




Generally speaking, would you say things in this country are heading in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?



# **Ipsos Global Consumer Confidence**



In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the U.S. today?




















# **2020 Democratic Primary Horserace – Public Poll Averages**




### **Biden's South Carolina Firewall?**








# **Current Delegate Counts – 1,991 needed to secure nomination**
