






Voting Intention: all giving an opinion vs. those "certain to vote"







How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is running the country / doing his job as ... ?



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his / her job as Prime Minister?





Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way David Cameron is doing his job as leader of the Conservative Party/ as Prime Minister?



Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way David Cameron is doing his job as leader of the Conservative Party/ as Prime Minister?



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way ... is doing his job as leader of the ... Party?



Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way Ed Miliband is doing his job as leader of the Labour Party?



Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the way Ed Miliband is doing his job as leader of the Labour Party?
















Do you think that the general economic condition of the country will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?







Do you think that the Coalition government is or is not...





Thinking about the next general election, do you think it will be a good thing or a bad thing for the country if no party achieves an overall majority?



And regardless of your personal views of coalitions how likely or unlikely do you think it is that there will be another coalition government after the next general election.


