

American Consumer Confidence Index








Direction of the Country

Generally speaking, would you say things in this country are heading in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?





Donald Trump's Approval Rating by Party Identification









Real Clear Politics National Market Average






Ipsos Model: Odds of Chief Executive Victory

Modeled Chance of Government Victory










2020 Democratic Primary Horserace – National Numbers

If the 2020 Democratic presidential primary election were held today, and you had to choose from the list of candidates below, for whom would you vote? (Asked of Democratic registered voters)






2020 Democratic Primary Horserace – Market Averages




Impact of the Last Pre-Caucus Debate

Who gained (and lost) support


Share of respondents who are considering voting for each candidate





Ideal Candidate Trait: Ability to Beat Trump


