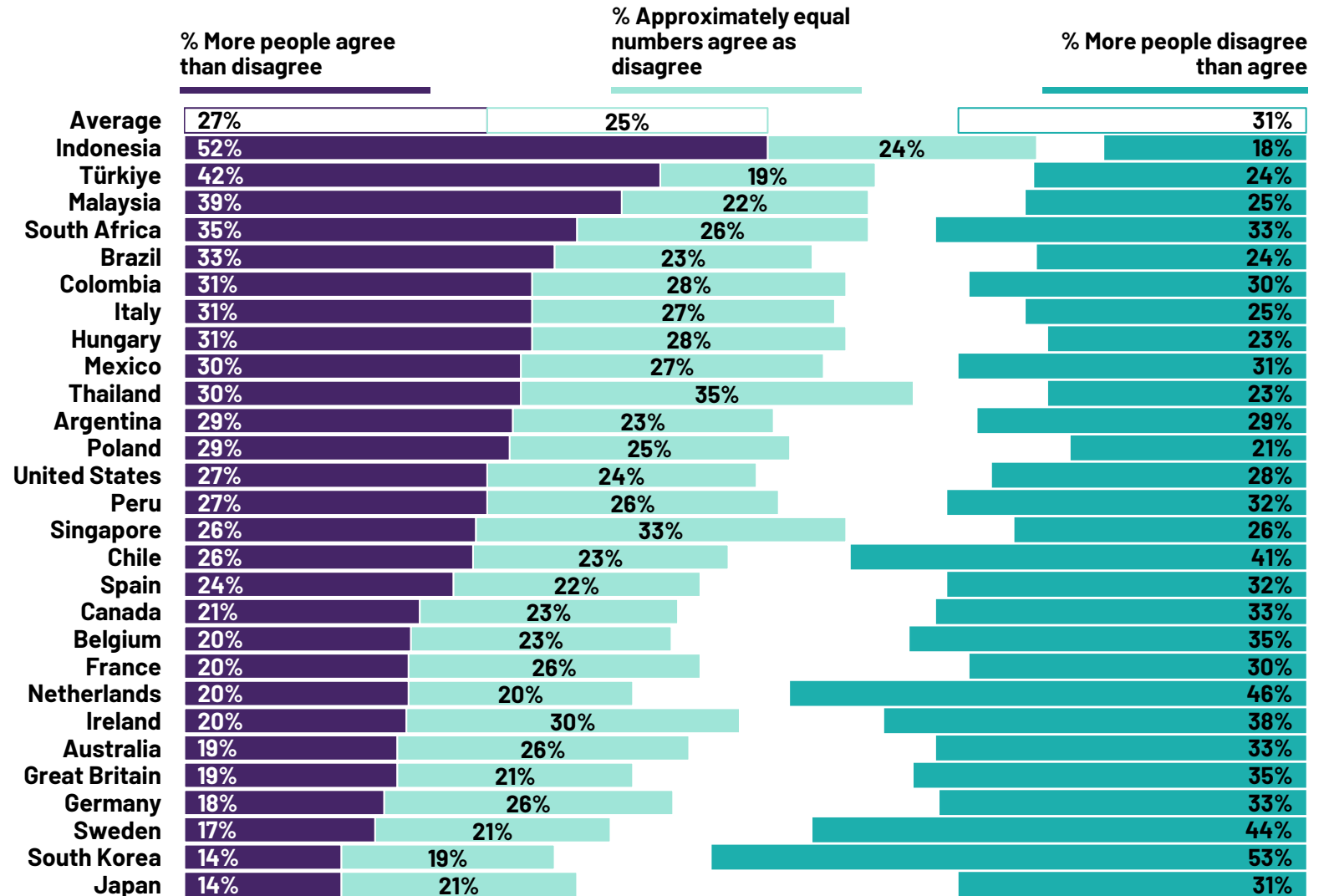

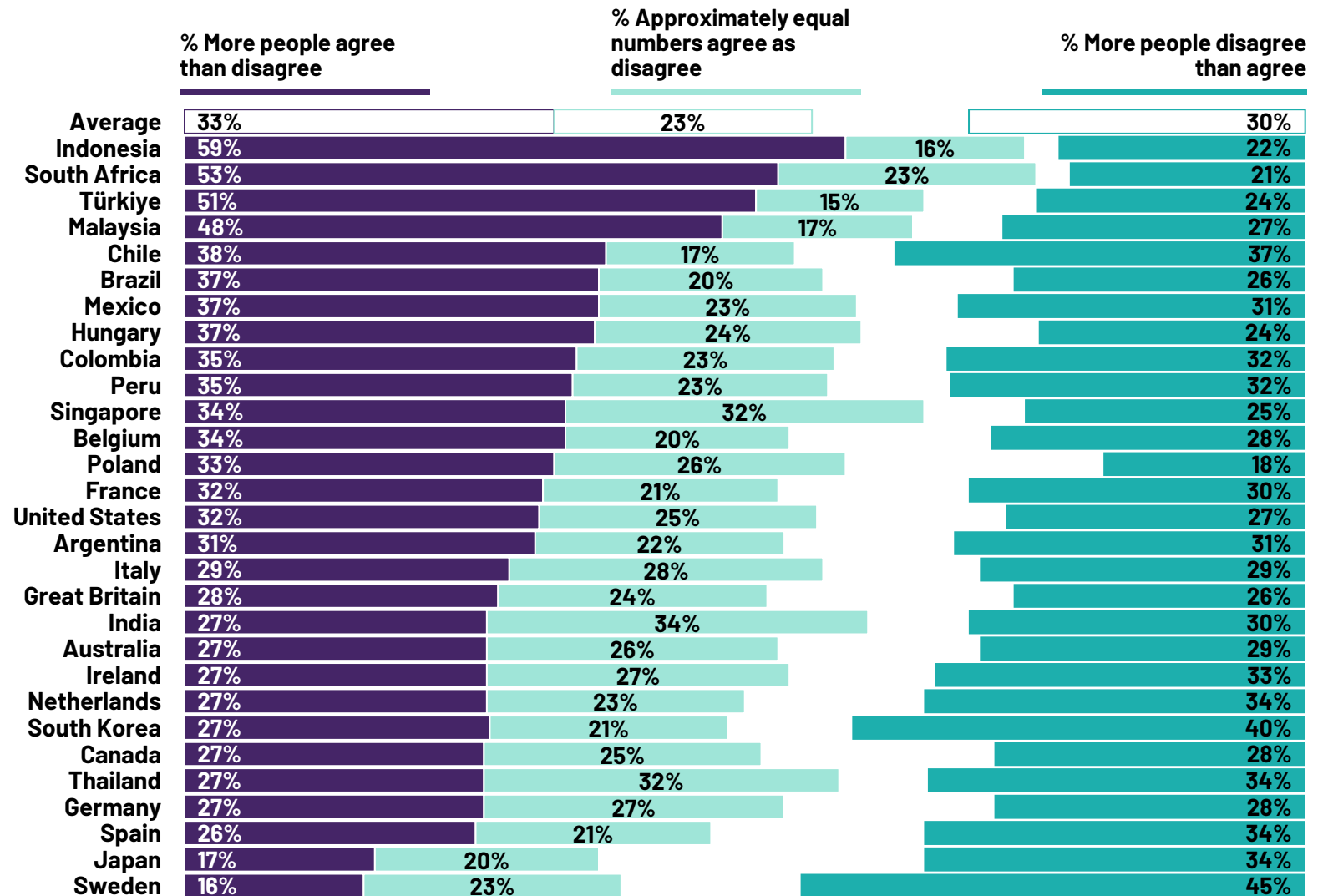

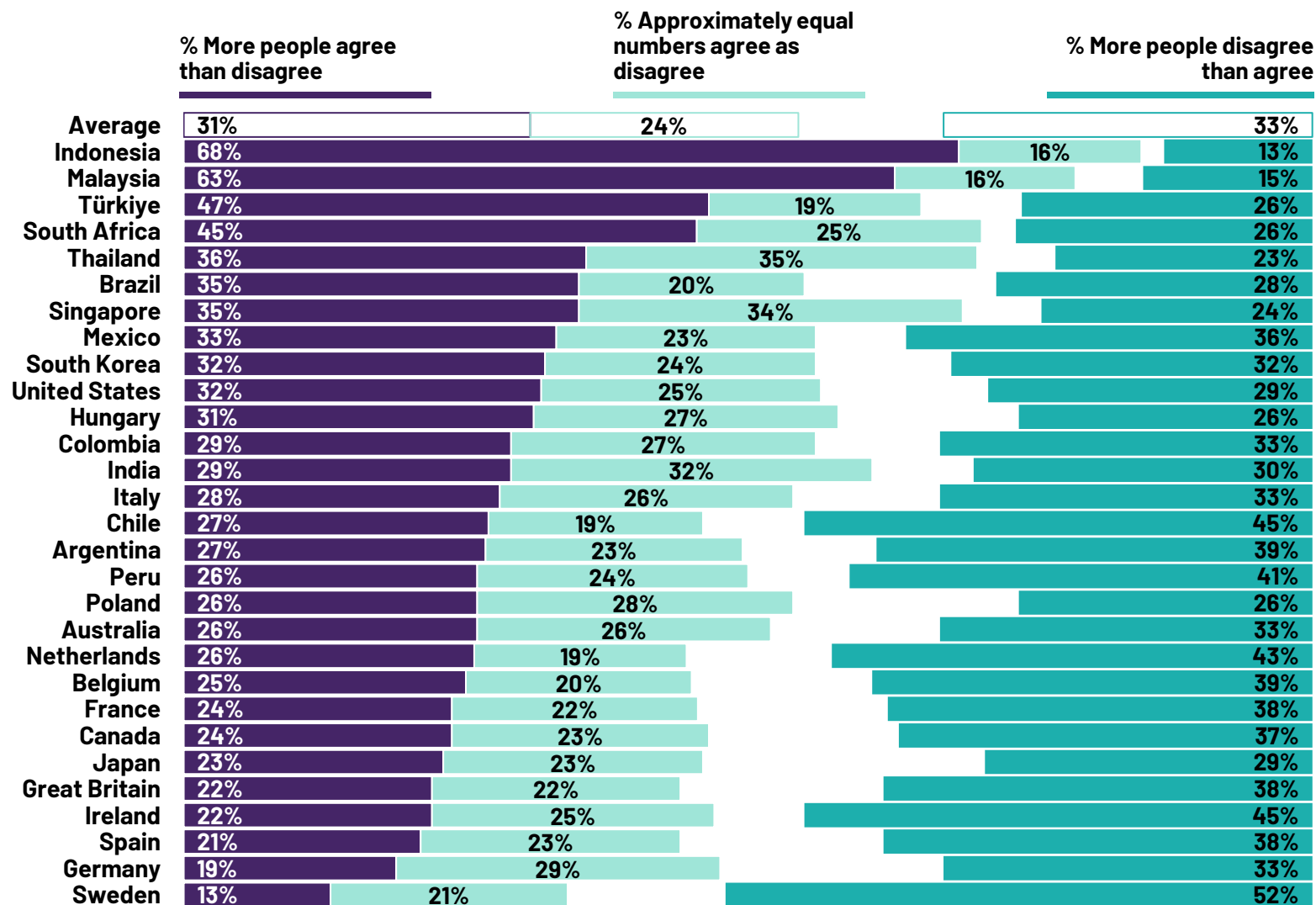

People are divided as to whether more in their country would agree (31%) or disagree (33%) that a husband should have the final word on important decisions made in his home.



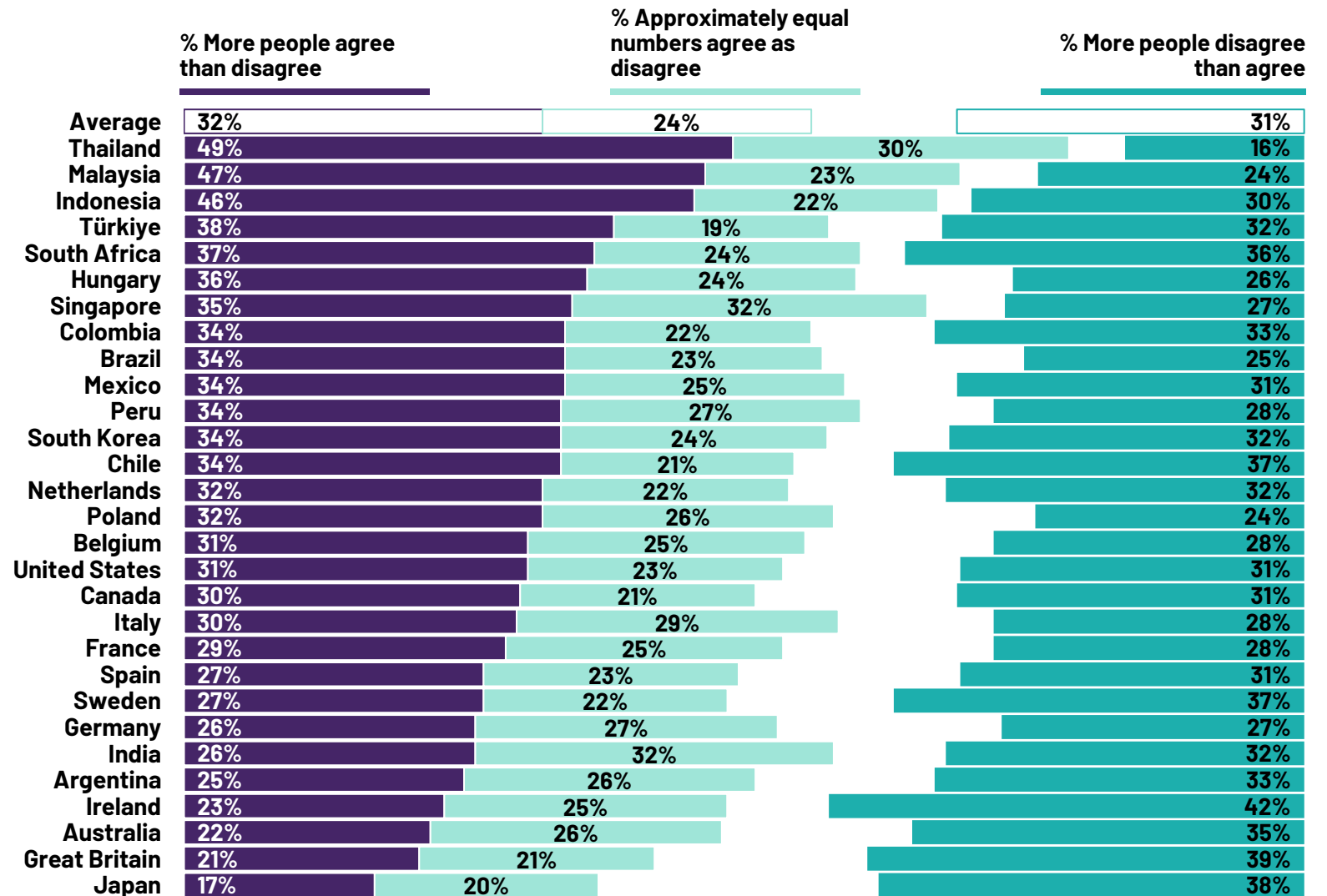

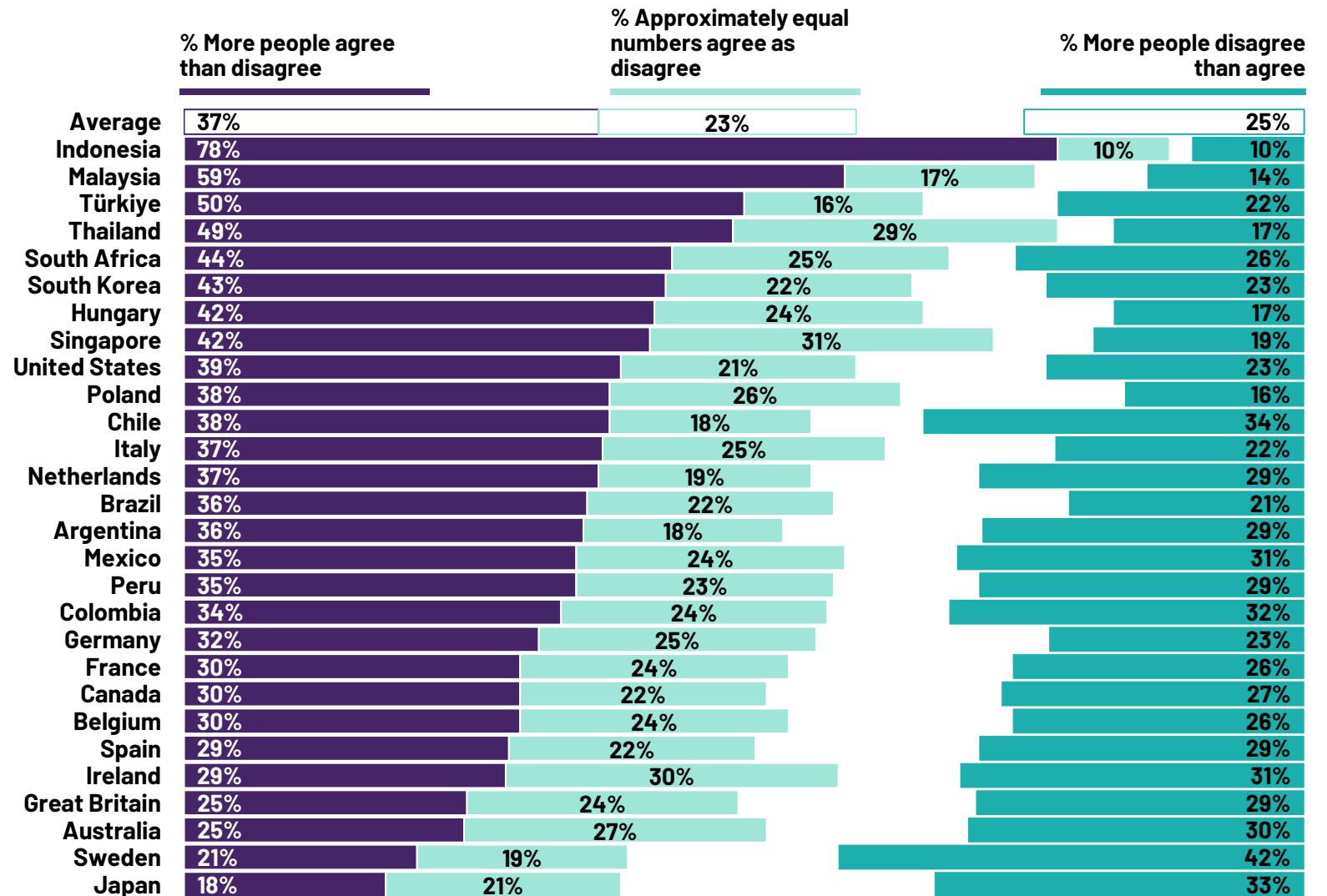

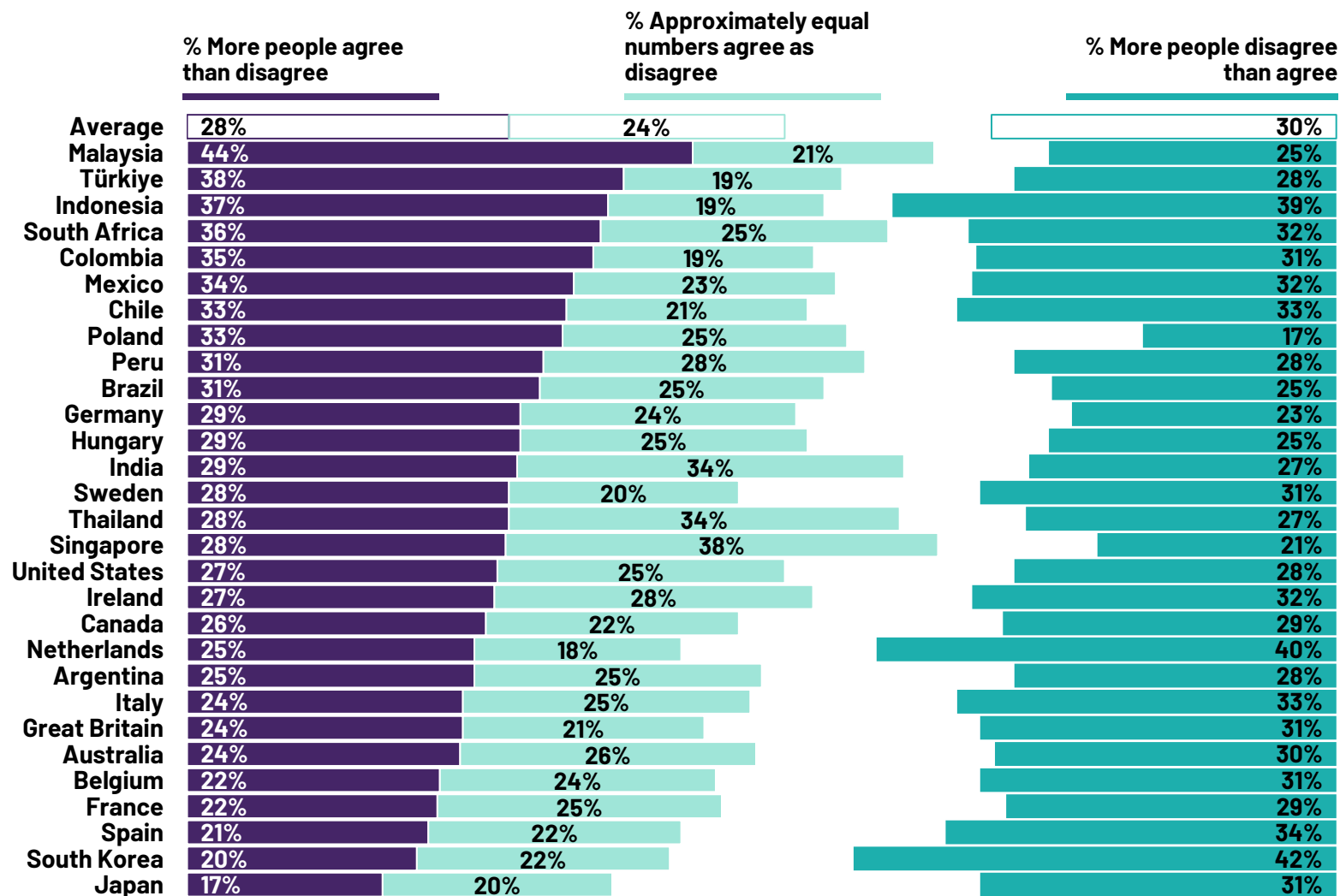

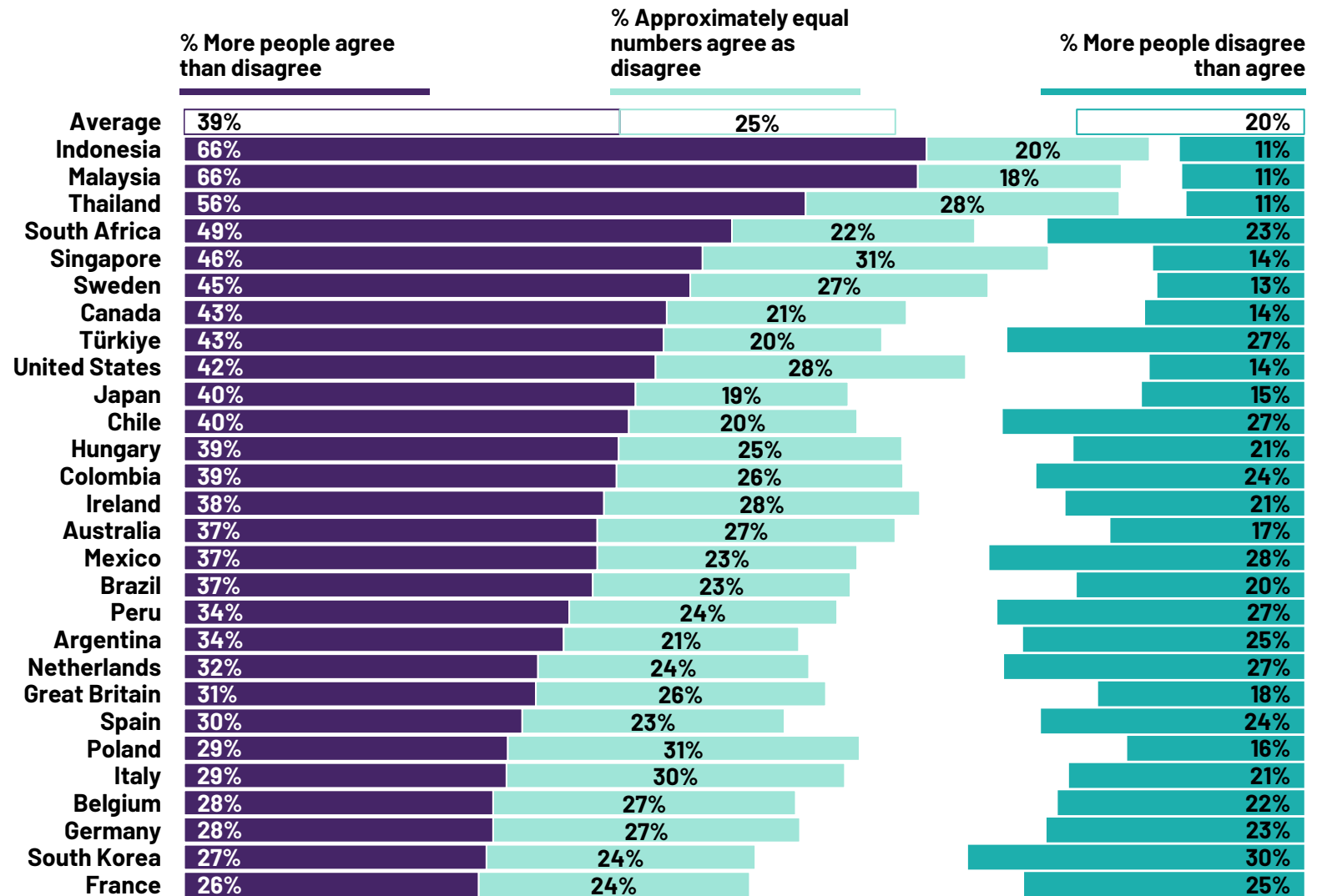

Technical Note

Methodology

These are the results of a 29-country survey conducted by Ipsos on its Global Advisor online platform and, in India, on its IndiaBus platform, between Wednesday, December 24, 2025 and Friday, January 9, 2026. For this survey, Ipsos interviewed a total of 23,268 adults aged 18 years and older in India, 18-74 in Canada, Republic of Ireland, Malaysia, South Africa, Türkiye, and the United States, 20-74 in Thailand, 21-74 in Indonesia and Singapore, and 16-74 in all other countries.

The sample consists of approximately 2,000 individuals in Japan, 1,000 individuals each in Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Mexico, Spain, and the U.S., and 500 individuals each in Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Malaysia, the Netherlands, Peru, Poland, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Thailand, and Türkiye. The sample in India consists of approximately 2,200 individuals, of whom approximately 1,800 were interviewed face-to-face and 400 were interviewed online.

Samples in Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Hungary, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Poland, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, and the U.S. can be considered representative of their general adult populations under the age of 75. Samples in Brazil,

Chile, Colombia, Indonesia, Ireland, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Singapore, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Thailand, and Türkiye are more urban, more educated, and/or more affluent than the general population. The survey results for these countries should be viewed as reflecting the views of the more “connected” segment of their population.

India’s sample represents a large subset of its urban population – social economic classes A, B and C in metros and tier 1-3 town classes across all four zones.

The data is weighted so that the composition of each country’s sample best reflects the demographic profile of the adult population according to the most recent census data. “The Global Country Average” reflects the average result for all the countries and markets in which the survey was conducted. It has not been adjusted to the population size of each country or market and is not intended to suggest a total result.

When percentages do not sum up to 100 or the ‘difference’ appears to be +/-1 percentage point more/less than the actual result, this may be due to rounding, multiple responses, or the exclusion of “don’t know” or not stated responses.

The precision of Ipsos online polls is calculated using a credibility interval with a poll where N=1,000 being

accurate to +/- 3.5 percentage points and of where N=500 being accurate to +/- 5.0 percentage points. For more information on Ipsos’ use of credibility intervals, please visit the Ipsos website.
