A Global @dvisory - May 2012 - G@32 LANGUAGES USED IN BUSINESS



These are the findings of the *Global @dvisor* Wave 32 (G@32), an Ipsos survey conducted between April 3rd and April 17th, 2012.

SURVEY METHOD

 The survey instrument is conducted monthly in 24 countries around the world via the Ipsos Online Panel system. This month we surveyed in 26 countries: the regular 24 + Singapore and Hong Kong.

COUNTRIES

 The countries reporting herein are Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, Great Britain, Hong Kong, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Turkey and the United States of America.

SAMPLE


 For the results of the survey presented herein, an international sample of 13,644 employed adults age 18-64 in the US and Canada, and age 16-64 in all other countries. were interviewed. Approximately 1000+ individuals participated on a country by country basis via the Ipsos Online Panel with the exception of Argentina, Belgium, Indonesia, Mexico, Poland, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden and Turkey, where each have a sample approximately 500+. In this wave (G@32), 500+ individuals from Hong Kong and Singapore also participated in the survey.

WEIGHTING

 Weighting was then employed. to balance demographics and ensure that the sample's composition reflects that of the adult population according to the most recent country Census data, and to provide results intended to approximate the sample universe. A survey with an unweighted probability sample of this size and a 100% response rate would have an estimated margin of error of +/-3.1 percentage points for a sample of 1,000 and an estimated margin of error of +/-4.5 percentage points 19 times out of 20 per country of what the results would have been had the entire population of adults in that country had been polled. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error, and measurement error.




ET1. Do you work in a job that requires you to interact with people who live in other countries? Base: Working Full time or Part time or Self-Employed (unwtd) n=13,644
























































