





In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?






Most Important Problem Facing America

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?





Percent of Eligible Voters by Racial and Ethnic Group





If the Democratic primary or caucus in your state were held today, for whom would you vote? Which candidate would you lean toward? [Asked only if leaned Democrat]




In your opinion, which candidate has the best chance of beating President Trump in the general election? [Asked only if leaned Democrat]






Biden and Sanders are African American voters' top choices
