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Ipsos Poll conducted for Reuters, September 2012 VOTER ID ANALYSIS – AGGREGATE DATA

These are findings from an Ipsos poll conducted for Thomson Reuters on a continual rolling weekly basis from January 2012 to the present. On July 23^{rd} we added a question on whether people have a valid government-issued photo ID. This analysis contains the results we have collected to date (7/23/12 – 9/25/12) for that question, represented by 20,774 Americans age 18+ interviewed online.

The data are weighted to the U.S. current population data. Statistical margins of error are not applicable to online polls. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Figures marked by an asterisk (*) indicate a percentage value of greater than zero but less than one half of a per cent.

Where figures do not sum to 100, this is due to the effects of rounding.
