


Emergent Belief System

Traditional parties and politicians don't care about people like me


In America today, the rich are getting richer and the poor are getting poorer

When jobs are scarce, employers should prioritize hiring people of this country over...










Increased Immigration Pressures

Economic Pressure on the Middle Class






Satisfaction with Infrastructure in Global Context

Overall, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the ... national infrastructure? Agree






Main Problems Facing America Today




Priorities Stable over Time and Correlated with Real Things







KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Increased political uncertainty in medium term due to belief in *broken system*
- Concern with Infrastructure but not a high priority issue
 - ✓ Needs to be linked to higher order concerns (jobs/economy and security)
- Infrastructure has multiple meanings: roads, bridges, jobs.
 But other concerns are important when prompted (water & energy)
 - ✓ Need to be specific about benefits
 - ✓ Talk Investment *NOT* Spending
- Stakeholders want a voice. Give it to them!
