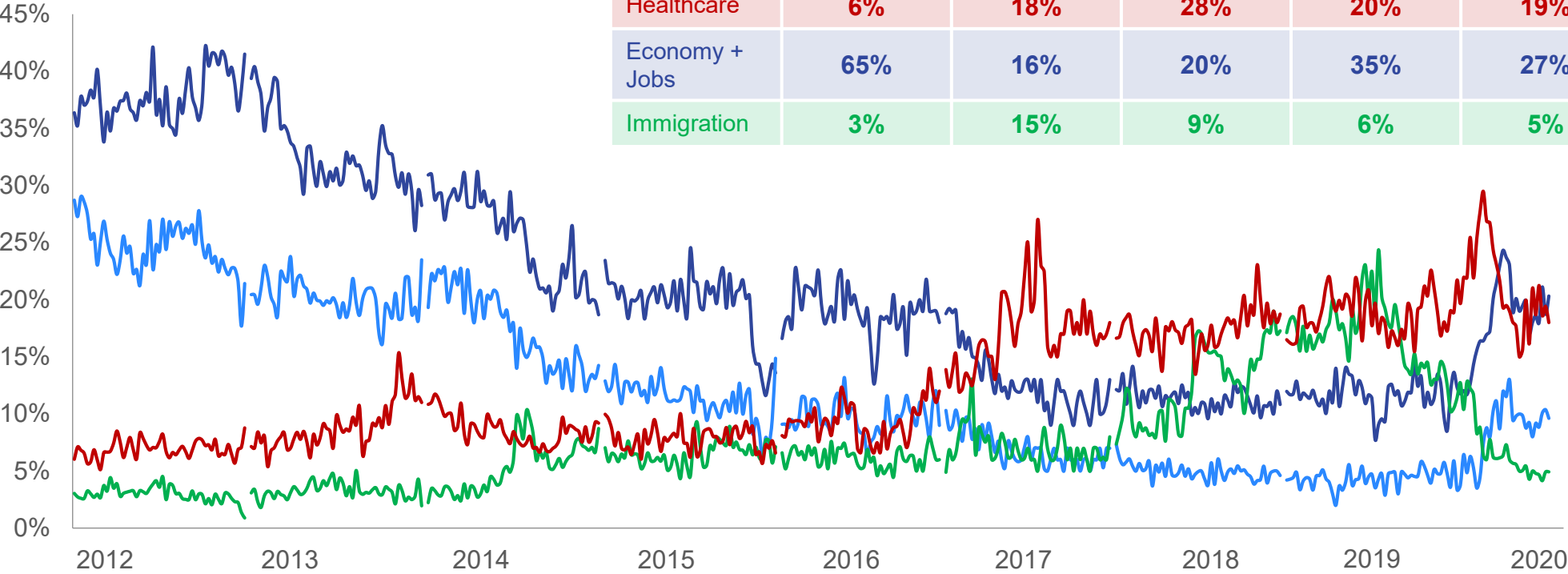

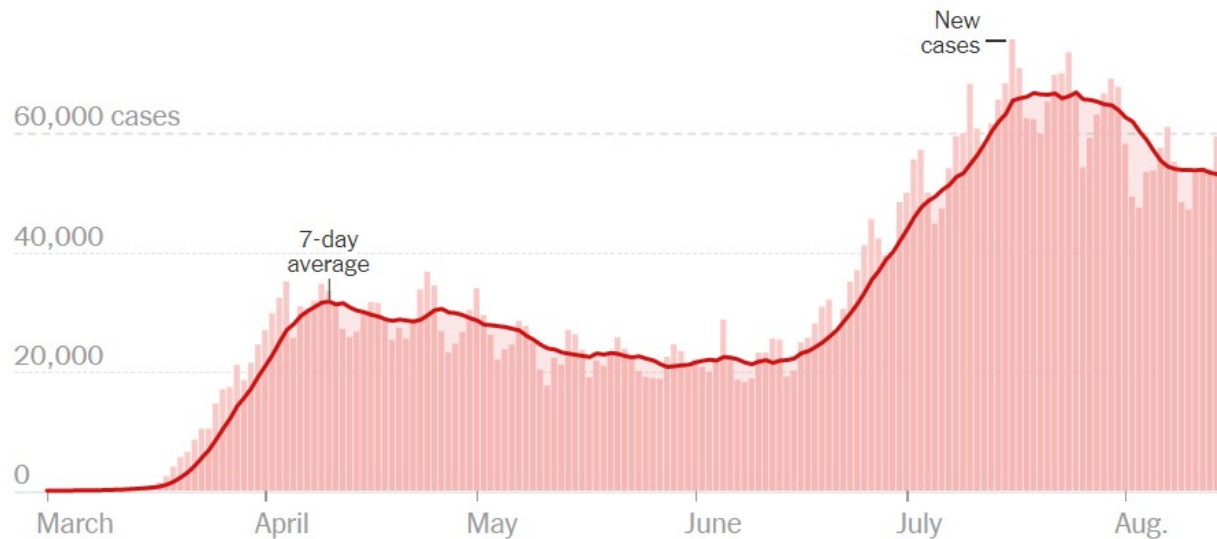

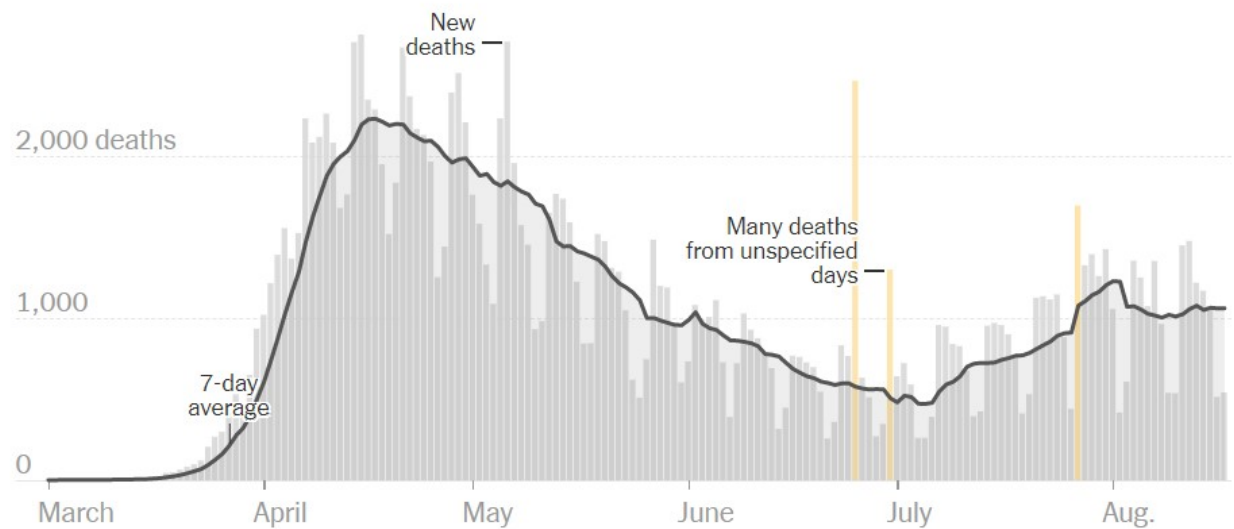
Reports of new cases are stabilizing at high rate

New reported deaths by day in the United States

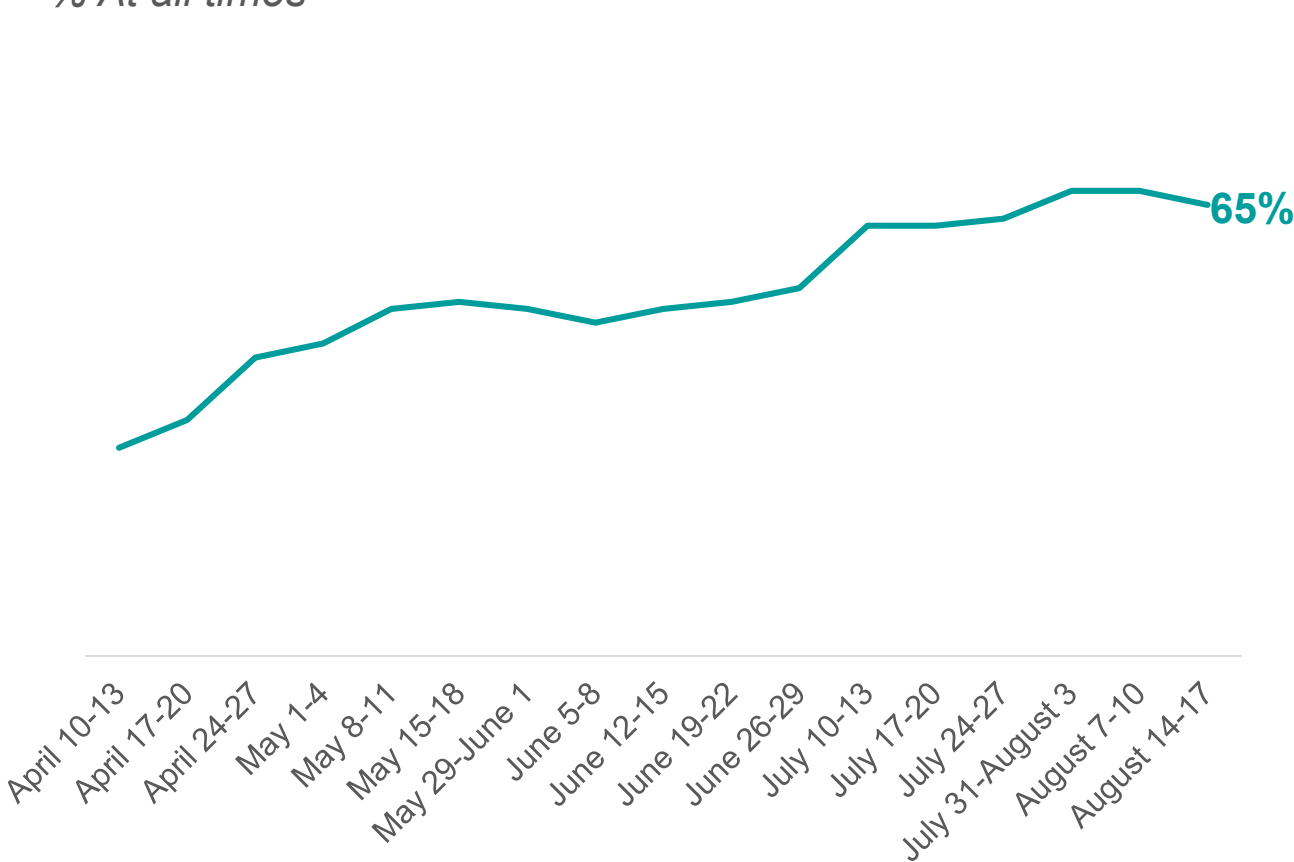

Mask usage has leveled off; Less than half of Republican comply

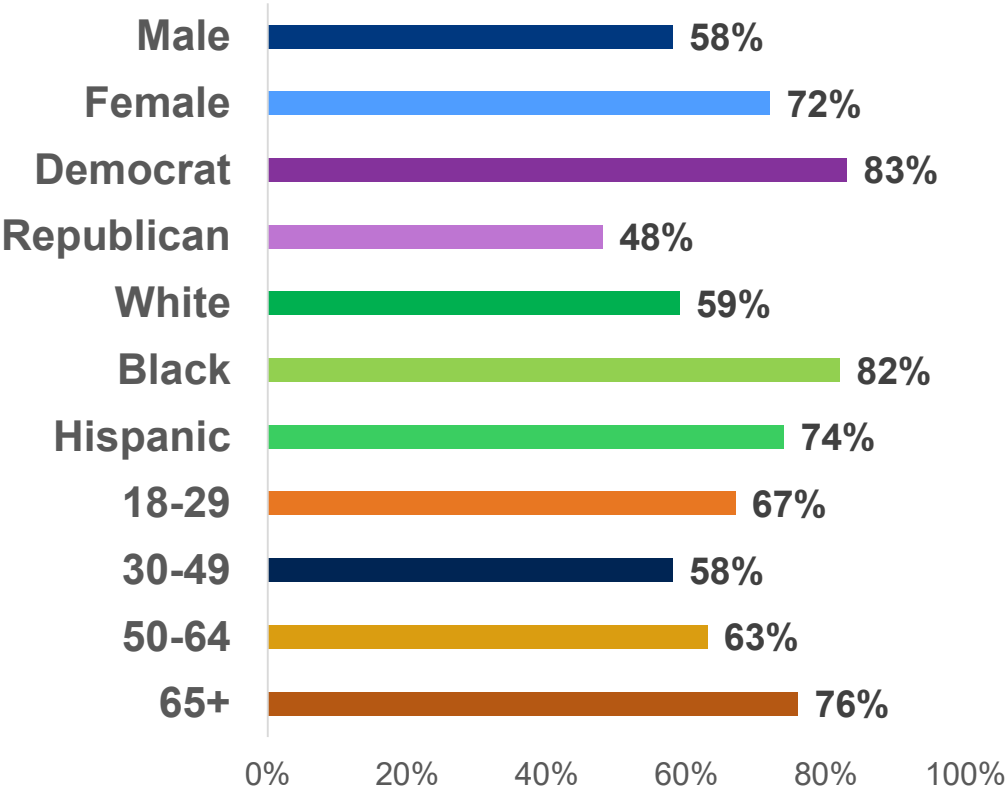
When you leave your home, are you wearing a mask?

% At all times



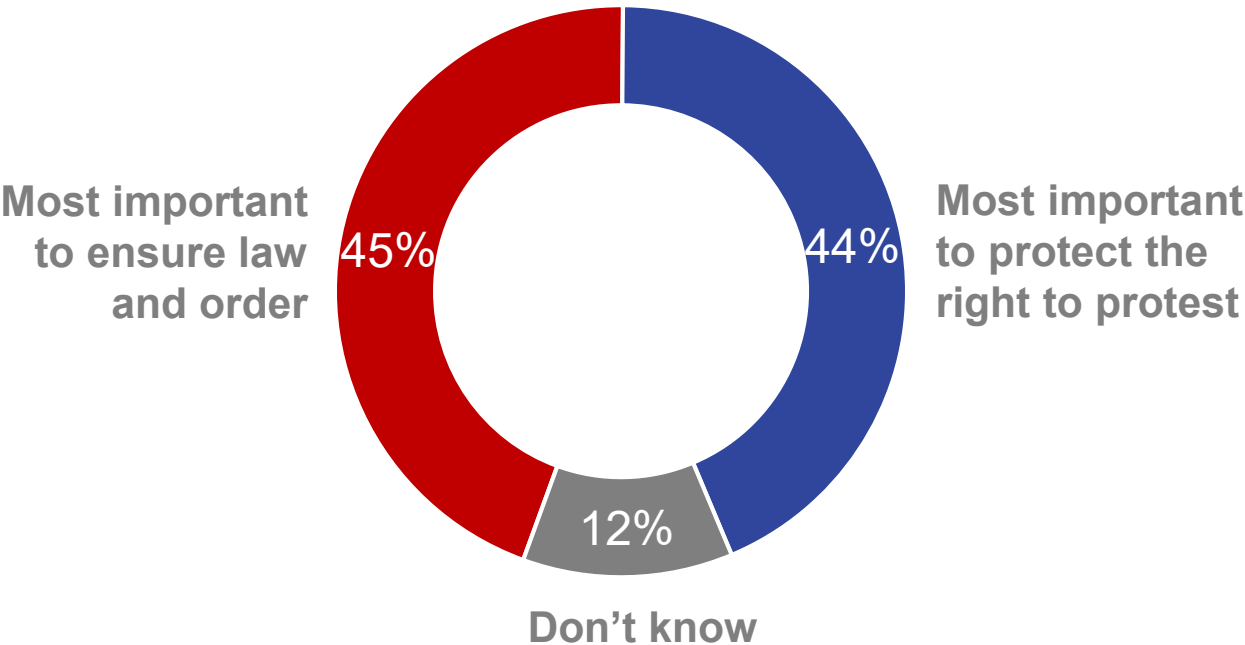

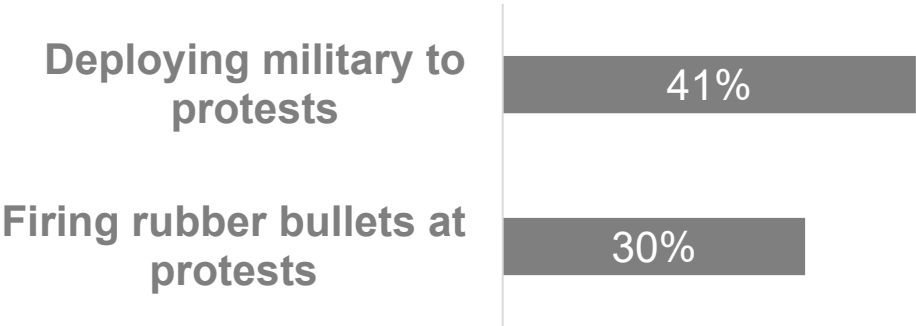


Protests vs. Law & Order Have Been Mixed Bag

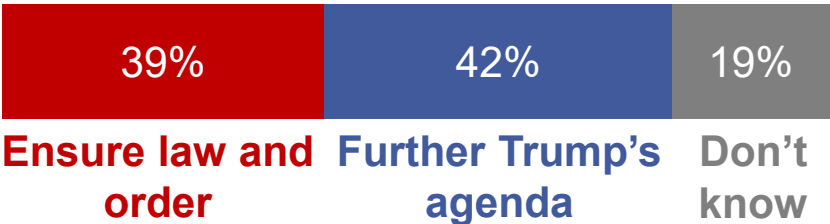
Which comes closer to your view?

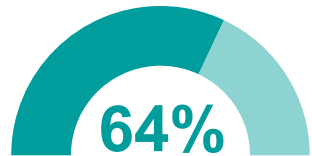

Have you received any of the following through the U.S. Postal Service in the last week?

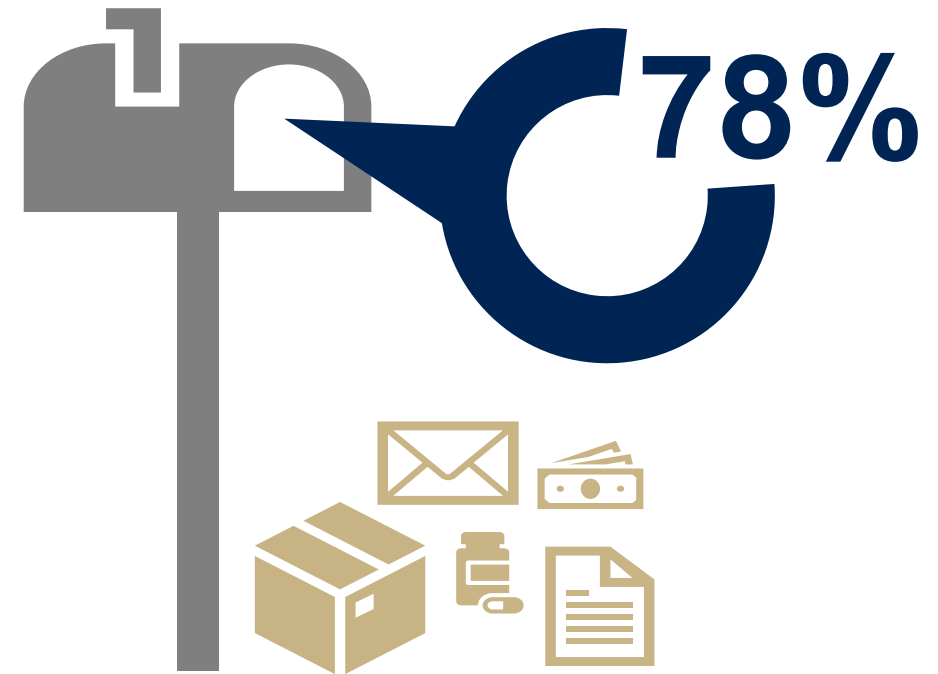


Expected to receive a **package** via USPS



Expected to receive **medication** via USPS

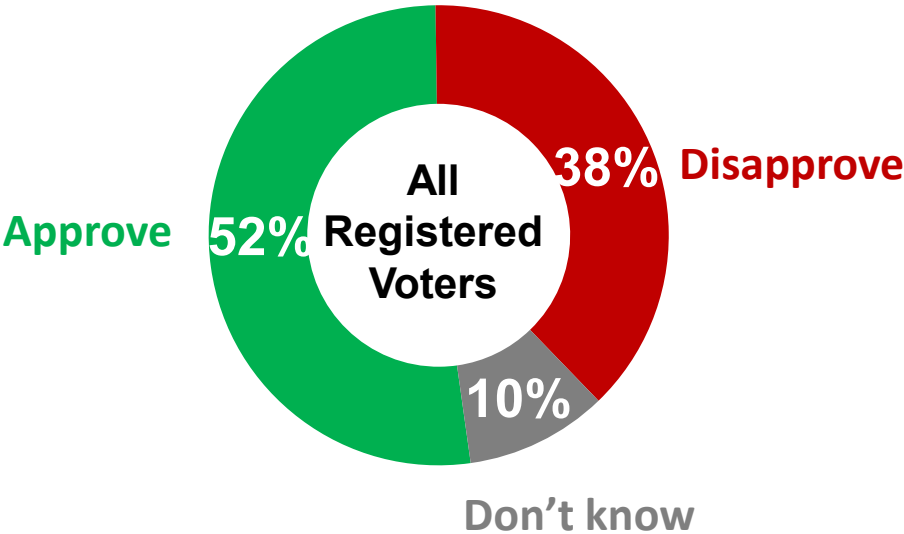
Majority agree: a well-functioning United States Postal Service is important to having a smooth and successful election during the coronavirus pandemic



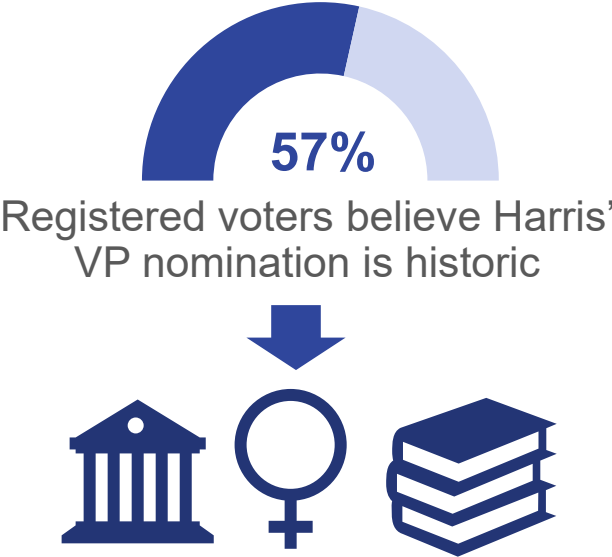
Kamala Harris Positively Received

Is the choice of Kamala Harris a milestone for the United States?



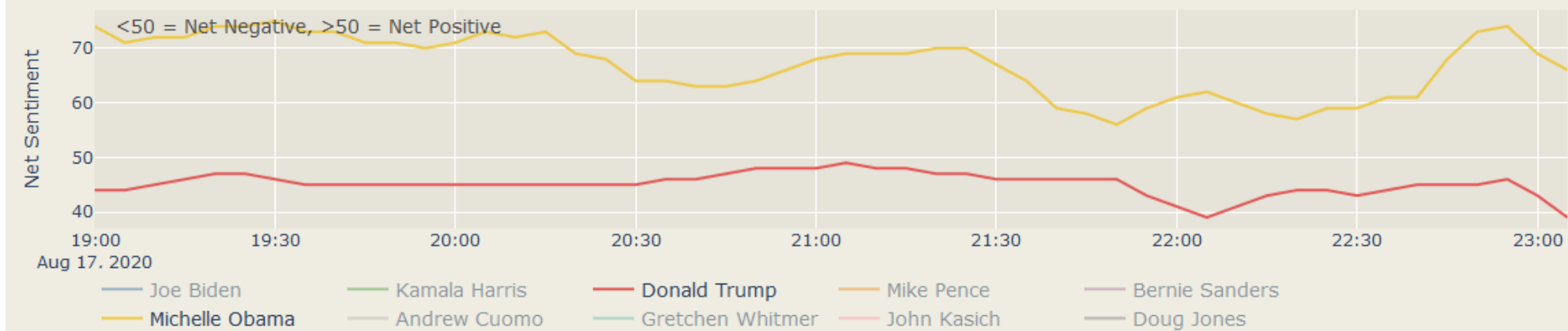

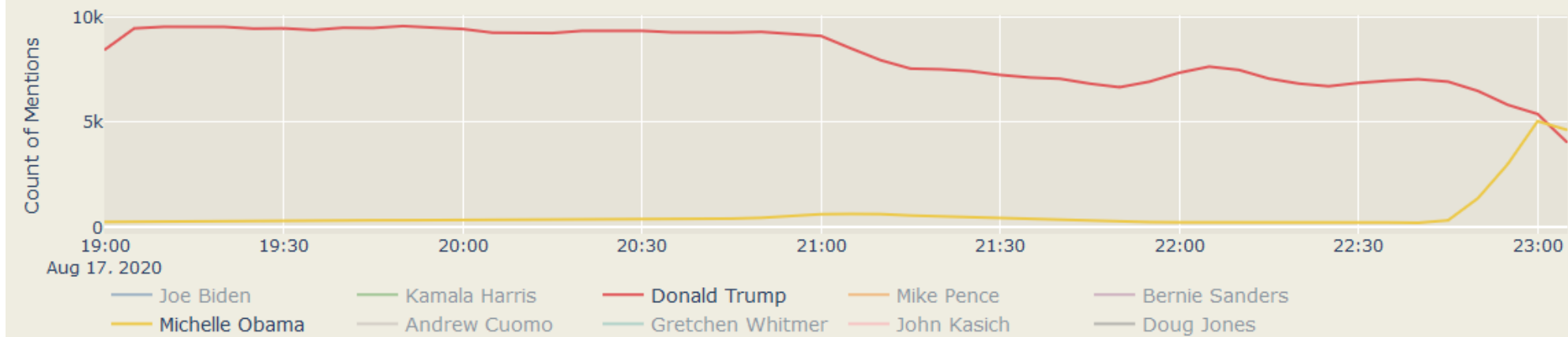

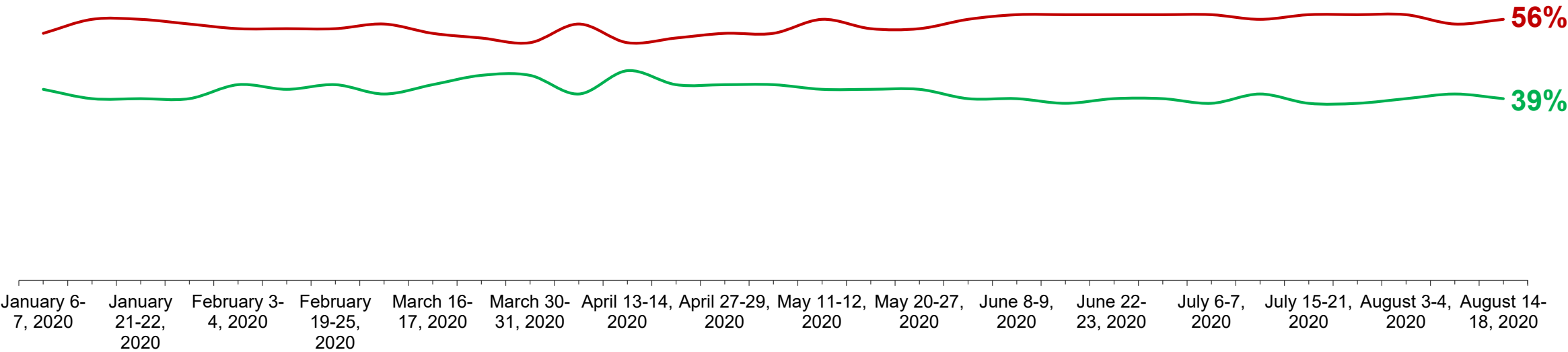

Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling his job as President?

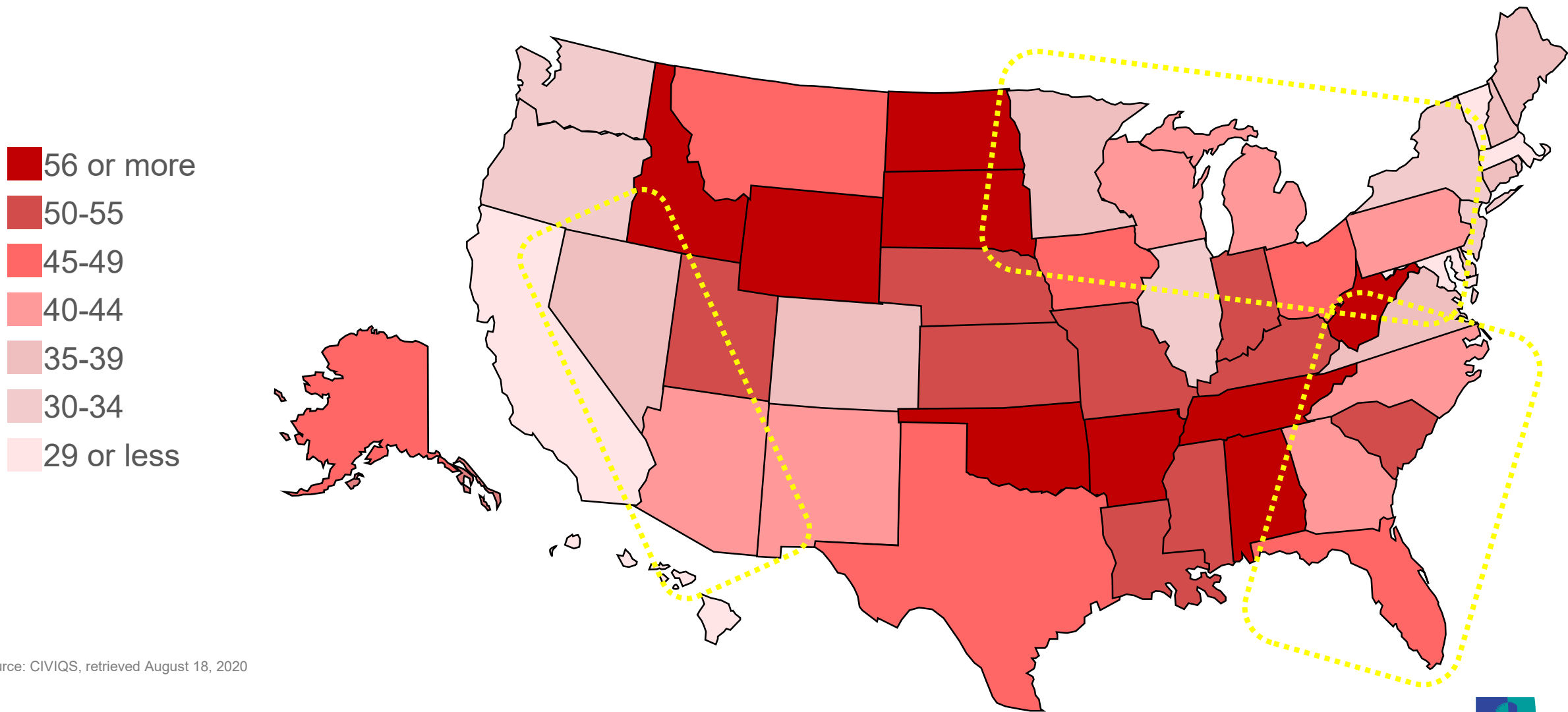

President Trump's approval rating by state



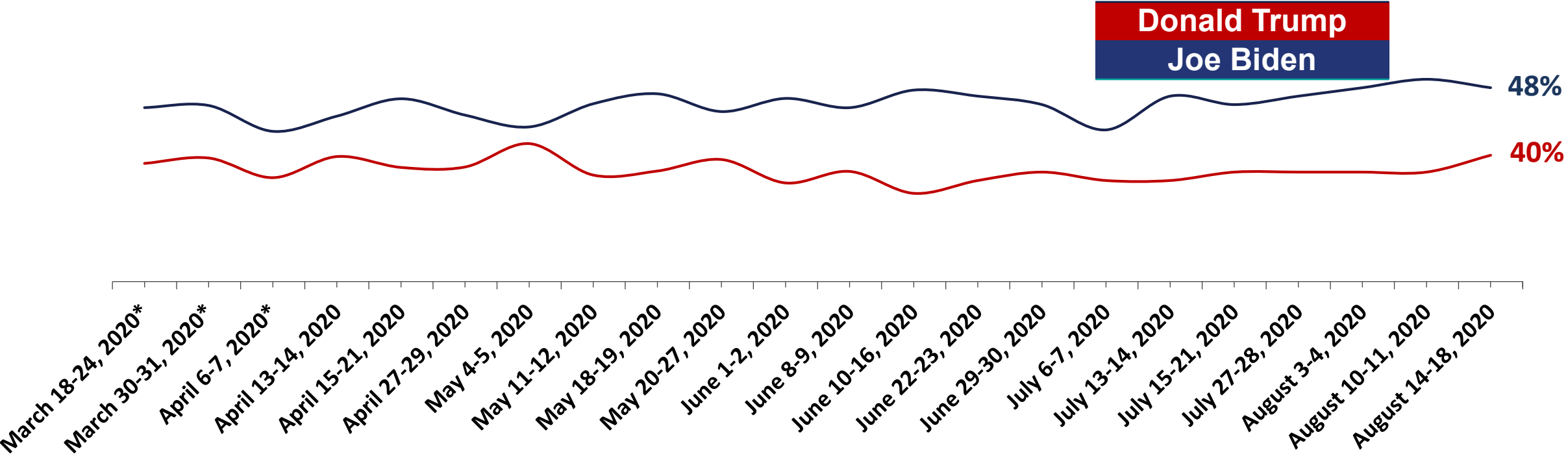

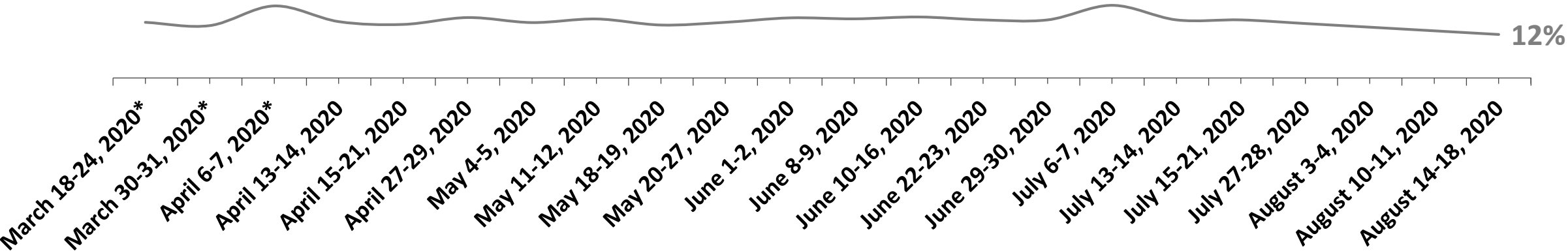


Undecided Voters Trend – Registered Voters

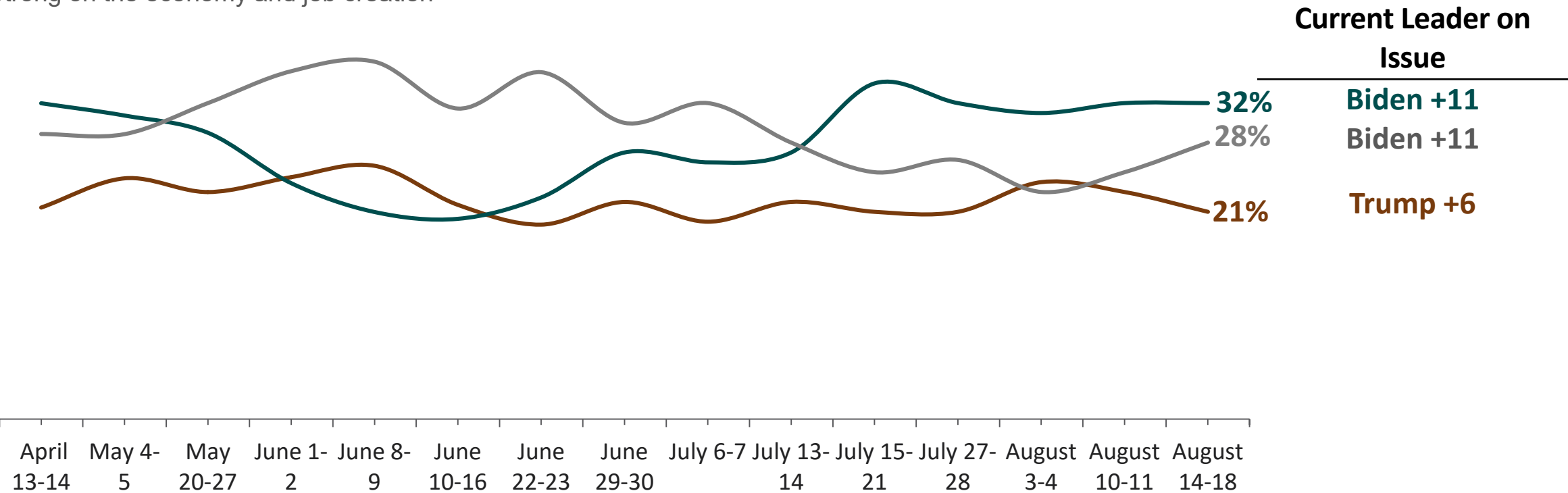

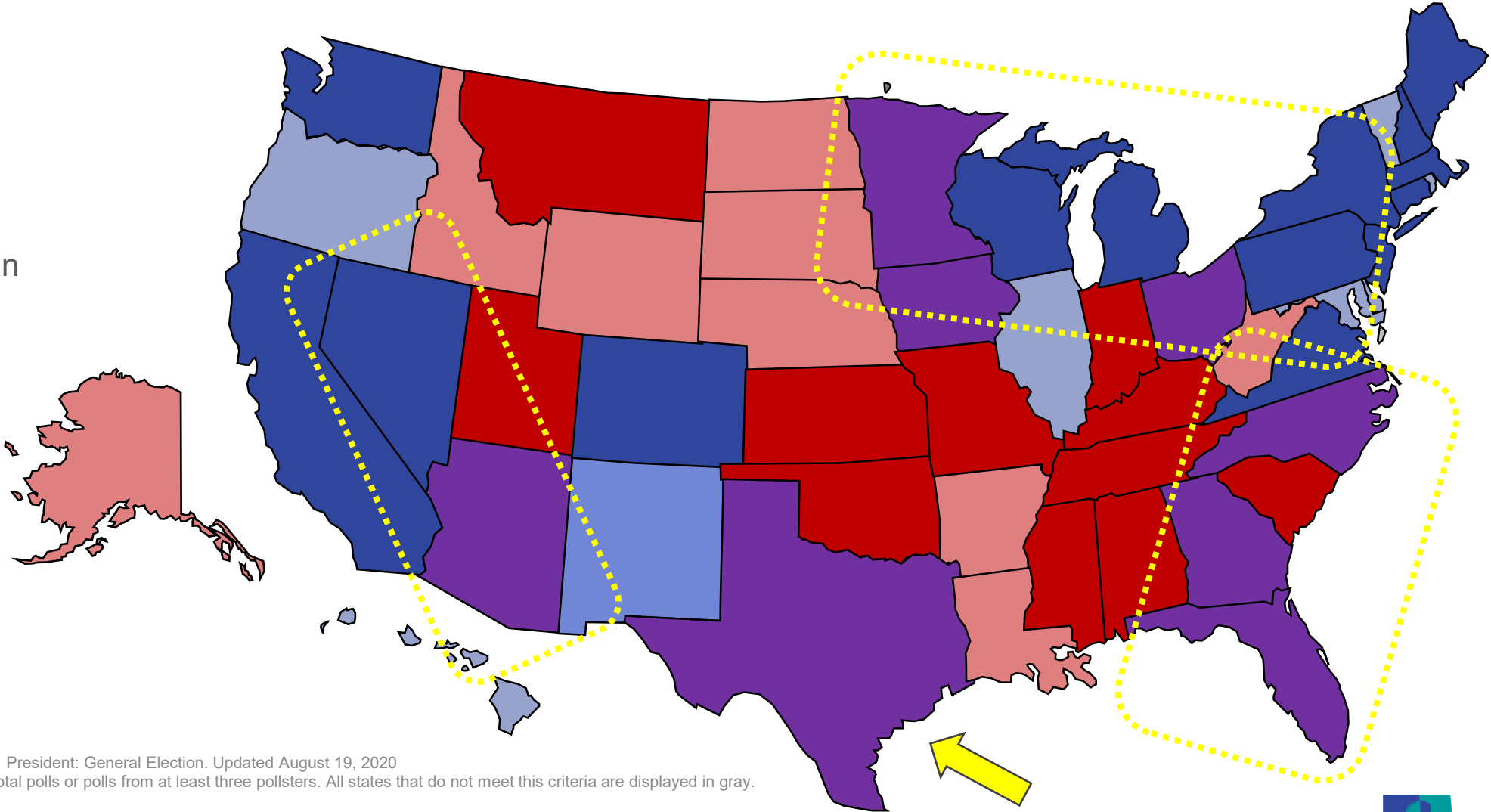
If the 2020 presidential election were being held today, which of the following candidate traits would be the MOST important factor for you in deciding who to vote for?

Polling market averages show Biden advantage in Rust Belt, number of toss-up states remain

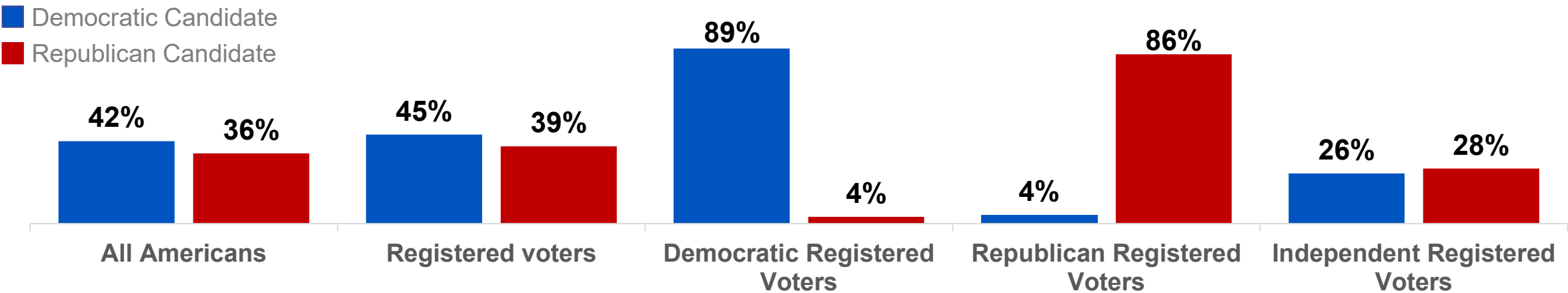
- Biden leads

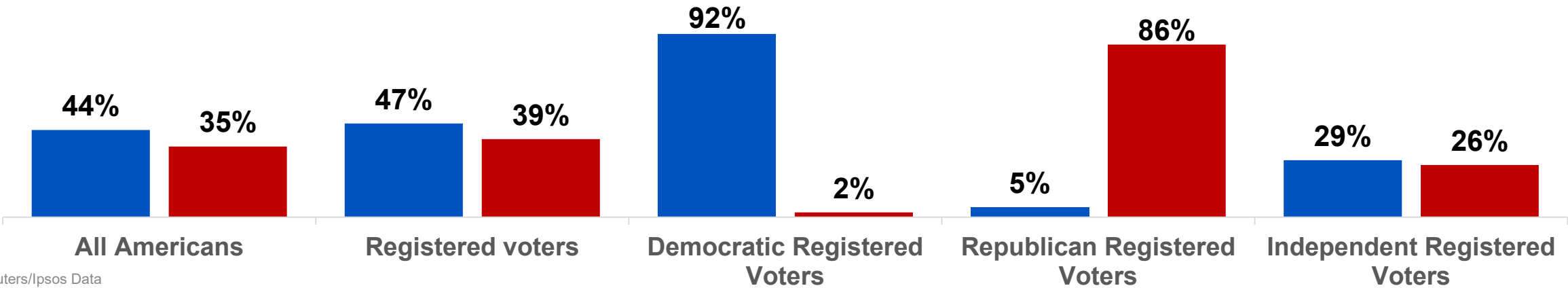
Five Thirty Eight 2020 National Polling Average, President: General Election. Updated August 19, 2020

Thinking about the elections in 2020, if the election for U.S. Senate were held today, would you vote for the Democratic candidate or the Republican candidate in your state where you live?



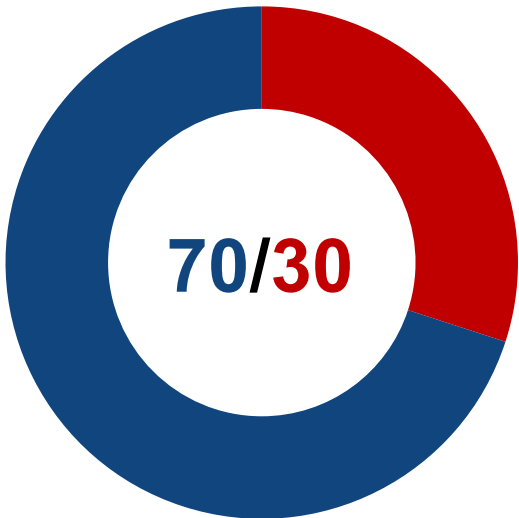

Control of Congress driven by presidential results

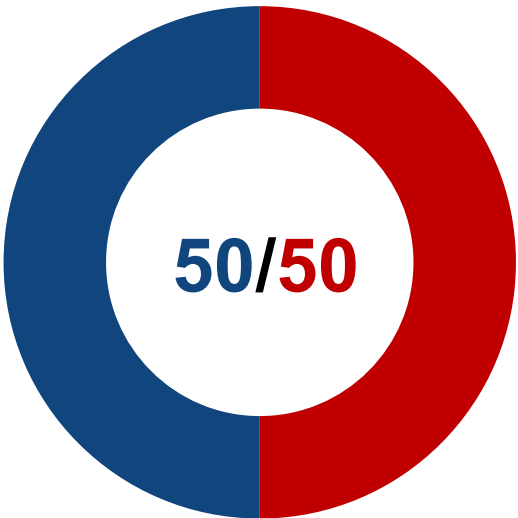
House of Representatives

Republicans currently hold 53 seats of 100. There are currently 35 seats open that will determine the election.



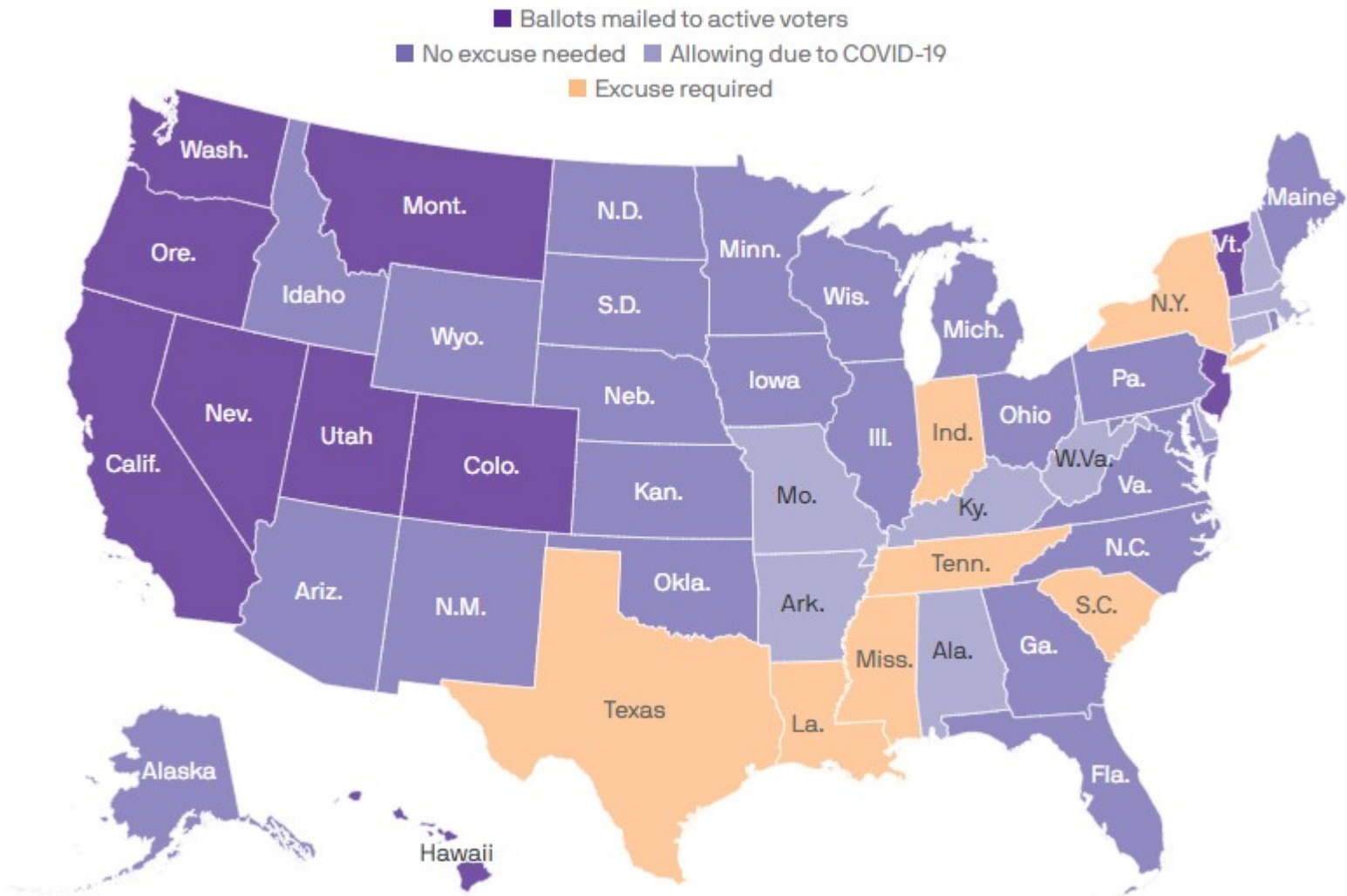
■ Democrats' odds of majority ■ Republicans' odds of majority

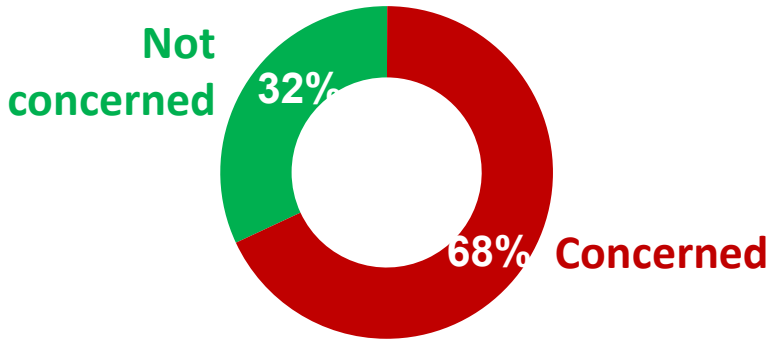

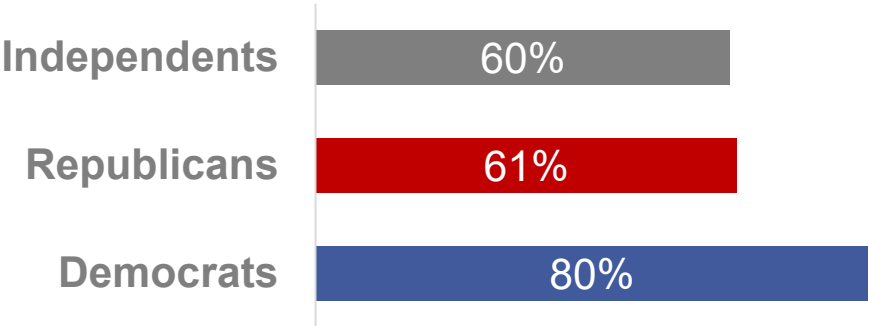

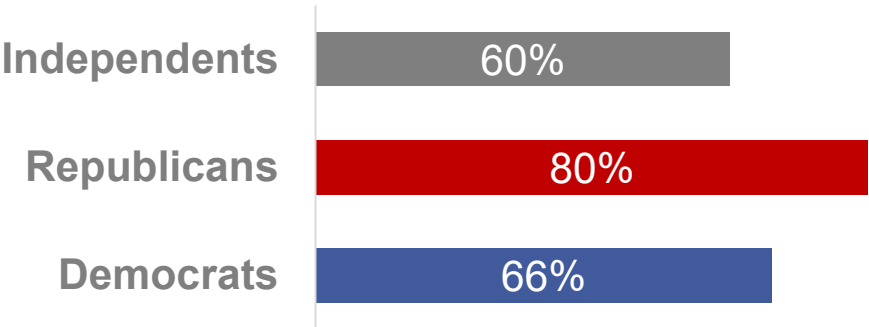

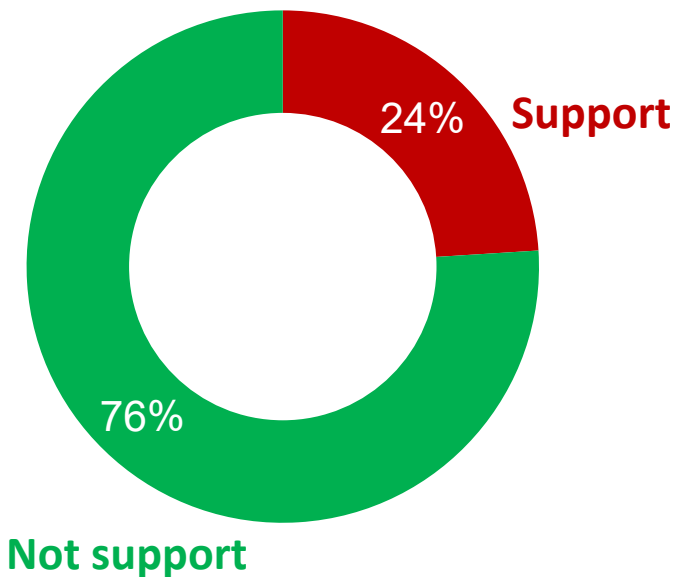

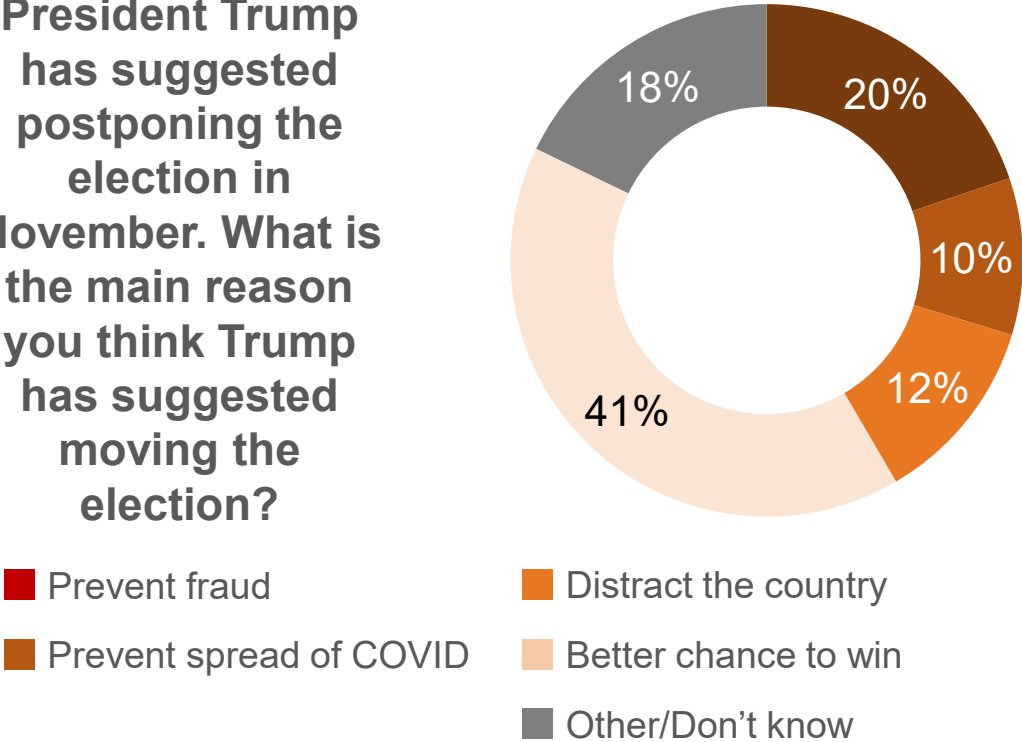
Recently, some have proposed postponing the election for Congress and the President because of fear of voter fraud from mail-in ballots. Do you support or oppose postponing the election?
