

How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?













How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is running the country / doing his job as ... ?






Net satisfaction with new Prime Ministers: Thatcher/Major vs. Blair/Brown

Net satisfaction with Prime Ministers (1979–2009)





How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his job as leader of the ... Party?





Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way Gordon Brown is doing his job as Prime Minister?












The Ipsos MORI Economic Optimism Index






Satisfaction with standard of living




How would you describe the current state of the British economy? And what state do you think the British economy will be in, in 5 years' time?




Fear of redundancy (amongst full-time workers)

Fear of redundancy (amongst full-time workers)





And do you personally know anyone who has been made redundant in the past six months?






Which party do you think has the best policies on managing the economy; the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats or some other party?




To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Conservatives are ready to form the next Government?










Society

People have different views about the ideal society. For each of these statements, please tell me which one comes closest to your ideal.








A society which emphasises similar incomes and rewards for everyone
