In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus the following percentage points










Coronavirus Outbreak

Q. Over the past week, would you say your level of concern about the Coronavirus on you personally has increased, decreased, or stayed the same?









2020 Election Tracker February 14-17, 2020. Arrows indicate a change from February 10, 2020.

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
