






Majority want greater control over immigration but few want a total end to the free movement of EU citizens

Which of these options best describes your own preference for the free movement of people in the EU?



Which three or four of the following reasons best describes why you think that the free movement of people between different EU countries should be restricted more than it is now?



There are a number of areas where David Cameron wants to renegotiate Britain's relationship with Europe. Which two or three do you think are most important for him to achieve?



One in five who would vote to leave the EU say they would change their mind to remain a member if David Cameron is successful at his renegotiation


If David Cameron achieved all of these aims, would you vote to stay in or get out of the European Union?

How confident, if at all, you are that David Cameron will get a good deal for Britain in negotiations with other European leaders?


