

Generally speaking, would you say things in this country are heading in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?






ALL ADULT AMERICANS Most Important Problem Facing America












For each of the following, please select the candidate you think is the best on that particular issue... *The economy and job creation*







% Large/Moderate Risk










ALL ADULT AMERICANS Americans Divided on Whether Nation Should Reopen for Business
