Responding to COVID-19 in African Member States:

Data Deck of Polling Results: Zimbabwe

September 2021





INTRODUCTION

This deck provides the survey results for Zimbabwe and should be used a reference document.

This is the fourth poll and analysis conducted since the pandemic began. The first poll occurred in May 2020, the second in August 2020, and the third in February 2021. Results of the second survey (S2) and third survey (S3) are provided for tracking purposes against this fourth survey (S4) where the questions are comparable. Results from the first poll are not included as the first poll was done in urban centers only and cannot be compared to the national polls conducted in the second and third polls.

METHODOLOGY

This fourth public opinion poll in Zimbabwe was conducted from 10 September 2021 to 22 September 2021.

The polling was conducted by telephone. Samples were drawn to be nationally representative of the population with access to a landline or cell phone in each Member State. Weighting was applied by gender and region to align the final data with the population.

The unweighted national sample size in Zimbabwe is 1227 interviews. The weighted sample size is 1,200 interviews.

The regional comparison for Zimbabwe is the Southern region which includes Mozambique, South Africa and Zambia.






Q4. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements?








Q5. Please indicate what you think your level of risk of catching coronavirus or COVID-19 is:





Q6. If you were infected by coronavirus or COVID-19, how seriously do you think it would affect your health?







Q3. Do you have a face mask of any kind that is ready for you to wear?



Q12a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? - A). Thinking about resuming normal activities makes me feel very anxious






