

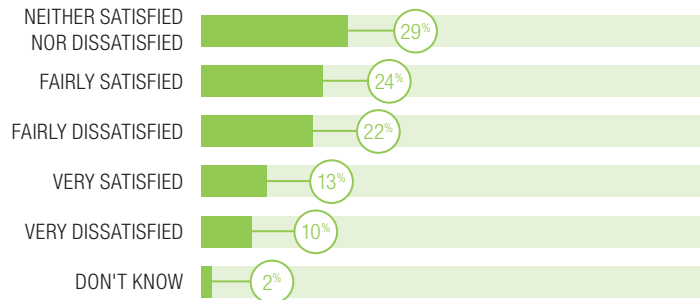
GLOBAL INFRASTRUCTURE POLL: U.S. Data

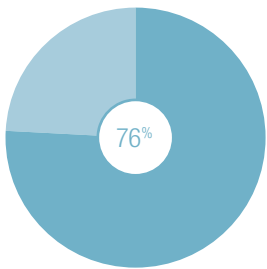
Americans are not satisfied with the quality of infrastructure in their area, according to an exclusive global survey from IPSOS. Americans believe that infrastructure is vital to economic growth, but that the nation is not doing enough to meet infrastructure needs. Americans prioritize water system, road and energy infrastructure as their preferred focus for development. Highlighting the need for opinion data at all levels of government, most Americans believe local communities should be solicited before major projects begin.

Results from a Sept 2016 Ipsos global public opinion including 18,517 people from 26 major markets.

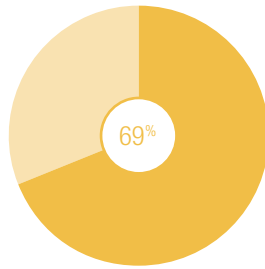
National Infrastructure Satisfaction Rate



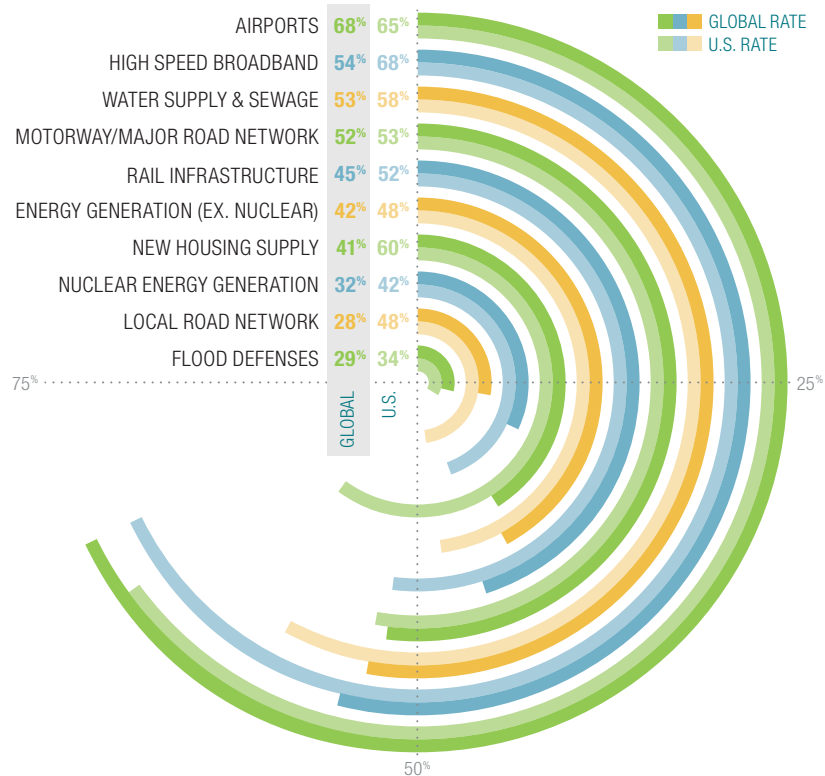
Percent Agree that Investing in Infrastructure is Vital to Future Economic Growth
