





How satisfied are you with your quality of life in Sydney?









How would you rate quality of life in Sydney compared to 12 months ago?







How concerned are you about the cost of living in Sydney?




Those who are not satisfied with their quality of life are more likely to be concerned about the cost of living









A third of Sydneysiders commute five days a week






















