



Economy struggling to return to normal


American consumer confidence and unemployment 2002-2020









Perceptions of Donald Trump




President Trump's approval rating in 2020

President Trump's approval rating by state








Trump's credibility on coronavirus particularly weak






Coronavirus remains the key issue this election



If the 2020 presidential election were held today, would you vote for Donald Trump or Joe Biden? Order of candidates is randomly rotated in question text













Uncertainty below the topline numbers










Roughly equivalent certainty of position




Greater volatility for Trump's ultimate vote





(Democrats hold House, take Senate and White House)

Emboldened progressive control of government

- Focus on getting coronavirus and economy under control
- Potential for major federal spending
- Proactive regulatory state
- Opportunities for "good" private sector actors to set agendas

Narrow Biden Win

(Democrats hold House, take White House, Republicans hold Senate)

Status quo ante

- Halting efforts to manage pandemic & revive economy
- Reconstituted regulatory apparatus and legislative gridlock
- Relative freedom of maneuver for private sector within existing context

Narrow Trump Win

(Democrats hold House, Republicans hold Senate & White House)

Continued governmental and social disorder

- Personality-driven global policy setting
- Pandemic and economic fallout continue
- Ongoing political and social risk for private sector
- Deregulatory efforts prioritize industry agenda

Potential Biden All likely voters expressing support for Biden

Firm Biden Already voted or certain to vote for Biden

Firm Trump Already voted or certain to vote for Trump

Potential Trump All likely voters expressing support for Trump

Ballot details

Voted Biden/Trump Early absentee/in person voter

Likely Biden/Trump Highly likely to vote and certain of choice

Probable Biden/Trump Lower likelihood of voting and less certainty of choice

Lean Biden/Trump Undecided, preference if pushed

Voted third party Early absentee/in person voted for third party

Probable third party Highly likely to vote, third party vote preference
