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


British economic optimism fell faster than elsewhere....





Duration of recessions


- Since 1870, there have been 255 examples of recession:
 - 2 in 3 lasted for one year
 - 1 in 4 lasted for 2 years
 - 1 in 8 lasted for more than 2 years

- The return to their GDP prior to recession took:
 - 1 year for 60% of countries
 - 2 years for 19% of countries
 - Over two years for the remaining 21%


Consumer incomes compared to last year

How would you describe the current state of the British economy? And what state do you think the British economy will be in, in 5 years' time?




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Optimism about personal circumstances has also improved


Do you think that your personal financial circumstances will improve, get worse or stay the same over the next few months?



Most know someone made redundant


And do you personally know anyone who has been made redundant in the past six months?

Fear of redundancy is falling slightly


How concerned if at all would you say you are about the possibility of being made redundant or becoming unemployed over the next few months?



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
Satisfaction with standard of living

Satisfaction with standard of living - trends







Do you think that the general economic condition of the country will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?





How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?



39% agree Brown's leadership style is to blame for the smear incident; 35% disagree


You've probably heard about the recent controversy about a senior Downing Street advisor planning an internet smear campaign against Conservative politicians.

More than a third (37%) feel the controversy has 'reduced' their trust in the Labour Govt


And has this recent controversy affected your trust in the Labour Government? (READ OUT)

How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is running the country / doing his job as ... ?



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

How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his job as leader of the ... Party?





Gordon Brown remains popular among Labour voters


Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way Gordon Brown is doing his job as Prime Minister?








To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Conservatives are ready to form the next Government?

To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Conservatives are ready to form the next Government?






Food retailing transformed by this recession?


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How should government deal with its huge borrowing requirement?



In conclusion....

- Some signs that we may be approaching the bottom of the recession
- Labour getting no credit for its handling of the crisis – or from rise in optimism about the future
- Huge uncertainty about the future electorate has no idea what awaits them
- Cameron remains on track to be Prime Minister next year
 - but still risks turning into Mrs Thatcher without the Falklands....
