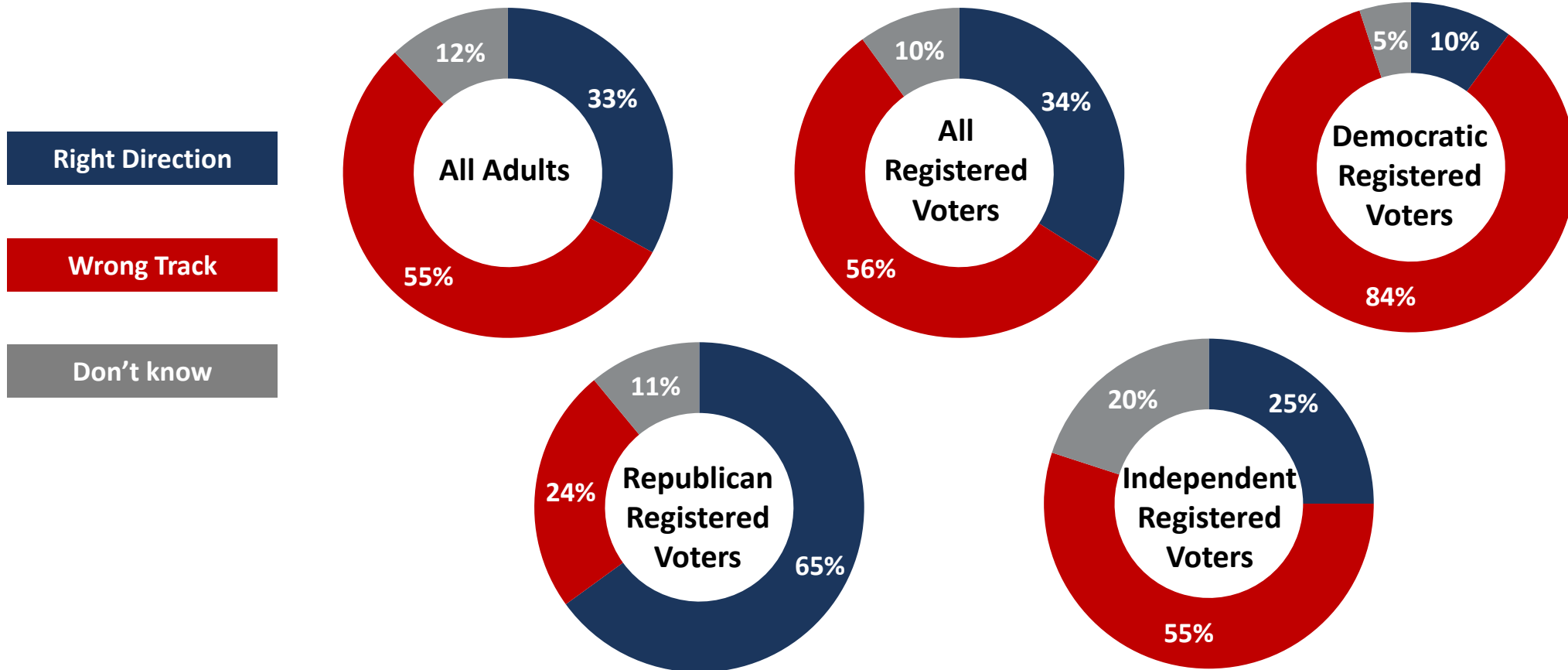

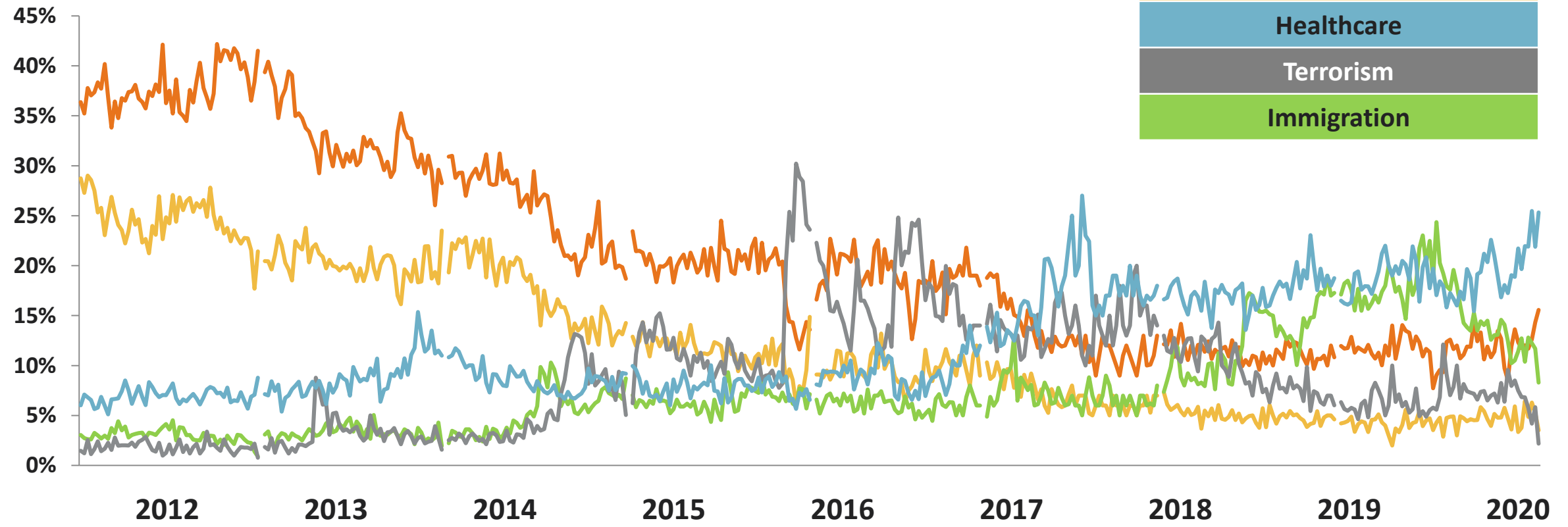

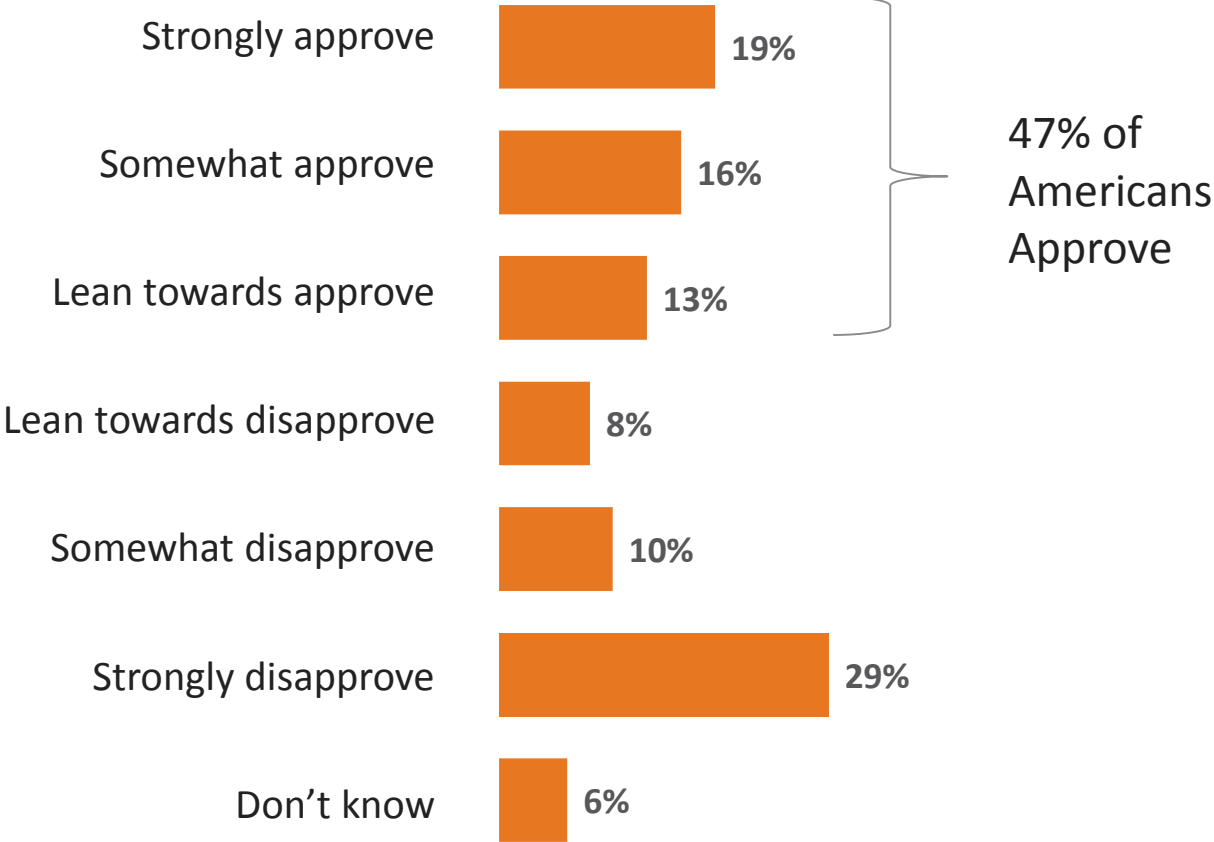

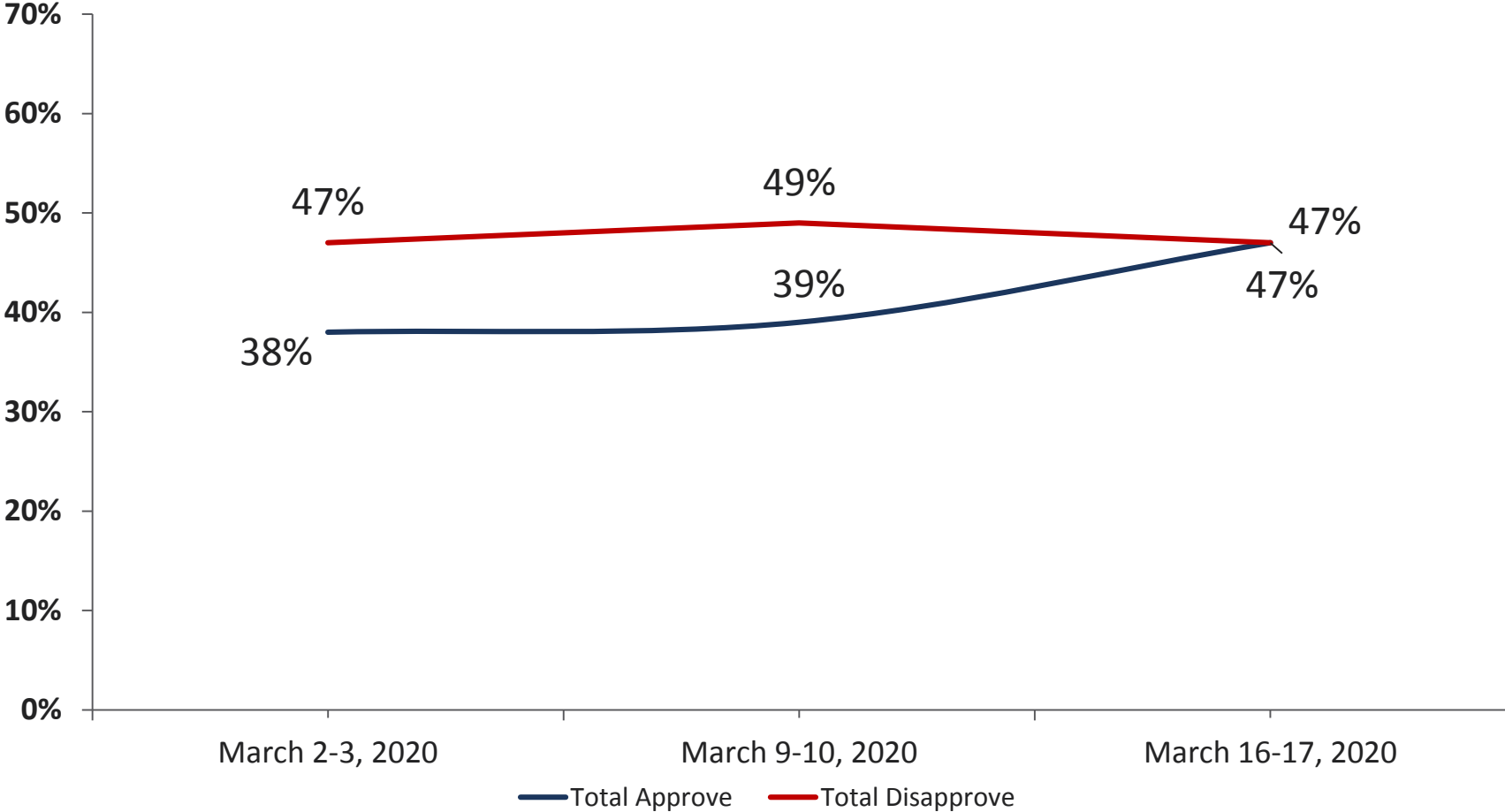
Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling the following issues? Coronavirus / COVID-19

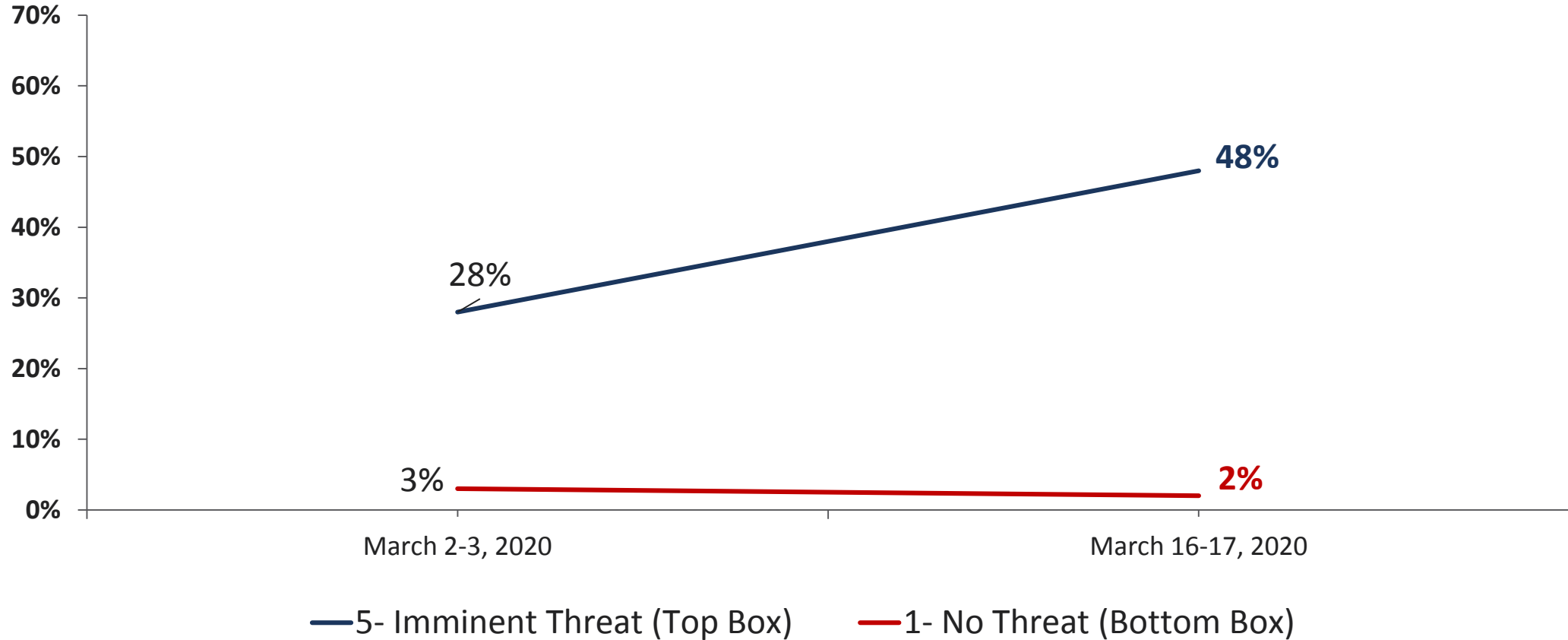

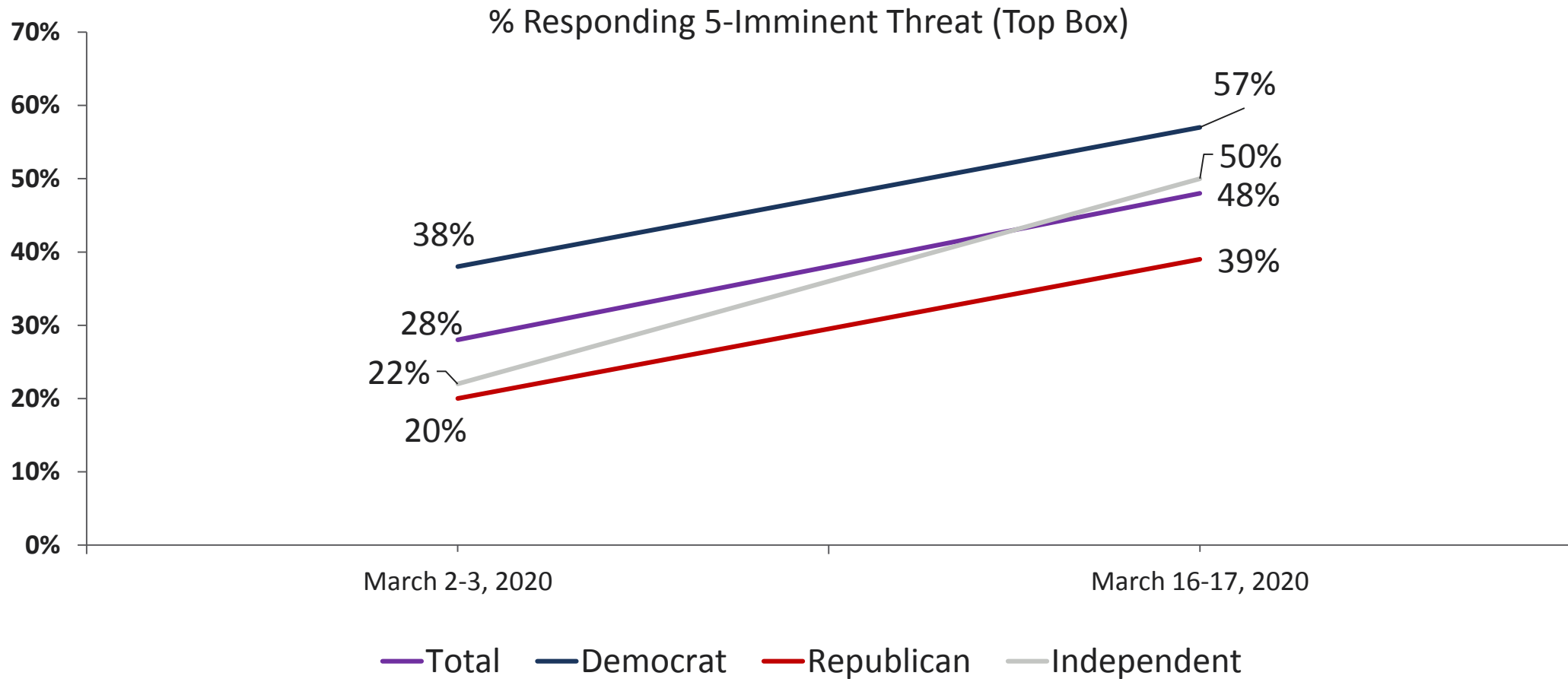

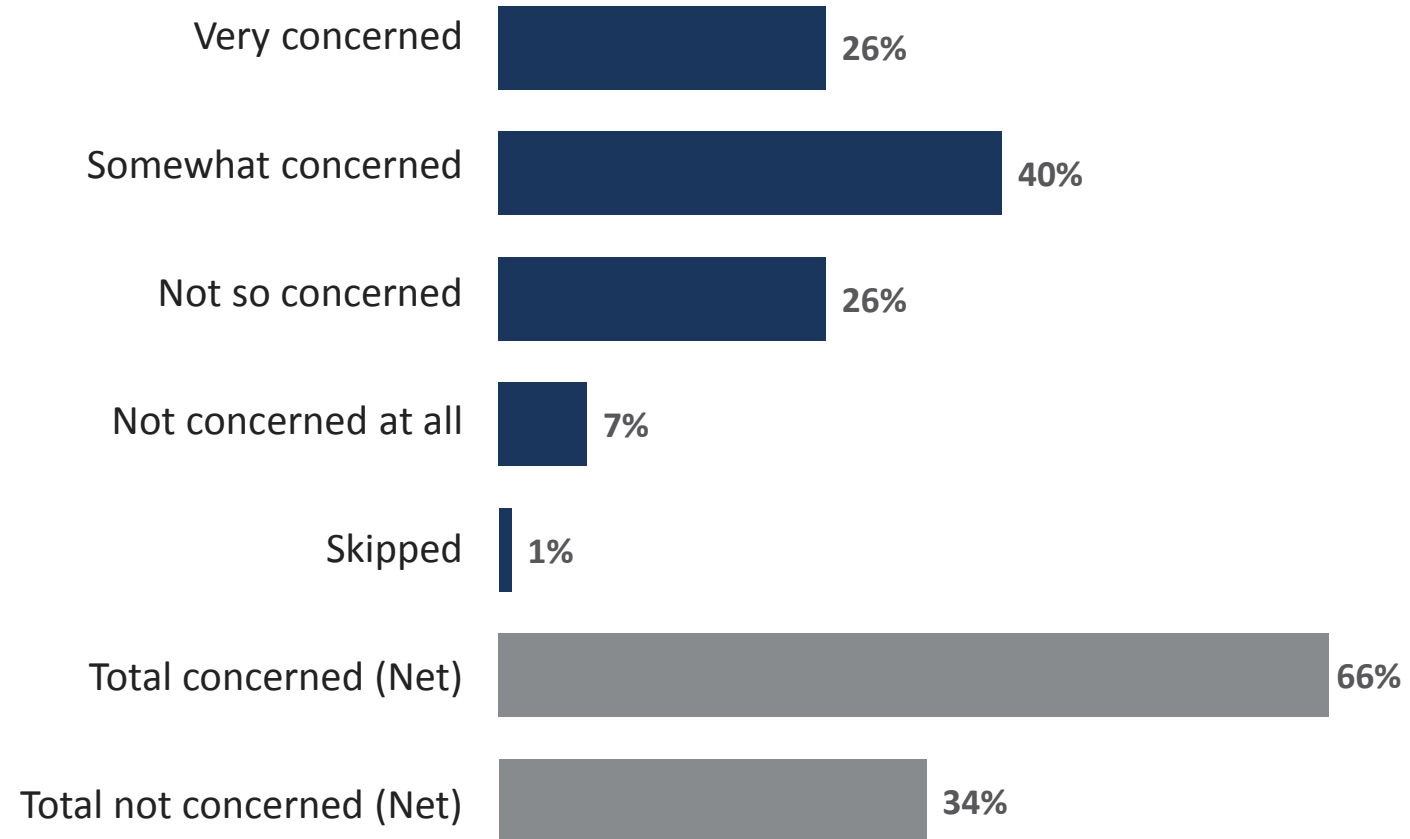

Concern With Coronavirus

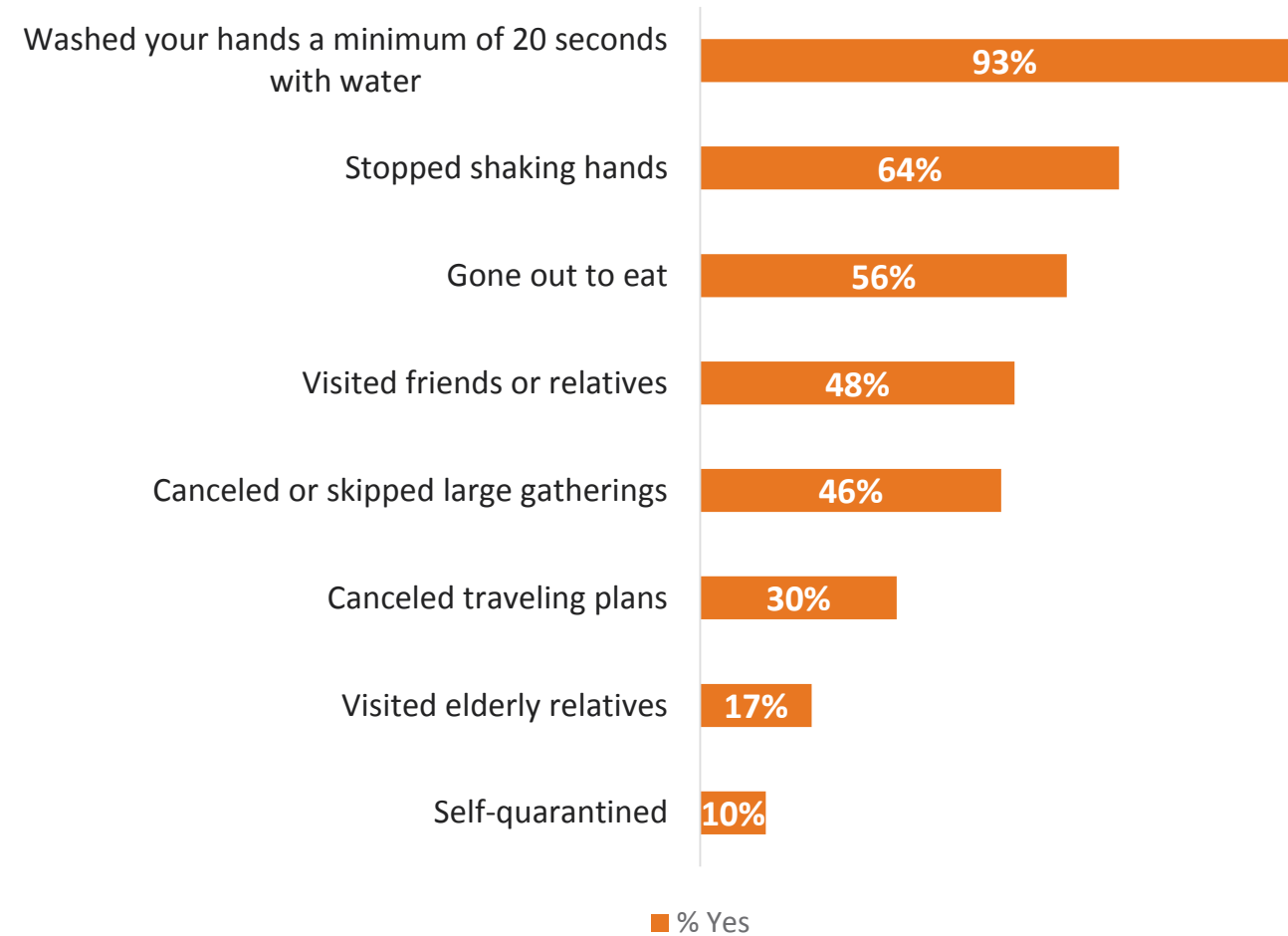
How concerned are you that you or someone you know will be infected with the coronavirus?

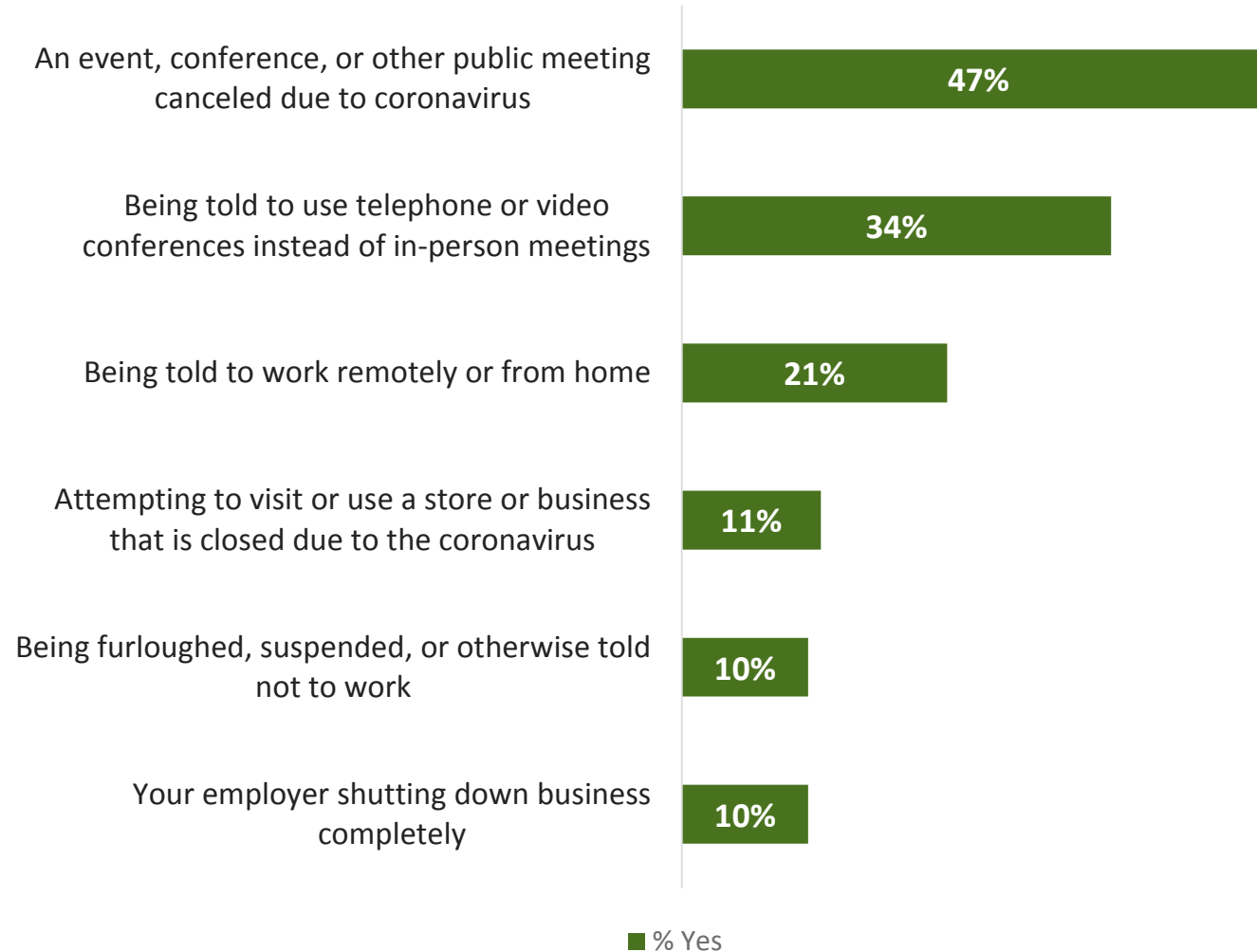

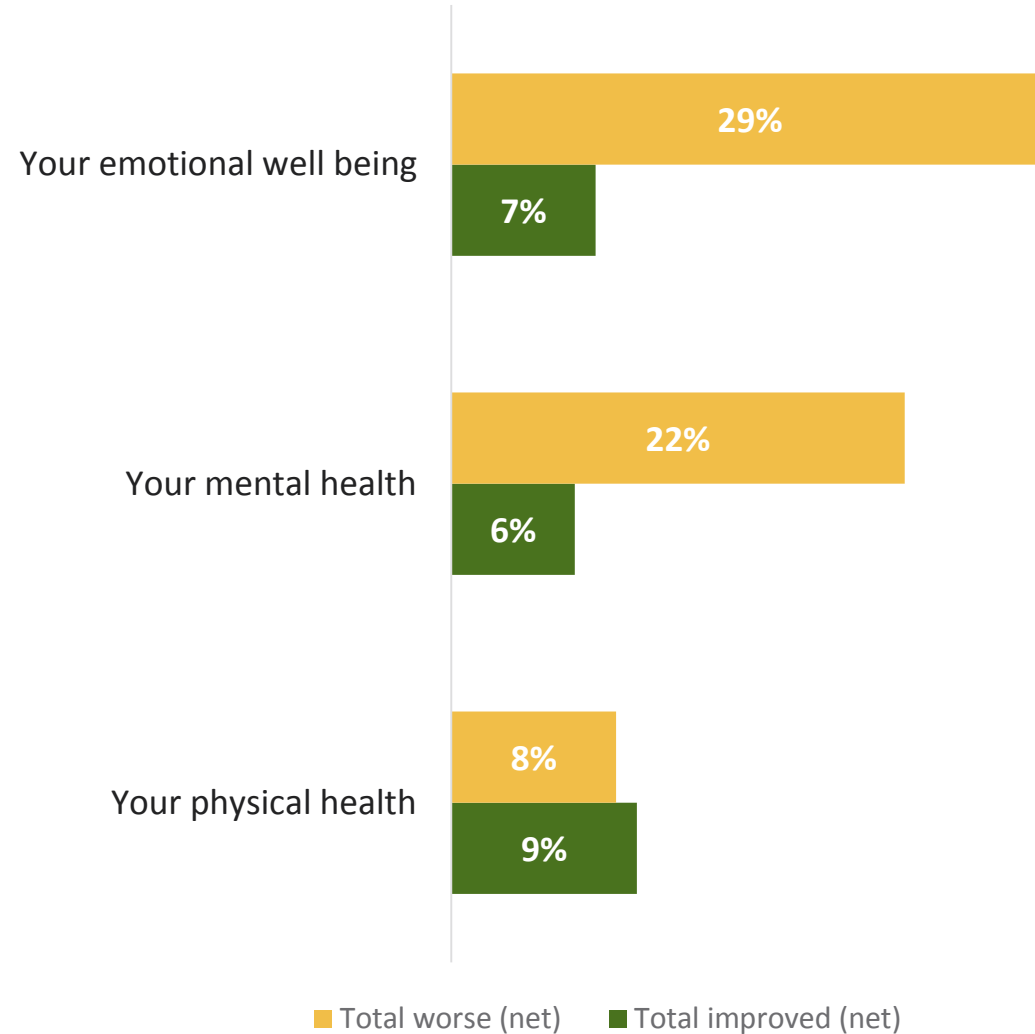

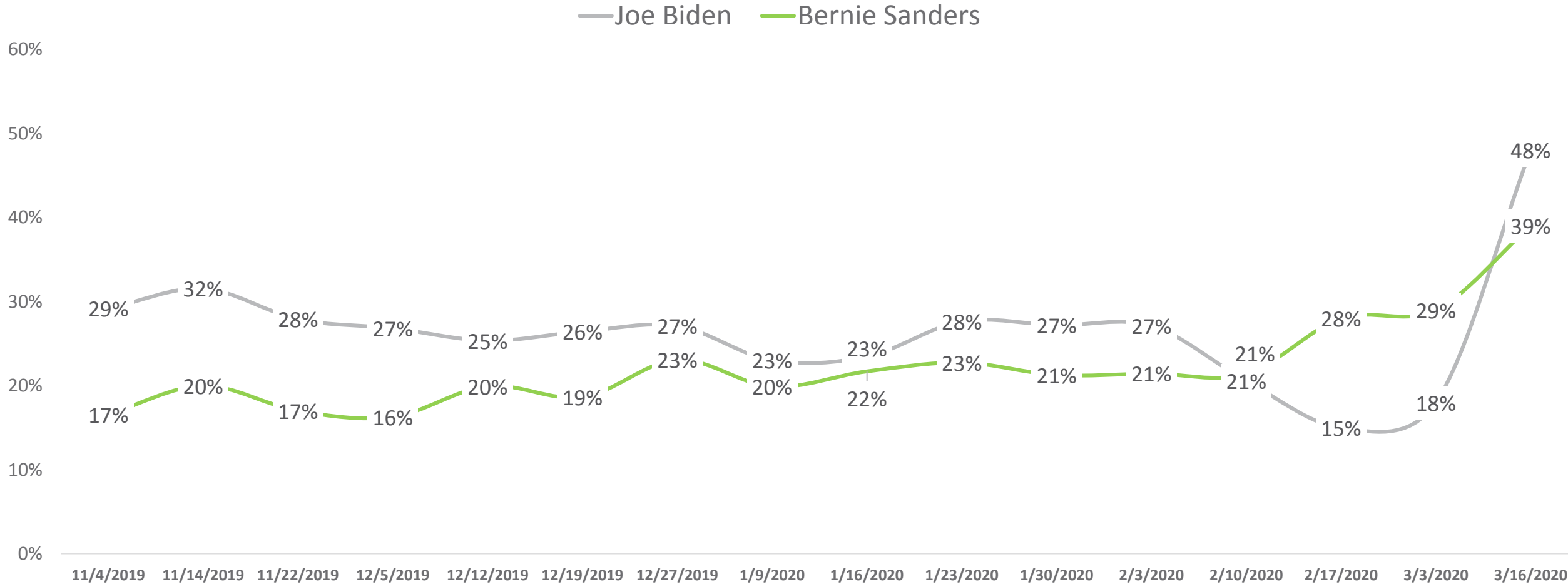

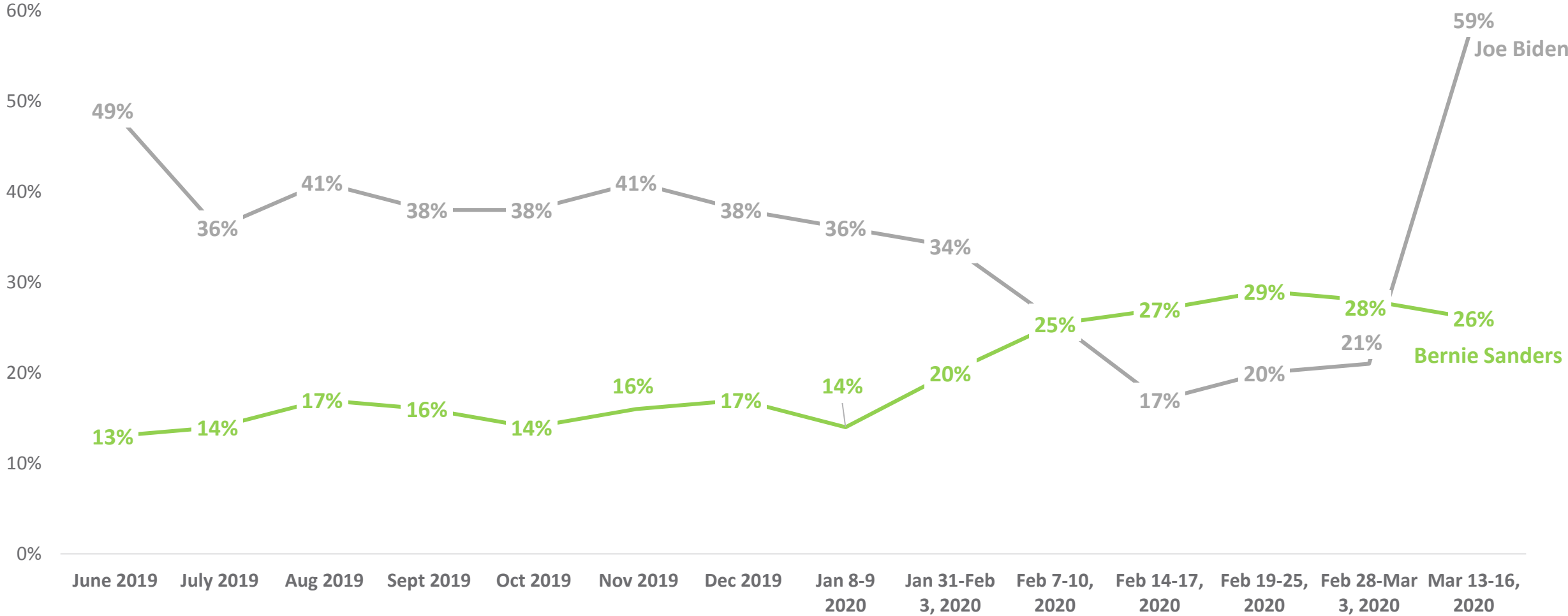
2020 Democratic Primary Horserace – National Numbers

Candidate Most Likely to Beat President Trump

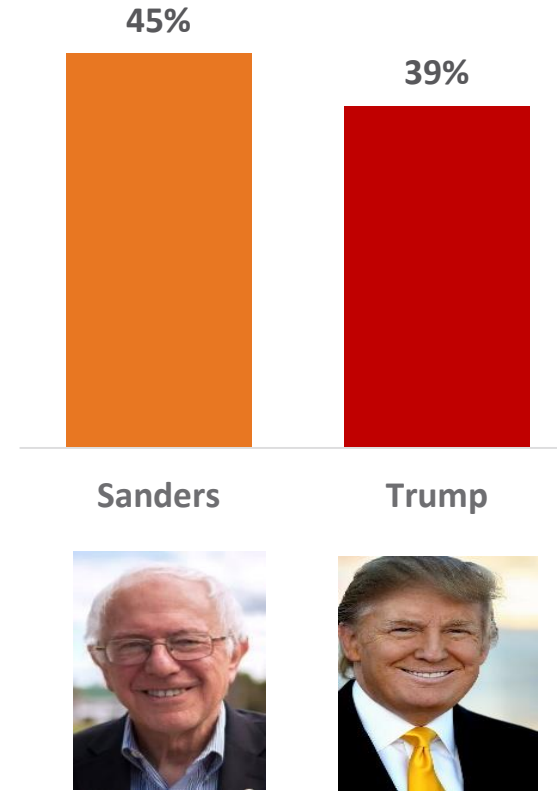
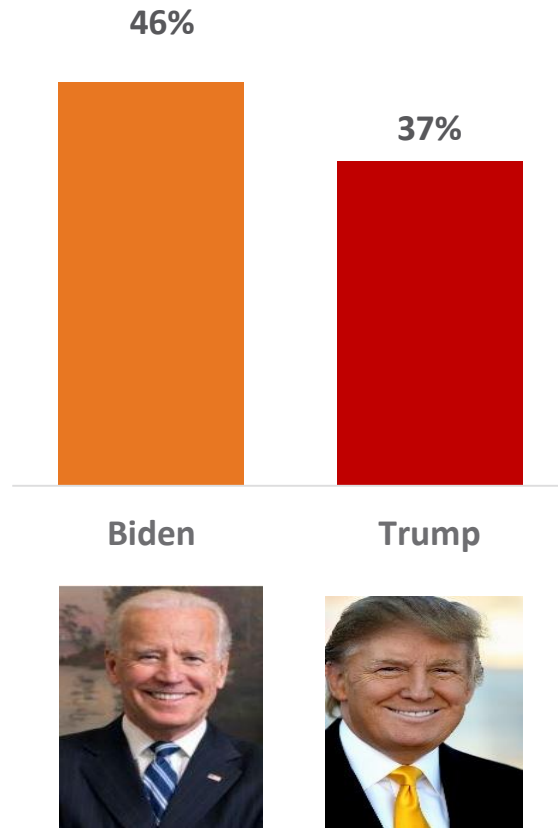
