

Methodology...





- This survey was conducted by Ipsos on behalf of the Centre for International Governance Innovation ("CIGI") between October 7, 2014 and November 12, 2014.
- The survey was conducted in 24 countries—Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Egypt, France, Germany, Great Britain, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Mexico, Nigeria, Pakistan, Poland, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Tunisia, Turkey and the United States—and involved 23,326 Internet users.
- Twenty of the countries utilized the Ipsos Internet panel system while the other four (Kenya, Nigeria, Pakistan and Tunisia) were conducted by Ipsos Computeraided Telephone Interviewing (CATI) facilities in each of those countries.
- In the US and Canada respondents were aged 18-64, and 16-64 in all other countries.
- Approximately 1000+ individuals were surveyed in each country and are weighted to match the online population in each country surveyed. The precision of Ipsos online polls are calculated using a credibility interval. In this case, a poll of 1,000 is accurate to +/- 3.5 percentage points. For those surveys conducted by CATI, the margin of error accuracy is +/-3.1.






How important is the Internet to their future when it comes to each of the following?





87% say the Internet is important for their future personal enjoyment and recreation...










^{8.} How important is the Internet to your future when it comes to each of the following? (Select one for each)










^{8.} How important is the Internet to your future when it comes to each of the following? (Select one for each)

81% say the Internet is important for their own economic future and livelihood...









Two thirds (64%) are more concerned about their online privacy compared to one year ago...





























77% are concerned about someone hacking into their online accounts and stealing personal information like photos and private messages...










MONITORING AND DATA USE BY PRIVATE COMPANIES



74% are concerned about private company monitoring online activities (such as internet surfing habits) and then selling that information for commercial purposes without explicit consent...








CYBER ATTACKS ON INSTITUTIONS



72% are concerned about important institutions in their country being cyber-attacked by a foreign government or terrorist organization...









64% are concerned about Governments censoring the Internet...









62% are concerned about government agencies *FROM OTHER COUNTRIES* secretly monitoring their online activities...














RESTRICTING ACCESS TO THE INTERNET BY GOVERNMENT



43% believe GOVERNMENTS OTHER THAN MY OWN will restrict access to the Internet...

















Of the 60% who have heard of him, 39% have taken steps to protect their online privacy and security as a result of what he revealed...That's one quarter (23%) of all users...
















How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet?








^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each) Base: All Respondents Total (n=23,376)


^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each)




^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each) Base: All Respondents Total (n=23,376)


^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each)




^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each) Base: All Respondents Total (n=23,376)


^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each)




^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each)






^{7.} How much do you trust each of the following to play an important role in running the Internet? (Select one for each) Base: All Respondents Total (n=23,376)
